WILLIAM ROSENWALD ADVISES ME THAT MR. MONTOR HAS RELAYED TO HIM YOUR INSTRUCTIONS NOT TO FURNISH LETTER TO HOFFHEIMER FOUNDATION WHICH FOUNDATION REQUIRES IN ORDER TO MAKE \$40,000 CONTRIBUTION TO NATIONAL REFUGEE SERVICE STOP REGARDLESS OF A SEEING INCONSISTENCY ON THE PART OF HOFFHEIMER FOUNDATION FOUNDATION STATES THEY ARE RESTRICTED FROM MAKING ANY OVERSEAS CONTRIBUTION I ASK YOU AGAIN TO COOPERATE AND NOT MAKE IT IMPOSSIBLE FOR NATIONAL REFUGEE SERVICE TO OBTAIN THESE FUNDS WHICH THEY BADLY NEED NOW AND WHICH OTHERWISE WOULD NOT BE AVAILABLE TO ANY MUCH NEEDED RELIEF FUNDS AT ALL.

Dear Mr. Ittleson:

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver telephoned to me today from Maine and referred to a telephone conversation which you had with him yesterday in connection with the Hofheimer Foundation. Dr. Silver was under the impression that all the facts in connection with this item had not been placed at your disposal and therefore asked that I send this memorandum to you as the background for the position which the United Palestine Appeal has taken in reference to the Hofheimer Foundation.

1) On May 16, 1939, the New York United Jewish Appeal submitted a letter to the Nathan Hofheimer Foundation, Inc., Mrs. Lester Hofheimer, President, asking for a contribution to be made to the United Jewish Appeal.

2) On May 31, 1939, on the letterhead of the Nathan Hofheimer Foundation, Mrs. Helen M. (Arthur) Hofheimer wrote to the United Jewish Appeal of Greater New York, attention of Mrs. David Levy, Chairman of the Women's Division, that at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on April 12, 1939, a grant of \$40,000 was made to the National Coordinating Committee.

3) On May 31, 1939, there is a memorandum from Mr. Joseph Willen on the stationery of the New York United Jewish Appeal as follows:

"Mr. Henry Ittleson telephoned me today that the Nathan Hofheimer Foundation, Inc. has voted \$40,000 to the National Coordinating Committee.

"The check for \$40,000. will be sent directly to the National Coordinating Committee.

"You may enter it, however, as a pledge of \$40,000. made to the New York campaign of the United Jewish Appeal, via the National Coordinating Committee. Please credit the gift to the Womens Division.

"Please also report it to the national office of the United Jewish Appeal, so that when the time comes for allocation of funds to the various agencies, we will know that a gift of \$40,000. has been made by the Foundation, through the campaign, directly to the NCC. The UJA of New York will, of course, receive full credit for this gift."

4) It should also be noted that on May 16, 1939, Mr. Henry Ittleson wrote a letter to Dr. I. Edwin Goldwasser, saying: "I have this day sent a formal and formidable document to the Nathan Hofheimer Foundation, Inc., placing before them an appeal for a substantial grant on behalf of the United Jewish Appeal of New York. As I have some suspicion that you know something of the work of the Joing Distribution Committee, the National Coordinating Committee, and perhaps also the United Palestine Appeal, I hope that you will use your excellent per-
suasive powers to see to it that this appeal receives generous and thoughtful con-
sideration by the foundation."

It is very evident from the foregoing condensation of correspondence that a pledge was made to the United Jewish Appeal of New York in the amount of \$40,000. Although it was earmarked for the National Coordinating Committee, the original application was made by the United Jewish Appeal, so that there could be no mis-
understanding as to the relation between the United Jewish Appeal and the National Coordinating Committee, two of its beneficiaries.

Although no formal and written repudiation of this pledge has ever been made, an attitude seems to have developed that the United Jewish Appeal is not entitled to this \$40,000 despite the very clear terms of the application and the manner in which the amount was originally pledged. In this connection the following additional information is pertinent:

On October 10, 1939, Mr. Arthur M. Lampert, then Executive Co-Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal of New York, had a conversation with Dr. I. Edwin Goldwasser in connection with the Hofheimer Foundation. Dr. Goldwasser at that time made the statement that the Hofheimer Foundation by law is limited to make gifts only to American institutions. Dr. Goldwasser recommended, however, according to Mr. Lampert, that the \$40,000 payment be made directly to the National Coordinating Committee, whose activities are limited to the United States of America. But, in order to rectify and adjust this payment insofar as the income of the United Jewish Appeal is concerned, the Allocations Committee of the United Jewish Appeal should be informed of this contribution and make an allowance of \$40,000 in the intended grant to the National Coordinating Committee in lieu of the \$40,000 the National Coordinating Committee received directly from the Hofheimer Foundation.

In the meantime a check for \$25,000 was paid to the National Coordinating Committee by the Hofheimer Foundation. Dr. I. Edwin Goldwasser subsequently stated that the \$25,000 was returned to the Hofheimer Foundation.

The United Palestine Appeal has therefore based its attitude and position on the formal application made by the New York United Jewish Appeal through you and on the definite pledge made to the New York United Jewish Appeal by the

Hofheimer Foundation. Since there has been no formal repudiation of this pledge in writing the United Palestine Appeal has felt that this sum should be paid into the treasury of the United Jewish Appeal or else held as an offset against allocations to the National Refugee Service (National Coordinating Committee) from the 1939 United Jewish Appeal. The contract constituting the 1939 United Jewish Appeal specifically provided that all income to the United Palestine Appeal, the Joint Distribution Committee and the National Refugee Service must be placed in the treasury of the United Jewish Appeal. On that basis it felt that the pledge to the National Refugee Service from the Hofheimer Foundation was part of the income of the United Jewish Appeal.

There was a parallel instance insofar as the United Palestine Appeal is concerned in the case of the proceeds of "Night of Stars". In 1939, over the vigorous objection of most of the officers of the United Jewish Appeal, the "Night of Stars" was held in New York City, as it had been for four years previously. The officers of the United Jewish Appeal denied to the "Night of Stars" the right to say in any way that the proceeds would go to the United Jewish Appeal. The "Night of Stars" is presented annually by a corporation entitled "Night of Stars, Inc.". Its program provides that the proceeds of its activities should go to the United Palestine Appeal.

Here, then, was an analogy between the Hofheimer Foundation and the "Night of Stars, Inc.". For some months the proceeds accruing to the United Palestine Appeal from the "Night of Stars, Inc." were held in suspense, not because the United Palestine Appeal felt that the money did not belong to the United Jewish Appeal, but in order that there might be a similar free discussion of the attitude taken by the Hofheimer Foundation. Following a meeting between Rabbi Jonah B. Wise and Rabbi Silver, this item was disposed of to their mutual satisfaction and \$50,000 accruing to the United Palestine Appeal from "Night of Stars, Inc." was turned over to the United Jewish Appeal. There has been no similar willingness on the part of the Hofheimer Foundation, either to repudiate the pledge of 1939 in writing or to agree that the United Jewish Appeal might take credit for the 1939 gift of \$40,000 inasmuch as the money would be used in its entirety by the National Refugee Service within the United States.

Dear Dr. Silver:

This letter will undoubtedly come to you many days after I shall have departed from the United States. Before leaving New York City I had dictated a number of letters, and assume that some days may elapse before the stenographer will have released them from her books.

The essential purpose of this note is to say "farewell", and to thank you for your many courtesies during my visit to the United States. I have come to know more closely the vigor and effectiveness of your championship of Palestine interests. The universal regard for your devotion to that which is best for Palestine has been a source of great strength and encouragement, for we depend upon you in increasing measure to represent Palestine to American Jewry.

I realize that it is too early at this time to make decisions with respect to 1941. These will depend upon events which cannot be predicted at this moment. Nevertheless, I would like you to know that we in Palestine feel that money alone is not the sole criterion in determining our relationship to those who believe they are conferring charity upon Palestine, or who resent the growth of Palestine.

The United Palestine Appeal can continue to grow as the instrument through which the financial support for our work in Palestine may grow stronger. It may also become the medium through which the community as a whole acquires a closer knowledge of our problems and our achievements.

I am asking that copies of letters which I am addressing to the Joint Distribution Committee and the Emergency Committee in clarification of certain problems should be sent to you.

The minutes of the last meeting of the Administrative Committee of the United Palestine Appeal, circulated by Mr. Monter, made me think again about the problem facing the UPA and the JDC with respect to a joint campaign during 1941. As I understand it, a sub-committee of the UPA is to study the matter on the basis of the discussions at the last meeting and to formulate a proposal which is to be submitted at the next meeting of the Administrative Committee. I should like to suggest for the consideration of your sub-committee that it decide in favor of a joint campaign with the following provisions:

1. No definite quotas or percentages should be set now but allocations should be made quarterly to each of the participating organizations on the basis of a careful examination of the needs and activities of these organizations by the allocations committee.
2. The participating organizations are to have complete freedom to carry on their propaganda within the welfare fund set-up without the restrictions and limitations mentioned at the last meeting.

Although I was much impressed by the statements of Mr. Lipsky and some of the others regarding the restrictions which a joint campaign imposes upon the UPA, I am impelled to urge a joint campaign because it is clear that whether the participating organizations agree to it or not the welfare funds and the organized contributors in non-welfare-fund cities will not tolerate separate campaigns. This leaves no alternative to a joint campaign. However, there is so much uncertainty regarding the present work and future activities of some of the participating organizations that it seems questionable wisdom to agree on percentages so far in advance and to be bound by them. It is not impossible that the international situation will be such during the next year as to make the work of one or more major organizations difficult, if not impossible. There is necessary, therefore, considerable flexibility in the programs of allotments to the organizations. If the JDC or the ORT should be unable to carry on all of their activities in Europe or if the NRS should require considerably less than it is now using, there seems no valid reason why some of the funds should not go to Palestine if the situation there is such as to permit constructive usage. If, on the other hand, the Mediterranean war should preclude the possibilities of effective work in Palestine, and the other organizations should be in a position to extend their work, it would seem only just for some of the funds which would normally go to Palestine to be diverted to their activities.

The situation today is so unclear and uncertain that no one can say which party to the agreement would be the loser or the gainer in such an arrangement. But it seems clear that Jewish life in general would benefit thereby. At any rate, the allocation of funds could be made on a much more equitable basis than is now the case with the purely arbitrary proportions and percentages. The quarterly basis would supply the essential minimum period for study and planning as well as periodic reviews which these uncertain days make necessary.


The scheme suggested above would require that the Allocations Committee think in terms of the needs of world Jewry rather than partisanship and consider itself the trustee for the funds entrusted to it by American Jewry for those needs. While it is probably too much to expect that at this early day in the functioning of this Committee all decisions can be reached purely on the basis of merit, it is not too much to hope that eventually this will be the case. If the Allocations Committee were to direct its thinking and activity in that direction, it could easily become one of the most constructive and harmonizing organizations in American Jewry. It would be a fitting monument to the work of all those who helped in its creation and development.





My dear Rabbi Silver:

I have ready copy of your communication to Paul Baerwald of November 28th, 1940, with a great deal of interest. The content of this letter and your own letter of December 27th present a very convincing argument on behalf of the position of the United Palestine Appeal. It is a source of great regret to some of us that notwithstanding the cogency of your logic and the brilliance of your statements that the American Jewish community will consider the severance as a step in the direction of disunity at a time when the opposite is sorely needed.

I am not so certain from my personal knowledge of some of our representatives of the cause of Zion in the communities of America that in a practical measure the budget committees of the scattered Federations will do more justice to the United Palestine Appeal than could be accomplished through the determined efforts of the New York negotiators. I do not mean to infer that your position on flexibility is not sound. Quite to the contrary, it is most emphatically sound. There are many who begin to question the advisability of much of the money that is spent in relief alone and this feeling is growing and it should reflect itself in the distribution of funds. Of course, the die has been cast. Whatever might now be said would only be classified as post mortems. I shall be pleased to work with whomever I can in this community as requested in your letter of December 27th; unfortunately, due to the fact that I am Chairman of the Budget Committee of the Federation and of our annual campaign I find it impossible to lead off in this connection.



Dear Montor:-

On January 8th I wired you regarding my immediate availability for work with you in connection with the UPA campaign. If ever there was need for complete mobilization on behalf of Palestine now is the time.

Undoubtedly you and the leaders of the current UPA campaign have faced some of the emphatic realities in attempting to work out clearly the steps which will lead to successful and outstanding effort this year. As it appears to me, and as you surely must already have realized, the UPA will have to face these inescapable facts:

1. That the Council of Federations and Welfare Funds, by tradition, and by the basic attitudes of its top staff, as well as of its most influential lay leaders, is not likely to grant UPA's complete justification for its \$12,000,000 campaign. This may not be overt, however.

2. That considerable advance work will have to be done before the meetings of the general Assembly of the Council in Atlanta in order to secure strong and effective backing, in advance, for a positive and unequivocal stand in behalf of the UPA objective.

3. That local and regional Welfare Funds are inclined to "freeze" their past conceptions and conclusions regarding specific allotments and relative "ratios". In many instances, the paid personnel heading the Welfare Fund are poorly oriented regarding Palestine, and will play the part of "yes-men" to some of the leading workers or contributors who are anti-Zionist and anti-Palestine in their thoughts and action.

4. That other organizations making a nation-wide appeal are likely to reach, even now, local key persons, far in advance of their campaign or budgetary meetings, in order to tie them up with commitments from which they may not be able to back down with any degree of "face".

5. That immediately the case for Palestine must be so well prepared from the fiscal as well as the educational side that no one free to make up his own mind will have any doubts or questions regarding the essential needs of the UPA.

6. That some new approaches and techniques in fund-raising must be developed within a short time in order to give/ any assurance that the substantial sum set as a goal will be raised. Some of the old procedures cannot be expected to work effectively now.

All of these conditions, and more, I am sure, have also occurred to you. They demand a rapid and effective mobilization of our best thought and effort. If, in my own small way, I can be of any real service, I shall be very happy to co-operate with you.




Thank you so much for your kind letter. I am happy that you are alert to the situation. The fact that Baltimore has no Welfare Fund does not mean that its Federation will not vote on the proposals, and it is important to have the matter scotched in the Federation Board. It is rather anomalous that this proposal which affects only Welfare Funds will, in your city, be voted upon by a Federation Board which is really in no way concerned with the problem. But I am sure that that makes no difference to the gentlemen who are determined to force this proposal down the throats of American Jewish communities whether they like it or not.

Have you a Jewish Community Council in your city? If so, there is a good chance to air the whole subject before such an organization, and its opinion will undoubtedly have weight with the gentlemen of your Federation.

My dear Dr.Silver:

This member of the American Jewry is beginning to question the small group of men who consider themselves the true leaders of American Jewry.
The writer lives in a small town in North Carolina, with a small family circle of four members. We are the only Jewish family in this community. Automatically we have been receiving communications from the existing and increasingly active Jewish national organizations.
Life moves at a relative slower pace in these small towns and we have had ample time to read the volume of Jewish promotional material that comes to us.
Whenever an appeal for a Jewish cause has been or is being made, we are happy to be able to give our support. This year we find ourselves called upon to "ratio or budget" our aid. The UNITED Jewish Appeal is non-existent. Only today we received a digest from "Committee on the Referendum for Budgeting: Minority versus majority.
Frankly speaking, the American Jewish individual does not believe that our Jewish leaders can lead a house that seems to be divided within itself. The needs are great, tyranny and oppression are on the march, hunger and starvation are cutting down the ranks, and still our American Jewish leaders are not UNITED. Every letter that we receive from a Jewish agency is completely covered with honorary chairmen and vice presidents. The selfish desires for honors and "koved" still are paramount in the hearts of our leaders.
Why not have our Jewish leaders begin to question their own ability to provide able and United Leadership?
The rank and file in American Jewry are every day raising the question pertaining to our diverting leadership.
Speaking as a young American Jew, that question is still unanswered within my own thoughts. As always, we are willing to carry on our share of the work that remains to be done.
We must all be united in a spirit of cooperation.



Dear Rabbi Silver:

Before his departure for Palestine, Chief Rabbi Herzog asked me, (as his private secretary during his stay in America,) to follow up personally the satisfactory arrangement of the U.P.A. allotment in behalf of his Torah mission.

Though the Chief Rabbi was most heartened by your personal attitude as well as that of Dr. Wise, Mr. Lipsky, Judge Rothenberg and others, he was rather disappointed over the fact that he had to leave this country without knowing the exact amount he was going to get, which was to be in the form of a service charge by the United Palestine Appeal for distribution by the Chief Rabbi in accordance with his discretion. In fact, I have received several cables from Rabbi Herzog, inquiring as to the decision of the last meeting of the Administrative Committee of the United Palestine Appeal, held the day of his departure.

Upon inquiry from Mr. Nonor as to the status of the matter, I received a letter this morning, a copy of which I am herewith enclosing, which I know would cause Chief Rabbi Herzog the greatest measure of distress in this difficult hour for the Homeland to which he is heading.

The amount is, first of all, much less than spoken about, (6000 Pounds aren't even the \$25,000 minimum, to which everyone seemed to agree, not speaking already of a larger sum about which ~~many~~ outstanding Zionists hinted to the Chief Rabbi.) Then again, the matter of paying the sum in 500 LP monthly installments, is certainly in violation of the impression that the Chief Rabbi had when he listened to your inspiring remarks at the U.P.A. meeting, which seemed to have been shared by all present.

I know that you were absent at the last meeting and the results would have been much different if you were there. The purpose of this letter is to call this matter to your kind attention and beg you in the name of Chief Rabbi Herzog to rectify this apparent misunderstanding.
