Dear Rabbi Silver,

I am sorry to hear you were not well, and I hope by now you are fully recovered.

I have been giving a great deal of thought to our conversation about my sculpture of Moses. I think you know how much it would mean to me to have you own it. Due to our long friendship, I needn't tell you how much it would please my father.

If you are willing to pay \$600.00 plus the bronze casting, which would amount to \$200.00, the piece is yours. I know this exceeds the price you quoted me by \$100.00, but I am unable to sell it for less. The sculpture has had very favorable comments, and I feel that you will be happy with it.

Please let me hear from you at your earliest convenience.





Dear Mr. Luntz:

The functional and aesthetic design of the Temple Annex has received national attention and applause from the architectural and educational professions. Since, to wear an old shoe, a successful building project is dependent upon a knowing and cooperative client, I would like to review the honors the Temple Annex has received to date.

The leading national magazine for school administrators, OVERVIEW, published an article on the Annex in their February, 1960 issue (enclosed). It is interesting that OVERVIEW shows the Temple as the solo architectural article in this issue which was published in conjunction with this year's annual meeting of the American Association of School Administrators in Atlantic City. Twenty-one thousand public school superintendents attended this year's meeting.

One of the three leading architectural journals PROGRESSIVE ARCHITECTURE, published an account of the design of the Luntz Auditorium in the March, 1960, issue. Other leading architectural and educational journals have indicated an interest in the work; CHURCH MANAGEMENT will publish an article this Fall.

A few months ago I received a request to exhibit the Annex at the 1960 Conference on Church Architecture sponsored jointly by the Church Architectural Guild of America and The Department of Church Building of the National Council of the Churches of Christ in the United States of America. This Annual Meeting was held in Minneapolis on May 3rd. One hundred and seven architectural firms from 30 states submitted 350 exhibits. Fifteen (equal) awards were given and I am happy to say that the Temple Exhibit was one of the recipients. This Exhibit is now a part of a traveling architectural exhibit which will tour the country for at least a year. This week the exhibit will be in Indianapolis at the Diciples of Christ Conference.

The Union of American Hebrew Congregations, New York, has requested I submit an exhibit in conjunction with the meeting in October.

This Fall I will gather the various articles and honors and have them bound and made a part of the Library collection.

May I join with the rest of the Congregation in wishing you well and thanking you for the many outstanding acts you have performed as President of the Temple.
