He will be very happy to learn when you plan to arrive so that he can go over your music with you. As to what you are to sing - I leave that entirely to your own judgment. Please select from your rich cantorial repertoire, the numbers which you would like to sing. If you would send me a list ahead of time I would perhaps indicate the numbers that would most probably fit into the setting of our religious service.
