My dear Rabbi Silver:

May I hope to hear from you promptly.



My dear Mr. Harlem:

Let me thank you for your kind letter of September 17. Denver is a long way from Cleveland, and it will take considerable time out of my crowded program, as well considerable effort, to come to your opening meeting of the campaign. Realizing, however, how desperately important it is to bring to the Jewish communities of this country the plight of our people overseas, and the need for increased aid, I shall make an effort to be with you on November 26. I must, however, ask you and your friends to make all necessary exertions on your part to see that Denver makes a larger contribution to the United Jewish Appeal this year than last year. The success of any community campaign lies, of course, in the hands of five or six leading citizens who, by their own contributions, serve as an inspiration to others. If these men in your community will indicate their willingness to make larger gifts this year, I am confident that your campaign will be very successful. Headquarters in New York informs me that the United Jewish Appeal should receive from the Jewish community of Denver, this year, a minimum of \$75,000.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

As I suggested in our telephone conversation, I am particularly eager to have you, if in any way possible, accept the Dayton speaking invitation this year because Dayton does so badly need the type of stimulation that you and you alone can give them. Our friends among the leaders of Dayton expressed a keen desire to have you and I felt at liberty to invite you to go there because of the reasonable nearness of Dayton to Cleveland.

Dayton has a Jewish population of approximately 4,900 and in 1939 allotted to the U.J.A. the sum of \$30,926 out of a total raised of \$53,000. The amount which the U.J.A. asked from Dayton last year was \$55,000 and they accepted this quota. This of course did not mean anything because their goal of \$74,500 was not reached. We have requested \$60,000 from their welfare fund campaign this year and if Dayton can raise a substantially larger sum of money the U.J.A. will receive an increased allotment.

In a nutshell the difficulty in Dayton is that the few families of great wealth have not only not contributed per individual or per family unit in relation to their means, but they have pretty much held aloof from active and enthusiastic participation in these annual fund-raising efforts. Almost, I can say to you confidentially, they have conspired among themselves in advance as to that which they would be unwilling to do. In Dayton one truly finds the situation of a very small wealthy group on one side of the track and the rest of the community on the other side. I am speaking of course of the Jewish communal activities.

To overcome this difficulty this year, Dayton selected Mr. Chester Adler, owner of two department stores and a member of the wealthiest family in Dayton, as campaign chairman. When I first visited Dayton in June to discuss 1940 plans, Mr. Adler and his brother-in-law, Elmer Rauh, who is independently wealthy and who represents a family of wealth, were completely skeptical as to the possibilities of the Joint Distribution Committee and the United Palestine Appeal using any money if they could raise it.

Both of these gentlemen were in New York later and I arranged a luncheon at which Jonah Wise and Bill Rosenwald undertook to persuade them as to the necessities. I made a second trip to Dayton a few weeks ago and while I found these two leaders somewhat more convinced of the possibilities, I also discovered a desire on the part of Mr. Adler to hedge on the set-up that would really permit Dayton to go to town in its fund-raising this year.


You would hardly believe that until this year we have never been able to convince Dayton that advance gifts preliminary meetings, for example, serve a useful purpose. Mr. Adler is arranging for a meeting tomorrow at which Marvin Lowenthal will present the picture and at which an effort will be made to secure larger individual gifts than last year. I am not completely convinced that this meeting will be as successful as we would wish it and for that reason, as well as many others, I am particularly eager to have you go to Dayton on October 6 and have an opportunity to step up some of these big givers if necessary. This we could easily arrange for you by having a meeting in advance of that which I understand is to be the annual campaign dinner.

The Dayton community as a whole is an exceptionally fine community. The most important event, as they see it, of their campaign is their opening meeting to which they invite the entire community. They believe that they require, and I agree with them, a Rabbi Silver this year to really stimulate the community and particularly to satisfy them on the requirements of the agencies of the United Jewish Appeal, and their responsibility to them. They feel that if you will be their guest for their October 6th meeting, the entire town will enthusiastically turn out to greet you and hear your message. It will indeed be helpful if you can arrange to be their guest on this occasion.

Outside of Philadelphia, Boston and Cincinnati, Dayton is about as important as any community we have scheduled for Fall participation.

The announcement of your coming to Toledo has aroused great enthusiasm and interest on the part of the Jewish community and we all look forward to your stimulating presence.

UNITED JEWISH APPEAL FOR REFUGEES AND OVERSEAS NEEDS  
DIGEST - TOLEDO, OHIO  
Assigned Quota - \$100,000 - Jewish Population - 10,500

On June 26th a formal letter of application, together with budgetary material was sent to Rabbi Leon I. Feuer requesting \$100,000 as the UJA allotment from the 1940 campaign of the United Jewish Welfare Fund of Toledo. Copies were sent to J. Eugene Farber and Elmer Louis, Executive Director of the Fund.

The campaign will be launched officially on November 24th for a goal of \$125,000. A tentative budget has been adopted on a basis of \$100,000, out of which the UJA is allotted \$51,000. Mr. Louis has indicated that leaders do not want to release these figures for publication as yet, but Mr. Farber advises that the figures are final. Field Representative Fischer reports that Mr. Farber has advised that no allocation was made of the sums to be raised over \$100,000, but that all agencies have been included in their budget as set, and that indications are that we could, therefore, count on receiving practically all sums over \$100,000. Mr. Fischer believes that the budget was set up on a \$100,000 basis in order to avoid any increases to other agencies. In the past, the procedure of the Fund was to first pay in full the allocations to all lesser agencies, the UJA bearing the loss in uncollectible pledges. An item of \$10,000 has been allocated for shrinkage and Mr. Farber says that the understanding is we will receive whatever is left over from that sum. Mr. Farber is also of the opinion that the goal of \$125,000 will be oversubscribed, although Mr. Fischer doubts this.

In October Mr. Fischer reported that Mr. Louis indicated that the resettlement program will probably be allocated \$3500 as against \$1200 last year. The \$10,000 that was allocated last year for local defense purposes will be very considerably reduced this year; most of it was not used last year.

Mr. Fischer is greatly concerned over final results as the big givers have not been attending the big gifts meetings originally planned for them. In a report dated November 14, Mr. Fischer indicated that Mr. Louis believes that the lack of these meetings will have no effect on the outcome and that it would not change the total sum raised by so much as \$1,000 and that they will get their large gifts this year as in the past, to wit: by personal solicitation. The general feeling is good and they all feel that they will come close to \$125,000, except Mr. Farber who thinks they will even do better. However, in a later report (November 17) Mr. Fischer stated that at a conference in Indianapolis, Rabbi Leon Feuer stated that in his opinion \$100,000 will be raised and consequently he is also of the opinion that substantial increases will not be forthcoming. It is Rabbi Feuer's firm conviction that the only one who might be able to accomplish something is himself and is considering taking appropriate action to meet this situation.

Mr. Coons met with leaders here in September for the purpose of clarifying questions as to the possibility of the UJA to carry out its program overseas at this time. Mr. Coons used that occasion also, to urge Mr. Louis to have the Fund adopt a more formal method of budgeting which would insure the UJA more adequate consideration.



The Guldman Family, who are in a position to contribute generously, have indicated their intention of decreasing their gift in relation to last year.

Although Field Representative Platt, who has been in the community through the fall, setting up a detailed campaign organization, at first encountered skepticism as to the UJA's ability to function in War-torn Europe, he feels that he has convinced the leaders of the greatly increased needs, and reports the spirit and interest of the workers to be excellent. He feels, however, that the Red Cross, Finnish Relief and election drives, held previously, may have an unfavorable effect on campaign results this year.

On November 15th, a letter in your name was sent to the invitees to the November 26th meeting, announcing your visit, and urging attendance.

The 1939 Allied Campaign of Denver was held December 7 - 15th, for a goal of \$111,000. A total of between \$58,000 and \$59,000 was raised. The UJA was allocated \$45,000, against which \$40,000 has been paid to date, the balance being uncollectible.


My dear Rabbi Silver:
