


MEMORANDUM

In re invitations by Governor Lehman to a meeting at his home on March 5th.

STATISTICAL ACCOUNT

On February 10th there were issued 238 invitations for a meeting at the home of Governor Lehman on the afternoon of March 5th. As of February 16th there were 64 replies, representing 16 acceptances. Of the 24 who said they could not attend the overwhelming majority stated that they would be in Florida or out of the United States at the time of the meeting.

There were nine others who stated they could not come but gave no definite reason. It is intended that there shall be a follow-up on a selected number of these either through a letter from someone other than Governor Lehman or by telephone message.

REACTION TO THE LETTER

From letters which have come to us from communities and from sentiment sounded by officers of the United Jewish Appeal, particularly by Mr. Isidor Coons who is now on a tour of the Middle West, a great deal of interest has been excited by the invitations, even among those who have said they are unable to come. It has needed a meeting of this kind, under the sponsorship of Governor Lehman, to arouse among local leaders, who have hitherto been lukewarm, an appreciation of the extent of the problem and of the necessity of their participation in its solution. No item in the program to arouse interest in the United Jewish Appeal could possibly be more effective than the meeting scheduled in the home of Governor Lehman.

March 5th may be considered an early date, in view of the fact that a number of the potential big givers are in Florida or on vacation elsewhere, but it should be kept in mind that a great many communities are planning their campaigns in March and April and that the success of these campaigns is dependent upon the leadership shown and the standard of contribution set by the other men who have been invited to the Governor Lehman meeting. Possibly additional action will have to be taken in April or in March for those who will be in Florida on March 5th; but the sixteen men who have already stated they will be present are of such character as to make the meeting worthwhile.

Mr. Louis Borinsteine is Chairman of the campaign in Indianapolis. He will need the stimulation that he can get from such a meeting in order that the community may adopt the full quota set for it by the United Jewish Appeal.

Mr. Oliver Kaufmann is Chairman of the Pittsburgh campaign. Pittsburgh has thus far been hesitant to accept the quota had in mind by the officers of the United Jewish Appeal.

Mr. Fred Lazarus has, in the opinion of some, not contributed as generously as circumstances warranted. The participation of Mr. Lazarus in the meeting will assure not only the success of the Columbus campaign but give an impetus to the

campaign throughout the State of Ohio.

The presence of Mr. Abraham Lichtman of Newark is of the utmost importance to the Newark campaign. The community hopes that Mr. Lichtman will accept the Chairmanship of the Newark drive. In 1938 the agencies embraced in the United Jewish Appeal were allotted \$48,000 by Newark. A quota of \$600,000 has been set for 1939 for that community. If Mr. Lichtman can be persuaded through such a meeting to accept the responsibility of Chairmanship, Newark will have been put far on its way toward overcoming its past negligence.

Detroit has accepted a quota for the United Jewish Appeal almost four times what it was in 1938. Mr. Meyer Prentis has, in the opinion of some, contributed on so low a standard as to depress the giving of the entire community. He is one of the four or five men whose gifts and whose work in the campaign will determine the outcome of the Detroit drive to raise the largest sum in its history.

PURPOSE OF THE MEETING *2/1939*

There are two definite purposes to the meeting which Governor Lehman has been kind enough to call for March 5th:

The first, and probably the most important, is to give those who attend a full picture of the situation which the United Jewish Appeal is called upon to meet. Although the newspapers are the best source of information and have carried the news for years, it is still true that a meeting of leaders in the home of Governor Lehman has a psychological value which is incalculable. The men who come to Governor Lehman's home should be able to leave with the feeling that a grave emergency exists and that their share of the task is not completed merely through a contribution, but that it involves also personal service in their local campaigns through accepting leadership in them or by communicating with others who are able to give substantial sums and imbuing the community as a whole with their own enthusiasm.

The second purpose of the meeting is to obtain from those who attend, a commitment to the campaign. It should be kept in mind that any contribution announced at Governor Lehman's meeting is intended to be part of the local campaign for the United Jewish Appeal and the local campaign will be informed immediately of the amount of the contribution announced. The securing of such commitments on the spot is important for the following reasons:

First, it establishes a national, instead of a local, standard of giving. In all too many communities men of great wealth have been contributing \$1,000 to \$5,000 to their local campaigns when if they were in New York or Chicago they would have to be giving \$25,000 or \$50,000. By attending a meeting at the home of Governor Lehman they are challenged to give on the basis of their relationship to other men of similar means, wherever they may be located.

Secondly, the announcement of unusually large gifts with a minimum of \$25,000 each will have a dynamic effect upon local campaigns. Although it is unfortunate, it is nevertheless true that giving in the larger brackets has often

been on a comparative basis rather than in proportion to the amount of sympathy a donor had for the cause involved. If the financial leader in a community sets the standard on a new and unprecedented scale it means that everyone else from the lowest to the highest giver will change his own standard accordingly.

Thirdly, the announcement of a contribution of unusual size means that the donor psychologically feels a personal stake in the United Jewish Appeal campaign. By his act of giving in an unaccustomed manner he himself becomes convinced of the importance of the success of the United Jewish Appeal and thereby pledges himself when he returns to his community to give unprecedented support to local campaign efforts. It has too often happened in the past that the men of largest means and influence in the community have absented themselves from campaign leadership, leaving it to men of small means and small influence.

NECESSITY OF NEW YORK PARTICIPATION

In issuing the invitations for the meeting on March 5th Governor Lehman has not only given the impression, but indicated that he wants to consult with a group of men representing all sections of the country. It is inconceivable that in such a group New York Jewry should not be represented, at least in proportion to its ratio of the American Jewish population.

One of the men who is planning to attend the meeting is expecting to make the long trip from San Francisco just for the sake of this one meeting. It would be a grave courtesy to that one man, not to speak of the others who are coming from long distances, if those Jewish leaders who are present in New York do not feel it possible to come to the Governor's home when it is within walking distance from their own.

It is probably true that a number of the large givers in the New York campaign are in Florida, but there are still a number of others of national reputation and known wealth who will be in New York and who would undoubtedly wish to attend the meeting at Governor Lehman's home if the invitation were extended and the proper follow-up made.

If it is intended to establish a "national basis of giving" it can be done only if New York giving is set as the example. If New Yorkers are not present it will discourage the out-of-towners, depress the tone of the whole meeting and, in fact, make a mockery of the very purposes for which the meeting was called.

Surely there ought to be four or five men in the New York Jewish community who are prepared to give large sums to the United Jewish Appeal and who have been prepared by such giving by the officers in the New York campaign. The announcement, even if only privately, of such gifts at the meeting at Governor Lehman's home will have an electrifying effect throughout the country through the stimulus it will give to the out-of-towners gathered there.

Every community in the United States has been asked to take a quota of at least twice, but more often four, five and even ten times, the amount raised in 1938. Extraordinary pressure is required to provide these results. Local

leadership does not feel itself capable of giving the pressure for such results. It has asked the national officers of the United Jewish Appeal to help in stimulating the local men of wealth and influence to regard the local responsibility in the light of the \$20,000,000 national goal. If it were possible for some of the national officers of the United Jewish Appeal to travel from community to community to meet with individuals perhaps the meeting at the home of Governor Lehman would be unnecessary, but everyone recognizes that this procedure is not possible.

This is the first time in many, many years that such a meeting as the one planned in the home of Governor Lehman has been called. It has been called in response to a great demand by men throughout the country who are accepting responsibilities for unusually large quotas. It is the responsibility of all who can, to help in making the meeting a success.

LETTER TO BE SENT TO INVITEES TO MEETING AT
GOVERNOR LEHMAN'S HOME
April 2, 1939

February 27, 1939

Dear _____

A number of my friends from all parts of the country have written to me saying that they are anxious to discuss the European situation, but that the original date of March 5th, which I suggested, is too early, since many of them are away on vacation. Accordingly, I have postponed the meeting until Sunday afternoon, April 2nd, at 3:00 P.M. and I hope that you will be able to join us at that time at my home, 820 Park Avenue, New York City.

Among the purposes of the meeting are: first, to receive a first-hand and clear picture of developments in Europe; second, to survey the consequences of refugee immigration into the United States; and third, to consider the nature of the responsibility that falls upon individual communities as well as the extent to which individual leaders are prepared to share this responsibility with us.

I believe that the problem is of such gravity as to warrant the utmost effort on your part to be present and to give those who will attend the benefit of your presence and counsel.



Since the recent happenings in Europe there are matters of great importance which we have before us. I should like the opportunity of discussing these with you and a few other leaders of the country as a whole, at a private meeting. In this emergency your counsel will be of great help.

Among the purposes of the meeting are: first, to receive a first-hand and clear picture of developments in Europe; second, to survey the consequences of refugee immigration into the United States; and third, to consider the nature of the responsibility that falls upon individual communities as well as the extent to which individual leaders are prepared to share this responsibility with us.

I believe that the problem is of such gravity as to warrant the utmost effort on your part to be present and to give those who will attend the benefit of your presence and counsel. I shall appreciate it if you will write to me personally at 1 William Street, New York City, telling me that you will be present at my home on April 2nd.
