Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have been trying to remain in the back-ground regarding the meetings in New York and in Brooklyn, but Judge Brenner has requested me to write to you on the following subject. He feels a delicacy about assuring you that your expenses will be taken care of, and that you will be nicely entertained, etc. Nevertheless he feels that this ought to be understood, and wants me to tell it to you.

He also asked me to tell you that the meeting is to be of the same nature as those which the Union of American Hebrew Congregations is arranging in other cities - a meeting for deepening interest in the Jewish religious cause.

The principal temples of Brooklyn will unite. Music will be furnished by the choirs of these temples, and judging from the preparations that are being made, a very enthusiastic meeting will be held.

I wish I could say as much for the meeting in New York. Although they started before Brooklyn began to make preparations, they seem to be as far away from the solution of their problems as they were on the day they started. At the present writing no date has been determined upon, no hall has been selected, and no choice has been made from the long list of suggested speakers.

I hope you will find it possible to come.

Enclosed is a hand-book for speakers which is not intended to make any suggestions to you for your address, but merely to keep you informed of what we are sending to lay speakers who have

volunteered their services in this Tour. The meeting in each city is intended to bring out a discussion of the "Status of Judaism in our City". There will be brief remarks by the presiding officer, and perhaps by some other speaker, but the visiting speakers in these Tour Meetings are being requested to speak upon the contribution of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations to the survival of Judaism in this country.

In your case, however, it isn't necessary at all that you be guided by what is being done elsewhere. I know that the subject will be well handled, no matter how you expect to treat it.

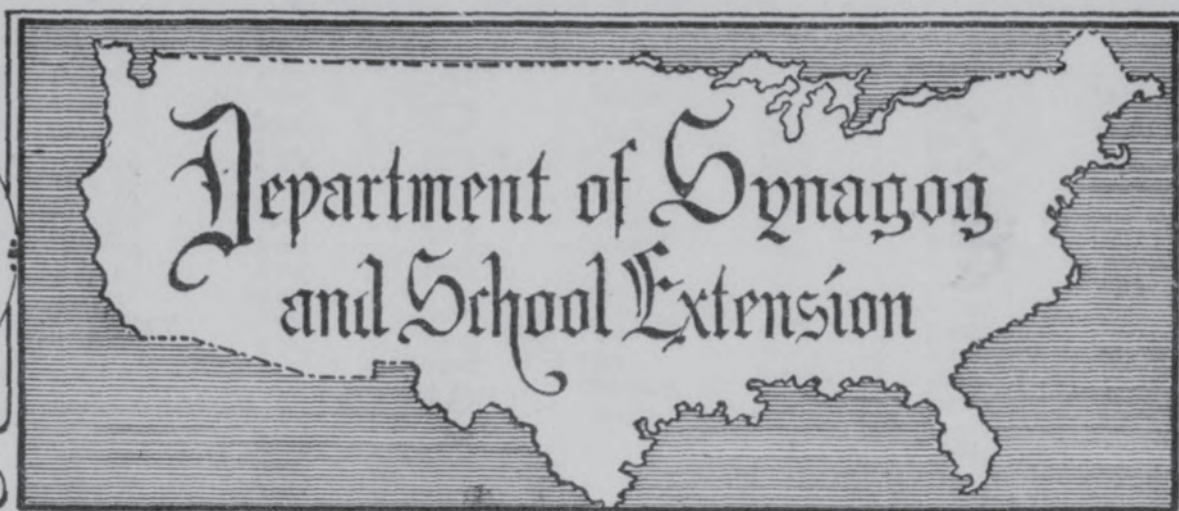

Mr. Gorrell.

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A BILL

To provide for the reading of the Holy Bible in the public schools.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. At least ten verses from the Holy Bible shall be read, or caused to be read, without comment, at the opening of each and every public school, upon each and every school day, by the teacher in charge; provided that where any teacher has other teachers under and subject to direction, then the teacher exercising this authority shall read the Holy Bible, or cause it to be read, as herein directed.

SECTION 2. If any teacher, or superintendent or principal, whose duty it shall be to read the Holy Bible, or cause it to be read, as directed in this act, shall fail or omit to do so, said teacher, superintendent or principal shall, upon charges preferred for such failure or omission, and proof of same, before the board of education of the school district, be discharged.

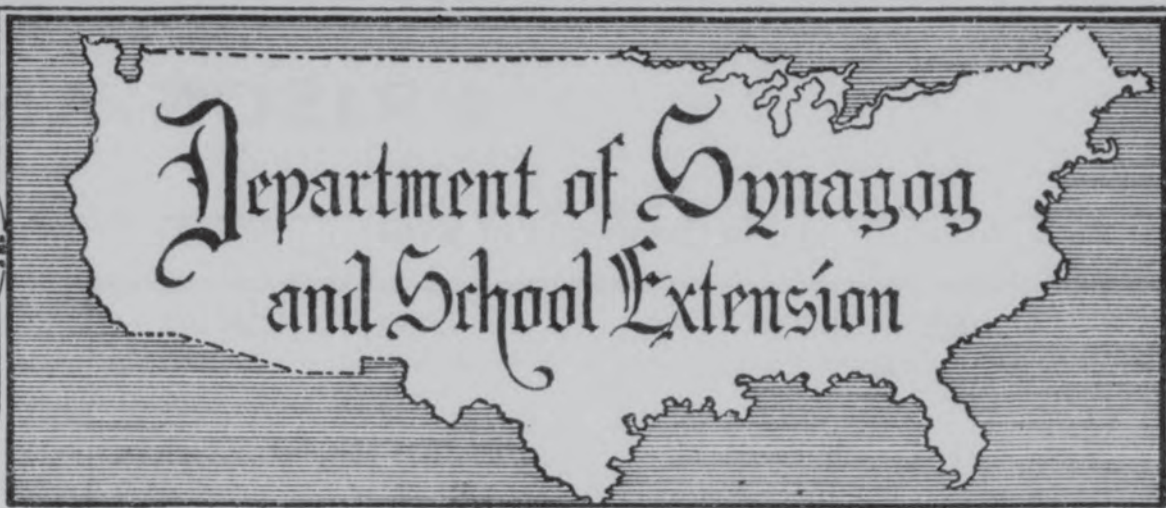
My dear Rabbi Zepin,

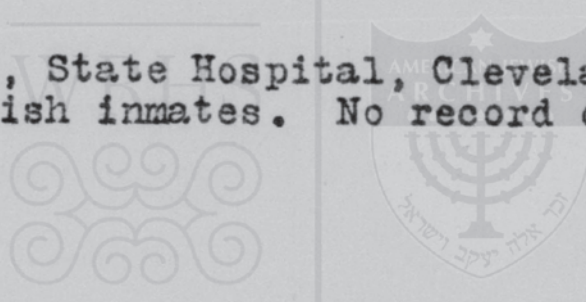

Mr. Henry Ford has been very assiduous in spreading a great deal of mis-information about the Jews.

Many American Editors, ignorant of the real facts, have repeated some of the malicious statements made by Mr. Ford. They would probably be just as ready to repeat more tolerant and truthful statements about the Jews if they were in possession of such information.

The occasions for imparting such information are rare and each one must be conserved. The approaching XXVII Council of the Union in Buffalo May 23rd to 26th is an opportunity for mentioning in the public press the work that the Jews are doing in behalf of religion, morality and good citizenship.

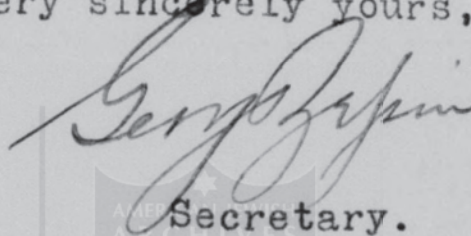
Nothing that we can do at this end will impress the editors of your papers as much as a personal visit or telephone message from yourself. We respectfully suggest that this is an opportunity for being of service to the Jewish Cause.

Will you call on the editors of your daily papers and inform them - (a) - That the Convention is one of interest and importance to Jews - (B) - requesting them to ask their newspaper representatives in Buffalo to send daily accounts of the meetings.

In this busy world we take most of our information on trust. If a man whom we know comes to us we accept his word without challenge - if a stranger approaches us we ask for proofs. Under the circumstances would it not be wise to associate with you in this call on the editors someone in your city who is acquainted with the newspaper men, either because he is a contributor to the columns of the paper or because he is an advertiser.

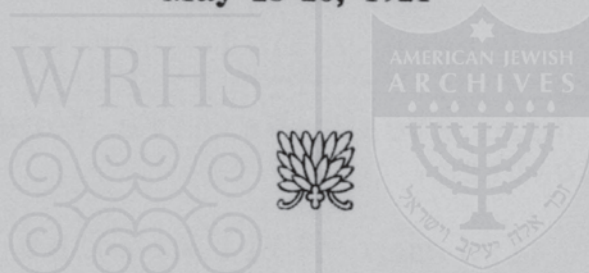
