My dear Mr. Brown,

Permit me to acknowledge the receipt of your kind letter of December 31st. The report on my address in the Jewish Advocate of Boston quoted by you is not accurate, and couched in abominable English. What did the reported mean by saying that the Russian Colonization is a new Catholicism? What I said at the meeting was that Zionists are not opposed to any relief drive for the authoration of the conditions of their people in any part of the world nor are they opposed tothis United Jewish Campaign. Their opposition was focused against the effort made by some who advocate Russian Colonization as the solution of the problem of Russian Jewry and as the panacea for all their ills. This you will recall, I stated in my letter to you and to Mr. Marshall. You may rest assured, my dear Mr. Brown, that I have not in the past nor do I intend in the future to do anything that would in the least harm the United Jewish Campaign. I did not hear the address of Mrs. Archibald Silverman for I left immediately after my talk to catch a train for North Adams.



PERSONAL

Dear Abba:

I wanted to write to you privately and confidentially with regard to our present situation and the prospects for the future, and I would like you to give these matters some thought.

After two or three months of active campaigning, we can begin to guage the possibilities and estimate the results of our effort this year. Although it is still early in the season, I am prepared to say that the outcome of the year's work will be far better than ever before in the history of American Zionism. In the controversy which grew out of the Crimean project, we have certainly emerged triumphant. Not only has the sum allotted for this purpose been reduced by half, but that feature has been now almost eliminated from the J.D.C. publicity and propagands, and pure relief taken its place. Much more important than that, we really have achieved in a large measure what we were striving for under the slogan of "the priority of Palestine".

In large areas where it has not yet been possible to organize J.D.C. drives, we have organized our campaigns and they are in full swing. In a number of cases the local J.D.C. committees have requested us to agree to joint drives on a fifty-fifty basis. In Stamford, Conn., they forced us reluctantly to accept a sixty-forty basis, 60% for U.P.A. In Florida we have a fifty-fifty agreement for Jacksonville and 66% in the Miami and Tampa districts, two-thirds being for Palestine and one-third for the J.D.C. Judge Mack will go to Florida to speak. Of course, in some cities where our personnel is comparatively weak, less advantageous terms were accepted by our committees. But on the whole I think it is fair to say that for the Jewish public the U.P.A. is at least on a parity with the United Jewish Campaign.

ever I have addressed them, the Zionists have frequently achieved moral victories and then thrown away the substantial victory. If after all of this we should fail to come within close range of our quota and the J.D.C. does get its money, then we shall have been defeated. Moreover, we have made such amextraordinary effort this year in the way of publicity and propaganda with visitors from abroad, etc., that if we do not come out well in the end, we shall most certainly suffer a reaction with all its disastrous effects on our work in future years.

But I am also, on the other hand, absolutely convinced that we can raise probably four million dollars, if not more, if we will exploit to the limit the present favorable sentiment. Extraordinary things are happening. The city of Boston, for instance, has already sent us the first check for \$50,000., and we are promised a check for the same amount by the end of February. I think the cash income from the New England region will probably be approximately twice as large as last year. In pledges, the income will probably be more than double. A similar condition is in Connecticut. It looks like double our cash income in this State. Pittsburgh, which was one of our worst towns, looks exceedingly promising this year. We got \$26,000. last year, and will get \$100,000. this year. I have mentioned Florida. We will get probably twenty or thirty times as much as ever before. In the South Western region, with St. Louis as the center, the prospects are very encouraging. We have already raised in that region as much as the whole of last year. The St. Louis campaign is yet to come. Chicago, the delinquent in our Zionist family, shows signs of life and improved activity. I expect to go out there in a fortnight. New York City we have already raised \$800,000. toward our quota of a million and a half dollars, and Zeldin believes that we will get at least a million and a third - which is equivalent to what the J.D.C. has set as its quota for the year in New York.

In a number of cities the J.D.C. campaign will not be held until next fall or winter, and we may have joint campaigns in such cities next winter. But in order to obtain favorable terms next season, it is essential, of course, that we show such results this year as will justify our demands. This may be the case in Cleveland, and I would appreciate your view, first, as to whether or not Cleveland is to have a J.D.C. campaign next winter, and second, whether we should consider joining with them, and third, on what basis if at all.

As I have said, there is a wonderful spirit abroad throughout the country, and we would be absolutely maiss as Zionist leaders if we failed to take full advantage of the situation.

In view of these unusual circumstances, I am impelled to approach you again, although you discouraged the suggestion when I spoke to you personally in the office, that you give us a larger measure of cooperation in this campaign even though you may find it difficult to do so in view of your other commitments. We have a wonderful line-up, and with a maximum of effort on the part of yourself, Wise, Mack, Sokolow, Bialik, Levin, etc., we will succeed. For myself, I can assure you that I am putting in every ounce of energy that I possess.

I propose that you let me have a record of all the dates still open on your calendar and that I make arrangements whereby you be reimbursed on the same basis as in the case of the forums that you address, or on any basis that would be satisfactory to you, and I would arrange this matter as strictly between you and me. I urge this because I don't think it is altogether fair for us to make heavy demands upon your time in a way which would mean practically your contributing thousands of dollars to the U.P.A. - a contribution out of all proportions to your means, and the contributions of others. I have not discussed this matter with a soul. I am acting entirely on my own and solely because of my deep interest in the outcome of the campaign and the good

of the cause. I beg you to give this matter earnest consideration, and I am sure that our personal relations are such that you will not hesitate to write me fully and frankly.

One thing more. You know we are bringing over the Bialik expedition. It includes himself, his wife and Dr. Levin. It is an expensive undertaking, involving transportation charges from Palestine and back, living expenses in America plus liberal compensation to Bialik for his time, etc.

In order to avoid placing an additional heavy charge on our campaign expenses, we have decided to cover the expense of this expedition by charging admission to a series of Bialik meetings in the large centers. In New York City we have taken Mecca Temple, and have priced the tickets to total \$7,000. It will yield us not probably over \$5,000. The tickets are going very well. About \$1200. worth have already been sold in the first two or three days. I have no doubt the meeting will be a success financially as well as otherwise. We are making similar arrangements in Baltimore, Boston, etc. We have received a letter from the Secretary of the Zionist District in Claveland, Mr. Shapiro, who has requested us to give him Bialik for February 28th. We have replied, asking what arrangements can be made in Cleveland and how much the meeting can net. If they do arrange such a meeting, it ought to be used, at the same time, for getting a substantial check for the U.P.A. on account of the pledges as well as new money from people who have not yet given. I would appreciate your opinion on this question as soon as possible.

I have other matters to write to you about, but I shall leave it for another letter since this one has already assumed generous proportions.

Dear Abba:

I have your confidential letter of February 1st and I hasten to reply.

Before submitting it to the Administrative Committee I would like to consult with Mr. Lipsky, who is due to arrive next Tuesday with Bialik. In the meantime, I shall keep this matter to myself and not discuss it with the Committee, with the possible exception of one or two privately.

I don't know whether you know, and I am telling you this also in confidence, that shortly after the Philadelphia Conference of the J.D.C. at which you will recall Maurice Samuel among others represented the viewpoint of the Zionists on the question of the colonization project in Rusda, Mr. Samuel was approached by representatives of the J.D.C. likewise with the suggestion that he join such commission. He fought shy of the proposal, suspecting that it might be calculated to commit him personally and perhaps the Zionist Organization. In other words, he was suspicious of an attempt "to buy him off".

As for myself, I should like to think the matter over. I can see of course certain advantages. On the other hand, it also seems clear to me that the J.D.C. leaders are anxious to secure the cooperation of a number of our ablest and most eloquent speakers for their campaigns next year and the year after. If you accept their invitation I think they will assume that you will give them a large measure of cooperation in the future.

But as I say, the matter requires more thought and I will communicate with you again next week. In the meantime, I would strongly advise that you delay making your decision.

Dear Friend:

We have received a number of inquiries from various parts of the country as to whether or not the Mizrachi is taking an active part in our Campaign, and also what our relations are to the Poalei-Zion Gewerkschaften Campaign.

With regard to the Mizrachi, they have been almost from the first, and are today, one of the constituent organizations of the United Palestine Appeal. The Mizrachi has a number of cultural organizations in Palestine, and is also responsible for certain religious activities in Eretz-Isroel, which are covered by the Palestine budget of the Keren Hayesod, adopted at the Vienna Congress. In addition, the Mizrachi has a number of institutions and activities in Palestine of a religious and educational nature, which were not included in the Palestine budget of the Keren Hayesod, owing to lack of funds.

When the Mizrachi entered the United Palestine Appeal an arrangement was made to include \$90,000 for the Mizrachi to cover these special Palestinian activities.

The recent Wise incident having been liquidated when it was discovered that Dr. Wise had been misquoted, the Mizrachi is now sending to its branches throughout the country instructions to continue to extend the cooperation which they are giving to the United Palestine Appeal in every Campaign in the land.

Moreover, in virtue of the agreement which exists between the United Palestine Appeal and the constituent organizations, the Mizrachi has agreed to conduct no Campaigns for the Tachkemoni or any of the other Mizrachi activities in Palestine, as these are now being covered by the United Palestine Appeal.

I hope that this explanation will make clear the situation as regards the Mizrachi.



With reference to the Poalei-Zion and the Gewerk-schaften Campaign, at the time of the Baltimore Conference negotiations were afoot between the United Palestine Appeal and the Poalei-Zion, whereby the Poalei-Zion fund would have become a constituent of the United Palestine Appeal. However, these negotiations did not materialize and the Gewerkschaften Campaign was launched with the Poalei-Zion as its most active supporters.

This fund is therefore not a constituent fund of the United Palestine Appeal. Nevertheless, cordial relations exist between the two Campaigns. The Poalei-Zion have recognized their obligation to help the United Palestine Appeal in every community in the country where a Campaign takes place as a constituent organization of the World Zionist Organization. Moreover, it is expected that the Gewerkschaften Campaign will conduct its Campaigns in such a manner as to not conflict in point of time or otherwise with the Campaigns of the United Palestine Appeal. These Campaigns should be held after the United Palestine Appeal Campaign is at an end, or, if the Campaign is held beforehand, in such a manner as to allow at least six weeks to elapse between the conclusion of the Gewerkschaften Campaign and the opening of the United Palestine Appeal Campaign.

We also learn that some misunderstanding exists as to the exact status of the Junior Hadassah in the United Palestine Appeal. A public statement has already been made to the effect that the Junior Hadassah has to raise a sum of \$43,000 to cover its Palestine obligations to the orphans in Palestine. This \$43,000 has been included in the five-million-dollar-fund of the United Palestine Appeal. It has been arranged that \$10,000 of this total is to be remitted in monthly installments from the National Treasury of the United Palestine Appeal, and the remaining \$33,000 is to be raised by social functions, dances, linen showers, rummage sales, etc.

These social functions are, of course, only to be held where it is clear that no injury to the general work of the United Palestine Appeal will result, and in consultation with the local representatives or the Regional Directors of the United Palestine Appeal.

We trust that the situation with regard to the Mizrachi, the Junior Hadassah, and the Gewerkschaften Campaign is now clear. We shall be glad to hear from you if there is any point upon which you need further explanation.



Dear Mr. Wise:

I am coming to you with the appeal of the Omaha Jewry. As Chairman of the Omaha Zionist District I do not know what to answer to the Omaha people about Rabbi Silver's last minute cancellation. Everything was arranged with about a hundred reservations for a luncheon which I ordered. A big delegation has been arranged to meet Rabbi Silver at the depot on the morning of the 18th, 7 A.M. coming from Kansas City, Mo., which has been scheduled here for that date.

He was supposed to speak at that date at the Temple Israel. Omaha would have the biggest success of its kind on the meeting.

I have worked for three weeks day and night in order to make a success. On the night of the 17th, at 10 P.M. Mr. Henry Monsky, Omaha's well known attorney, who was to be Chairman at Habbi Silver's meeting, calls me up telling me that he received a telegram from Mr. Charles Cooper at Kansas City, stating that Habbi Silver has cancelled the Omaha engagement.

To my mind I think that that was a big calamity to our Omaha campaign. I actually do not know what to answer to the people that call me upon the phone every minute.

I would appreciate an answer from you by return mail stating the cause of his cancellation.

We have been lead to believe that Rabbi Silver was to deliver an address here in Omaha last Thursday evening. His coming had been extensively advertised; arrangements had been made for him to speak at the Temple; a committee appointed to meet him at the station and entertain him here, to aid his Gause.

Imagine our surprise to receive a telegram late Wednesday night, telling us that he would not be here:

This may seem a very small matter to your organization, but it has raised particular "hell" in our city - so much so, that some of the more enthusiastic members of the Zionist organization have already accused some of us of purposely diverting Dr. Silver from Omaha. His non-appearance and no adequate explanation from you, has hurt your Cause.

In justice to the men who were absolutely sincere in advertising Dr. Silver's coming and in furthering the best interests of his Cause, you owe it to Omaha to give us an explanation of this fiasco. This explanation should come immediately, and from someone in authority.

I know that as fairminded men, you will give this letter and request your very prompt and courteous consideration.

EXTRACT FROM LETTER ADDRESSED TO MR. EMANUEL NEUMANN BY MR. HARRY LAPIDUS OF OMAHA NEBRASKA.

February 20th, 1926.

Now, then I would appreciate very much if you will kindly let me hear from you immediately just what was the reason that Rabbi Silver did not come to Omaha on Thursday, the 18th. My information is that the local chairman of the Zionist District, Mr. John Feldman, had been in communication with your Mr. Cooper, the Regional Director at St. Louis, and that he had positive information that Rabbi Silver would arrive in Omaha on Thursday morning, the 18th.

The local committee had arranged to have the most active men of our city to be present at a luncheon at noon, where Rabbi Silver was to speak. Arrangements were also made for a large meeting to take place in the evening, where Rabbi Silver was to address a mass meeting at the Temple. From all indications the Temple would have been crowded to over capacity, as very extensive propaganda had been sent out, both through the mail and through the local newspapers, as well as the local Jewish paper, and announcements had been made to all the different organizations in Omaha pertaining to Rabbi Silver. Everyone had been urged to attend, and the indications were that this meeting would have been a tremendous success, as I feel certain that Rabbi Silver's address would have produced wonderful results for the United Palestine Appeal. We were very much shocked and surprised when we received telegram late Wednesday evening that on account of a misunderstanding in New York, Rabbi Silver was dated elsewhere for Thursday, the 18th.

I am very much afraid that because of the publicity and propaganda of his coming, and then on account of his failure to arrive, that the cause has suffered greatly. Therefore I am very anxious to know just what are the facts in this case, and just where the mistake was made in first the announcing of his coming, and second because of his failure to arrive, as I believe we are entitled to know the real facts so that the misunderstanding can be cleared up.

Mr. Friedlander is a man of about 55 years of age. He is assisting our Director in our Chicago Bureau, in the organization of the midwestern states. He has been active in the zionist movement for a number of years, and was at one time secretary of the Chicago Bureau, during the Mestoration Fund Campaign of 1919-20. He has been identified, also, with one of the Anglo-Jewish weeklies of Chicago. On the whole, he is a very good man for publicity work. As to his actual fund-raising ability, I am unable to say as yet. As to that, we will be able to judge a little later on, when his work with the Chicago Bureau will have been completed.

It would be well, I believe, for Er. Friedlander to visit Cleveland, so that your committee could interview him, and see whether he is suitable and satisfactory to the Cleveland Committee.

I have been asked by the cities of Minneapolis and Duluth to extend a most urgent invitation to you to address banquets for the opening of the United Palestine Appeal campaign in Minneapolis and a joint drive for the Relief and Palestine in Duluth.

Both of these cities say they will accept no one other than yourself, as they feel that the biggest man available is absolutely essential to put the jobs accross. I believe that this is true.

Minneapolis has always done well for Palestine. The people of Minneaplis this year wanted a joint campaign; for months they negotiated and had agreed upon a sixty forty arrangement, 60% for Palestine and 40% for the Relief. Mr. David Brown upon his visit to the Twin Cities, cancelled that arrangement. After his departure attempts were made to get together upon some other basis, but with no success.

As Regional Director I proceeded pursuant to instruction of Minneapolis to arrange a separate United Palestine Campaign which was to have commenced next Sunday evening with Rabbi Stephen Wise at a banquet. About ten days ago with all arrangements almost perfected for the separate campaign, a number of individuals, interested in the Relief again broached the question of a joint campaign, feeling that Minneapolis should do something for the Relief of suffering Jews in Eastern Europe; despite the objection of a number of the stronger Zionists an agreement was made for a one year campaign on a fifty fifty basis. The campaign to be postponed until May. The chairman of the joint campaign reported to headquarters of the United Jewish Campaign and asking for their assistance, were advised that the arrangement made ould not be approved, and after a number of wires back and forth with Mr. Brown, the joint campaign was cancelled for Minneapolis.

Now that the administrative committee of the United Palestine Appeal for Minneapolis has determined to proceed with its separate campaign for Palestine to commence about May 11, or shortly thereafter, the situation in Minneapolis calls for an unusual effort upon the part of all Minneapolis Zionists and they are ready to make the same. The campaign needs a stimulus however, and I hope you will not consider it as flattery, because it is not intended as such, when I say to you that under all the circumstances only you can provide the maximum stimulus by addressing the Minneapolis ban uet to open the campagin.

The situation in Duluth is such that if you go there I believe that a very strong lasting sentiment for Palestine will be aroused which will help Duluth in its campaign for Palesine for years to come. Not only that, but Duluth will raise much more through your presence than would be possible with any one else. The Duluth campaign as I have said, will be divided fifty fifty with the Pelief campa@n. However, I am sure that the theme of the whole Duluth Campaign may be made Palestine and less stress placed upon the other effort, as Duluth is in no manner communicating with Headquarters of the United Jewish Campaign, but is making all its negotiations through my o fice.

As Regional Director for Minnesota, North and South Dakota, I have been beset with many difficulties and complications arising almost daily. I know how you are being called upon to deliver addresses here and there, but in spite of the I turn to you as one of the leaders in our movement to save the situation in Minnesota. If you could come to Minneapolis on the 11th, that would be fine; we could arrange for a banquet in Duluth either the day before or the day after. If you cannot come for that date wont you please let me hear from you at once possibly by wire as to what dates you could give for Minneapolis and Duluth.

I hope that I have not burdened you with the details of this letter, but I felt that the urgency of the situation required an explanation. Awaiting your very early reply I am,



Carmel reports that Goodman and family are likely to contribute \$25,000 to the Joint Campaign. That will possibly be the principal contribution in the State. He deserves all encouragement and congratulation, and we trust that you will also find him to merit your mention by public acclaim of his work. And I feel that you feel very much the same way. What is most important, of course, is first, that at every banquet, meeting, etc.k the Zionist cause be properly put before the public, and that the same be done in the matter of publicity, literature, etc. We have dispatched today another thousand copies of our pamphlet, and we are asking the Chicago office to forward you additional copies. We are somewhat low in our supplies at the present moment, but have ordered reprints. I am happy to learn that you are going to utilize Silver's presence for a mass meeting, as well as the banquet. It was an excellent move on your part. Dr. Silver will, I know, help to lay a solid foundation, on which you will be able to build next year. I am writing him fully, explaining the situation, advising him of the efforts which you have been putting forward, and I know that he will cooperate with you in every possible way. It is also of the greatest importance that we should announce our plans to conduct a campaign next year, so that the public will be prepared. You, as the leader of the Zionist forces in the State, may properly take occasion, wherever possible, to emphasize that face, in your addresses, your statements and interviews to the press, in your correspondence, and in every other way. In conclusion may I say that I believe the difficulty in which you have found yourself, and the circumstances which have dictated your course of action. I am sure you realize that the duty imposed upon me, as General Director of this campaign, is to leave no stone unturned, in order to secure the quota required for Palestine. I have been on this job continuously since last October as a volunteer, to the complete neglect of my personal affairs. I have given this campaign my thought day and night, and have placed the best that is in me at the disposal of the cause. Of course, I feel it is worthwhile, in view of the results we are getting, and I feel particularly happy over the calibre of men, such as yourself, who have stepped in this year and have taken hold of the responsibidities of the campaigns in the various parts of the country. 

Now that the United Palestine Appeal is drawing to a close, especially the New York campaign, I am moved to write to you and to thank you with all my heart for your help in the campaign, and to remind you that we have other duties to face in connection with Jewish life.


Nothing is more urgent, it seems to me, at this moment, than the need to build up the American Jewish Congress which is, after all, the one potent factor and democratic instrument of Jewish life for service in general questions affecting our people, and for the crystallization of public opinion whenever uncertainty and confusion prevail. # PRESIDENT COOLIDGE'S MESSAGE TO AMERICAN JEWISH CONGRESS

(Sent through Dr. Stephen S. Wise, President of the American Jewish Congress.)

"American Jews are justified in seeking to safeguard the rights of their brother Jews in all lands in which these may in any way be imperilled; and the more because the Jew in this country is secure in those religious, civil, political rights, which are the inalienable possession of every

law-abiding American.

"The President declared himself to be peculiarly interested in the effort of American Jews to have part in the building up of Palestine under British mandate as a Jewish Homeland, where homeless Jews may rebuild their ancient and historical home, whither Jews and all peoples may turn for that inspiration with which Palestine has long blessed mankind.

"When told that it is felt in Jewish circles that the immigration restrictions bear especially hard upon the Jew, and that in some East European centers would-be Jewish immigrants to America are not fairly dealt with by our consular representatives, the President stated: 'The administration will continue to refuse sanction or tolerance to any anti-Jewish discrimination in the matter of immigration, or in any other matter.' He

felt sure that a careful investigation, if needed, would reveal that these so-called discriminations were unreal.

"In closing, the President earnestly wished Godspeed to the American Jewish Congress, under the leadership of one of the best of Americans, Nathan Straus, in seeking to lift the Jewish people of all lands to a level equality of status, which is the deserved lot of the loyal and patriotic American Jew."

My dear Dr. Silver:

I regret very much that our people in Providence can't see their way clear to postponing their drive from the first week in October to October 21st, the date that you are free to go out there. Of course, they realize what a loss this is to them and you can imagine what conditions prevail there if they have to deny themselves the pleasure of having you as the speaker at the opening banquet of the campaign.

This campaign should have been held last Spring and was postponed for important local reasons. In the latter part of October there will be a Community Chest campaign and it is imperative that we make a United Palestine Appeal drive during the first week of October, therefore the only date suitable to our people there is either the 3rd or 5th of that month. Too bad indeed that you can't be there.

I understand that Mr. Cooper had written you a letter, asking you to go out to Omaha during September. I assume that you hardly have a free day during that month, when we have the High Holidays. But it is also a city where it is orgent that we make a United Palestine Appeal campaign early so as to be ahead of the United Jewish drive. We were negotiating there for a combined drive, but we were not offered the right terms and we will have to go it alone. Our quota is \$25,000. If, of course, it were possible for you to give them a date in September, it would save the situation for us.

May I not, at the same time, ask you, my dear Dr. Silver, to hold for us whatever free dates you have and you can spare during the coming Fall and Winter? I need hardly press this matter as I am sure you yourself realize the importance of your services to the United Palestine Appeal during the coming campaign for \$7,500,000. I know that people in many important cities will be clamoring for you and it would be well if we knew shead of time just what dates you are at the disposal of the United Palestine Appeal campaign. If convenient to you, would you please write us about this.

Dear Abba:

As I told you over the 'phone last week, it was my "mazzel" to have an almost continuous downpour of rain during my vacation. Last Thursday, when I was in town, I had to hurry back with Mrs. Neumann, for fear we might miss some of the precious drops. Now that I have returned to the city, it has cleared up, and we are enjoying almost spring-like weather. I am sorely tempted, despite my devotion to duty, to take another week or so "off".

I was very sorry that I could not see you last week, particularly since you seemed to have something on your mind. Perhaps you could write me a private personal letter, or else, worse come to worse, we will have to wait until you come east again, or I go west.

I want to thank you again for the books you recommended to me. They were my consolation during the time when my spirits were heavy with rain weather. In Muirhead's book, I relished particularly Hobbouse and Inge, and also got some "kick" out of Bertrand Russell. Any more suggestions? I would welcome them.

I am still uncertain of the exact date of the arrival of Dr. Weizmann. We cabled again last Friday, but as yet we have had no reply. Sir Alfred Mond will be here, but we were advised that he is in America on a special mission, and should not be approached to help in our propaganda during this trip. There is a possibility, as I think I told you, that Dr. Magnes will be here, and will place himself for a time at the disposal of the U.P.A. For the rest, we must depend on our own forces. Which brings me to the subject of your own speaking engagements. I understand that Mr. Edlin has been negotiating with you with reference to Providence, Omaha, etc. Would it not be possible for you to send me a list of dates, scattered

through the fall and winter months, which are open, so that we will be able to adjust ourselves and arrange opening dates of campaigns to fit these free days. Of course, in many cases, it is difficult to set the exact date of the opening of the campaign, because it does not depend entirely upon our wishes. Local conditions and unforseen events frequently compel us to alter our plans. But in a number of instances it is possible to fix such dates definitely.

If you give me such a list, I promise to give the matter my personal attention, so that we will book you in only such places as are worthwhile. If you send us such a list of dates, it would be helpful if you would give us an idea of the city from which you will have to start in each case, whether from home or elsewhere. That will avoid our attempting to book you in Newark, N.J., for instance, a day or two after an engagement in Kansas City.

Zeldin has just returned from Palestine, and I am going to remind him of your desire that he visit Cleveland to help prepare for the next campaign.
