Gentlemen:

In accordance with instructions, we have examined the books and records of United Jewish Appeal, Inc., for the period from the inception of the 1939 appeal to December 31, 1939, and herewith submit our report thereon, consisting of:

EXHIBIT A - Statement of Assets and Advances on Account of Allocations and Liabilities as at December 31, 1939

EXHIBIT B - Statement of Income and Expenses for the period reviewed

together with four supporting schedules.

The 1939 campaign of the United Jewish Appeal, Inc., represents the unified fund-raising activities for refugees and overseas needs on behalf of:

American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., (J.D.C.) United Palestine Appeal, Inc. (U.P.A.) and National Coordinating Committee, Inc. (N.C.C.)

It was designated as the organization to manage the campaign under an agreement dated December 9, 1938, between American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc. and United Palestine Appeal, Inc.

The goal of the campaign was to raise a minimum of \$20,000,000.00.

The United Jewish Appeal, Inc. was incorporated in 1935 under the membership corporation laws of New York State. The present organization is utilizing the corporate charter of the 1935 Appeal to which minor amendments were made during 1939.

We understand that the corporation still has on hand certain assets acquired by it during its 1935 appeal. Relative to these assets, a resolution was adopted at the 1939 annual and special meeting of the organization, which provided, "that any monies or other property now held by or hereafter received by the corporation in connection with the 1935 appeal shall be segregated and disposed of in accordance with the agreement made January 31, 1935...."

No attempt has been made by us to ascertain or to account for any money or property owned by United Jewish Appeal, Inc., other than those arising from its 1939 campaign activities. Accordingly, the statements and comments submitted herewith pertain only to the organization's 1939 campaign.

The agreement between J.D.C. and U.P.A. includes the following financial arrangements:

- (a) The first \$9,500,000.00 to be allocated to the beneficiaries is to be apportioned as follows:
 - \$2,000,000.00 to National Coordinating Committee, Inc.
 - \$2,500,000.00 to United Palestine Appeal, Inc. \$5,000,000.00 to American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc.
- (b) All amounts available for distribution thereafter shall be entirely subject to the disposition of an Allocations Committee which is to be composed of two nominees of the United Palestine Appeal, Inc., and two nominees of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., and a fifth member selected by the other four persons.
- (c) The Allocations Committee, by a majority, may vote an additional \$500,000.00 to the National Coordinating Committee, Inc., on proof of need, but no additional amounts shall be allocated to that organization except on unanimous vote of the Allocations Committee.

At a meeting held on November 15, 1939, the members of the Allocations Committee, consisting of Dr. Solomon Goldman, Henry Ittleson, Louis E. Kirstein (selected as the fifth member) Albert D. Lasker and Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, voted unanimously to instruct the officers of the United Jewish Appeal, Inc., to distribute the net funds collected in excess of \$9,500,000.00 in the following manner:

- (a) The next \$6,000,000.00 is to be divided:
 - (1) \$600,000.00 to the National Refugee Service, Inc., (formerly the National Coordinating Committee, Inc.)

\$250,000.00 "to non-sectarian organizations dealing with Christian refugees, with the understanding that Protestant and Catholic refugees shall share and share alike in the distribution of such funds." Since the Allocation Committee was not empowered to authorize allocations other than to the N.C.C., U.P.A. and J.D.C., the \$250,000.00 allotment was recommended, subject to the approval of your Negotiating Committee. We were informed that your National Chairmen were among the members of such Committee and that it had approved this allocation.

(2) The balance of \$5,150,000.00 (\$6,000,000.00 less \$850,000.00 provided under (1)), is to be distributed as follows:

\$1,500,000.00 to United Palestine Appeal, Inc. \$3,650,000.00 to American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., which amount includes:

- (A) \$500,000.00 in obligations assumed in connection with the refugees disembarked from the S.S. St. Louis; and
- (B) \$500,000.00 for the Coordinating Foundation for Refugees.
- (b) The amount available for distribution in excess of \$15,500,000.00 shall be apportioned:

Total 100%

(c) If the total amount available for distribution is less than \$15,500,000.00, the amount in excess of \$10,350,000.00 (i.e., after eliminating the original allocation of \$9,500,000.00 and \$850,000.00 provided under (a) (1)) shall be divided:

provided, however, that the amount distributed to either organization will not exceed the amount stipulated under (a) (2).

The Allocations Committee also requested that as soon as possible, \$500,000.00 should be made available to the National Refugee Service, Inc., and \$250,000.00 to United Palestine Appeal, Inc.

On January 3, 1940, a payment of \$125,000.00 was made to Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America on behalf of Protestant refugees.

The accounts and our examination thereof are discussed in the following comments:

[#]This amount does not include almost \$1,000.00 of post-dated checks on hand and over \$45,000.00 in transit from communities on December 31, 1939.

The welfare funds and combined campaigns from which the United Jewish Appeal, Inc., receives its funds are conducted in communities throughout the United States. Each community, we are informed, organizes its local campaign committee, which solicits pledges and cash. The campaign expenses of these committees are usually paid from the cash collected by them. From the net receipts, the campaign committees allocate amounts to each of the organizations which are to participate in the net funds raised. Contact between the local campaign committees and United Jewish Appeal, Inc., is maintained through correspondence between these committees and the Appeal's national office, and through visits by the latter's field representatives. When United Jewish Appeal, Inc., is informed that an amount has been allocated to it, such item is reflected in its records as a pledge.

our function, as auditors of United Jewish Appeal, Inc., was limited to the examination of the books and records of the national office of the organization. In connection with our audit of contributions received, we ascertained that the recorded cash receipts agreed, by totals, with the corresponding deposits shown by the bank statements, and assured ourselves generally that proper control records for receipts and acknowledgments were maintained. We also compared acknowledgment duplicates with the amounts reflected in the books and with the independent list of remittances received, as prepared daily by your office manager; in addition, we made test comparisons of the contributing communities' correspondence with recorded remittances.

During the year, letters were sent to contributing communities and organizations (except those which have late or fall campaigns and which will be circularized at a later date), requesting confirmation of their pledges and payments to United Jewish Appeal, Inc., as at July 31, 1939. The replies indicated the correctness of the recorded cash and the substantial accuracy of the pledge records.

The responses received to date are summarized as follows:

In many instances, contributions to the current campaign were sent directly to the beneficiaries of United Jewish Appeal, Inc. The beneficiaries, in most cases, turned over such contributions to this organization; in other cases, they deposited the items pending the determination of the applicable campaign period. In the accompanying statements no effect has been given to the contributions received directly by the beneficiaries, which, at December 31, 1939, had not been transferred to your organization.

The beneficiaries were requested to furnish us with a detailed list of remittances, if any, sent directly to them for or on your behalf which, at December 31, 1939, had not been forwarded to you.

The National Refugees Service, Inc. (formerly referred to as National Coordinating Committee, Inc.) informed us that it had no such remittances on hand. A similar response was received from United Palestine Appeal. The American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., informed us that it had on hand sundry items aggregating \$540.00, which it stated will be sent to you.

The Greater New York Campaign, of the United Jewish Appeal, Inc., was also requested to furnish similar data at December 31, 1939, with respect to pledges, expenses, etc., but to date we have not received the desired information.

RE EXPENSES ---

The arrangements made with respect to the disbursements for expenses and our audit thereof were discussed in our report submitted under date of May 16, 1939.

An expense budget of \$412,225.00 was adopted for the year 1939, including a provision of \$10,000.00 for contingencies and of \$18,000.00 for rent (for the year from May 1, 1939, to April 30, 1940). For the purpose of comparison, we have reduced the budgeted expenses by \$6,000.00 to give effect to the rent included therein which is applicable to 1940. In Exhibit B, Schedules I and I-B, a comparison is made of the 1939 budget (as adjusted) with the actual expenses for the period.

The balances on deposit were confirmed by correspondence with the depositary.

The petty cash and postage funds were counted by us.

ADVANCES TO FIELD REPRESENTATIVES, ETC. -- \$3,625.00

The items comprising this amount are set forth in Exhibit A, Schedule I, and represent expense funds in the hands of field representatives, etc. The balances were confirmed to us.

ADVANCES TO SPEAKERS --- \$400.00

This amount included advances to:

DEPOSIT --- \$425.00

This amount was on deposit with Transcontinental and Western Airlines, Inc.

AUTOMOBILES, NET --- \$1,865.25

Five automobiles were purchased at a cost of \$3,393.90 for use by your fieldmen. Depreciation thereon, provided on a basis of a two-year life, has been included in fieldmen's expenses.

FURNITURE, FIXTURES AND OFFICE EQUIPMENT ---

During the period under review, \$4,687.50 was expended for furniture, typewriters and other equipment; the entire amount thereof has been included in expenses. The office equipment in use also includes items which were borrowed from J.D.C. and U.P.A.

DUE TO UNITED JEWISH APPEAL CAMPAIGN FOR 1940 --- \$5,000.00

On December 21, 1939, a contribution of \$5,000.00 was received from South Bend, Indiana, for the 1940 campaign; this was temporarily deposited in the organization's 1939 account.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE --- \$2,237.27

This amount represents the unpaid expenses applicable to the period under review; no provision has been made for the necessary subsequent expenses in connection with the collection of unpaid 1939 pledges.

CONTINGENT AND UNRECORDED ASSETS ---

Among the contingent and unrecorded assets are the following:

Bequest (in litigation):

An action has been commenced by certain persons opposing a bequest of \$10,000.00 made to your organization. According to correspondence which we examined, if the litigants succeed, your organization will receive nothing.

Art collection:

On September 22, 1939, a collection of 66 paintings, one tapestry and twelve other items were deeded to United Jewish Appeal, Inc., by the Federation of Jewish Charities of Atlantic City, N. J., which organization had previously received it as a gift.

The collection will be offered for sale at auction and the proceeds thereof included as a contribution when received.

Relative to the above figures, the following should be observed:

- (a) The figures include the gross pledges received by the Greater New York Campaign and are subject to reduction by the New York Campaign expenses, the amount of which has not been reported to the national headquarters.
- (b) The figures are also subject to reduction if certain communities are not able to collect their pledges in full.
- (c) The Philadelphia community has not yet made its 1939 allotment, nor paid anything on account.
- (d) In other communities, such as Baltimore, Cincinnati, Boston and Chicago, the amounts received on account, or estimated minimum pledges, have been included.

INSURANCE ---

Our examination of your insurance policies indicated coverage for such risks as open stock burglary, public liability, workmen's compensation, messenger robbery, safe burglary, portable typewriter floater, fire and employees' fidelity. With respect to the automobiles owned by the organization, insurance is carried for bodily injury and property damage, and for fire and theft, etc. Other policies covered similar risks on automobiles owned by fieldmen.

We shall be pleased to furnish you with any further information with respect to the accounts discussed herein that you may desire, or to confer with you thereoh.

The expense budget of \$423,688.68, net, adopted for the 1940 campaign (including \$12,000.00 for contingencies) represents an allotment of \$458,688.68 for current expenses, less \$35,000.00 chargeable to the 1939 campaign for collecting outstanding pledges. It is pertinent to note that no provision has been made in the 1940 budget for collection costs of 1940 pledges which will be outstanding at the close of the current year.

The asset and liability accounts appearing on Exhibit A, hereof, are in accordance with your books and records, but, for the purpose of this interim report, were not verified independently.

UNRECORDED AND CONTINGENT ASSETS ---

The United Jewish Appeal, Inc., received, as a gift, a quitclaim deed to two lots located in Bronx County, N.Y. We did not inspect the county records to verify your title thereto and encumbrances, if any, thereon, but we examined a quit-claim deed which indicated that on February 9, 1940, the property was recorded in your name. We were informed that several offers have been received for the property; when the lots are sold, the proceeds thereof, less expenses, will be included as a contribution.

In accordance with instructions, we have examined the books and records of United Palestine Appeal, Inc. (for 1940) for the six months ended June 30, 1940, and submit herewith our report thereon, consisting of:

EXHIBIT A - Statement of Assets, Advances on Account of Allocations and Liabilities at June 30, 1940

EXHIBIT B - Statement of Income and Expenses for the period from January 1 to June 30, 1940

We also submit on Exhibits C and D summaries of the collections and allocations to Jewish National Fund, Inc., Palestine Foundation Fund, Inc., and to others, for the period from the beginning of the joint appeal on January 1, 1936, to June 30, 1940.

Kayemeth) and Palestine Foundation Fund, Inc. (Keren Hayesod) agreed to conduct a joint campaign for the year 1940 and again appointed the United Palestine Appeal, Inc., as their agent, to manage the campaign on their behalf, under substantially the same arrangements as heretofore. These arrangements included the provision that the Jewish National Fund, Inc., collections (exclusive of specified income), less expenses, are to be turned over to United Palestine Appeal, Inc., and the total receipts of United Palestine Appeal, Inc., after deducting expenses and allocations as hereinafter set forth, are to be divided equally between Jewish National Fund, Inc., and Palestine Foundation Fund, Inc.

The agreement provided for an allotment of \$125,000.00 for 1940 to the Mizrachi Palestine Fund, with the understanding that this sum "shall be spent entirely within Palestine and that an accounting for such expenditure, duly audited and certified, shall be made to the United Palestine Appeal, Inc., and a copy furnished to the Agency Executive in Palestine." Consideration will also be given to an application for an additional allocation not to exceed \$15,000.00, if a request is made therefor subsequent to April 1, 1940.

Other allocations provided in the agreement follow:

- (b) To recognized parties in the Zionist movement in order to obtain their cooperation and support and to utilize the Palestine educational programs maintained by them, the following service payments (the amounts of which were fixed in a supplemental agreement):

With respect to the raising of funds for the year 1940, United Palestine Appeal, Inc., and American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., agreed to continue the 1939 campaign structure of United Jewish Appeal, Inc. (U.J.A.) which was designated to manage the 1940 joint campaign of the other two organizations. The goal of this campaign is to raise a minimum of \$23,000,000.00, for distribution as follows:

- (b) In addition to the foregoing, the New York City and Metropolitan Area Campaign of United Jewish Appeal shall allocate \$1,000,000.00 directly to N.R.S.
- (c) All amounts thereafter available for allocation (in excess of that provided under (a)) shall be divided between U.P.A. and J.D.C. as directed by a "Distribution Committee" composed of an equal number of nominees of U.P.A. and J.D.C. and representatives (approved by both organizations) of Welfare Fund Communities, except that N.R.S. shall have the right to apply for an additional allocation not to exceed \$500,000.00.

- (d) An allotment not exceeding \$25,000.00 is to be made to the "Distribution Committee" upon its organization, for 1940 budget studies, personnel and overhead expenses.
- (e) All details for implementing and carrying out the agreement are in charge of Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver and Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, or their respective nominees.

The scope of our examination of the income and expenses of the 1940 campaign was similar to that of the 1939 campaign; for details thereof reference should be made to our report dated February 20, 1940.

An expense budget of \$107,972.14 was adopted for the year 1940; this compares with a budget of \$63,492.10 for the year 1939. Correspondingly, the expenses for the first six months of 1940 amounted to \$45,515.97 as compared with \$28,423.43 for the same period in 1939. In Exhibit B, Schedule I, the budgeted figures for the year are compared with the expenses for the six-month period ended June 30, 1940.

CASH --- \$91,620.53

This amount includes \$26,000.00, representing a "special deposit" which is discussed hereinafter, and a remittance of \$25,000.00 from U.J.A. which was received on June 28th and deposited on July 1st. However, there has been deducted from the total \$200,000.00, representing checks drawn in June, 1940, to J.N.F. and P.F.F. which were withheld, temporarily. The corresponding amount of \$200,000.00 has been included in the total payments to the beneficiaries.

The balance on deposit, \$66,563.77, was reconciled with the June 30, 1940, bank statement, but, for the purpose of this interim audit, we did not request a written confirmation from the depositary.

DUE FROM JEWISH NATIONAL FUND, INC. --- \$42,395.68

The J.N.F. reported that \$45,482.52, representing its June, 1940, net income subject to the agreement, was due to U.P.A. From this amount \$3,086.84 was deducted for 1939 contributions which it had received previously and paid to U.P.A., although subsequently the amount was determined to be due to U.J.A. under the agreement between U.P.A. and J.D.C. On the books of U.P.A. this deduction was applied against 1939 income.

ADVANCES ON ACCOUNT OF ALLOCATIONS ---

The advances on account of allocations are set forth in detail in Exhibit A. At a June 26, 1940, meeting of the Administrative Committee, a grant of \$2,500.00 was voted to the Council of Jewish Federation and Welfare Funds for the year 1940. At June 30, 1940, this grant had not yet been paid.

The \$94,000.00 advanced to Mizrachi Palestine Fund includes \$25,000.00 which was lent to that organization by the Jewish Agency in Palestine under the arrangements described in the following paragraph:

DUE TO PALESTINE FOUNDATION FUND, INC. (FOR JEWISH AGENCY IN PALESTINE) --- \$24,000.00

The Jewish Agency in Palestine advanced to the Mizrachi Palestine Fund L.P. 8,000 (the agreed-upon dollar value of which was \$28,000.00); the Mizrachi Palestine Fund assigned to P.F.F. an equivalent amount of its 1940 allotment from U.P.A. for remittance to the Jewish Agency.

It was understood that monthly deductions were to be made and that such deductions should not extend beyond 1940. At June 30, 1940, \$4,000.00 had been paid to the P.F.F. on account of the assignment.

The advance, \$28,000.00, was included in the 1940 allotments to the Mizrachi Palestine Fund.

SPECIAL DEPOSIT PAYABLE --- \$26,000.00

This amount represents a remittance cabled from Geneva by Dr. Fritz Ullmann to Mr. Henry Montor, Executive Director of U.P.A., who was requested to hold it, as Trustee. The remittance was deposited in the regular account of the U.P.A.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE --- \$1,762.78

This is the total, so far as we could ascertain, of the unpaid expense liabilities at June 30, 1940, for which bills had been rendered.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am taking the liberty of sending you the enclosed data which explains in detail the program of the American Forum of Democracy.

The purpose of the Forum is educational. We expect to have discussions of topics of interest among high school pupils, college and university students, civic groups and clubs.

Today, Democracy is a junk-yard of wrecked ideas. There are plenty of parts lying around but they don't fit together. The Forum believes that if people could reach a common understanding of what Democracy means, socially, economically and politically, our conceptions of government would fit together and Democracy would run.

What this country needs is to get together, to know what it stands for and where it is going. I feel sure that the plan in question would bring us closer to that goal.

We are now planning debates among students in an elimination contest, beginning with the local and advancing to the state, district and national fields. Through this process of narrowing down the thousands of students who will debate we will come to the national finals with a team of five boys and five girls representing the five districts throughout the United States who will receive awards and scholarships to continue their education.

Another phase of the program of the American Forum of Democracy is to have a nationwide contest in order to obtain the best one hundred word definition of the word "Democracy". Prizes will be offered to high school, college and university students, also for the best definition submitted by a foreign born American, the best definition submitted by the negro race; and special awards will be given to the Jewish race, which, we feel, covers the masses of the American people.

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the thesis of the Forum, chart, the letter explaining the program which has been sent to the governors of the forty-eight states, a partial list of

In accordance with instructions, we have examined the books and records of the 1940 United Jewish Appeal (national organization) for the nine months ended September 30, 1940, and herewith submit our report thereon, consisting of:

EXHIBIT A - Statement of Assets, Advances on Account of Allocations and Liabilities at September 30, 1940

EXHIBIT B - Statement of Income and Expenses for the period reviewed

together with three supporting schedules.

Our report dated May 18, 1940, with respect to the audit for the four-month period ended April 30, 1940, contained a synopsis of the agreement constituting the 1940 United Jewish Appeal, and a discussion of other organization matters; these are not repeated herein.

The scope of our examination of the books and records of the 1940 Campaign was similar to that of the 1939 Campaign; for details thereof, reference should be made to our report dated February 3, 1940.

The allocations paid to beneficiaries to September 30, 1940, were as follows:

In a letter dated October 9, 1940, from Mr. William Rosenwald, President of National Refugee Service, Inc., addressed to your Chairmen and Treasurers and written pursuant to Paragraph 8 of the agreement constituting the 1940 United Jewish Appeal, the following grants and contributions were reported to have been received during the period from January 1 to August 31, 1940, by the National Refugee Service, Inc.:

Mr. Rosenwald's letter states, relative to the above items, that "these grants and contributions are reported as funds received by the National Refugee Service, Inc., which shall not be included in, or considered part of, the United Jewish Appeal."

In view of Paragraph 8 of the agreement and in order that we may properly reflect the items in this report, we requested, in a letter dated October 19, 1940, that your Chairmen and Treasurers advise us whether they concur in Mr. Rosenwald's opinion. As yet no reply has been received.

In the report submitted herewith, the allocation payments to National Refugee Service, Inc., \$1,325,000.00, do not include the grants and contributions set forth in Mr. Rosenwald's letter; accordingly, this report is subject to any change that the decision of your Chairmen and Treasurers may necessitate.

An allocation of \$5,000.00 was made to the Distribution Committee "on account of an amount not in excess of \$25,000.00, to be used during 1940, in connection with budget studies, personnel and other overhead expenses." This appropriation was provided for in Paragraph 5 of the agreement constituting the 1940 United Jewish Appeal. At this writing, we have not yet received an accounting of the expenditures from the allotted amount.

SURVEY

OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF JEWISH PALESTINE DURING THE FIRST YEAR OF THE WAR (October, 1939, to September, 1940.)

The Effects of War.

Economic conditions in Palestine were not vitally affected during the early months of hostilities. The preceding disturbances and the White Paper policy were still fresh in mind and discouraged any extensive activity on the part of private initiative. The rapid development of war events during the first half of 1940, however, induced considerable changes affecting both the military position and the supply channels of Palestine. Supplies, it is true, were never really in danger during the period under review. Though many sources of supply in the Balkans and in Europe have been cut off by Italy's entry into the War, this has not led to any considerable deterioration of the food situation. Hitherto there has been no need for rationing any essential food commodities, which can all be purchased without restriction, though at higher than prewar prices. The effect of the European war on other branches of economic activities, such as building and citriculture, the key industries of the Yishuv, has been felt far more; the tourist trade and certain industries closely connected with building have also been severely affected. On the whole, it may be said that Palestine's economic structure has so far experienced the disadvantages deriving from the economic dislocation caused by the war rather than the benefits usually deriving from the speedy utilization of natural resources and manpower in mobilizing a country.

Under such circumstances double weight attaches to the work of the Jewish national institutions, (Palestine Foundation Fund and Jewish National Fund) which have carried on their regular activities besides shouldering a substantial part of the responsibilities falling on Palestine through the war.

The present survey covers the more important of these activities and functions.

Immigration.

Despite the interruption of regular sea communications after Italy's entry into the war, and the difficulties encountered by non-visa refugees arriving at the shores of Palestine, immigration still proceeds at a remarkable pace. At least 15,000 immigrants and refugees entered Palestine during 1940 and there are reasons to expect a new upswing of immigration in 1941.

The present immigrants, as compared with those of previous years, offer many new problems.

Most of them are in a state of utter destitution. This form of immigration is without parallel in modern history; severe restrictive measures made it impossible for the immigrants to take with them any funds which may have been left in their hands hitherto. The sums needed to help them to become part of the economic life of Palestine are very high under such conditions, and the money must exclusively come from public funds. A number of recent transports of immigrants, to be sure, came to Palestine without formal permits; naturally,

Palestinian and world Jewry must take care of the unhappy victims of Nazi persecution who arrive in Palestine destitute and in a pitiful condition. The following sums were expended by the Jewish Agency on accommodation, medical treatment, financial assistance and training abroad:-

The total amount for the year 1939/40 does not greatly exceed that spent during the preceding year. However, if the work of training immigrants and preparing them for a life in Palestine is to be successful, the sums required are far in excess of those available. Several thousand immigrants are stranded today in Eastern and South European countries, in the Balkans and in Turkey, eagerly awaiting a chance to come to Palestine. Palestinian refugee camps are crowded with people whose absorption into the country's economic life constitutes a grave problem because of lack of funds. On the other hand, there is no shortage of sound proposals for enabling the bulk of the able-bodied to earn their livelihood. But this, as said before, depends on the amounts that can be raised for this purpose.

Agriculture and Land Purchases.

The experience of the first year of war decidedly justifies those who insisted on the development of Jewish agriculture on the lines of mixed farming. The motive for this policy was to create a Jewish peasant class rooted in the soil and able to produce the most vital foodstuffs. Jewish colonization policy had for years been based on this motive despite the tremendous difficulties brought about by cheap agricultural imports from neighboring countries and overseas. The exclusion of many sources of supply provided Jewish agriculture in Palestine with an excellent opportunity to fill the gap and adapt itself to the urgent needs of war. Jewish agriculture has undeniably stood the test: The area cultivated was extended, production increased and effective new methods introduced with a view to overcoming certain difficulties in ensuring regular supplies of vital foodstuffs. A case in point is the establishment of cold storage in the settlements for keeping potatoes or seeds.

Jewish colonizing institutions, therefore, had to undertake a double duty; they had to combine their normal colonization activities (such as consolidation of existing settlements, completion of irrigation plants, erection of houses and other buildings, procuring of livestock and implements, health services, security, etc.) with special measures necessitated by the war. The most important of the latter included a speeding-up of the development of new branches of agriculture, extension of the area under cultivation, and increased research.

Land Purchase.

It is evident that all activities aiming at settlement on the land are contingent on one important factor: sufficient land. The Jewish National Fund has tried to make use of all the possibilities open to it. During the year under review the Jewish National Fund purchased 43,180 dunams of land which, while not a quantitative record, represent an achievement remarkable in J.N.F. annals. Only twice previously has this record been surpassed - once in 5689 (1928-29) when the purchase of Emek Hepher and Emek Zevulun raised the year's acquisition to 59,549 dunams, and again in 5699 (1938-39) the last pre-war year, when 53,409 dunams were acquired. The achievement is the more remarkable as it falls in a period marked by a decidedly unencouraging attitude on the part of the Government towards any expansion of the area in Jewish possession. It should further be noted that the area formally acquired does not indicate the full range of the J.N.F.'s land operations. To the outright purchase by the Jewish National Fund of 43,180 dunams must be added, for instance, an area of 5,000 dunams at Wadi Kabani acquired by the J.N.F. for a group of private investors in accordance with the Fund's joint land purchase scheme, whereby private capitalists participate in land redemption.

A total of 43,144 dunams of the land purchased by the J.N.F. during the year were in rural regions; 36 dunams were urban land. Rural land purchases were effected in the following districts:

Of the urban land bought, 26,000 sq.m. were near Tel-Aviv and were allocated to the Herzlia Gymmasia, which has outgrown its present premises. 8,000 sq.m. were acquired in Jerusalem, mainly on Mount Scopus, for the expansion of the Hebrew University and the Rothschild-Hadassah University Hospital. A further 2,000 sq.m. in Tel-Aviv comprise two plots to be used for public purposes.

Land purchases do not exhaust the activities of the Jewish National Fund during the year under review. Besides spending £P. 399,056 on new land purchases, the Fund expended £P. 50,896 on land maintenance, holdings and taxes. Disbursements in connection with the occupation of new lands amounted to £P. 53,032 for all the settlements. A further £P. 50,543 was expended on plantation, £P. 17,284 on afforestation and £P. 3,936 on irrigation. Total expenditure on settlement activities aggregated £P. 574,747.

Settlement activities of the J.N.F. continued throughout the year, though at a reduced pace owing to the war. Eight new settlements were established. Plan for occupation of new lands which, if carried out, would have meant a considerable expansion of settlement zones, had to be postponed because of the lack of means. Altogether sixty agricultural settlements were established between 1936 and 1940 which was a period of protracted political instability - a convincing proof of the constructive power of Jewish efforts in Palestine. The names of the new settlements established in the year 5700 are:-(Figures in brackets denominate number of farm units.) Upper Galilee: Metzudath Ussishkin C. (60), Hameshek Hameshutaf (60), Amir (50), Matzuva (50); Sanaria: Beth Oren (60); Sharon: Beth Yitzhak (95), Gan Hepher (40); Judea: Kfar Felix Warburg (50). These settlements will comprise a total of 465 farm units when completed.

Labor and Housing.

Attention has already been drawn to the consequences of the economic dislocation caused by the severing of many of the former economic relations and by the loss of confidence in long-term investments, which are concomitants of every war. Citriculture suffered most seriously from the sharp reduction of shipping space. Prospects of marketing more than a fraction of the citrus crop are very gloomy indeed. The building industry in Palestine, which in normal times used to absorb the bulk of the newcomers, skilled and unskilled, did not recover from the shock of the disturbances and the continuous war threat on the Mediterranean. The 28,000 workers employed at the peak of the building boom had to be provided for elsewhere. Military construction in the country during the year under review provided employment for many thousands of Jewish workers, but proved to relieve only a fraction of the total number of unemployed. The position was aggravated by the fact that in recent years immigration included a decidedly smaller percentage of persons with means. As a result capital available for investment declined, together with the number

of people able to live on their own resources. Once more the Jewish national institutions were called upon to fill the gap, and endeavored to do so under most adverse circumstances.

It goes without saying that the usual rate of relief, amounting to three piasters a day (about 12 cents) per head, is entirely inadequate to maintain an individual. Besides, even this rate is paid only upon proof being shown that the applicant is registered as unemployed for at least twenty days in the month. It was impossible to raise this very unsatisfactory help (in other countries rates range between 20 to 30 piasters, -- from 80 cents to \$1.20 -- a day) although the Government also contributed a certain amount for the purpose.

The sums expended by the Jewish Agency on direct relief, medical services and supplies, public works and all other kinds of relief measures designed to secure employment or credits for the provision of cheap housing are given in the following Table:-

Industry and Urban Settlement.

In the period under review Palestine industries were faced with many difficulties brought about by the war directly or indirectly. These difficulties consisted mainly in the sudden cessation of the supply of raw materials and credits for them, in the shortage of capital experienced by companies which had already suffered during the disturbances, in the lack of machinery or spare parts and the like. In order to surmount these obstacles, the Jewish Agency, in conjunction with the Anglo-Palestine Bank, created a revolving fund for the purchase of raw materials from abroad. The procedure adopted was to provide a guarantee to the Anglo-Palestine Bank for a certain percentage of the total credits; this secured a business basis, whereby all kinds of industrial enterprises were enabled to obtain credits for the import of raw materials which could not otherwise be purchased. Here the Jewish Agency has tried to fulfil a service similar to that rendered by the British Overseas Trade Department to British industries though, naturally, on a much smaller scale. If no important industrial enterprise was compelled to close down for lack of raw materials during the first year of the war, it is certainly due in no small degree to the activities of the Jewish Agency; the figure of £14,800 expended for this purpose is unquestionably small, but it has enabled Jewish industries

to carry out orders given by the Government and the Army which, during the first year of the war, exceeded one million pounds. The financial difficulties of the Jewish industries in Palestine still exist, however, and no entirely satisfactory solution has so far been reached.

As an outcome of the Conference at New Delhi, on the other hand, the prospects of participating in the industrial war efforts of the Empire are at present much more favorable than before. Given the necessary finances, Palestine industries are in a position to carry out a production program on an ambitious scale. In certain branches three shifts have already been introduced (for instance in plants making jellies and marmalades). Further expansion of production is, however, hampered by the absence of machinery and particularly by the lack of credit facilities for industries.

The Jewish Agency will have to take its share in enabling Jewish industries to exploit the opportunities created by the war. It has already been consulted in connection with an evaluation of the productive capacity of Jewish industry.

In addition to credits for the purchase of raw materials, the Jewish Agency has assisted Jewish industries in many ways. Among them are:

- (1) Loans for industrial recovery, given in cooperation with the Anglo-Palestine Bank and Industrial Bank (40% provided by the Jewish Agency, 50% by the Anglo-Palestine Bank and 10% by the Industrial Bank).
- (2) Participation in the Small Loans Fund of the Industrial Bank.
- (3) Participation in the expenditure of institutions which encourage the use of Jewish industrial products, and help to market them abroad, such as the Foreign Trade Institute and Igud Lemaan Tozereth Haaretz. Both institutions were established by the Jewish Agency jointly with other national institutions. During 1939/40 the Foreign Trade Institute had its most successful year, and Jewish industrial products became predominant on the home market. In many instances only locally produced goods were available.
- (4) The Jewish Agency has financed courses of technical instruction, which are particularly necessary at a period of industrial expansion such as the present one; exhibitions, etc.
- (5) The Jewish Agency has provided funds for artisans, shopkeepers and traders in order to assist them in credit difficulties created by the war. In Palestine the latter led to sharp credit restrictions, partly due to the decline in bank deposits and partly to the decline in private capital imports.
- (6) Under miscellaneous expenditure for urban settlement one may include the sums expended on the Tel Aviv port, economic research, subsidies, information service, etc. The various items of expenditure under these heads are as follows:

Education.

The structure of Jewish education in Palestine is an interesting and important subject. The Jews who provide cheap schooling for all children, a thing almost unknown throughout the Middle East, where compulsory education is not yet general, have, unlike the Arabs, to bear most of the costs of this ambitious undertaking. Government grants for education are based on low Arab standards and therefore Jewish national institutions must bear the main burden of Jewish education. All institutions for technical training in Palestine are, with one exception, Jewish and supported by Jewish funds.

Approximately 16% of the educational budget of the Vaad Leumi is borne by the Keren Hayesod. In addition, the Technicum in Haifa, the Marine College in Haifa, the Mikveh Israel Agricultural School, etc., received grants from the Jewish Agency.

Cultural activities such as the Bialik Institute, the Rabbi Kook Institute (both maintained entirely by the Jewish Agency), Habimah Theatre, Ohel Theatre, Palestine Symphony Orchestra, etc. were likewise assisted from Keren Hayesod sources. It may be said without exaggeration that these important manifestations of the Jewish spirit are to-day more than at any time before dependent for their support on national institutions.

Education and Culture.

National Organization and Security.

The total expenditure under this head amounted to £P129,000. More than half of this sum was spent on security, namely watchmen, military volunteers, special constables, etc. as well as on A.R.P. (Air Raid Protection) services (shelters, evacuation, water supply, etc.) The last item is one of those which the war has set newly before the Yishuv. The Jewish Agency has appointed a special A.R.P. officer whose task it is to advise the various Jewish settlements on the necessary precautions to be taken, to arrange exhibitions, to issue leaflets with instructions, etc. Furthermore, the Jewish Agency has transmitted a considerable sum of money to the Vaad Leumi for similar purposes.

It is to be expected that, as long as the Middle East remains one of the most important theatres of war, the Jewish Agency will have to share the care for the protection of the Jewish civil population. The maintenance of the Jewish National Home, whose moral and physical forces are identified with the British cause, is one of the major contributions of the Jewish people to the war effort of the British Empire.

Jewish Public Funds.

The Jewish central institutions, the Jewish Agency, the Keren Hayesod, the National Fund, the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews, for all of which joint income and expenditure figures are given below, are the mainstay of Jewish national activities in Palestine.

During the year under review there was as already mentioned a sharp decline in private capital import on account of both the occupation of almost all of continental Europe by Hitler's forces, and the Foreign Exchange Control introduced in many neutral countries as well as in Palestine. At the present juncture the income of the national institutions, maintained despite the disappearance of revenue from many European countries, represents a large part of the new capital placed at the disposal of the Jewish National Home.

The total income of these institutions is not sufficient to replace the decline in private capital imports, while the tasks now devolving on the Jewish funds grow daily. As an example, the Pica and the Alliance Israelite Universelle school system head offices are now cut off from Palestine, and the maintenance of their services in Palestine is most uncertain. The four national institutions remain, now more than ever, the bulwark of Jewish activity in Palestine.

The combined income of the above four national institutions amounted in 1939/40 to £P1,973,000 of which 70.2% or £P1,385,000 were collected by means of contributions; £P162,000 or 8.2% are debt collections, service charges, etc., and £P34,000 represent special earmarked funds.

Expenditure amounted to £P2,184,000, and therefore the year ended with a deficit of £P212,000.

The details given show that during the first year of war the Jewish national funds were called upon to perform new tasks and to take over new responsibilities, maintaining at the same time the pace of the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home. Land purchases as well as settlement continued, new villages sprang up, new industrial production was started and training of newcomers and relief work were maintained. Despite the hardships caused by the war, the Jewish National Home is now after the first year of war, stronger than before its outbreak. It is therefore natural that, under the special

conditions prevailing during the budgetary year, expenditure should increase even more rapidly than revenue. The table shows that agricultural settlement and land purchase have taken more than half the total expenditure. There are increases in expenditure on trade and industry, education and Youth Aliyah.

Debts.

The unremitting and insistent demands on the national institutions made the incurring of debts inevitable. So far the repayments on account of these are being made in due order. During the year 1939/40 £P 505,000 of debts were repaid. Of this total £P 451,000 represented expenditure by the Jewish National Fund, the greater part on land purchases in former years. The Jewish National Fund has succeeded in mobilizing considerable sums during the last few years by the issue of debentures, etc. As a result it was able to acquire land during the worst period of political instability.

£P 54,000 was repaid by the Keren Hayesod to Lloyds Bank. It will be recalled that the loans granted by Lloyds Bank (London) to the Keren Hayesod, amounting to £P 450,000 and £P 150,000 respectively, constituted practical recognition of the financial stability of the Jewish national institutions.

Pride may be taken in the fact that during this war, when many countries have defaulted on their debts and the economic and financial stability of most governments in the world has been severely shaken, the Jewish national institutions in Palestine continue to fulfil their obligations punctually.

The effect of an expenditure of more than two million pounds in a country where the Government budget does not exceed 4 or 5 millions, is easily understood. It means providing security and dignity to the more than half a million Jews who have settled in Palestine - a most significant fact at a time when Jews are being actually annihilated in vast areas of the world. Furthermore, these funds have laid the foundations for a continuous extension of the Jewish positions along the lines of development made possible by this same national capital for the last twenty years. In the light of achievements like these we are impelled to ask ourselves: How great might have been the progress in Palestine if even a fraction of the Jewish wealth swallowed up in the European turmoil could have been saved for the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home?

- To 2 (b)(iii) Grant from Vaad Leumi for Relief Up to October 15th, 1939, relief was actually distributed by the Jewish Agency and since then by the Vaad Leumi, to which the Jewish Agency now transfers its allocations for this purpose. Up to the end of September, 1939, the Jewish Agency alone supplied the funds for relief, the Emergency Tax collections which are partly designed for unemployment relief having begun only in October, 1939.
- To 2 (c) Participation by Private Land Purchasers The J.N.F. has during recent years developed a system of acquiring land jointly with private Jewish purchasers, and has established a separate company "Hemnutah" Ltd. which acts as trustee of the J.N.F. and the private purchasers for such purchases. The sum of £P.82,598 shown in the Account as the private purchasers' participation for the year 5700 in these joint land purchases has facilitated inter alia one of the J.N.F.'s most important purchases of this year, namely that of Wadi Kabani, a tract of some 9,000 dunams contiguous to Emek Hefer.

<u>Palestine Foundation Fund (Keren Hayesod)</u> - The sum of £P.16,000 is part of £P.22,000 received by the Jewish Agency from South Africa earmarked for a number of specified investments, the remaining £P.6,000 having been paid over to the J.N.F. and included by the J.N.F. under "Loans".

- To 1 (a) Of the total of £P.49,593.860 spent by the Jewish Agency on Immigration & Training, £P.20,014- was spent on Refugees, both in Palestine and abroad, through the Palestine Offices and otherwise.
- To 1 (b) The whole of the German Bureau's expenditure under this head (£P.14,315.270) was incurred on Refugees.
- To 2 (a) Land Purchase The total expenditure on land purchase during the year was £P.407,187.818, whereof £P.8,132 spent on urban land, together with the relative costs of maintenance amounting to £P.1,127, is shown in the account under Urban Settlement etc. Section 4(b).

To 2 (b) (vii) & (viii) - The activities carried on by the Agricultural Research Station at Rehovoth embrace all branches of agriculture and all problems bearing on agricultural development. The work is conducted by various departments, each dealing with a special problem or set of problems, such as study of the soil and manures; selection of seeds; investigation of diseases in cereals, vegetables and forage crops; fruit growing; citriculture; viticulture; cattle feeding; rational planning of the farming unit; and practical instruction to farmers. The Station employs a considerable staff of scientific workers and technical instructors and maintains laboratories and experimental farms, fields and orchards in various parts of the country.

The Station's Instruction Extension Service was faced with new problems on the outbreak of war in view of the curtailment of imports affecting the available food supplies. The task of the Instruction Extension Service was

therefore to promote an increase of agricultural production generally, with special attention to such principal foodstuffs as wheat, potatoes and vegetables, dairy and poultry products.

The miscellaneous expenditure under sub-section (viii) includes the following items: special research preparatory to the founding of new settlements; experimental boring for water; surveys; and a special subsidy to the Centre for Palestine Products (Igud Tozereth Haaretz) in connection with the marketing of Jewish agricultural produce.

To 2 (b) (x) - Palestine Agricultural Settlement Association (PASA), a company granting long-term agricultural loans, was founded by the Jewish Agency in 1936 with the special aim of inducing private capital to cooperate with national capital in agricultural colonization and development - a type of investment from which private capital as a rule withdraws owing to its comparatively low profits. The Company's share capital was contributed from a national source - all from Keren Hayesod funds - while additional capital was raised from the public by means of debentures bearing guaranteed interest at 4%. The Company's Board are nominated by the Jewish Agency and its operations conducted by means of the machinery of the Colonization Department of the Jewish Agency, the national character of the Company thus being assured. Founded with a share capital of £P.50,000, the Company increased its share capital in 1937 to £P.150,000 and in 1940 to £P.200,000. It has made two successive issues of debentures of £P.200,000 each. Its interim balance sheet as of August 31st, 1940 shows the following position (condensed):

The Company's lending policy is to concentrate on <u>mixed farming</u>, thereby - (a) fostering a sounder type of farming than <u>specialized</u> farming; (b) avoiding the risks attaching to specialized farming which is more liable to sudden fluctuations.

It is worthy of special note that, after the outbreak of war, so far from withholding loans which it had previously approved - as did other credit institutions - the Company actually continued to approve new loans.

The Jewish Agency's total investment in the Company's shares to the end of 5700 out of Keren Hayesod funds was £P.155,815. The difference between this and the figure £P.137,562 shown among the Company's liabilities as the paid-up share capital represents a premium paid by the Jewish Agency on the majority of the shares and set aside by the Company as a reserve.

RASSCO - which is an abbreviation for Rural and Suburban Settlement Company - was founded in 1934 with the assistance of the German Bureau to promote the settlement of middle-class German immigrants. It has a registered share capital of £P.50,000 of which £P.39,944 is paid up. It has also issued debentures, of which an amount of £P.25,056 is now in circulation. It has so far set up the middle-class settlements of Kfar Shmaryahu and Sde Warburg in the Sharon and Shavei Zion in the Plain of Acre, and facilitated the establishment of auxiliary farms at Kiryath Bialik. In 5700 it started on two more middle-class settlements - Gan Hefer and Beth Itzhak in the Sharon.

Previous investments of the Jewish Agency in Rassco, mostly from funds of the German Bureau, were £P.11,969, so that its total investment in this Company at the end of 5700 was £P.12,072.

Mekoroth Water Company was founded in 1937 by the Palestine Foundation Fund, J.N.F. and "Nir" Company for the purpose of supplying water to the settlements of the western part of Emek Jezreel. It has a registered share capital of £P.30,000 of which £P.21,134 was paid up at the end of 1939. This Company, too, has issued debentures, to an amount of £P.50,000. In 1938 it completed the construction of its plant and in 1939 supplied water to 16 settlements in the Kishon block of the Emek and in the Plain of Zebulon. It now also supplies water to Hadar Hacarmel - the Jewish section of Haifa - and the various residential quarters on Mount Carmel, with a total population of 50,000.

The Jewish Agency's total investment in this Company to the end of 5700 was &P.8,150

"Shomron" (Samaria) Water Company is an undertaking in which the Palestine Water Company (a subsidiary of the Palestine Economic Corporation), PICA, and the Jewish Agency participate. Its main object is to supply water to the settlements of Pardess Hanna, Karkur, Givath-Adda and Benjamina in the Shomron. The Jewish Agency has contributed to its share and working capital a total of £P.14,980, which includes £P.9,980 received by the P.F.F. from Mr. Simon Marks of London as a contribution earmarked for this purpose.

To 3 (i) - Relief distributed through Vaad Leumi - £P.46,015.828.

As from October 15th, 1939, relief was distributed by the Social Welfare Department of the Vaad Leumi, whose activities up to September 30th, 1940 were as follows:

On an average, therefore, 67,500 lives per month depended on relief. These figures include individuals who received relief month by month and others who were assisted only once or twice during the whole period. The total number of recipients, whether regular or occasional, is 114,000.

To 3 (ii) - The General Labor Sick Fund served, at the end of 1939, 179,931 members in 229 towns and villages.

The People's Sick Fund served at the same time 20,970 members in 43 towns and villages.

- To 3 (iii) Workmen had to be transferred from the plantation colonies, where unemployment was rife, to other parts of the country. The sum of £P.2,470.022 shown covered the cost of transporting and accommodating 400 workmen transferred from Judea and Samaria to various settlements in Emek Jezreel and the Jordan Valley, where they were first employed on building works and later mostly absorbed into regular agriculture.
- To 3 (v) The Jewish Agency's concern in this sphere was (a) to endeavor to increase the number of Jews employed in Government public and military works during the year some 8,000 Jews were regularly employed in such works and (b) to establish camps for the Jewish laborers employed in those works in different parts of the country.

<u>labor Exchanges in Villages</u> - Some 25,500 working men and women are registered at these united labor exchanges. Up to December 1940, i.e. in fifteen months, these exchanges distributed more than 900,000 working days in agriculture, building and public works. Part of the wages were paid through the exchanges, and this amounted to £P.100,000.

To 3(vii) - A large proportion of the agricultural laborers employed in the plantation colonies in past years consisted of newly-arrived immigrants, whose inexperience led to dissatisfaction and continual friction with employers. Two years ago the Labor Department of the Jewish Agency, in cooperation with the Mercaz Haklai of the General Labor Federation and Hapoel Hamizrahi, instituted a system of instructing workmen in their different jobs within the very groves in which they were employed. This has had considerable success in increasing the productiveness of labor and in smoothing relations with employers.

Another problem claiming the attention of the Labor Department was that of training the growing number of adolescent boys and girls in the cities in productive occupations. In cooperation with the two prominent Youth Organizations of Hanoar Haoved ("Working Youth") and Hanoar Hadati ("Orthodox Youth") Bnei Akiva, the Department organized courses of instruction for boys and girls in various trades, a large number of youths being trained in

locksmithing, joinery, and auxiliary building trades at Trade Schools in Tel-Aviv and Haifa. A total number of 900 boys and girls were thus training during the year.

To 3 (viii) - Auxiliary Farms are a boon for rural laborers, in supplementing their meagre incomes and helping them over the slack seasons in agriculture, and the Jewish Agency has constantly endeavored to assist laborers (whether individuals or groups) to establish themselves and develop such auxiliary farms by providing them with suitable loans.

One of the Jewish Agency's latest measures in this direction was to establish a joint fund with the Workers' Bank for such loans, to which the Jewish Agency contributed up to the end of 5699 a sum of £P.4,798.300 and the Workers' Bank £P.3,950. With the additional allocation of £P.2,912.500 to this purpose this year, the total contribution of the Jewish Agency now amounts to £P.7,710.800.

Another loan fund was established jointly with the "Nir" Company for assisting members of workers' quarters in villages to lay out small vegetable gardens, to erect chicken coops and, in some cases, small cowsheds. A total of £P.2,525 has been contributed by the Jewish Agency to this fund, whose capital now amounts to £P.5,788 and which has so far granted loans to 407 individuals.

To 3 (ix) - The difficult situation in the citrus industry has meant that employers have often paid their laborers' wages in promissory notes (for periods of up to one year) instead of in cash. The sum of £P.1,000 to Labor Exchanges shown in the Account was granted for discounting such promissory notes. On the other hand, £P.1,200 was granted to Contracting Offices partly for working capital and partly to equalize wages - for one of the aims of these Contracting Offices was to introduce Jewish labor into areas where previously cheap non-Jewish labor was employed.

To 3 (xi) - Housing conditions of individual laborers and labor groups in villages constitute a major concern of the Labor Department. The situation in this respect is still far from satisfactory. Labor groups and individuals in various places are still obliged to live in tents and light temporary structures throughout the year for want of houses or huts, the difficulty has been accentuated where there are children, as well as in malarial areas. The Department endeavors to relieve the situation - (a) by providing loans enabling individual laborers to build themselves small houses, and (b) by itself building houses and huts - the so-called "Labor Camps" - for the labor groups and providing adequate sanitation.

During the year the Department participated with the Palestine Mortgage and Credit Bank (a subsidiary of the Palestine Economic Corporation) in the erection of 40 houses for laborers in Rehovoth; jointly with the PICA it built another 20 houses for laborers in Yavnel; and in Ness Ziona the Department participated with the "Nir" Company in building 29 such houses.

For labor groups (including groups of refugees who settled in villages) the Department erected this year five camps, consisting of buildings and huts, in various settlements and one at the Dead Sea for workmen employed by the Palestine Potash Co. New buildings and huts were also put up and hundreds of tents purchased to accommodate some 1,500 new refugees released during the year from the temporary internment camps.

To 3 (xii) - "Bitzur" Company, as is well known, is an institution established by the Jewish Agency and the General Federation of Labor to stimulate large public works and private building schemes by providing the requisite credit. It serves a dual purpose - creating large-scale employment, and promoting works of public importance. Founded in 1936, it has a registered share capital of £P.125,000 (increased from the original £P.50,000) of which £P.88,140 is paid up, and has made a series of issues of debentures to a total of £P.284,660. In its first four years Bitzur has managed to finance extensive public works and construction schemes in all parts of the country, both in town and village. To June 30th, 1940, the total loans granted by the Company were £P.491,622, of which £P.329,996 was outstanding, and which facilitated works to a total cost of £P.1,323,600, involving a total of 1,780,000 working days.

The Jewish Agency has until now contributed to the share capital of the Company a total of £P.62,120 (the remaining £P.26,020 of the paid-up share capital having been contributed by the General Labor Federation), and has also taken up debentures for a sum of £P.22,925.

To 3 (xiii) - Since 1936 the Jewish Agency has devoted increasing attention to the marine and fishing industries.

The main items of the Jewish Agency's marine program are: efforts to increase Jewish labor in the Ports of Palestine, accompanied by training of laborers in various port works; efforts to establish and develop Jewish shipping between Palestinian and Mediterranean ports; and training of Jewish youths in seamanship. The last-mentioned activity is carried on mainly by means of the Haifa Marine College (mentioned hereafter) and partly by means of associations subsidized by the Jewish Agency.

During the year the Jewish Agency continued to train laborers employed at the Haifa Harbor in various new types of marine and port work and helped to provide them with equipment. It also assisted them with loans to tide over "slack" periods. This incessant training and encouragement may have contributed to the fact that during the last winter, nearly two-thirds of the laborers employed at the Haifa Harbor were Jews.

Training of youths in seamanship was continued at the Haifa Marine College (opened at the Hebrew Technical Institute of Haifa towards the end of 1938 in collaboration with the Jewish Maritime League and actively supported by the Jewish Agency which provides over a third of its annual budget). The College now has 70 trainees for the pursuits of sea-officers, engineers and boat builders. Practical training was also given during the year by the maritime associations "Zevulun", "Hapoel" and "Sea Scouts" to about 300 members.

Fishery - a new field opened to Jewish endeavor - this year takes up the bulk of the expenditure shown under the head "Maritime Activities". The Jewish Agency is here concerned with - (a) developing sea and lake fishing as an auxiliary pursuit of agricultural settlements situated on the coast or on the shores of the country's lakes; (b) developing the raising of fish in ponds at various agricultural settlements; (c) studying general questions of fishery. This year's activities were - engaging experts for the instruction of beginners, some of them being brought especially from abroad; supplying boats, fishing tackle, loans to beginners; and experiments. The results achieved were a doubling of the number of persons engaged in the industry as against the previous year and an increase of 230% in catch, bringing the Jewish fishery production up to about a tenth of the country's total production. Three years of experiments in carp rearing in ponds have

now culminated in the establishment of a regular industry on a large scale at Nir-David and on a smaller scale in various other settlements in the Beisan Valley.

To 4 (a) (i) - £P.15,000 Guarantee to Anglo-Palestine Bank - This is one of a number of guarantee funds established by the Jewish Agency during the recent disturbances, when the restriction of credit caused great difficulty to industry. It was designed to enable the Bank to grant loans to manufacturers on the security of charges on their stocks of finished goods or of raw materials, and since the outbreak of war it has served mainly to facilitate the laying in of stocks of raw materials and to finance the execution of Government and Military orders. The guarantees given by the Jewish Agency on account of this Fund - totalling for the year 5700 £P.14,819 - constituted between 25% and 35% of the credits granted. The total credits issued by the Bank in connection with this guarantee fund from its establishment to the end of 5700 reached £P.250,000, facilitating a total turnover of goods to the amount of £P.400,000.

Joint Loans for Industrial Recovery - Another form of assistance to the hard-pressed industry initiated by the Jewish Agency during the disturbances. The Jewish Agency's participation in these loans in 5700 (£P.9,000) together with the contributions of previous years is £P.33,000, being 40% of the total loans granted.

Small Loans Fund at Industrial Bank - also initiated during the disturbances, facilitating credits for small and medium-size industries. The Jewish Agency's participation of &P.4,900 constitutes 70% of the fund, the balance being provided by the Industrial Bank.

The Foreign Trade Institute was founded in 1937 by the Jewish Agency in collaboration with the Anglo-Palestine Bank, the Industrial Bank and the Palestine Manufacturers' Association to serve Palestinian industry in all matters of exports. It operates by means of agencies in countries of the Near East (Syria, Egypt, Cyprus, Iraq, Iran and Turkey), in South Africa, U.S.A. and Australia, where it exhibits and distributes Palestinian products and forms connections for Palestinian industries. It represented Palestine at various international exhibitions and fairs, in New York, Johannesburg, Capetown, Wellington (New Zealand), and Izmir (Turkey). During 5700 it was instrumental in obtaining foreign orders for Palestine products to an amount of £P.100,000, of which £P.60,000 had been executed by the end of the year.

General Promotion of Industry - This includes - (a) activities through the Centre for Palestine Products (Igud Tozereth Haaretz) directed at securing the local market and competing with imported goods - with increasing success; (b) expert technical advice to manufacturers, including subsidies to a special institute for testing raw materials; (c) advice to prospective investors; (d) promotion of home industries. The last-mentioned activity represents an important new departure and should be described in some detail. Appreciating the importance of developing in Palestine this form of industry, which still plays such a notable part in the economic life of some European countries, the Jewish Agency has recruited a body of instructors from among the numerous expert craftsmen who arrived with the recent waves of immigrants and refugees, to instruct various classes of the Yishuv - particularly refugee groups and individuals and members of small-holders' settlements - in such handicrafts as embroidery, hand-weaving, leather-work, and the manufacture of trinkets, artificial flowers, toys, ceramics and glassware. This is meeting with considerable success, and home industries promise to become a reliable auxiliary source of income for wide classes of

both the rural and urban population. Special funds have been set aside for small loans to beginners for the purchase of tools and material.

- To 4 (a) (ii) Loans to Artisans & Small Tradesmen The sum of £P.9,884.100 (shown in the Account in two separate items as the Jewish Agency's allocations for this purpose in the year 5700), together with an additional £P.5,500 attracted from other sources, has so far served for 2,100 such small loans.
- To 4 (a) (iii) Economic Research Institute This is one of the special organs for economic affairs established by the Jewish Agency in recent years. Functioning since February 1936, it has been engaged in systematically studying all phases of Palestine's economy, collating data for the economic programs of the Jewish Agency, preparing material for the Jewish Agency's representations to the successive Commissions of Inquiry sent to Palestine by the British Government and studying, reporting to the Jewish Agency and publishing comments on various problems, such as population movement, development of agriculture and industry, currency, foreign trade, public finance, and the economic absorptive capacity of the country. Since the outbreak of war the Institute has dealt particularly with the following topical matters: investigations and suggestions regarding food supplies and prices; nutrition problems in war-time; insurance against war risks; a study of sources of income; investigation of unemployment; investigation of the industrial possibilities of Palestine in connection with the war effort (material prepared in connection with the New Delhi Conference late in 1940 to discuss the participation of the Middle East in the war effort.)
- To 4 (a) (iv) The Department of Statistics has functioned since 1924 and has rendered valuable service by carrying out various investigations and censuses giving insight into conditions of the Yishuv. One of its special tasks is the systematic collation of material for an index of Jewish industrial production. The Department's cutstanding activities during the year 5700 were: a census of the Yishuv's man-power (carried out on the outbreak of war), a study of unemployment and one of the cost of living.
- To 4 (a) (vi) The Marine Trust, which has constructed and runs the Tel-Aviv Harbor, is well known. Less known, perhaps, is the share of the Jewish Agency in this great national concern. It was the Jewish Agency, after various investigations and preparatory work done by its Labor Department, that obtained permission from the Government in 1936 to unload goods on the Tel-Aviv shore and that furnished the funds for the construction of the first jetty. The Jewish Agency sponsored the creation of the Marine Trust and had invested in its share capital up to the end of 5699 a sum of £P.44,355. With the sum invested in 5700, the Jewish Agency's total investment in the Marine Trust is now £P.56,959.
- To 4 (a) (viii) The temporary loan to the Palestine Land Development Company is distinct from the Jewish Agency and Palestine Foundation Fund investments in the Company's share capital now amounting to £P.27,700.
- To 4 (a) (ix) The Tel-Aviv Development Co. (founded by the late Meier Dizengoff, builder and mayor of Tel-Aviv) was until now a predominantly private concern. It holds important valuable land properties in Tel-Aviv, chiefly the Levant Fair grounds which now partly serve the Tel-Aviv Harbor. The Company is being reorganized, and the sum of £P.3,000 represents part

of an agreed investment in its share capital which is designed to assure national control of the Company.

To 4 (b) - Purchase of Urban Land by J.N.F. - The sum of £P.9,259 - consists of £P.8,132 paid as purchase price for land acquired near Jerusalem and Tel-Aviv and £P.1,127 spent on taxes and legal and other expenses.

At the end of 5700 the population on J.N.F. land in towns was 16,000.

To 5 (a) (i) - From 1922 to 1932 the financial responsibility for the entire Jewish school system rested on the Jewish Agency and was met mainly with funds of the Foundation Fund. The total education budgets for those eleven years amounted to £P.1,280,264, of which £P.785,426 came from Foundation Fund funds. Since 1933 the Vaad Leumi has been in charge of the school system, and the Jewish Agency merely contributes a share of the budget. The budgets for the years 1933-1939 totalled £P.839,574, of which the Jewish Agency contributed £P.177,602.

Apart from the contribution of £P.30,038 in cash to the Education Budget for 5700 (1939-40), the Jewish Agency guaranteed a loan of £P.10,000 raised by the Vaad Leumi for education purposes.

It is significant to note that the total gross allotments from the major cities which held Spring campaigns represent 69% of the total raised in the Spring phase of the campaign. It is clear that losses in income from the major cities cannot, to any appreciable percentage, be offset by increases in the other communities. A number of the other communities show material increases in their 1940 contributions above 1939, or at least contributed as much as last year. For example:

Aggressive efforts are being made to obtain the maximum results from the Fall campaigns. Philadelphia, Boston and Cincinnati represent the major communities which will participate within the next six weeks. In all these cities, campaign plans have been completed and the organization is well under way. From coast to coast we are doing our best through personal visits and in other directions to satisfy leaders and contributors that the monies sought can be used effectively by the agencies of the U.J.A., in the face of existing conditions. There prevails everywhere a defeatest attitude which we are seeking to overcome and, where the opportunity is given to present the facts, this attitude can be counteracted.

The national administrative expense to date is well within the budget set up for this year.

1939 UNITED JEWISH APPEAL

As of September 16, 1940 the total gross pledges of the 1939 campaign are officially reported in the sum of \$16,236,997.18. Cash has been received at national headquarters in the amount of \$14,752,873.91.

Allowing for the deduction of local campaign expenses and reported as well as additional estimated shrinkages in collections, it is believed that approximately \$727,000 will be received in additional cash. The U.J.A. is giving its most complete attention to gathering in these funds at the earliest possible moment.

It should be noted that in the outstanding total collectible balance of approximately \$727,000, the sum of \$570,000 is outstanding in 12 cities which have balances of over \$10,000. These cities are, in addition to New York City,: Philadelphia, Boston, Baltimore, Detroit, Pittsburgh, Los Angeles, Buffalo, Toledo, Dayton, Milwaukee and Rochester.
