Dear Dr. Silver:

The happy aftermath of the Convention and the steady inflow of good wishes is all about my office this morning. I know that you are probably overwhelmed with all expressions of good will and appreciation for the stirring and heartwarming address you delivered at the most memorable Saturday evening dinner tendered in your honor.

Let me add my own heartfelt "thank you" for your many considerations and kindnesses and for your matchless role, which made this Convention an historic occasion.

In humility and pride I cherish the privilege of associating with you in serving the welfare of our people in the ultimate purposes of Zionism.

I am facing a difficult problem as you know. One of my tasks is to find ways to meet our pressing needs. No less immediate are the tasks of implementing the program adopted at the last Convention a program of constructive service through the Z.O.A. to Israel and American Jewry.

I shall need financial help - You can be of tremendous assistance to me Dr. Silver, if you could see your way clear to relieve the pressures upon us, one of which is \$3,500 due to the Temple. Is it possible to have these notes converted into a contribution to Kfar Silver for the purpose of financing the summer Ulpan to be conducted in Kfar Silver next summer?

It is my fervent hope that our regions will send 200-300 young men of highschool age to spend their summers in Kfar Silver. Each of them will receive intensive training in the study of Hebrew. I will try to work out an equitable arrangement with the Jewish Agency.

If it is at all possible I would appreciate this help from you.

My dear Max:

Thank you for your letter of September 7th. I enjoyed the Saturday evening meeting of the ZOA Convention tremendously. Judging by the reaction in the press both here and in Israel, I think that the convention has given the ZOA a great lift. I wish you every success in your work as president of the organization.

With reference to your suggestion that the Temple convert the \$3500 due it from the ZOA into a contribution to Kfar Silver, it is really out of the question. The Temple makes no contributions whatsoever to any cause -- local, national, or in Israel. It urges its members to contribute generously to all good causes. The Temple is satisfied to meet its own budget for its own needs. It was with considerable difficulty that I persuaded the Temple Board to loan the amount to the ZOA. It would be a source of great embarrassment to me and would hurt the position of the ZOA here if the debt now over-due is not paid without further delay.
