Dear Charles:

It will be necessary to call a meeting of the Budget Committee some time within the next two weeks to consider our expenditures for 1942. This is in accordance with the direction of the Administrative Committee of the United Palestine Appeal.

Prior to the meeting, however, I have composed a draft and a tentative outline of what those expenditures will be. I have not been able to see how we could possibly reduce our expenditures in 1942 below \$148,000; the budget in 1941 was \$179,000. This would represent a reduction of \$31,000, - a reduction that must inevitably be felt in many directions.

In the draft which is herewith submitted note should be taken of the fact that all salaries of employees are fixed at the same amount as in 1941. It is very clear, however, that allowance will have to be made for increases, for reasons which are obvious, but I did not want to delay the budget until we had gone through the long process of determining what increases should be made to whom. I think in general we must agree with the principle that increases are both desirable and essential.

There are certain economies responsible for the reduction in the proposed budget. First, I have eliminated all offices for the United Palestine Appeal. You will recall that in 1941 the United Palestine Appeal had an office for its field representatives in Chicago and in Los Angeles. In addition to the offices there were girls employed there. There were also subventions to the Seaboard Region.

I look forward to a discussion with you of the individual details as soon as possible.

M E M O R A N D U M

TO : Officers of the United Jewish Appeal

Subject : Pledge and Payment Report

In submitting the Pledge and Payment Report of the 1941 United Jewish Appeal prepared as of November 30, we wish to call the attention of the officers to several of the problems that have arisen in the meantime as well as to summarize the status of the United Jewish Appeal.

As of December 15, 1941, the United Jewish Appeal has recorded pledges of \$12,566,700, representing allotments of \$8,017,500 from the country at large and gross pledges of \$4,549,200 recorded in the Greater New York U.J.A. drive, but not including approximately \$275,000 carried by New York City as additional "pledges to raise". There are a substantial number of communities, including Philadelphia and Boston, which have conducted or completed their 1941 fund-raising efforts but which have not yet reached decisions on allotments, or which have not yet informed the national headquarters of the amounts that will be made available, although in each of these cases we are anticipating certain amounts based on our experience during the past few years so that we estimate that the gross total pledges for the 1941 campaign will be over \$13,900,000.

The records show that as of December 15th approximately 3,800 communities have engaged in fund-raising efforts in which the U.J.A. was the sole, the major or a very substantial beneficiary.

Despite situations that have arisen in recent months involving anxiety as to the scope of the agencies in the U.J.A., it has been gratifying to observe the wholehearted cooperation of the communities in making available cash for the needs of the U.J.A. As of December 15th the U.J.A. received a total of \$8,358,278.60 in cash including \$5,258,178.60 from the country at large. This compares with the amount of \$8,393,732.66 in cash as of the same date in the 1940 campaign, including \$4,928,732.66 from the country at large. From New York City the U.J.A. national

office has received \$3,100,100 in cash, which compares with \$3,470,000 as of the same date in 1940.

The outbreak of war evoked questions from a number of communities as to the possibility of continued effective functioning. The agencies in the U.J.A. have endeavored to clarify their operations as rapidly as considered judgment would permit. It is fortunate that the U.J.A. has reached the end of its calendar campaign year so that the effects of misapprehension will not reflect themselves in the potentialities of income for the U.J.A.

It must be made clear, however, to the officers of the U.J.A. that each, in his own community, can render the utmost aid in the following ways:

(1) It is vital that there be no interruption in the collection of outstanding pledges to the U.J.A. The rate of remittances thus far has been most satisfactory. It should be clear to the officers, as to the country at large, that the operations of the U.J.A. agencies during the year 1941 have been based on commitments entered into in anticipation of income to be made available. Work has been done and funds have been borrowed on the basis of the good faith of the American Jewish communities. This major fact cannot be lost sight of in pressing for the most rapid and complete redemption of pledges, both from individuals and communities.

(2) A number of communities which conducted their campaigns in the Fall and which have not yet completed decisions must understand the importance of giving to the U.J.A. the fullest consideration in making decisions on allocations. It has been heartening to note that the campaigns held in the Fall in the major cities have been uniformly successful and have produced larger sums than in 1940. It is certainly a fair expectation that a generous share of this increased giving should be made available to the U.J.A. agencies.

There can be no prediction at this time as to the reaction of various economic and psychological factors on the further income of the 1941 U.J.A. It is assumed that any psychological uncertainty that may have followed in the wake of the first anxious days of the declaration of war will gradually subside as the situation is clarified by the action of the agencies in making clear the problems which continue to confront them in their work.

Insofar as the economic factors are concerned, it is of course obvious that all pledges, whether made to local communities or by communities to the U.J.A., represent a vital element in the maintenance of the good faith of American Jewry toward the institutions which have been enabled to keep going during the year 1941 on the justified assumption that pledges originally made would be faithfully fulfilled.

In this difficult transition period, the officers of the U.J.A. throughout the country can add to the service they have already rendered to the U.J.A. by exerting every effort to accelerate the flow of cash and, wherever allocations are still in doubt, to use their personal influence to assure the most favorable decisions.

1940 UNITED JEWISH APPEAL

As of December 15, total cash in the sum of \$12,628,645.59 has been received against total gross pledges of \$14,049,883.11. Most of the outstanding sum is made up of balances due from New York City, Philadelphia, Boston and Los Angeles.

A minimum estimate of additional receivable funds is \$165,000 and there may be substantially more.

1939 UNITED JEWISH APPEAL

Total cash has been received as of December 15 in the sum of \$15,173,054.85 against gross pledges of approximately \$16,125,000. A careful survey of all outstanding balances indicates that there remains in collectible accounts approximately \$65,000, almost two-thirds of which is anticipated from New York City and Buffalo.

In reply to your cable dated 11.11.41, the estimated budget of the Jewish Agency and of the Keren Hayesod for the year 5702 (see enclosure) was telegraphed to you on 12.12.41. In supplement to this estimate, I beg to submit the following details.

1. <u>Immigration & Immigrant Training</u>	40,000	42,582
The Agency has requested the approval of 6000 Immigration Certificates for workers in agriculture, industry, fisheries, etc. during the current immigration season. Possibilities still exist of transferring immigrants from Syria, Turkey, Iran, Iraq, Yemen and other countries. There are prospects also of obtaining permission for the release to Palestine of Jewish refugees from Poland, Lithuania and Latvia, now in Russia.		
The estimate comprises, among other items, L.P. 15,000 for immigrant transportation; L.P. 8,500 for immigrant training (Hachshara), and L.P. 5,000 for uncertificated immigrants who have been or will be released from the refugee concentration camps.

the increase and expansion of agricultural production, and the establishment of new pioneer enterprises in order to fortify our present positions.

The sum is allocated as follows:

LP. 195,000 for the continuation of colonizing activity in 42 new "watch-tower" settlements founded since 1936. Their number includes 33 collective settlements (kvutzoth) and 9 small-holder settlements. The sum set aside is for development of various farm branches, irrigation, construction of farm buildings and dwellings, machines and agricultural implements.

LP. 55,000 - for the consolidation of 16 "transition settlements" founded between 1928 and 1936, including 10 moshavim and 4 kvutzoth.

LP. 25,000 - for middle class colonization, on additional equipment, livestock, etc. for existing settlements, water supply installations, buildings for storage in the settlements of agricultural produce, loans for the purchase of seeds, for the expansion of the poultry branch and for vegetable raising.

LP. 15,000 - to the Agricultural Research Station, Rehovot for the continuation of research, the maintenance of the Planning Division, the laboratories and for experiments in the field, etc.

LP. 10,000 - for agricultural extension services, organizational expenditures, etc.

LP. 50,000 - for the construction of four new settlements to be devoted to the memory of Dov Hoz and Isaac Ben-Jacob.

3. Labour, relief, assistance to the Citrus Industry

125,000 124,690

Of the sum noted, LP. 60,000 are to be spent on grove maintenance loans with a view to ensuring the maintenance of groves at a minimum standard and in order to enable growers to employ Jewish labour.

Of the total grove acreage of 155,000 dunams in Jewish hands - 125,000 are cultivated by hired labour. Only 54,000 dunams are cultivated purely by Jewish labour, and this largely because of the assistance rendered by the Jewish Agency. Owners of 42,000 dunams are in need of cultivation loans, and could provide employment for 3,000 competent grove labourers settled in the colonies.

LP.10,000 are marked for the training of workers for industries important to the War effort. There is a demand for skilled workers in metal, machine and other industries.

A sum of LP2,000 is allowed for participation in the costs of occupational training of working youth; LP.750 for the transfer of urban working youth to agriculture; LP. 2,500 as our participation in constructive assistance to unemployed women workers; LP.3,000 as our contribution towards the cost of introducing Jewish workers into Government employment (transportation costs, housing assistance); and LP.1,500 for the instruction of agricultural workers in the citrus colonies.

The allotment for labour and housing includes LP.5,000 for the construction of dwellings in newly established labour camps, participation in joint housing funds, construction of sanitary installations in labour camps, participation in a loan fund for group and individual housing.

LP.5,000 for auxiliary farming loans for individual settlers and farmers groups.

LP.1,500 for small loans to labour groups.

LP.30,000 for relief, assistance, etc.

LP.10,000 for devoted to sea and fishing activities, training of fishermen, fish breeding ponds, to the establishment of fishermen settlements on the sea and lake coasts, for experimental fisheries, boats and equipment.

4. Political Department and Security 150,000 127,624

The sum indicated includes general political expenditure, security expenditure, expenditure in connection with enlistment to the Forces, expenses on servicemen's welfare, aeronautics, air-raid precautions, expenses of the Geneva and London Offices, support to various organizations, etc.

5. Education and cultural activities 50,000 45,718

In view of the difficult position of the school system of the Vaad Leumi, an increase of the Agency's grant to education from the previous level of LP.35,000 to LP.40,000 is necessary. The estimated total of LP.50,000 includes grants to the Bialik Foundation, the Rabbi Kook Institute, the theatres "Habima" and "Chel", the Palestine Orchestra, etc.

6. Trade and Industry 132,000 71,643

In addition to the sum of LP.71,643 spent in 5701, commitments were made by the Department of Trade & Industry to the sum of LP.18,500. The total expenditure in the previous year was thus LP.90,343.

The estimate for the current year includes LP.56,000 as additional participation in credit funds for the development of industry to meet wartime requirements, in small producer funds, long-term industrial credit, export promotion activities, guarantees to cover the accumulation of reserves in order to combat speculation and assistance to home crafts.

LP.40,000 are earmarked for constructive loans to artisans, small producers, small tradesmen and vendors, circulating capital for artisans and for participation in the activities of the Free Loan Fund Centre.

In addition the budget includes grants-in-aid and participation in various industry, trade and craft institutes, grants for occupational training and to various trade courses. The sum noted covers also expenditure by the Institute for Economic Research and the Economic Bureau at Tel-Aviv.

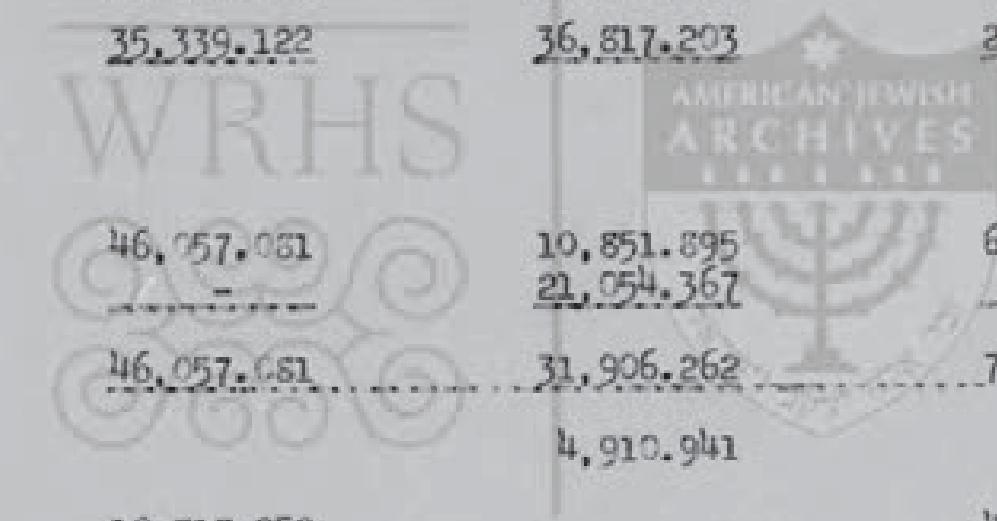

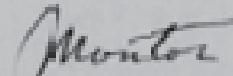

Gentlemen:

In accordance with instructions, we have examined the books and records of United Jewish Appeal, Inc. (1941) - national organization - from the effective date of the reconstitution of the joint appeal, March 16, 1941, to December 31, 1941. Reports were submitted by the constituent organizations setting forth the 1941 campaign collections received by them prior to the reconstitution of the joint appeal; we ascertained that the amounts paid over to U.J.A. were in accordance therewith. The expenses incurred by the constituent organizations in connection with launching their 1941 campaigns were reimbursed by the U.J.A. as hereinafter discussed.

Herewith we submit our report consisting of:

EXHIBIT A - Statement of Assets and Advances on Account
of Allocations and Liabilities of the 1941
Campaign at December 31, 1941

EXHIBIT B - Statement of Income and Expenses of the 1941
Campaign for the period reviewed

together with three supporting schedules.

We also submit, in Exhibits C and D and supporting schedules, comparative data relative to the campaigns from the beginning of the joint appeal, January 1, 1939, to December 31, 1941.

Under an agreement dated May 29, 1941, between American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and United Palestine Appeal, the 1941 Appeal continued the 1939 and 1940 organization of United Jewish Appeal, Inc., and conducted the unified fund-raising activities, in the United States, for refugees, overseas needs and Palestine, on behalf of:

American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc. (J.D.C.)
United Palestine Appeal, Inc. (U.P.A.)
National Refugee Service, Inc. (N.R.S.)

The agreement included the following provisions:

(a) The first \$5,500,000.00 allocated to the beneficiaries is to be divided as follows:

J.D.C.	\$4,275,000.00

An addendum to the agreement provided that the amount received by N.R.S. from United Jewish Appeal (national organization) shall be deemed to include the participation of the former in the proceeds of the Greater New York Campaign of the United Jewish Appeal.

(b) All amounts thereafter available for allocation shall be divided among U.P.A., J.D.C. and N.R.S. in the sole and exclusive discretion of an Allotment Committee. The Allotment Committee shall be composed of an equal number of nominees of J.D.C. and U.P.A., and shall also include three representatives of Welfare Fund communities who have been approved by J.D.C. and U.P.A. The members named by J.D.C. and U.P.A. are the following:

Representing J.D.C.:	James H. Becker Solomon Lowenstein I. Edwin Goldwasser Harold F. Linder

We understand that the following Welfare Fund community representatives have been named:

(c) An amount, agreed upon between the parties, shall be allocated to the Allotment Committee, when organized, for 1941 budget studies, personnel and overhead expenses. (For this purpose an amount not exceeding \$10,000.00 was authorized by the Treasurers; to December 31, 1941, \$8,500.00 had been advanced to the Committee.)

(d) All funds and assets, with certain specified exceptions, pledged to and/or collected directly by the beneficiaries, which would, in the ordinary course, be credited to the 1941 United States campaign of the recipient, including such items resulting from 1941 United States campaign activities, shall be transferred and/or paid over to the United Jewish Appeal, Inc., and shall be considered part of the receipts of the joint campaign and subject in their entirety to the provisions of this agreement. (We understand that you have not yet been advised of the amount of collections, if any, by the beneficiaries that come within the

scope of the agreement; this report is therefore subject to any adjustments that may be required in connection therewith.)

(e) The agreement shall be deemed to have commenced on January 1, 1941, and to expire on December 31, 1941.

(f) All details for implementing and carrying out the agreement are in charge of the National Chairmen of United Jewish Appeal, Inc., or their respective nominees.

The agreement also provides that expenditures incurred by J.D.C., U.P.A. and N.R.S. in connection with the launching of their campaigns for 1941, prior to the reconstitution of the United Jewish Appeal, shall be dealt with as provided in a memorandum approved and subscribed by representatives of J.D.C. and U.P.A. Schedules (which we were informed represented the memorandum referred to above) submitted by the accountants for J.D.C. and U.P.A. and approved by Frederick F. Greenman, Esq., who, we understand, was designated as the mediator, indicated the amounts to be reimbursed to J.D.C. and U.P.A. by the reconstituted Joint National and Greater New York Appeals.

With respect to the allocation of funds over the first \$5,800,000.00 (see point (b) of the previously referred to May 29, 1941, agreement), on December 4, 1941, the Allotment Committee decided (as per an unsigned copy of the decision, the original of which was not available for our examination) as follows:

(a) To divide the sum of \$2,800,000.00 as follows:

J.D.C	\$1,275,000.00
U.P.A	500,000.00
N.R.S	<u>725,000.00*</u>
T o t a l . . .	<u>\$2,800,000.00</u>

**\$50,000.00 of this amount was earmarked for the specific purpose of permitting refugees with temporary visas to leave the country and return on permanent visas. If the State Department failed to issue new regulations in this regard before December 31st, the \$50,000.00 reverted to the Allotment Committee for distribution."

With reference to the final disposition of this item, refer to item (c) on page 4, hereof.

(b) The Allotment Committee would agree on the distribution of all funds in excess of the \$2,800,000.00 prior to the annual meeting of the Council of Jewish Federation and Welfare Funds, to be held in Chicago early in 1942.

On December 31, 1941, an agreement was made between J.D.C. and U.P.A. to conduct a united appeal for 1942. Since the details thereof are not pertinent to this report, they have not been included herein.

However, a letter dated December 31, 1941, from Mr. Edward Warburg on behalf of J.D.C. and Judge Morris Rothenberg on behalf of U.P.A. to Mr. William Rosenwald, President of N.R.S., "for the purpose of recording an understanding reached on certain points not included in the agreement for 1942" (previously referred to), stated:

- (a) "It is agreed that there shall be an acceleration to the National Refugee Service of \$300,000 during the month of December, 1941, from the proceeds of the United Jewish Appeal 1941 Campaign, to be absorbed by the U.J.A. from payments due the N.R.S. over a period from January 1st to June 30th, 1942."
- (b) "... it is understood that the National Refugee Service will receive such share of the 1941 proceeds of the United Jewish Appeal to which it is entitled in the normal course of collections."
- (c) "It is also agreed that the National Refugee Service may obtain the \$50,000 contingent fund which it was voted by the Allotment Committee of the United Jewish Appeal out of the 1941 proceeds of the United Jewish Appeal and that it may use the same for general National Refugee Service purposes."

Checks issued by the United Jewish Appeal, Inc. (1941) were signed by at least two persons, one designated by J.D.C. and the other by U.P.A.

In October, 1941, letters were sent to community and organization contributors (except late or fall campaigns which will be circularized at a later date) requesting confirmations of their pledges and payments to the 1941 Campaign at September 30, 1941. The replies received indicated the correctness of the recorded cash and the substantial accuracy of the pledge records.

Your controller informed us that (a) amounts may be due from contracting organizations of the United Palestine Appeal for contributions received and (b) such amounts have not as yet been determined; consequently, no effect has been given thereto in the accompanying statements.

The scope of our examination of the income of the 1941 Campaign is similar to that of the 1939 and 1940 Campaigns; for details thereof, reference should be made to our report dated February 3, 1940.

An expense budget of \$370,000.00, net (\$395,000.00 for current expenses, less \$25,000.00 to be charged to the 1940 Campaign for collection expenses) for the period from March 16, 1941, to December 31, 1941, was adopted for the campaign. The amount budgeted does not include: (a) any allowance for reimbursements to the constituents previously referred to; (b) the collection costs of 1941 campaign balances outstanding at the close of the current campaign year; and (c) the expenses of the Allotment Committee.

The reimbursements to J.D.C. and U.P.A. for expenditures prior to organization (including cash items totaling \$163,707.77 and advances to field representatives, automobiles, etc.) were negotiated and agreed upon by the contracting parties. Since your Executive Committee approved these payments, we did not consider that such reimbursements came within the scope of our examination.

The following comments are pertinent to the items appearing in Exhibit A:

CASH ON DEPOSIT --- \$470,488.29

The balances were confirmed by correspondence with the bank.

RAILROAD SCRIP ON HAND --- \$6,117.80

This account represents scrip purchased prior to October 10, 1941, the effective date of the 5% federal transportation tax, entitling the holder to purchase tax-free railroad transportation accommodations. This balance does not include scrip in the hands of field representatives.

PETTY CASH FUND --- \$500.00
POSTAGE FUND --- 300.00

These funds were counted by us.

SUNDAY RECEIVABLES --- \$427.18

This amount comprises a claim of \$427.18 against your insurance company for a wrecked automobile and a balance of \$50.00 due in connection with the sale of an automobile. Both items were paid during January, 1942.

ADVANCES TO FIELD REPRESENTATIVES, ETC. --- \$4,027.32

Included herein are revolving fund advances (consisting of cash and railroad scrip) to field representatives, officers and speakers for expenses.

DEPOSIT --- \$425.00

This item represents the deposit required by Transcontinental & Western Air, Inc., in connection with your account with that company.

AUTOMOBILES, NET --- \$5,013.05

This account represents the book value (after deducting depreciation, included in fieldmen's traveling expenses) of the remaining automobiles used by fieldmen for traveling.

FURNITURE, FIXTURES AND OFFICE EQUIPMENT ----

The 1941 Campaign spent \$1,963.50 for office furniture and typewriters, which, in accordance with your practice, was charged to current expenses.

So far as we could ascertain at the time of our audit, all unpaid expenses applicable to the period under review have been included. However, no provision was made for the necessary subsequent expenses of collecting the unpaid campaign pledges. In this connection it is pertinent to state that the 1940 Campaign reimbursed the 1941 Campaign from March 16, 1941, in the amount of \$25,000.00 and that \$35,000.00 was paid by the 1939 Campaign to the 1940 Campaign.

The liabilities were not verified by correspondence with creditors.

With the exception of cash on deposit, \$470,455.29, and sundry receivables, \$477.18, all the assets set forth in Exhibit A have been transferred to the 1942 Campaign and reimbursed by the latter. It is also necessary for the 1941 Campaign to make cash advances to the 1942 Campaign for preliminary expenses, etc.

Dear Judge Rosenblatt:

I herewith submit to you statistics on the basis of which it is possible to estimate what the United Palestine Appeal may receive for the period ending September 1942 from the United Jewish Appeal. It should also be noted that the income of the U.P.A. also includes the net income from the Jewish National Fund.

On the basis of what the U.P.A. will receive from the U.J.A. and from the J.N.F. during the five months from May through September 1942, it may be expected that the Keren Hayesod in America will receive as its share the sum of approximately \$300,000. That sum will come from receipts of the 1940, 1941 and 1942 campaigns of the U.J.A. plus income of the J.N.F., which is estimated now at approximately \$40,000 a month.

In arriving at the figure as to what the U.P.A. may have available for distribution between the Keren Hayesod and Keren Kayemeth, it will be noted that in addition to the administration expenses of the U.P.A., there are deductions for the Mizrachi Palestine Fund, which received \$125,000 per year, the Poale Zion, the Mizrachi and the Zionist Organization of America.

You will note that the heaviest months of income for the U.P.A. from the 1942 campaign will be in June and July.
