Dear Dr. Silver:

I am sending you herewith a letter, together with an outline drawn up by Prof. Landsberger. He is one of the refugee professors at the Hebrew Union College.

As you probably know, he is one of the outstanding authorities on art, and occupied a very important position in Germany until the present regime made it necessary for him as for so many others, to leave the country.

Dr. Landsberger would like to prepare a book on Jewish art, the butline of which is being submitted herewith. Professor Englander, chairman of the Committee on Adult Education of the Commission on Jewish Education, has especially requested that you serve on the committee to consider this matter. He also wanted me to point out not only the value of the work of which we think there is a need, but also that a book on art would be quite an expensive undertaking. A rough estimate is that it would involve about \$3,000.00. Now, of course, if there should be a sale for the book and there may be, because there is no book in English on the subject, this would not be a serious problem; nevertheless, we are anxious in this particular case, to have the reaction of our committee, not merely to the outline submitted, but also to the practical question as to whether there would be an interest in such a book on the part of the Jews of America.

I do hope you will give this an early examination and let us have your opinion on the subject.
