

**UNITED NEW YORK APPEAL**

---

**T**HE Joint Distribution Committee and the National Refugee Service will continue to come before the Greater New York community in a united drive for funds. This appeal will be made through the United New York Appeal for Joint Distribution Committee and National Refugee Service.

The imperative need to keep the refugee problem at home under control, and to meet the infection abroad by aiding those trapped in the persecution areas, is still with us. These are inescapable obligations which we, as Americans and Jews, must place above all other considerations.

### *Our Responsibility*

As the largest Jewish community, New York must help provide life-sustaining service and emigration facilities to oppressed Jews abroad; assist in the rehabilitation and resettlement of refugees in 900 communities in America, and make full provision for New York's own refugee program. Our community welfare and our self-respect is at stake in this matter.

### *The J. D. C. Abroad*

The second year of the war finds the Joint Distribution Committee standing almost alone between the 5,000,000 Jews of Europe and certain destruction. By deliberate intent and through the events of total war, the Jewish populations throughout the old world have been driven out of the main stream of life. Herded into official ghettos, starved by decree, abandoned on hostile frontiers, they live under such conditions of hardship and horror that it is difficult to understand how human life continues among them.

The Joint Distribution Committee alone sustains these people. Operating in fifty countries throughout the world, the Joint Distribution Committee today cares for 1,000,000 distressed and homeless persons, keeping them alive with emergency aid, providing avenues of escape and facilitating their rehabilitation in new surroundings and new countries.

More than 630,000 Jews in German occupied Poland receive daily assistance at 2,000 Joint

Distribution Committee institutions, including soup kitchens, food package stations, child care organizations, medical aid units, cash subvention agencies and clothing distribution centers. In Greater Germany, approximately 400,000 Jews look to the Joint Distribution Committee for help, seeking both the immediate necessities of life and an opportunity to emigrate to Palestine, South and Central America and other parts of the world. As in the past, a special clearance arrangement enables the Joint Distribution Committee to extend aid without contributing to the economy of aggressor nations.

### *Central and South America*

There are approximately 100,000 refugees in Central and South America, transported there under emergency conditions. We must continue to make adequate provision for their retraining, cultural adjustment and resettlement in 1941. With our government exerting every effort to establish friendly ties with the countries to the south of us, it is our duty to continue the work of refugee absorption there. We dare not permit these emigre populations to become pretexts for anti-democratic disturbances or innocent pawns in the international game of fascist infiltration.

### *Palestine Emigration*

The Joint Distribution Committee, since the advent of Hitler, has been a major agency through which refugees from Europe have reached Palestine. From 1933 to the present time, the organization spent \$2,400,000 for emigration, and for the preparation of refugees for emigration, to Palestine.

The J. D. C. was on the scene in the Holy Land in 1914 and for many years thereafter, taking a direct part in the development of the country. In 1926, the agency routed its constructive assistance through the Palestine Economic Corporation, which continues its work today. The J. D. C., in addition, makes direct grants in ever larger amounts to cultural and religious institutions in Palestine.

## ***What Is Needed***

Throughout the world, the Joint Distribution Committee lifts the burden of suffering from the shoulders of our people. If we make the money available, millions can be saved in 1941 from starvation and death and, in many instances, given a chance to rebuild their lives in new lands. Despite the difficulties of working under war conditions, nothing but lack of funds will prevent our program of war relief and refugee aid from continuing and expanding.

Minimum Joint Distribution Committee requirements for the first six months of the year call for an expenditure of \$12,600,000. Moreover, we may reasonably anticipate that an equal amount will be needed for the latter half of 1941. Our duty is clear. To fail now would be to invite final catastrophe for the Jewish people everywhere.

## ***The National Refugee Service at Home***

There are 150,000 refugees in the United States. Innocent victims of a relentless racial mania, these people struggled across the beleaguered frontiers of the old world to reach our shores—to enter a country with a great tradition of liberty and brotherhood — seeking surcease from pain and systematic enslavement. For the security and well-being of our own community, we must not allow a single refugee to become a public charge; for reasons of simple decency and humanity alone their induction into American life should enlist the help and deep sympathy of every one of us.

The National Refugee Service is the central Jewish agency for refugee needs in America. In 1940, 18,000 refugees were given temporary financial assistance, enabling them to gain a foothold in their new country; 5,200 were resettled in 900 communities throughout the nation; many more were prepared for citizenship, new occupations and cultural adaptability. During this period a total of 325,000 requests for service and information were received and acted upon at the offices of the National Refugee Service.

The whole problem of refugee adjustment to American life—taking the form of a carefully planned program of retraining and resettlement—rests squarely on our shoulders. With 3,000 refugees arriving monthly in this country, American Jewry must provide not less than \$4,342,000 this year to enable the National Refugee Service to continue its work. As the largest Jewish community, we in New York are obligated to contribute at least half of this amount.

## ***New York's Own Refugee Program***

The National Refugee Service stands at the main port of entry—New York—and guides the newcomer along the road to American adjustment and citizenship. New York has the direct responsibility of feeding and housing the needy among the new arrivals, of making them self-supporting at the earliest possible moment and helping them to become assets to the community and to America.

Last year, the Jewish community of New York City contributed \$1,000,000 toward the local refugee program in addition to giving substantial financial aid to the national program. With the refugee needs of the city rising steadily, a greater expenditure will be necessary in the coming year. The delicate problem of refugee absorption must be solved smoothly and speedily. It can be done with the help and understanding of the community.

## ***In 1941***

Nothing less than a truly great and united effort in 1941 can prevent wholesale disaster from engulfing the Jews abroad and the refugees scattered around the world. In the past, the Jewish community of New York has done its share in providing for refugee needs and overseas aid, meeting its communal responsibilities in a forthright and determined manner. But in this tragic year we are witnessing an attempt to destroy and overthrow civilization itself. At such a time we cannot think merely in terms of "communal responsibility." Today we are fighting for the preservation of human rights, the dignity of man and the life and soul of the Jewish people. The United New York Appeal asks you to help in this struggle.

UNITED PALESTINE APPEAL OF GREATER NEW YORK

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE CHAIRMAN

FEBRUARY 20th, 1941

I am happy to be able to report that the Greater New York Campaign of the United Palestine Appeal has made excellent organizational progress in advance of the official launching of the campaign. Before proceeding to outline what has been done, may I take the liberty of making a few remarks about my own post as Executive Chairman of the Greater New York Campaign - a post of which I am very proud. When it became apparent that the United Palestine Appeal would be compelled to engage in an independent campaign - a fact which I deeply deplored, especially in view of the United Palestine Appeal's willingness to make many sacrifices for the sake of unity - I felt that I could do no less than accept the invitation to participate in the campaign. You may be aware that I have not been particularly active heretofore in Zionist affairs. But when I examined objectively the great role that Palestine is playing in the current world history - when I saw how much more humanely and effectively Palestine is coping with the problem of the refugees - when I saw how vital is the part that Palestine is playing in the defense of Great Britain and democracy the world over - I knew, that here was a cause which was the duty of every Jew, whether Zionist or non-Zionist, to support with all his heart and with all his might.

To return, then, to the organizational accomplishments of the campaign to date. We are happy indeed that the Hon. Herbert H. Lehman,

the Hon. Julian W. Mack, and Dr. Stephen S. Wise have joined us as Honary Chairmen. Their names would add lustre to any roll of honor.

We have as our Chairman that staunch veteran, Nathan Straus. Nathan Straus, whose very presence in the organization is a source of great strength. I am sad to think that he cannot be with us today because illness confines him to his home. I am sure that you all join me in praying for his swift and complete recovery.

As Co-Chairman, it is gratifying to have the privilege of recording the names of the Hon. Emanuel Greenberg, Mr. Arthur M. Rosenbloom, Mr. Max J. Schneider and Mr. Abraham F. Wechsler. We all know what their efforts have meant to the cause of Palestine in the past. They will mean no less in this great emergency effort. We may safely leave the care of our finances in the hands of our Treasurer, Mr. Abraham L. Liebovitz, who has with him as Associate Treasurers, Mr. Abraham Mazer and Mr. Jacob Sincoff.

Mr. Leonard Ginsberg, President of Hearn's, has agreed to grant us the benefit of his enthusiastic labors as Chairman of the Trades Council, and Mr. Harry A. Hatry, Vice-President of Bloomingdale's, will cooperate with him as Co-Chairman. Rabbi Irving Miller, whose indefatigable labors for Palestine need no review at this time, will serve as Chairman of our Executive Committee, and the Hon. Jonah J. Goldstein has consented to serve as Chairman of Boroughs Mr. Louis Nizer, himself a public speaker of great repute, is with us as Chairman of our Speakers' Bureau. The Chairman of our Employees Division is Dr. Harold M. Weinberg, so we need have no doubts as to the success of that division. Nor need we feel organizations will be handled in any but the most efficient manner, since

the Chairman of Organizations is Mr. Herman Hoffman. We have also set up a Women's Division, of which we are proud, and this division will be headed by Mrs. Leo Spitz as Chairman. We know that she will carry the Women's Division through to great accomplishments. Our Junior Division will see to it that the youth of Greater New York are made aware of what they can do to help the cause of Palestine. This division will be headed by Mr. Nathaniel S. Rothenberg as Chairman. Time does not permit me to name for you the many splendid gentlemen who have consented to participate in the campaign as Honary Vice-Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen, but I assure you that the list makes up a roster that could not easily be surpassed for presige and standing in the community.

With the help of these leaders and with the cooperation of all of you here assembled, I am confident that we shall go forward toward a brilliant success for the sake of Palestine. Under the capable direction of Mr. Samuel Blitz, a most efficient staff has been assembled and Mr. Blitz will report to you on the work that has been done in the trades and in the boroughs. I know that great strides have been made. We have a very real and effective story to tell the people of Greater New York this year and there is no doubt that this story will strike a responsive chord in the hearts of the Jews of New York.

MINUTES OF MEETING OF OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

UNITED PALESTINE APPEAL OF GREATER NEW YORK

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 20TH, 1941

AT CAMPAIGN HEADQUARTERS

PRESENT: Rabbi Irving Miller, presiding; Herman W. Bernstein, Bernard Crausman, Sidney Davidson, Harry P. Fierst, Jules L. Freed, David Freiburger, Judge Emanuel Greenberg, Dr. Bernard Joseph, Abraham Krumbein, Seymour Levine, Abraham L. Liebovitz, Major William J. Mack, Mrs. Augusta C. Rabbi Miller opened the meeting at 5:10 P.M. and welcomed the members of the Executive Committee. He read a message of greeting from Nathan Straus, Campaign Chairman, who is convalescing from his recent illness. Rabbi Miller also read a report submitted by Sylvan Gotshal, Executive Chairman of the Campaign, who was unavoidably called out of town. (Appendix A)

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Blitz reported that campaign headquarters have been established at 200 Madison Avenue, and that all departments of the campaign including field staff, treasurer's office, records department, and addressograph system are now in operation. Prior to the establishment of the Greater New York headquarters, the national offices of the UPA were made available so that there was no delay in the preparations for the campaign.

Campaign officers have been appointed in the various divisions, in the boroughs, and in a large number of trades. (Appendix B) Pressure for joint drives with the JDC and NRS is keeping our campaign officers busy with negotiations causing a serious delay in the campaign for funds.

In the boroughs, our local leaders insisted upon receiving 50% from joint drives which terms were refused by representatives of the JDC and NRS. In many trades, we have insisted on a 50-50 arrangement and we have refused to accept less than 40% in any trade.

Mr. Elitz reported that our people are subject to great pressure by JDC leaders who urge that terms for joint drives be left to borough and trade allocation committees. We cannot accept this proposal as the UPA cannot depend on such allocation committees for a fair allotment. He urged that our borough and trade leaders proceed with independent campaigns where negotiations have broken down in order to insure a maximum amount for the UPA.

A lengthy discussion ensued in which the following participated: Charles Ress, Henry Montor, Judge Emanuel Greenberg, David Freiburger, Abraham Liebovitz, Morris Weinberg, Carl Sherman, Major William Mack, Joseph Schlossberg and Jules Freed.

Rabbi Miller stated that negotiations were still possible for a national joint drive or for a joint drive in Greater New York. He urged that our leaders in every trade and borough insist on a maximum amount for the UPA in their negotiations, so that our national leaders may be strengthened by the assurance of the loyal support of the New York Campaign organization.

It was moved and unanimously adopted that the UPA cannot as a matter of policy enter upon a joint drive in any borough or trade where it is asked to commit itself in advance to accept any terms to be arrived at by a local allocation committee.

It was also unanimously decided that all terms for joint drives in any borough or trade be subject to the approval of the Officers and Executive Committee.

#### OPENING CAMPAIGN FUNCTION

It was reported that Dr. Chaim Weizmann is planning to sail for America on March 8th and that his arrival could be utilized for an opening campaign function. The following three proposals for an opening function were submitted for the consideration of the committee:

1. A dinner in honor of Dr. Weizmann
2. A public reception in Carnegie Hall
3. A demonstration in Madison Square Garden.

It was the consensus of opinion that the best interest of the campaign would be served by a meeting in Madison Square Garden and the matter was referred for action to the Campaign Officers.

#### ADVERTISING CAMPAIGN

Mr. Henry Montor presented a proposal for an extensive advertising program in the metropolitan press and stated that the National UPA may be willing to share one-third of the cost of such a campaign. Mr. Montor urged favorable action on this proposal, not for its fund raising possibilities, but as a medium of education and encouragement to the UPA workers and givers.

It was decided to approve the proposal in principle and refer the matter to the Campaign Officers.

#### ADDRESS BY DR. BERNARD JOSEPH

Dr. Bernard Joseph, Legal Adviser to the Jewish Agency in Palestine, delivered an address dealing with the present situation in Palestine and its relation to the UPA campaign. (Appendix C)

EXCERPTS OF ADDRESS BY DR. BERNARD JOSEPH

I did not come here to make a speech but I will say a few words since I am speaking to Zionist friends for the future of Zionism in this country.

I am amazed at the experiences which I have undergone in the last few weeks during my stay in America. In Palestine, I was always trying to persuade my friends that American Jews are very good business men and that they know what they want and usually get it. I am beginning to wonder whether they are still the same as they were twenty years ago.

How can you sit at your meetings and permit people to propose terms that are impossible and accept them? The most absurd suggestions have been considered and entertained seriously. You have a meeting and come to a decision and after that negotiations begin all over again. I don't understand it. How can you sit at these meetings and discuss terms with people who have their tongues in their cheeks.

We all want to help Jews and do not oppose the JDC but does that mean that we should forget our duty to Palestine and our people? You are trustees for the Nation. You have no right to throw away 10% and 20%, which mean lives of Jews and the welfare of Jews. You should know in your own minds what is right and what is unfair.

There is no doubt that the JDC does good work. They help Jews get from one country to another. It is important that food be given them. That is good but we must approach this problem from a national viewpoint. We are also a nation. America has millions who are without work. You do not stop buying cannon or warships. You do not stop rendering educational services and give all your money to your unemployed. You make a budget and say, I have so much money and must do certain things for my nation.

To take the point of view that the JDC is entitled to more than 50% is preposterous! The JDC has been doing good work since the last war but what have the Jewish people to show for it? Absolutely nothing! Expenditures have to be made. They must be made but how much may I spend on an expenditure which creates no permanent material value? We cannot approach these problems as individuals. We are a nation and must look at it from the point of view of a nation.

We have done a thousand times more for the Jewish people than the JDC. We have the greatest asset — Palestine. You have built up Palestine. That investment is of tremendous value and if we solve the problem, it will be you who did it.

What has JDC accomplished in the last twenty years for Jewish security and self-respect? Absolutely nothing! The only Jewish force is in Palestine. We must fight as a Jewish people. That is our national instrument with which to regain for us our national self-respect.

We are going to have millions of Jews at the end of the war in Europe who will have to find a home elsewhere. Where will you take them? Are you going to bring 200,000 Jews to Santa Domingo? You will again have a problem there. The only place to take hundreds of thousands of Jews is Palestine and under those circumstances, the amounts being given to the UPA are absurd. The fate of our people is sealed if we do not have a Jewish National Home. You are trustees of these people. Tell the representatives of the JDC that it is important that the Jewish people be fed, but we are engaged also in the prominent task of saving a nation. The problem cannot be solved as individuals.

We give up our lives in Palestine and do not surrender our position and you have no right to give up your position here. As Zionists you must unfurl the flag. We want a Zionist solution of the Jewish problem. Zionism welcomes every Jew. Palestine is open to all.

Now is the chance to solve our Jewish problem. Do not take 60-40. Even 50-50 is not fair. I appeal to you to take your positions and not give them up. Some of you have had the courage not to give up. You must follow the banner of Zion. Now is our chance for the Jewish people and you must not fail us.
