May the beginning of a new century of service be an inspiration to your people to move on to greater victories and may it add further to the illustrious achievements of your own ministry.



I have visited the temple, lectured once on its premises, and greatly admired all that the Temple has achieved as one of the most respected and effective religiouscultural institutions in American Jewish life. Above all, however, I wish I could stand up at your celebration and pay my highest respect to the man who started as the spiritual guide and teacher of your community and became the most outstanding political leader in American Jewry and the inspiring force for Jews everywhere. I was greatly fortunate in having had the opportunity to serve for five years with Dr. Silver and under his direction in the political battle for the realization of Zionist aspirations.
