Dear Rabbi Silver:

In connection with the forthcoming visit to the United States of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, we are arranging a National Conference for Palestine, to be held at Washington, D. C. on February 7th.

All of us feel that this will offer a unique opportunity to meet with the President of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and the World Zionist Organization so that we in America may have a better view of the situation in Palestine and of what is required of us in America to influence that situation. The visit of Dr. Weizmann to America at this time can be made to have a decisive effect insofar as American public opinion is related to the Royal Commission and its interpretation of British obligations in Palestine.

We have not yet perfected a final program for the conference, which will begin on Saturday night, February 6th, and continue until Sunday night, February 7th; but we are anxious that it shall be fully representative and that those who attend the conference shall be made fully aware of the responsible part which American Jewry can play in helping to decide the issues which today confront Jewish Palestine.

All of us join not only in inviting you to attend the conference, but to take an active part in its deliberations and to speak at such session and on such topic as we shall mutually agree upon in the next few weeks as the outlines of the program we must adopt become clearer. We are asking you to make definite arrangements to be with us at the conference and to share with us in planning and conducting it.



March 31, 1937 Dr. Stephen S. Wise, 40 West 68th Street. New York, N.Y. My dear Dr. Wise: Let me acknowledge your letter of March 21st in which you ask me to address some meetings towards the end of May in New York. As you undoubtedly know, the annual Convention of the Central Conference of American Rabbis begins, this year, on Tuesday, May 25th. As I am President of the Alumni Association of the Hebrew Union College, I shall beve to attend the sessions. Your letter suggests the two days of May 25th and 26th. It would be possible for me to give the New York Campaign Organization Monday, May 24th and perhaps Tuesday, May 25th, but I must be in Columbus for the Conference on the 25th. I am accepting these engagements tentatively, contingent upon the matter concerning which I wrote to you a few lays ago, a reply to which you sent me on March 25th. I ask no praise either from you or from anyone else in the U.P.A. organization. But in official Zionist publications and at an official Zionist gathering, I expect the same recognition to be taken of my services rendered to the Campaign or to a meeting which I addressed in behalf of the Zionist cause as is accorded to you or to the other leaders in the work. I ask for no more and no less. Last year, The New York Campaign Organization invited me to open its campaign. I believe that I delivered three addresses. The your skillful publicity bureau timed its publicity in such a way and in such a matter that a letter of Dr. Weizman to the campaign was released on the very day of my meeting. Tagged on to that release, somewhere in an obscure corner, was the fact that I delivered the opening address of the campaign. Had that happened to you, you would have raised the roof off the U.P.A. headquarters. I said nothing about it. But I refuse to be subjected to that kind of handling indefinitely. Dear Dr. Silver:

I do not think that your letter of March 31st is entirely fair to me. After all, I cannot control the actions of this great organization and its multifarious activities.

Please believe me when I say that I am deeply anxious to have you cooperate fully with the
United Palestine Appeal. We need the help that
you can give us and the counsel and the leadership. It would certainly be valuable if you
would arrange to be with us regularly when we
have meetings of the national chairmen at which
we discuss methods of proceedure affecting the
campaign.

I should like to recall to you that it was I who invited you to the United Palestine Appeal Conference at Washington. I had felt that your presence and your speed would provide splendid stimulus, but you could not attend.

You can make a very great contribution to the campaign if you out undertake during the early part of April or May go on a transcontinental tour, visiting ten or fifteen of the biggest cities in the United States. We could dramatize that tour and make it of great value for all our work on behalf of Palestine. Can you do it?

I note what you say with regard to May 24th and 25th for New York City. The New York Campaign is so arranged that functions are of a sectional character. The result is that the individual functions do not and cannot receive the publicity not merely that the speaker wishes, but that the United Palestine Appeal itself needs for its work.
