UNITED JEWISH APPEAL FOR REFUGEES AND OVERSEAS NEEDS DIGEST - SCHENECTADY, NEW YORK Jewish Population - 3,800

This digest is prepared for your use in connection with the Big Gifts Luncheon on November 13.

Although neither the total goal, nor the question of allotments to beneficiary agencies has yet been definitely decided upon, it is the opinion of our Field Representative Mr. Goldby, that the United Jewish Appeal is not likely to receive more than \$30,000. Mr. Henry Montor feels, however, upon the basis of his conversation in September with Joseph E. Grosberg and other leaders, that our requested allotment of \$50,000 may be possible; Mr. Goldby indicates that any substantial increase over the 1938 allotment (totalling \$25,250) will depend upon the standard of giving set by these leaders. Mr. Goldby reported that the following may be depended upon for substantial giving:

On June 12 a formal application, together with budgetary material was sent to Joseph E. Grosberg suggesting \$50,000 as the UJA allotment for 1939. Copies of this material were also sent to Lewis Lurie.

In October Dr. Silver expressed to Mr. Schaffer appreciation of his acceptance of the chairmanship of the Big Gifts committee.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am delighted to learn that you will come to Indianapolis to speak Thursday night, May 2nd, to an audience of prospects and workers.

There will be, I am sure, an over-flow gathering.

Our campaign for general solicitation of funds will open the next morning.

I can think of no man who can inspire prospects to generous giving and enthuse workers to do a real job as you can. You will help us immeasurably to get off to a wonderful start.

I hope you can arrange to be here by noon Thursday to talk also to an audience of women at a luncheon. We are going to repeat our plan of last year to ask our women to purchase the lives of children. We told them that ten cents per day would save a child's life, that thirty six dollars and fifty cents would save a child's life for a year. We did not ask them to give us money but to tell us how many lives they wished to buy, and we stressed that no woman could purchase a child's life unless she agreed to save the amount whether it be on her table, her clothes, her entertainment, her beauty parlor or what not as we wished it emphatically understood that the subscription of no woman should in any manner whatsoever affect the subscription of her husband. Last year we raised approximately ten thousand dollars at the luncheon. If you will talk to this group I feel confident we will do as well or better this year.

I know how many demands are made upon you and I reluctantly ask you to do this only because the money is so sorely needed. I hope you will advise me that you will do this so we may plan accordingly and have our invitations ready to go out at the proper moment.

While we did an excellent job here last year in raising more money than in any previous campaign we are increasing our quota this year and we will do our best to raise every dollar possible.

When you come to Indianapolis Mrs. Borinstein and I want you to be a guest in our home. You will, of course, let me know in due time your arrival date so I may meet you.



Dear Rabbi:

Again it is my pleasant duty to thank you for the great service you rendered our Jewish Welfare Fund Campaign by addressing our community meeting.

While to us the attendance was most discouraging, since we had hoped to have an overflow meeting, I must explain that all along the line this year we have had that experience. Despite everything we could do we have not been able to get people out to meetings. It can only be explained by a heaviness of heart and a feeling of futility, which causes people to want to be spared any more pulling at the heart strings. That situation, of course, is pretty tough on the men who run campaigns.

Your address last might would have meant so much in the raising of large funds could we have gotten these people there. However, we did have in the audience most of our workers, and they were inspired; and I know that their path is made much easier in the inspiration which they had and which they will impart to their prospects.

I was deeply impressed by the dignity and statesmanship of your address. It gave me courage as I am sure it did everyone else present.

Again in behalf of this community, and personally, my sincere thanks to you.
