I regret that I did not previously send you a copy of Mr. Bosenwadd's letter to Babbi Jonah B. Wise in which Mr. Rosenwald specifically suggests that all reference in the forthcoming campaign to the National Coordinating Committee be, as you will note, "National Coordinating Committee Fund, Inc.". In our conversations I noted this verbally and we have complied in the first statement from Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver and Rabbi Jonah B. Wise. I shall discuss the other details in the letter with you at any time.

Rabbi Wise feels for good reasons that Mr. Rosenwald should not be asked to be Treasurer of the forthcoming campaign but that we should have two national Treasurers. He suggests Mr. Sidney Lansburgh of Baltimore, who is this year the national Theasurer of the Joint Distribution Committee Campaign, and Mr. Charles Rosenbloom of Pittsburgh, whom we of the Joint Distribution Committee would be only too hapy to have. Will you let me have your viewpoint on this at your earliest convenience so that we may proceed accordingly.

In view of the suggested arrangements, it will be absolutely necessary to have Mr. William Rosenwald's name on our stationery in some important capacity as the head of the National Coordinating Committee Fund, Inc. I shall discuss this with you.

Both the latter communications deal with the relation of Federation to the 1939 campaign in New York.

I take it for granted that the assent of the U.P.A., at least insofar as its New York officers are concerned, is involved. I have turned over copies of the communications to Mr. Blitz for comments by Mr. Jacobi and himself.

There is one important point that must be kept in mind and that is clause 3 in the second letter of December 16th from Dr. Solomon Lowenstein in which he states that:

"It is distinctly understood that the united overseas campaign will cease public operation not later than June 30, 1939."

This means an acceptance by the U.P.A. and J.D.C. of the theory that regardless of the sum that may be raised they will not be able to engage in any fund-raising activities after June 30th. This is not in accordance with the practice in previous years of either the U.P.A. or J.D.C.

Who shall answer Mr. Baerwald's communication and how?

OF NEW YORK CITY 71 West 47 Street December 16, 1938 (Personal) Mr. Paul Baerwald Joint Distribution Committee 100 East 42 Street New York City My dear Mr. Baerwald: I beg to advise you that at a special meeting of the Board of Trustees of Federation held yesterday afternoon the following report was adopted: "An agreement has been reached, subject to the approval of the various bodies concerned, for a phited campaign in the spring of 1939 in behalf of the Joint Distribution Committee, the United Palestine Appeal and the Coordinating Committee for work of overseas relief in Europe and Palestine and for refugees in the United States. This united group invites the cooperation of Federation in this effort through making available a substantial part of its money raising force for this purpose, with the understanding that if this request is granted the conduct of the campaign will be under the general direction of the Federation portion of the staff, which will coordinate with itself the local New York money raising machinery of both the Joint Distribution Committee and the United Palestine Appeal but which would not be conducted in the Federation headquarters nor in any other wise be connected with Federation as such. It is further understood that if the Federation approve of this cooperation the following conditions will be followed out: 1) That Federation as such will not be called upon to make a direct money contribution for the care of refugees in this city as was done in 1938. The same ruling will apply also th the Brooklyn Federation. 2) Such members of the New York-Brooklyn Federation money raising staff as are assigned to this campaign work will be paid for on a cost basis. 3) It is distinctly understood that the united overseas campaign, by whatever name it may be called, will cease public operation not later than June 30, 1939 and unless some unexpected and overwhelming emergency presents itself will not in any wise solicit funds the remaining portion of the year when Federation is conducting its own campaign. 4) It is further understood that should Federation so request, the Joint Distribution Committee and the United Palestine Appeal shall make

available to Federation for service in the fall in its campaign such of their money raising staffs as may be requested, similarly to be paid for by Federation on a cost basis."

It was also the sense of the meeting that this arrangement should be for the year 1939 only and should not be considered as constituting a precedent for action for future years.

If this agreement is agreeable to you and you desire to act upon it, will you kindly advise us to that effect. Any arrangements with reference to the actual conduct of this work by our staff will be made by Mr. Joseph Willen, the Executive Director of the Business Men's Council of Federation.

My dear Mr. Baerwald:

Supplementing my letter of even date with reference to the proposed participation of part of the Federation staff in the united campaign on behalf of overseas and refugee work, may I advise you that we were previously committed to a similar participation in the campaign of the Greater New York Fund by part of our staff, and as you know that campaign likewise takes place in the spring.

We felt it proper to clear the whole situation with the Greater New York Fund before taking definite action with regard to our participation in the united effort for overseas and refugee relief, and the matter was reported to their Executive Committee, which in the letter containing an extract from their minutes on the subject, writes as follows:

however, to use his personal influence and the influence of the Board of the Federation to arrange, if possible, for the timing of the national campaign so that a minimum of conflict and confusion may result. The Executive Committee hopes that the National Refugee Campaign can be started in February, or early in March. The Committee felt that it would be unfortunate for the two campaigns to be started at the same time.

Will you please consider this request in connection with my other note of this date.

I want to summarize the main points of our telephone conversation today:

- 1) That the U.P.A. is opposed to the participation of a Christian Committee in the campaign. Apparently the talks that you had with Rosenberg, the definite expression you gave to Rabbi Wise and particularly the attitude you voiced at the original meetings at Mr. Ittleson's office, have not congealed on the minds of the J.D.C. Mr. Hyman, for example, continues to talk of cooperation of Christian bodies. Every time he brought up the subject and he insisted on discussing it for at least one hour, I vigorously emphasized that the U.P.A. was opposed to any such program.
- 2) It is agreeable that a number of out-of-towners shall be placed on the Executive Committee, the list, of course, to be determined by the U.P.A. and J.D.C. after Coons and I have gotten through drawing up tentative suggestions.
- 3) There is to be an Honorary Secretary named by the U.P.A. alongside of Joseph C. Hyman, if the latter wishes to be Honorary Secretary. Otherwise, it is satisfactory to have him as one of the Vice-Chairmen.

# # #

Last week I sent to Coons a list of the allotments received by the U.P.A. from Welfare Fund cities. I asked for a similar list from the J.D.C. Today Coons told me that he was preparing such a list. He said, however, that the J.D.C. had received only a total of \$30,000 from Welfare Fund cities for its emergency fund outside of its normal allotments. He added that a very great part of that amount represented contributions from the reserves held in Welfare Fund cities from previous years and therefore the J.D.C. considered these amounts outside the terms of our agreement.

Mr. Coons asked that the U.P.A. submit a list of the amounts which the J.N.F. had received from Welfare Fund cities as a result of special campaigns. He also asked that the amounts received by Haganah in Welfare Fund cities should be listed by the U.P.A. With regard to the latter item particularly, I pointed out that the U.P.A. had nothing whatsoever to do with that item.

In any event, Mr. Coons is to submit a list of all the money which the J.D.C. has received from Welfare Fund cities with his observations as to why certain amounts should or should not be credited to the 1938 campaign.

Shall I ask the J.N.F. for such a list as Coons requests?

It should be noted that Bob Herman, during the discussion with the field men which took place during the past three days, pointed out that the traditional collections of the J.N.F. are outside the campaign. Apparently this word has spread quickly through the ranks of the J.D.C. I am wondering whether you have heard directly from the J.N.F. with regard to the action it had voted following your exchange of correspondence with Dr. Goldstein.

There is a problem in connection with Masaryk. The J.D.C. decided, insofar as it was concerned, that it did not think that the united campaign ought to pay \$500 for Masaryk's appearance at the Council meeting in Baltimore on January 21st.

Would the U.P.A. be justified in spending its own \$500 to make Masaryk available to the Council? I do not think so. It is very likely that various cities would like to have Masaryk for their campaigns but cannot afford the \$500 fee. Would the U.P.A. be justified as part of its educational program in paying all or any part of Masaryk's fee for the purpose of using his outstanding personality to put over the message of Palestine?

Attached herewith is a copy of the publicity story as it has been planned for release to the English-Jewish and Yiddish press. Apparently the J.D.C. wants to give more thought to the question of the release to the general press.

This release, which was supposed to have gone out today to the English-Jewish and Yiddish press, has been held back because Mr. Baerwald declined to have the phrase "For Refugees" in the title of the campaign on the ground that this would alienate those people who feel that the J.D.C. ought to be doing more or is not doing enough in Poland. On your advice, however, I did not agree to the issuance of the release.

I am consulting with our people here in accordance with your suggestion with regard to their own attitude to the use of the phrase "For Refugees" in the title. My opinion is that we would miss a great asset if we did not have that phrase in the title of the campaign. How adamant shall we be?

It has been agreed that there is to be a committee to set up the office which will consist of Edwin Goldwasser and Isidor Coons for the J.D.C. and Arthur Lamport and Henry Montor for the U.P.A. We shall probably meet next Tuesday or Wednesday.

P.S. Coons informs me that the Joint Distribution Committee does not intend that his salary shall be paid by the new campaign but by the Joint Distribution Committee itself, he being loaned to the drive. This puts me in a strange position. I believe that both of us should be paid by the united campaign, and not by the respective organizations which put us into the campaign.

I have not been able to discover what Coons' salary is but obviously it must be more substantial than Herman's. I assume that my salary will have to be somewhere in the neighborhood can his merely for the sake of that thing called prestige; but I must confess that I find this embarrassing. Getting a substantial salary from a Jewish communal organization is probably one of the finest causes for ulcer of the stomach known to mankind because every five-dollar contributor feels that this executive is getting paid far beyond his deserts. In the Zionist movement particularly, a man getting what is known as a substantial salary is public prey for every coffee house from the Tip Toe Inn at 86th Street to the Cafe Royal at 12th Street. I wish that there were a maximum for such salaries by law. What should I do?

It was with a great deal of pleasure that I read the contents of your letter of December 21st for the particular reason that I can now see where all of the various competing factions that we have had are now cooperating.

You can understand that I as a sergeant in the cause might feel terribly disturbed because I would have commands at one time from one group and at another time from another group, and it was most difficult to serve more than one master.

It might interest you to know that my heart is in Palestine so much so that both my children are studying over there, and if there is anything I can do to further the cause of the United Palestine Appeal I am most anxious to do so, but the requests from other groups were always also so important that it was quite difficult for me to concentrate dn any one particular cause.

Now I can see a wonderful picture where all colors harmonize, and I want to promise you that anything that you command will be executed if it is at all humanly possible.

We are a small community with only about 200 families, but our per capita contribution to the United Palestine Appeal I believe exceeds a great many other places, and we are not stopping at this point but we are going to go stronger than ever, especially under the present circumstances.

It has been a pleasure to serve you and I hope that the good Lord will give you strength so that you can continue to lead us in the cause in which I am happy to follow.

Dear Dr. Silver:

In all matters that have to do with the initiation of the 1939 campaign the JDC is moving with all the lumbering grace of a pachyderm. This is as true in the field of office set-up as in that of publicity.

Mr. Lipsky had written an editorial for the New Palestine two weeks ago. I urged and was successful that it should not be used the week before, but Mr. Lipsky became impatient and used it last Friday. It must be said, however, that he telephoned Coons in advance and told him about the editorial and asked whether Coons approved. Coons gave his agreement, as he later told me himself, seeming very pleased that Mr. Lipsky had called him to ask for permission. Today I am informed that the JDC officers, according to Coons, are displeased by the reference in the editorial to the sum of \$20,000,000. However, Coons has only himself to blame, since I have stood fast that no editorial should appear until approval had been given to the issuance of a release.

The release which was started on its way some two weeks ago is still unissued. In this case, of course, the onus would seem to be on our side, since we are making a point of the use of the phrase "for refugees".

In my discussions with Coons and with Hyman one thing is emerging and that is that the JDC does not seem to place much if any confidence in Rabbi Jonah Wise. You will recall that when the agreement was formulated in Mr. Ittleson's office it was apparently agreed by all that the details of effectuating the agreement should be in the hands of Rabbi Wise and yourself. But apparently the JDC does not consider itself bound by that clause. This is a source of embarrassment because after you and Rabbi Wise finish discussing and agreeing upon a policy it returns to the JDC committees for such action as may later take place.

As part of this same process it is evident that the JDC has not yet cut its ties to the Christian committees. My own ability to make clear our unalterable stand on this policy is hampered by the fact that I deal only with Coons, whereas policy-making or even policy discussion seems to be not in his hands but in the hands of myriads of others. When I speak to Coons I do in a sense represent you and the UPA on policies that have been adopted, but I can never be sure that Coons represents final policy insofar as the JDC is concerned.

Mr. Lipsky has made a point about the publicity release of which I issued a copy to him and Dr. Wise after speaking to you Last Friday. Mr. Lipsky says that it is important that any publicity release should emphasize that the agreement is between the JDC and the UPA and not with any third body such as the Coordinating Committee. If the Coordinating Committee is to be mentioned at all it is to be in a subordinate capacity as one of the beneficiaries of the fund to be made available. I agree with him on this point. Do you?

Last week for three days the field directors were in New York receiving a description of the work of the various agencies of the campaign and being assigned to new territories. I can imagine that there will be a number of difficulties until a unified office is set up. Mr. Goldwasser, upon whom the fate of this campaign seems to hang, is for the moment ill so that our discussions are halted. But perhaps eventually we may be able to buy some typewriters, ribbons and erasers even with the approval of Mr. Goldwasser.

Necessarily some questions have arisen as a result of the division of territory. Mintz, it is proposed by Herman, should be transferred from New Jersey to western Pennsylvania. Immediately the phone, telegraph lines and mails were burned up with pleas on behalf of Mr. Mintz. I am much more sympathetic to Mr. Mintz' position today than I was a week ago, when the name of Amateau was proposed as the New Jersey field director. I had not known Amateau except through his stupid performance in Charleston, but having seen him at first hand I have not been convinced that Amateau is the man to bring Jersey back to a state of grace. Accordingly, I shall probably fight for Mintz to be retained in New Jersey, paradoxical as that position may seem to be for me.

I sometimes try to convince myself that I must not permit my temperament to becloud my judgment, and that perhaps the JDC, with its calm deliberateness, should know best, but there are times when I feel that a campaign cannot be regarded with that same sense of eternity as one looks upon the future of the world.

The death of Harold Jacobi was really one of the greatest losses the UPA could sustain. Aside from contributions that he

made he was a personality who gave dignity and prestige to the UPA in New York as well as elsewhere. I do not see, at this time at least, how he can be replaced. Undoubtedly, however, some names will have to be studied so that the New York campaign can be speeded. That, too, is moving with all the rapidity of the traditional molasses in January.

My dear Mr. Montor: On the subject of the name for the Campaign - please keep on insisting on the inclusion of the words "for refugees". Mr. Baerwald's explanation that such a name would eliminate those who feel that the JDC "ought to be doing more or is not doing enough in Poland" is not well taken. I suspect there is another motive behind his suggestion - namely some possible later campaign on the part of the Taylor Committee in behalf of refugees. With regard to your salary - it would, of course, be highly desirable that your salary and that of Mr. Coons should be paid out of the United Campaign. However, if the JDC does not wish it so, I suppose we cannot compel it. You should, of course, receive an increase in salary. I think it would be well to make the decision when we meet in Washington and I have an opportunity of discussing it with Wise and Lipsky. I shall make the recommendation and ask for their approval. Regarding the request of Mr. Coons for a list of the amounts which the JNF had received from welfare fund cities as a result of special campaigns - such a list should, of course, be given. With reference to Masaryk's appearance before other cities in behalf of Palestine propaganda with the UPA paying the cost in view of the fact that this is to be a United Campaign, I do not think that the UPA should be called upon to undertake any such obligation. We ought to try to persuade the JDC to agree for the use of Masaryk's time at least for a number of lectures jointly in the United Campaign, the cost to be defrayed by the United Campaign. Furthermore, if it is agreeable to Masaryk's manager, a letter should be sent eithr by the UPA or the ZOA to the larger communities of the United States apprising their of the availability of Masaryk and suggesting that they arrange meetings for him. I am sure that many of these communities will

Mr. Jan Masaryk, former Czechoslovakian Ambassador to Great Britain, is coming to the United States early next month. He is, as you know, one of the outstanding figures on the International scene today, not only because he is the son of his father, the founder of the Czechoslovakian Republic, but because of his own dramatic personality which was so remarkably displayed during the September crisis in Europe.

It occurs to me that in connection with your forthcoming campaign you may want to avail yourself of the presence in the United States of Mr. Masaryk, who is a brilliant speaker, in English, of course.

Dear Dr. Silver:

It is apparent that the Federation group would like to see the elimination of "Night of Stars" as a medium of fundraising in New York. What is to happen in the New York campaign is, of course, slightly complicated by the delay that will be caused by the death of Mr. Jacobi.

There seems to be a misunderstanding with regard to the broadcasts. They are to be as follows:

On Saturday, January 14th, from 6:15 to 6:30 P. M. there is to be a fifteen-minute address by Jan Masaryk. Unfortunately this is the only time that we could get for a broadcast by Masaryk, since none of the stations could make time available on Sunday at 2 P. M., at which time he is to speak at the Conference. I thought it would be most valuable if we could get his message over to the radio audience and at the same time advertise the National Conference.

There is a period from 8 to 8:30 P. M. on Saturday, January 14th. This broadcast, as well as the one from 6:15 to 6:30 P. M., is not to be from the Hotel Mayflower but from the studio of the National Broadcasting Company in Washington. Mr. Masaryk will not, of course, speak again at that time, therefore we must prepare an adequate program. That is why I asked what personalities you had in mind for this broadcast. I would appreciate a wire from you at your earliest convenience so that I may inform others who might have to be prepared accordingly.

There is another broadcast by the Mutual Broadcasting System on Sunday, January 15th, from 4 to 4:30 P. M. This will be devoted to the speech by Solicitor General Robert H. Jackson.

I think that this will be the most widely covered Conference we have held from the point of view of the number of broadcasts made available, even though they do not always coincide with the periods we should like.

I am inclined to agree with your interpretation of the effect of a visit to the White House at this time. I shall ask some of our other friends.

Are you answering Mr. Charlie Miller of Birmingham directly? It is possible to assume that a multiplicity of campaigns can go on forever without overlapping, but it is letters such as these whose numbers multiply, which offer increasing evidence that it is actually possible to have too many campaigns at the same time. I am herewith returning the letter from Mr. Miller.

Attached hereto is a copy of a letter which I have sent to a number of the leading cities of the country which I thought might be able to meet the \$500 fee. I find, however, in two cases at least, that the \$500 fee is considered excessive.

If this type of negative attitude continues it is evident that we shall not be able to make much use of Masaryk, because I do not think that Coons is very much inclined to have \$500 go out of the united campaign for individual speeches by Masaryk.

Lady Reading is expected to be here one month. Ten days of that month are to be spent in Washington. She does not want to travel too much; she would prefer to stay most of the time in New York City for a number of private campaign functions.

Baruch Braunstein, who has been assigned the territory of Texas and vicinity in the united campaign for 1939, seems disinclined to continue. He would prefer to be used in another capacity either by the united campaign or by the United Palestine Appeal. What he has in mind is to go throughout the country making talks for the United Palestine Appeal and engaging in educational work, which the United Palestine Appeal has spoken of doing, or doing the same thing for the united drive, and going from community to community in the larger areas where his services can be especially valuable. I should very much dislike to lose his services in the state of Texas, but I agree that he can be much more valuable in the larger communities than in the towns of five and ten families to which he has devoted a great part of his attention during the past year. I shall try to see if we cannot work him into the united campaign on that basis. If not I think we ought to keep him in the United Palestine Appeal strictly for contact work. Do you agree?

If he is removed from the St. Louis office, as he will be in any event because in the united drive he is slated to take care of Texas, it means that our St. Louis office will have to be closed down.

Please get in touch with Mr. Schlessinger and tell him that there is no possibility of having his organization represented on the program. If he wishes to distribute some informative literature among the delegates, I suppose there is no objection, - Confidentially I hated this miserable arrangement from the very beginning. It is now serving as the model for the notorious Schact or Warburg Plan. I am very anxious to know what if anything has been done about the proposal which we made to the JDC to convoke, within five or six weeks, a conference of the wealthy Jews of America in Washington or elsewhere to dramatize our Campaign and to solicit funds at the Conference as a means of insuring large-scale giving. The money has not gone through the Treasury of the K.H. nor through the Treasury of the Executive, and there is, therefore, no justification for the K.K.L. to claim an appropriate amount out of the United Palestine Appeal.

Thank you for your letter of January 5th. I greatly appreciate the honor contained in your suggestion of appointment me Honorary Vice-Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal.

I am forced, however, to refuse to accept this designation. While I am very largely in sympathy with the work of the United Palestine Appeal and feel very strongly that so far as political and world conditions permit we should under present state of affairs assist Jews from those parts of the world where their living conditions are intolerable to go to Palestine or anywhere else where they can have some chance of building life anew. Nevertheless, there are many points in connection with the Zionist program that I do not agree with at all. As a regular officer of the United Palestine Appeal I should feel it my duty to take a stand against those things which I do not approve of and I do not care to do this for many reasons, not the least of which is that this is no time for Jews to vent their disagreements.

I have no other way of accounting for the lack of destructive results of J.D.C. ineptness. Not a single decision is made, whether it has to do with a letter or a matter of major policy, that does not seem to be submitted to one or more committees of the J.D.C.

I hope to report progress by the time I see you in Washington.

Ear-Marked Contributions in 1939

You asked me to clear with you the following paragraph from the minutes of the meeting of the JDC Executive Committee held on December 15th:

"In a conversation with Mr. Isidor Coons, Mr. Henry Montor, Field Director of the United Palestine Appeal, had raised the question of an effectuating clause for 1039 and had indicated that it was his understanding that such a clause would be included in the new agreement. After some discussion, it was the consensus of opinion that such a question was academic, owing to the proposed creation of an Allocations Committee. However, there should be an exchange of letters between Rabbi Wise and Rabbi Silver to the effect that individual contributions to either of the two agencies should be reported to the Allocations Committee for its consideration."

The death of Jacobi upset even the program of the Washington Conference. Last year it was he who presented the formal report of the U.P.A., touching upon such items as the amount of money raised, the number of communities in which campaigns were held and making other remarks about the relation of the U.P.A. to the communities.

I think that such a report comes in better part from a layman, particularly since we have so few associated with the campaign. Accordingly, Arthur Lamport is supposed to present the financial report since he is the Treasurer of the U.P.A. This, of course, eliminates such a report from

What I had in mind was that on Sunday morning there would be the report by Lamport and then the statements for about five minutes each of about ten or twelve community leaders who have all been notified that they are to speak on the general theme "American Jewry's Role in the Upbuilding of Palestine".

It is quite possible that a number of questions may be raised either by these speeches or from the floor in respect to the U.P.A. or to the unified campaign. I thought that I might then make a summary, taking notes as I go along. If no answers are required for certain questions then I would not speak at all. Aside from the financial report there is nothing special that I would have to say to the Conference except for answers on specific problems.

Don't you think, then, that we ought to let the program go in this way, my saying anything at the morning session to be determined by the circumstances? As you know, I have no great passion for speaking.

It has been decided that it will not be a letter that

will go to the communities since the material, as you say, is much too long. The material is being cut down and will be put up in printed form on four 82xll sheets. The top of the sheet will read, "STATEMENT BY THE CHAIRMEN OF THE UNITED JEWISH APPEAL FOR REFUGEES AND OVERSEAS NEEDS", almost in the style of a letterhead. There will then go with this printed material a letter under your signature and that of Rabbi Wise along the following lines:

In accordance with our letter of December 21st promising that we would send further details of the United Jewish Appeal for Refugees and Overseas Needs, we are herewith sending you a statement that amplifies the details and indicates the manner in which each community will wish to share in our national responsibility of raising a minimum of \$20,000,000 in 1939.

Dear Dr. Silver:

Attached herewith is a copy of a letter and covering letter which Dr. Goldstein has sent to you with respect to the Jewish National Fund.

Before sending a copy of this letter and data to the Joint Distribution Committee, I would like to make my own private remarks to you to anticipate what Coons will undoubtedly say.

There should be a more specific definition of the Golden Book activity. From the memorandum of January 13th defining the Traditional Collections of the Jewish National Fund it is very difficult to see why the Jewish National Fund will not go on with the type of thing it has been doing in 1938, that is, using the Golden Book for large campaigns.

There should also be, it seems to me, a more specific definition of the Sefer Hayeled. Ten dollars is quite a contribution for small collections.

The definition of "General Collections" is very loose. You could raise almost any kind of money under that heading.

In connection with the Forest Projects, it seems to me that the Hadassah Forests need not be included, since it is a definite Hadassah project even though for the Jewish National Fund.

A more serious problem, it seems to me, is created by the definition of Nachlath. This problem has been raised already in Connecticut in the case of Waterbury. There separate allocations are being made to the U.J.A. and to the Connecticut Forest of the Jewish National Fund. I am of the definite opinion that that type of money ought to be credited to the U.J.A.

Just as serious a problem is raised by the Leon Blum Colony. If, as has happened in the past year, activity for this colony is to be conducted on the same scale with the same lavish publicity as in 1938, it will be a definite interference with the campaign.

If I raise these questions myself, it is certainly not because I do not want the Jewish National Fund to get more money because when the Jewish National Fund gets more money, the United Palestine Appeal gets more. We may be successful in keeping twenty, fifty, or even a hundred thousand dollars out of the campaign by devices which may seem clever. But all the Joint Distribution Committee needs is such instances and they will be able to keep hundreds of thousands out of the pool.

Therefore, I strongly urge that the letter from Dr. Goldstein to you be revised. At the present time it looks as if the whole world is open to the Jewish National Fund for campaign purposes.

I would appreciate your remarks on this at the earliest opportunity. Incidentally the J.D.C. informs me that they have already received, in cash, for the 1939 campaign, \$110,000. This indicates what type of response the campaign is getting even though the campaign is not yet started. I have learned from you that it is better to give in on small things so that we may have the advantage of the big things.

### MEMORANDUM

Subject

I trust that all preparations have been completed for the immediate launching of the United Jewish Appeal campaign in New York City. The policy that has been adopted by the national leadership of the United Palestine Appeal and the Joint Distribution Committee requires that the United Palestine Appeal be represented in all discussions affecting the nature, the methods and the program of the 1939 campaign. I trust that you will see that this procedure is carried through.

I note the observations you have made on the question of campaigns after July 1, 1939. I would be willing to agree to the following formula:

It is understood as a general principle that no campaigns will be held by the United Palestine Appeal or by the Joint Distribution Committee after July 1, 1939, it being assumed that the most energetic efforts will be made during the first half of 1939 to conduct a successful United Jewish Appeal drive in New York for a quota of \$10,000,000.

The United Palestine Appeal, however, wishes to reserve the right to continue two traditional functions which have always been a source of income as well as a basis for educational activity. I refer to appeals in the synagogues during the High Holidays and the annual performance of "Night of Stars". I take it for granted that money from these sources, as from all other activities during the calendar year 1939, will be credited to the United Jewish Appeal.

I suggest, therefore, that these two items be reserved for discussion with the understanding that the United Palestine Appeal will carry them through but the matter is to be reviewed later in the light of the practical outcome of the United Jewish Appeal campaign in New York City.

My dear Mr. Montor:

I have just returned from Cincinnati where I attended the convention of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. I will now have a few days at home to attend to a crowded schedule and a loaded desk of mail.

The meeting in Birmin ham was very large and enthusiastic. The Campaign seems to be in the hands of very capable and earnest people. They are going out, I understand, for fifty to sixty thousand dollars. At their opening meeting, last Monday evening, they said that they raised twice as much money as at the opening meeting of the year before and they are confident of success.

I am enclosing herewith the three checks which were given to me at the Washington Conference and which I failed to turn over to you.

Samuel Goldsmith of Chicago called me Long Distance in Cincinnati and invited me most urgently to address a meeting of the Chicago Welfare Fund next Tuesday, January 24th, at the Standard Club. This will be a luncheon meeting at which he expects a thousand workers and others. He states that by the 24th, he hopes to have reached a million and a half dollars. His mood was altogether different from the last one - full of kindness, pleading, gratitude, etc. I accepted the invitation.

I saw Jonah Wise in Cincinnati yesterday. He is anxious to get together in the very near future and settle all the names of the officers, etc. I would suggest that you get up a final draft of the officers as we would like to present it, taking into account the request of our Executive Committee that our present UPA co-chairmen should also be co-chairmen of the United Campaign. This will, of course, mean a smaller list of Honorary Presidents.

Henry Montor January 19, 1939 -2-If the office of Comptroller is to be included, there should be one representing us. Why not suggest the name of a woman like Mrs. Stroock or Mrs. Sporborg, etc.? I do not think that Charles Rosenbloom is of the rank of Albert Lasker as far as financial impressiveness is concerned. Personally, I think that the offices of national campaign chairmen are unnecessary. If we are to have the two National Chairmen, Jonah Wise and myself, and eight co-chairmen - that is altogether sufficient. The name of Lasker may be presented by the JDC as one of their co-chairmen. In fact, I think that it will avoid considerable confusion if we do not have campaign chairmen. The question of the hotel expenses of Lady Reading should be taken up with the UJA. If Lady Reading is to be used in the United Campaign, as she undoubtedly will be, there is no reason why part of her expenses, at least, should not be paid by the UJA treasury. In my conversation with Jonah, I again pressed the importance of the conference in Washington in February of one hundred fifty to two hundred of the wealthiest Jews in America. He expressed the thought that Governor Lehman will be happy to convoke such a conference. Take the matter up with Coons at once and try to get the machinery moving. My dear Mr. Montor: I would like you to come to an arrangement with Mr. Coons with reference to my traveling expenses. Last year, of course, I charged most of it - though not all - to the UPA. Some of it, I paid myself. I am wondering whether the UPA ought to be called upon to pay my traveling expenses when I go to a community in behalf of the United Jewish Appeal, as for example, Birmingham, Alabama. I am also to address the Chicago Jewish Welfare Fund next Tuesday. I don't know what arrangement the JDC has with reference to the traveling expenses of Dr. Jonah Wise. Does the JDC intend to continue paying his expenses out of its own funds, or out of the funds of the United Jewish Appeal? Personally, I would prefer to have the local organizations pay the traveling expenses of the speakers. Thus, in Birmingham, the chairman offered to pay such expenses. I think that that procedure ought to be followed throughout the country unless the communities insist that our head warters should pay. I should be in favor of including Mr. Sidney Hillman's name among the Honorary Chairmen of the Campaign. However, I should like to have this matter passed on at the meeting of the Executive Committee meeting, next wonday. My secretary called up Mr. Ismach. He informed her that the Jewish National Fund meeting to be held here will be in the nature of general propaganda and that no funds will be raised. I can say to you quite frankly that the many reports reaching me in this office personally from throughout the country as to the activities of the Youth Aliyah has caused me more than passing concern in relation to taking the edge off of our own United Jewish Appeal fundOraising possibilities, especially in the medium sized communities. The Youth Aliyah cause is most deserving and appealing and the energy which the women of Hadassah and their friends are putting into the Youth Aliyah campaign is extraordinary.

This is a matter with which I think we should concern ourselves seriously because none of the funds raised by Wouth Aliyah, as I understand it, will be channeled into our treasury. I think this matter so important that I am sending a copy of this memorandum to Rabbi Jonah B. Wise and to officers of the Joint Distribution Committee. I hope that you will find it possible to consider the matter with Rabbi Silver and the officers of the United Palestine Appeal because it seems quite obvious that if the situation can be corrected, it must necessarily be through the good offices of the leaders of the Palestinian agencies.





Dear Mr. Fisher:

I receive your letter of January 18th and while I was happy to receive your praise for originating and fostering this "vision and dream", I was also grieved and saddened by the last part of your letter, which seems to threaten to destroy the very "dream" for which you have so kindly commended me. You say in this letter that it is best to be "outright and frank." Well, I will take this opportunity to be "frank" with you.

On July 9th, 1937, when I completed gathering material for the book and persuaded Mr. Peres to have it published, I wrote Dr. Goldstein telling him of my plan to raise \$2500.00 among the three Zionist groups this \$2500.00 to be matched by Mr. Peres. I then asked you to name a Colony for the late Chancellor Israel H. Peres.

You, on behalf of Dr. Goldstein, replied on July 12, 1937 (if you have no copy, we will sent you one) stating that we could not expect to have a Colony for \$5000.00 but stating that the minimum would be \$10,000.00 We took you at your word and we went to work. We have published the book and we have started raising funds/ There is an old Russian proverb which says "Silence means Consent". You let us go ahead and develope that "dream".

Mr. Plough, under his signature, sent out several thousand letters stating that a Colony would be built. Mr. Fred Goldsmith acknowledged each contribution with letters through the United States mail, that the money would be used for MEMPHIS PERES COLONY. Dr. Stephen S. Wise, standing in the pulpit of the Synagogue before nearly 2000 people, and with his voice on the radio, proclaimed to all who listened that Memphis is to build a Colony in the name of Peres. All the local newspapers proclaimed in large headlines MEMPHIS PERES COLONY TO BE BUILT IN THE LAND OF ISRAEL. Atlanta, Ga., and a few other Southern cities carried the same headlines. The story of the Memphis Peres Colony, under your supervision, was printed in the New Palestine and sent to every Zionist in the country.

If you knew that a Colony was, as you now call it, "an obvious impossibility", why have you permitted it to go on? We have sent you copies of letters of all newspaper clippings. I am not quarrelling with you Mr. Fisher. It is not a personal matter, even though I am deeply grieved and disturbed. For eighteen months, I have been battling for this project. I have spoken before many groups. I have even dared to tell them that we have an historic mission to set the example before the rest of the country. Memphis, a small Jewish community, honors its foremost Jew and builds a Colony in his name. Other cities throughout the land follow our plan- Nashville, Birmingham, Chattanooga, etc., honor their foremost Jews and the land of Israel is rebuilt speedily in our own day and time.

You say it costs more than \$25,000.00 to build a Colony. Sure it does, but what of it? Have nt we raised money for it for over a quarter of a century? What about the \$8000.00 or \$9000.00 from this year's Welfare Fund which is going from Memphis to Palestine. Do you know that we were offered this money for the Peres Colony and we refused to take it? Do you know that the first \$3500.00 for the Welfare Fund came from Mr. Plough and Mr. Peres and at the Welfare Board meeting, Mr. Peres said "I give you \$1000.00 because I am interested in Palestine."

Of course, you have an agreement with the JDC. but if we Zionists in Memphis did not give or work for the Welfare Fund, you would not get a nicke for Palestine from the local fund. I dare not tell the zzmmunttesx committee of your letter because that would mean the end of my "dream" and a complete failure of the project. Not only would this flow of money to the Memphis Peres Colony stop, but all other Zionist Funds would suffer from it.

According to the reports from the Holy Land, thirty five new colonies have been built in the last thirty months. Some of the names have been taken from the Hagoda. I am sure that a half million dollars was not provided for each colony as you suggest that we do.

Now, I believe that your generation is doing as fine work as any generation throughout Jewish history. I believe that we have produced as fine men in our times as any that have passed before us. I consider Mr. Peres one of the finest whose memory should go down in Jewish History as one of the foremost of our day and to demand half a million dollars for a Colony in his name appears to be to be almost ridiculous.

Of course, I understand that you mean well, and that you want to raise as much for the National Fund as you can. That is as it should be, but you are trying to strike too hard a bargain and I am afraid you will "kill the goose that lays the golden egg."

I hope you will reconsider and see it from my point of view and that you will reply immediately, because I do not wish to appear before any more groups, pleading for a colony when, according to your last letter, it will only be a Machlath.

There are many details within the United Jewish Appeal which seem too trivial for constant discussion but which, nevertheless, reflect a situation of interest.

In other words, Steinglass is subject not only to the scrutiny of Coons and myself but to the Publicity Director of the JDC. Naturally I cannot object if Coons says that he relies for publicity advice on a particular person to act as his representative, but, nevertheless, it does indicate some of the difficulties with which Steinglass must contend. He is not a free agent but must go through a long filtering process.

I enclose herewith copies of an exchange of correspondence between Coons and Steinglass. I direct your attention particularly to the fact that the JDC has certain problems in relation to the publicity of the United Jewish Appeal which are sometimes very difficult to adjust.

### MEMORANDUM

FROM: Mr. Coons

SUBJECT: Publicity Program

I attach hereto a memorandum from Mr. Belth to me on the subjects of:

- 1. News letters and mat service to the general press.
- 2. Securing European information through foreign correspondents and direct from Europe

Through my own knowledge and experience with these two subjects over the years, I know that Mr. Belth is absolutely right in his observations and before anything is done along these lines I feel that you and Mr. Montor should join with Mr. Belth and me for further consideration.

I am sure that you will agree with me as to the possibilities of a mat service, and if we know that we cannot hope to secure a result in production where such service will be of value, it is better not to incur unnecessary and useless expense.

As to the relationship of European news direct from Europe to the United Jewish Appeal, any information involving the Joint Distribution Committee in any way would necessarily have to have the complete approval of the officers of the Joint Distribution Committee.

There are innumerable involvements which any Publicity Director not associated with the Joint Distribution Committee could not be expected to know.

SUBJECT: Mr. Steinglass' Proposed Publicity Program

In going over the publicity program for the UJA submitted by Mr. Steinglass, I find two items which I feel require further discussion. Under the leading "General Press," Mr. Steinglass makes the following point:

(c) The general press must also be kept informed of the progress of the UJA and developments in Jewish life by means of a weekly news letter describing in detail the important phases of the work of the UJA. In this connection the general press should also receive bi-weekly or monthly mat layouts illustrative of UJA effort."

You will recall our experiments of a year ago with a clip sheet and mat service for the so-called general or secular press. Our experience was that we got a considerable return on mats in the tank towns (many of which had little or no Jewish population) and very little in the larger communities. Furthermore, the appearance of these mats rarely coincided with local campaigns and therefore constituted so much maste motion at considerable expense. While such a service might be of some value from a strictly educational viewpoint, it seems to me hardly of any value from a campaign viewpoint.

(d) In order that the United Jewish Appeal may be directly linked with events abroad affecting Jewish needs, contact should be made with the foreign correspondents of American jewspapers in the important capitals of Europe. This contact must be aimed to establish direct association in cabled reports between the situation overseas and the activities of the UJA in improving the lot of Jews in Central and Eastern European countries."

Mr. Steinglass does not explain how he intends to achieve this. We, in the JDC, have, of course, made similar efforts in the past, chiefly through our European office and through the special services of Mr. Boris Smolar. I want to point out, however, that matters of JDC policy will arise should the UJA as such, be injected in the situation abroad. At such times as the JDC has been mentioned in dispatches from abroad, it was always in the character of a service agency and not in the character of a fund-raising agency. I have a feeling that our Paris office might at times be considerably embarrassed by news stories emanating from Europe and linking conditions and events over there to the UJA.

Here are two situations in which your help is greatly needed:

Canton, O. has a quota of \$32,000 for 1939. It seems, however, that Canton is thinking of adopting a quota of only \$20,000 for the United Jewish Appeal. For the past several years Canton has not done the best job possible for the agencies embracing the United Jewish Appeal.

American lewish Appeal.

Could you drop a note or telephone Mr. Abe M. Luntz, Harter Bank Building, and ask him and several others to come to see you in Cleveland to discuss the Canton situation so that they may be impressed with the absolute necessity of accepting the \$32,000 goal. Canton contributed \$13,000 to the J.D.C. and U.P.A. in 1938. Would you let me know when you speak to Mr. Luntz and the developments thereafter so that our field man may be kept informed? I understand that one of the difficulties of Canton is that the building occupied by the Community Center has been condemned and the community has been thinking of going out on a campaign for another building at this time.


Syracuse, N.Y. Could you telephone Mr. Benjamin G. Rudolph, 475 South Salina Street, President of the Zionist District of Syracuse, who is known to be one of the wealthiest men in the community? Mr. Rudolph contributed \$200 in 1938. His reason for not giving more was that he had just returned from a trip to Palestine where he spent several thousand dollars. His brother contributed \$650. A quota of \$60,000 has been scheduled by the United Jewish Appeal for Syracuse. The community leaders, particularly H. Hiram Weisberg, feel that they can raise this money if a few men like Mr. Rudolph contribute the \$5,000 of which they are capable. I understand that Mr. Rudolph has the highest regard for you and that a telephone call from you would be most effective in getting him to do his proper share in the campaign. Could you let me know the results of this? Mr. Weisberg said he would be willing to be one

among five or six people who would set the pace by giving \$5,000 each to the campaign.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I met with Mr. Justice Brandeis in Washington last Saturday to ask his help for the United Jewish Appeal. I made various suggestions, such as consenting to broadcast a message for the United Jewish Appeal or to write letters to particular individuals who might be persuaded to take office or to give large sums of money. He felt that he could not do any of these things. His practices during the past twenty years ought not to be changed at this time, he felt.

As he put it, there were three things that he could do in the present situation: give substantially; think more about the problems involved; and counsel privately with others who might wish to meet with him.

He thinks that the \$20,000,000 quota is not adequate although he recognizes that the Jews will require a great deal of pressure to make them give even that sum.

During our talk I brought up the name of Mr. Kirstein who had been suggested for the fifth member of the Allocations Committee. He again repeated that Mr. Kirstein would be the best selection for that post. He feels that he is a very fair minded person and could be relied upon to deal justly with a given situation -- as justly as any person could who is not actually a Zionist. He remarked that "It is lucky that the name of Kirstein was suggested by Mr. Lasker."

I believe that Dr. Wise is expected to return to the United States by March 9th or 10th. Should we await more definite news from London before scheduling any meeting? My tour of a number of cities to discuss quotas with communities will bring me back to New York on Thursday, March 16th. Since you are to be in New York on Saturday evening, March 18th, for the broadcast on the "Message of Israel" hour, should there be a meeting on Friday, March 17th, or even Saturday night, March 18th? You are to be in Boston on the next day.


