Traving realized in income of more than \$5,000,000 in 1930, the United Palestine Appeal will coloured American Jewry's greatest year of effort for Palestine televilding at the National Conference for Palestine in Washington, D. C. on Eaturday evening, January 6th and Sunday, January 7th. More than 1,500 delegates will pay tribute to the dynamic leadership of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver (left), National Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, who made this record possible through his energetic service as United Palestine Appeal and United Jewish Appeal National Chairman in 1939. The need for providing for absorption of \$5,000 refugees who entered Palestine in the past twelve another will be tressed among Issues considered at the Washington conference. Promotion of Immigration and colonization as illustrated in (1) arrival of homeless lews on refugee chip on Palestine shore; (2) education and health for child victims of oppression; (3) training of refugee youth for new life on the land and (4) extending Jewish agricultural estilement activities in cooperation with Arab neighbors will be hailed as major American Jewish achievement through the United Palestine Appeal.

As THE central American instrument for the rebuilding of Palestine, the United Palestine Appeal, which combines the fundraising efforts of the Palestine Foundation Fund and the Jewish National Fund, has made possible the establishment of a Jewish community of 500,000 in Palestine. 


