Agreement was reached on the following suggestions:

- 1. That a chairman or monitor be selected from each Confirmation Class to contact all the members of the class in order to inform them of the rededication service and to insure as full attendance as possible. Each chairman will receive a list of the confirmants in his class, and after making the calls, he will report back to Miss Rice.
- 2. The most significant prayers of the Confirmation service (opening, closing, floral offering) will be incorporated into the regular Sunday morning service. Two large Menorahs will be erected, one on each side of the altar, and each holding about 30 holders. At a designated time in the service, the roll will be called and a representative from each class will ascend the altar and light a taper for his year.
- 3. A printed program will be prepared, including the Confession of Faith which will be repeated during the service by the confirmants.
- 4. Interest was expressed in using the traditional Confirmation music and the possibility of singing one of the Confirmation songs. The playing of "Largo" was also requested.
- 5. Reading of Scriptures by one of the confirmants.
- 6. Following the service the confirmants will adjourn to the School building where rooms will be assigned to each class for brief reunions, following which everyone will assemble in Mahler Hall for a general reunion.
- 7. It was suggested that buttonieres of carnations be distributed in the lobby of the Temple to all confirmants as they enter.
- 8. The class chairman will act as hostess at the individual reunions and at the general reunion.
- 9. Class pictures and programs will be exhibited in the halls of the School building.
- 10. Admission cards will be sent to all confirmants indicating their interest in attending the service.
- 11. Possibility of dismissing Religious School on December 18th.


