ASSETS OF THE JOC

There can be no doubt that there are assets of the JDC in existence whice are not listed in their Statements of Resources and Liabilities. In the Report for the Year 1933 and Early Months of 1934, the following note appears on Page 81, where the Statement of Resources and Liabilities is published:

""Hote - The foregoing statement is exclusive of the following:

can Joyish Joint Agricultural Corporation, the American Joint Reconstruction Foundation, the Palestine Economic Corporation, and other assets which may exist abroad as a result of investments in kindred organizations or of disburgements having residual value."

According to a note published in the Report for 1939, these assets, however, are not available for the general relief work of the JDG. This note (Page 4 runs as follows:

The above statement does not include the following

items, investments in American Joint Reconstruction Joundation, Falestine Reconstruction Chesel Rassas, etc., available only for continued us in the present activities and being of no immediate cash value to the J.D.C.

If this note represents the truth - and what is equally important - the whole truth, Mr. Linder may be justified in stating that the JDD has no assets which could be converted into each and which could be used in the present emergency.

It would, of course, be quite interesting to know what is meant by "among they fire and by the "etc." appearing in the second note quoted above. In view of the swantwe methods used by the JDG, however, it is impossible these generalities. On the other hand, I do believe it would be relatively simple for one of our people, who is at the same time a member of the JDG Council (and certainly Professor Ginsberg), to obtain a full statement from the JDG of all its assets.

My dear Mr. Montors In the course of Mr. Lurie's report on the subject of National Advisory Budgeting, yesterday, he indicated that the committee has already been studying two organizations, The Hebrew University and the Ort, and that the Hebrew University report was almost completed. I am amazed that the Hebrew University did not cooperate with us in delaying action until our controversy over the subject of Advisory Budgeting was over. Is the Hebrew University working with us, or against us? I would suggest that you contact immediately the secretary of the Hebrew University and tell him what the action of the Zionists of America had been on that score. Remind him also that the Hebrew University is receiving a subsidy from the UPA, and suggest that no further cooperation be extended to the Council Fact-Finding Committee until our differences are adjusted. Please communicate also with all other fund-raising Palestinian agencies apprising them that negotiations are still going on and have not been settled, and that no cooperation be extended to the Council until the matter is finally disposed of. In accordance with the suggestion made at the meeting of the Administrative Committee of the United Palestine Appeal on September 25th, I spoke to Joseph C. Hyman of the Joint Distribution Committee today as to the procedure to be followed for a discussion of a 1942 United Jewish Appeal.

Mr. Hyman said that the logical procedure would be for the United Palestine Appeal and the Joint Distribution Committee each to appoint its own committee and that arrangements could then be made for a meeting of these groups in accordance with a provision of the 1941 United Jewish Appeal agreement that the 1942 campaign should be discussed not later than October 31, 1941.

Mr. Hyman informed me that he had met with you in Cleveland during a meeting of the Council Board, and that the question had been raised as to the participation of the Council of Federations in the discussions for 1942. He stated that Mr. Shroder and Mr. Hollander had suggested that, with respect to 1942, the Council should have its representatives attend the discussions from the very beginning as contrasted with the situation in 1940. Mr. Hyman stated that this procedure was agreeable to you.

Mr. Hyman also reported that Mr. Rosenwald felt that, since the National Refugee Service had a large stake in the United Jewish Appeal, it, too, should have representatives attend the discussions from the beginning.

At yesterday's meeting of the AC, the Regional reorganization plan proposed at the Convention, was ratified. We now have a mandate to proceed to reorganize the ZOA Regional setup. I understand from Rabbi Breslau that you have expressed a willingness to give up UPA field service, as such, on the understanding that the field representatives of the ZOA would in addition to directing membership and program activities on behalf of the ZOA, also carry on UPA promotional work. Your office would supply our office with the material and our field men would carry on UPA work simultaneously with and as an integral part of our Zionist field service. This, obviously, would achieve results which you and I have frequently discussed. Anything which will strengthen Zionist organizational structure and functional activity must of necessity strengthen the UPA position.

I expect to be in New York on October 15th to attend a meeting. My present plans would keep me in New York on the 16th and 17th at which time I should like to interview prospective candidates for the various field positions. I would very much appreciate if you would furnish me with a list of your field men with some confidential comment as to their relative merits. Later, I should like to ask you if you could arrange to have some of the most likely of these men meet me in New York on the 16th and 17th for a personal interview.

I would also appreciate if you could give me a copy of your Regional setup. I am particularly interested in the geographical outlines and the reasons for establishing the lines as they are. This information would be very helpful to us in our future planning.

I hope I'm not imposing upon you unduly. Reciprocating your very warm New Year's greetings and with kindest regards.

This will acknowledge your letter of September 29th.

I look forward to seeing you in New York and to the cooperative work which we can do on behalf of the ZOA and the UPA.

At the last meeting of the Administrative Committee of the United Palestine Appeal, it was suggested that Judge Levinthal, Dr. Silver, you and I meet at an early opportunity to review the situation and formulate a program on realistic lines for coordination of efforts. Your letter of September 29th and its effectuation along the lines you have in mind must necessarily await such a meeting, which, I am sure, you would welcome,

There seems to be some misunderstanding as to how a Regional program is to be effected and what the relationship is to be between the United Palestine Appeal and the Zionist Organization of America. Surely you will agree that this must come about through a consensus of opinion as between the UPA and the 264 and cannot be unilateral action taken by the 20A itself. I have always taken the position that a powerful Zionist Organization of America is the best asset that the United Palestine Appeal could possibly have. Our experience has proved that wherever the Zionist Organization was weak in the locality, effects upon the UPA have been evident. At the same time, we ought not to ignore the wisdom of creating a variety of fronts on which the Zionist movement can express itself and on the basis of which it can attract forces which, for good or bad reasons, hesitate or are unvilling to become officially identified with the Zionist Organization. All of these matters should be canvassed in the discussion which Dr. Silver, Judge Levinthal, you and I must have on the subject. Until that time, do you not think that it would be premature on my part to take action that could only be individual in character and have none of the authoritative quality of action by the United Palestine Appeal leadership?

There is a variety of problems which must be canvassed and for which there cannot be any cut-and-dried solution. For

Mr. Simon Shetzer October 2, 1941 example, there is the question as to whether one man, operating in the membership field, can also have the time and energy to do whatever supplementary UPA work is required and vice versa. Perhaps a meeting could be arranged in Cleveland earlier than the date you have indicated so that being the common point between all of us, it may be most convenient for Dr. Silver, you, Judge Levinthal and myself. Please let me know how this suggestion strikes you so that we can deal with this problem not on a personal basis, but officially, so that whatever action is taken may have binding character. Instead of suggesting to the organizations whom they should designate for the conference on social security for employes, it would be better to apprise the organizations of the action of the UPA and request that they send their presiding officers.

Inasmuch as I am to be in New York for the meeting of the Allotment Committee on the 16th and 17th, it might perhaps be well to have a meeting with the representatives of the JDC for a discussion of the 1942 campaign on Wednesday evening, October 15th. I would suggest that each group have three representatives. It was I who suggested at the Council Board meeting in Cleveland that the Council, if it wishes to be helpful in the negotiations, the should come in right from the beginning and not as it managed to do last year, as a partisan towards the end. The Council should also have three representatives. I do not believe that any good can be served at this preliminary meeting to have the representatives of the NRS present. The two overseas agencies who are the partners to the contract should have an opportunity to discuss their problems by themselves at first. Certainly before the negotiations will be much advanced, the representatives of the NRS will be called in.

It will not be possible for me to attend the New Jersey State Conference in November.

Dear Henry:

A few days ago I discussed the reported intention of the Defense Agencies (American-Jewish Committee and B'nai B'rith Anti-Defamation League) to make an independent solicitation of funds in Los Angeles, with the Western regional representative of the Council of Federations and Welfare Funds. When I say "independent" I mean outside of the Welfare Fund. He asked me what inference was to be drawn from the report of the Allocations Committee to the Board of the Los Angeles Jewish Community Council in which this notation appeared:-

"No allocations had been made for the American*Jewish Committee or the Anti-Defamation League because of contemplated special campaign for their increased joint needs to restricted list of givers."

The report of the Allocations Committee was not discussed or acted upon because of the lateness of the hour when it was reached in the agenda for the meeting. Whether this phase of the report will be given special attention in the discussion of the allocation schedule, I, of course, cannot foretell. At this writing I anticipate that a special meeting will be held for consideration of the Allocations Committee report.

It was with Samuel Holcenberg that I had the discussion referred to, and he stated that he was immediately writing to Harry Lourie of the Council of Federations and Welfare Funds with special emphasis on these possibilities.

- (a) The setting of a precedent in relation to other beneficiary agencies and organizations.
- (b) The possible effect of a substantial collection even though from a comparatively few, on the next campaign for the United Jewish Appeal.
- (c) The extent to which the knowledge of this separate solicitation here may be reflected by similar movements in other Welfare communities.

I repeat frankly that I regard it as unimportant whether the substantial sum indicated comes from a small group or a large group. The other principles involved are the real danger signals. Just when this campaign will take place I do nit know. Joe Willen told me when he was here in August that he was coming back in September to do the job. I do not believe he has been here this month.

We are continuing our efforts to reach a total of \$702,000, and as of this date we have approximately \$693,000. We are combing every list that shows any possibility and we are waging a fairly spirited mail campaign. In addition to this, of course, I do make some personal contacts and I think you will understand when I say that this phase of the campaign is to me always the most aggravating and in some respects it brings me more directly in line with or personally in contact with many individuals who have refused or neglected to contribute, and when your thoughts are directed to individuals rather than the masses, that is when it gets particularly foul under the hide.

Thank you for your good wishes, especially for Mrs. Nathan, who is still confined in a sanitarium, but who now gives more definite promise of ultimate recovery.

I received yours of October 8th.

I regret that I cannot attend the New York meeting on October 19th for the reason that on that date I am scheduled to speak at Little Rock, opening their Welfare Fund Drive.

I will be glad to receive any literature about the settlement in the Dominican Republic, in which, of course, I am interested. I rather gather the impression that this project is moving too slowly. From 1939 to the present time you have only 425 settlers, with 200 more expected within two months - a total of 625 settlers. From January of 1940 to the present time is 22 months. This is getting settlers out of Europe at the rate of 26.5 per month.

At this rate, it will take 377 months, or more than 31 years to get 100,000 people out of Europe.

Perhaps this to something to grow enthusiastic over - but I cannot do it.

In these times of crises we should concentrate on moving people to the place where they can readjust with the least cost. I have not seen the capita figures of expense on the Dominican Republic settlement proposition - but I wenture the guess that you could have moved a far greater number of people to Palestine for the same money that it has cost you to move 625 people to the Dominican Republic.

I think this project reflects poor Jewish leadership.

It is just such projects as this which adversely affect giving for overseas needs.

Dear Henry:

I have read very carefully your letter of October 2nd, and it surely gives one plenty to think about.

I have always believed that the Zionist Organization of America should take upon itself certain specific work.

However, I think whatever action they take involving relationship between the Jewish National Fund, the Keren Hayesod or the U.P.A., attention should be given to the relationship of these organisations to all other Zionist factions, as well as non-Zionist, but sympathizers of Palestine.

It would be too bad if the Z.O.A. would so completely capture these major funds, or give the impression that they dominated these funds so completely, that the other Zionist bodies would feel that they were being pushed aside.

Even that wouldn't be so bad if there could be absolute assurance that the Z.O.A. would undertake the support of these funds with vigor, enthusiasm and intelligence.

To make any drastic changes in the hope that they would be able to give full support to the programs that they suggest, is certainly not based on past experience with Z.O.A. activities.

I submit herewith for your consideration four letters and ideas in connection with the preparations for the National Conference in Cleveland. I trust you will forgive the liberty I have taken in making several of these suggestions inasmuch as they involve you and your person rather than being merely official in character.

But I should like very much, in view of the unusual situation that exists in having the Conference in Cleveland, to take advantage of the personal aspect and build up the kind of attendance that will mean most to us throughout the country in good will on the part of the persons on whom we depend for an understanding of our work.

- (1) A draft of a letter to be sent to all important national Jewish organizations inviting them to send representatives to the National Conference in Cleveland.
- (2) A more specific request of Zionist organizations for cooperation in stimulating interest in the Cleveland Conference.
- (3) A special approach to Presidents of Welfare Funds and similar key leaders throughout the country asking them to meet with you for lunch on Saturday, January 17th. The approach in this instance is on the social plane, one of the respects in which we have been rather derelict. Because it separates the occasion from the routine sessions to which tens of thousands of people are invited it is more attractive as a magnet for attendance. One of our handicaps in previous Conferences has been the inability to get a uniform attendance of Welfare Fund leadership. It is in an effort to remedy this latter that I make this suggestion and hope you will approve.
- (4) The last suggestion involves a special approach to the Directors of Welfare Funds throughout the country. We cannot forget that these men wield an enormous amount of influence throughout the year and are important factors in their communities. Therefore I infringe upon your private life to the extent of asking

Dr. Abba Hillel Silver - 2 - October 23, 1941 whether you would be willing to sponsor a little gathering in your home. I do not know how many of the 125 Welfare Fund Directors throughout the country would be able to attend, but I think that even an invitation to come to your home would be most flattering. If they would respond it would undoubtedly be more effective in terms of good will than participation in any number of conferences. I imagine that in making the suggestion I invade the domain of Mrs. Silver. Perhaps she may find it appropriate to approve. The great benefit that we enjoy in having the Conference in Cleveland is that we have leadership which is rooted in the local community and has the capacity for doing things which could never be done in Washington, for example. In order to expedite action as rapidly as possible, I trust that I may have your approvals or corrections on these four suggestions at your earliest convenience. At this particular moment Mr. Edward Warburg and Mr. Joseph Hyman are paying Portland a visit. They plead for more funds for the work of the J.D.C. I cannot see how their plea can go unanswered and yet we have no means to grant even a dollar increase of what we have already allocated to the U.J.A.

Confidentially, it appears to me that these gentlemen are greatly concerned over the fact that the division between J.D.C. and U.P.A. is not equitable and that unless a more reasonable arrangement can be worked out there is a probability of separate appeals. I wonder whether you know anything about that situation.

The aggressive action of the Zionists in last year's referendum has seemingly bestirred the men who are looking after the cause of the J.D.G. So you can see my dear Jacob that we in this community are, like in all other communities perhaps, confronted with a real problem, that is lack of funds to meet these tremendous calls and by reason of our inability to raise sufficient money many of the institutions are dissatisfied and many causes are entirely neglected.

There is a feeling in our community that if there is a U.J.A. next year, that all funds for Palestinean purposes should be merged into one allocation. Please let me have your reactions to that suggestion. It is hard to battle against such a proposal because on the face of it it seems fair.

You will recall my own belief that the U.P.A. should have a definite place in the communal program of Chicago. It was the feeling of some of our friends, however, that this was merely duplication and that the role could be adequately filled by the Zionist District. It is my feeling and conviction that we should undertake exactly the same kind of meeting as has been held for the other causes. It would certainly be helpful if those members of the Chicago Jewish Welfare Fund Board who share your views on Palestine would join with you in such a gathering. It occurs to me that the most effective personality for such an occasion would be Mr. Israel Sieff, who, as one of England's foremost industrialists and philanthropists, might serve as a special megnet for the lukewarm. Incidentally, he is one of the most impressive speakers I have ever heard and he is as familiar with the realities of Palestine as any man in this country. It is also complimentary to the U.P.A. that one of its field representatives should have been taken into one of the major communities for a post of this character. Subject: Summary of conversation between Joe Weingarten and Simon Shetzer

On Monday of this week Joe Weingarten and Simon Shetzer got together in order to discuss local Zionist matters and having me used as both the Z.O.A. and U.P.A. representative in the area.

With regard to the latter, Joe Weingarten made it plain in no uncertain terms that he was very much opposed to my being the Z.O.A. representative, because it would result in the alienation of many local leaders who want to have nothing to do with Zionism but are anxious to cooperate with the United Palestine Council and the United Palestine Appeal. Joe became very heated when Shetzer pressed the idea in devious ways, and finally Shetzer got the point that it wouldn't be such a good idea to have one field representative - and that it would be better to have a separate Z.O.A. man in the area.

Shetzer and Weingarten discussed the forthcoming campaign for Zionist Organization membership, and Shetzer asked Weingarten to assume chairmanship of this drive. Weingarten refused to do so because he stated that he intended to devote the majority of his time to the Council in order to build it up because he viewed it as the strongest possible agency to win the support of people heretofore untouched by the Zionist Organization for Palestine. I could see that Shetzer disapproved this view of Weingarten's, especially since the status of the names attached to the Council was so much higher than that of the local Zionist district. Shetzer wanted to have these people become the leaders of the Zionist Organization - because it was, after all, the parent body of all Palestinian movements. Joe agreed with Shetzer, but pointed out that the majority of people to date affiliated with the Council were not strong Zionists but strongly in favor of what was accomplished in Palestine, and to attempt to get them to be Zionists in a hurry would only cause their alienation of affection and spread the word around that all the Council was, was the Zionist Organization in a different form. Joe and the other people didn't look upon the Council that way, but indicated to Shetzer that he was sure that the work of the Council would result in the making of many more Zionists. I suggested to Joe, and he agreed with me, that the Council could be very helpful in the forthcoming campaign of the Zionist Organization by getting in touch with key men throughout the four states and having them participate in the membership drives within their local communities. Before Shetzer left we worked out a number of names who will be contacted by Weingarten and asked to take part in these drives, and it was also decided that for the time being, until a Z.O.A. field man comes in, I was to assist in whatever way possible in the formulation of the plans and their execution for the membership drive of the Z.O.A.

I think that Shetzer is pretty much convinced now that it will not work to have the U.P.A. and the Z.O.A. man one and the same person. He has not given up hope altogether, because he asked me to work on Weingarten and try to get him to change his mind. I don't think that Joe will, nor will such people as we had present at our Conference, favor the idea.

Dear Phil:

In general, I believe the proposed Certificate of Incorporation and By-Laws of the above corporation are both workable. However, I have the following suggestions:

I would prefer the following title:

THE UNITED JEWISH APPEAL OF GREATER NEW YORK FOR REFUGEES, OVERSEAS NEEDS AND PALESTINE INC.

As to the Certificate of Incorporation:

Purpose clauses:

1. Clause 2 in the second paragraph of the certificate should read:

"To distribute its net receipts, or any part thereof, to the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., the United Palestine Appeal, Inc., the Mational Refugee Service, Inc. and among such charitable corporations, associations, committees and/or agencies (hereinafter called "beneficiary agencies"), heretofore or hereafter organized, as are engaged in such relief, rehabilitation, and settlement work, and as may, in accordance with the provisions of such by-laws as are adopted by the corporation, become beneficiaries thereof, the manner, proportion, and amounts of said distribution to be regulated in the manner provided in the said by-laws."

- 2. Clause 7 would appear to have no place in an organization of this kind and should be eliminated.
- 3. Clause 8 should be modified so as to eliminate the power "to borrow money for its corporate purposes."
- 4. Clause 9 should be eliminated.
- 5. Paragraph Third, the words "and adjacent or neighboring territories and communities" should be eliminated.
- 6. Paragraph Fifth, there appears to be no need for the words "and may be divided into classes not exceeding three, in accordance with the provisions that may be set forth in the By-Laws of the corporation" in the Certificate of Incorporation. This, or a similar provision, may be placed in the By-Laws. My main reason for objecting to including the provision in the Certificate of Incorporation is that any subsequent change would require the filing of a certificate of amendment. This would seem to be unnecessarily cumbersome.

As to the By-Laws:

1. The title should read

"BY - LAWS

of

THE UNITED JEWISH APPRAL OF GREATER NEW YORK FOR REFUGERS, OVERSEAS NEEDS AND PALESTINE. INC."

2. Article II, Section 1 should read:

"The members of the corporation shall consist of contributors to the United Jewish Appeal."

All subsequent clauses dealing with membership and the right of membership must be modified in accordance with the fundamental principle that all who contribute to the United Jewish Appeal are regarded as members.

3. Article III, Section 2 should provide that:

"Special meetings of the membership may be called... at any time by... or at the request, in writing, of fifty (50) members in good standing of the corporation."

4. Article III, Section 4, should contain a clause:

"A majority vote of those present and voting at any meeting at which a quorum exists shall be requisite and adequate for any resolution, act or decision of the membership at any of its meetings, annual or special, it being understood that a quorum shall consist of at least fifty (50) members."

- 5. Article III, Section 6, should be modified in keeping with the manner in which the Board of Directors is to be elected as provided for in Article IV.
- 6. Article III should contain the following provision:

"Notice of the time, place and proses of annual or special meetings of members may be given and/or waived in writing or by telegram or letter, and attendance at any such meeting shall be deemed such a Waiver of Notice."

7. Article IV, Section 3, should read as follows:

"The Board of Directors shall consist of two (2) classes of members: one named by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., and the other by the United Palestine Appeal, Inc., each having equal and similar rights as members of the Board of Directors."

All subsequent clauses and sections in this Article should be modified accordingly.

- 8. Article IV, Section 5 should be eliminated so that the Board of Directors may be elected annually instead of by rotation over a three year period.
- 9. Article IV should contain a provision that:

"Notice of the time, place and purposes of any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors may be given or waived in writing or by telegram or letter, and attendance at any such meeting shall be deemed a Waiver of Notice."

- 10. Article V. Section 1, no power should be vested in the corporation to permit it to establish reserves.
- 11. Article V, Section 2 should read as follows:

"Except as otherwise provided in this article, all of the net funds or property thereafter remaining in the hands of the corporation shall be transferred to the national United Jewish Appeal for Refugees, Overseas Needs and Palestine for distribution in such manner as shall have been agreed upon between the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc. and the United Palestine Appeal. Inc. in the setting up of the national United Jewish Appeal, Inc. of the particular year; failing the existence or the continuation in any year of the national United Jewish Appeal, Inc. as a fund-raising instrument for the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc. and the United Palestine Appeal, Inc. the funds of the United Jewish Appeal of Greater New York shall be distributed among the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., the United Palestine Appeal, Inc. and the National Refuges Service, Inc. in such proportion and in accordance with such formulae, manner and procedure as shall be determined from time to time by contracts entered into between these corporations."

12. Article V, Section 3 should read:

"Any philanthropic agency or agencies (whether incorporated or otherwise) which engage in the relief, rehabilitation and settlement work described in subdivision 1 of paragraph Second of the Certificate of Incorporation may be admitted as a 'beneficiary agency' or 'beneficiary agencies' of the corporation and as a 'distributee' or 'distributees' of its funds, after assent to such inclusion shall have been given by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., the United Palestine Appeal, Inc. and the National Refugee Service, Inc."

13. Article V, Section 4 should read:

"The Board of Directors, by a three-fourths vote, shall prescribe the terms and conditions on which such philanthropic agency or agencies shall become beneficiary agencies at a meeting called upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice mailed to each director or Executive Committee member, after the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc., the United Palestine Appeal, Inc. and the National Refugee Service, Inc. have given their assent to the inclusion of such additional beneficiary agency or agencies in the corporation as provided for in Section 3."

14. Article VII, Section 1 should read:

"The Board of Directors, by resolution passed by three-fourths of the entire Board present and voting at any meeting, regular or special, may appoint an Executive Committee of not less than thirty (30) members nor more than fifty (50) directors who shall have and may exercise during the intervals between meetings of the Board of Directors the powers vested in, or which may be exercised by, the Board of Directors, except to fill vacancies in the Board of Directors or in the Executive Committee, or to amend the by-laws."

"At any meeting of the Executive Committee eighteen (18) members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and all questions shall be decided by a majority of those present and voting."

15. Article VII, Section 4 should read:

"The Board of Directors shall have the power at any time to terminate and change the membership of the Executive Committee by a three-fourths vote of any quorum present and voting."

- 16. Article VIII, Section 3 should be eliminated.
- 17. Article IX, Section 4 should read:

"The seal of the corporation shall be circular in form and shall bear the words 'THE UNITED JEWISH APPEAL OF GREATER NEW YORK FOR REFUGEES, OVERSEAS NEEDS AND PALESTINE, INC. 'in the margin thereof, and the words "Incorporated, New York, 1941' in the center thereof."

- 18. Article IX, Section 7 should be modified to eliminate the right of any member, director, Executive or other committee member to vote or to give his approval, or disapproval, by mail, but must give such vote by personal attendance at the meeting at which the vote is taken.
- 19. Article X, Section 1 should read as follows:

"Any and all provisions of these by-laws, except those relating to additional beneficiaries which may not be amended, except with the consent of the three original beneficiaries, may be amended or repealed by a two-thirds vote of the qualified members...".

You will have noted that the annual Assembly of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds will be held in Chicago at the end of January.

Dear Dr. Silver:

It is not wise to jump at conclusions in the first days after the announcement of war. No one can predict with certainty what will be the effect in various directions insofar as fund-raising and the general morale of the community are concerned. These observations, however, I believe, are justified by such facts as are known at the moment:

- 1. In relation to the U.J.A. the strongest factor of appeal is the U.P.A. It is the one organization working in an area whose relationship to the democracies is unquestionable and support of which can, without reservation, be termed aid to the democracies.
- 2. A realistic view must be taken of what may be the situation with regard to the J.D.C. and the N.R.S. Already questions have begun to pour in as to whether the J.D.C. can operate. This is an intensification of questions heard during the past two years. If, within the coming days there is a state of war between the European Axis powers and the United States it will be inevitable that J.D.C. operations in Europe must cease instantly. At the present time the possibility of functioning in Europe by the J.D.C. is bound up exclusively with emigration, which is the foundation of the clearance arrangement. That automatically would be suspended. Even before the declaration of war against Japan emigration from Europe had descended sharply. There can be no doubt that with the new State Department regulations, effective as of December 1, 1941, this tendency will be even further indicated.

It is clear what the situation of the J.D.C. is in the Far East. The J.D.C. budgeted approximately \$225,000 in 1941 for assistance to refugees in Shanghai. It will be inevitable that this would have to be suspended both because of the freezing of Japanese funds and the unwillingness of the Japanese to permit such outside assistance for Jews.

In saying these things I am not in any way trying to minimize the good faith or the previous activities of the J.D.C., but

I believe that internally, at least, we must face the problem frankly, as should the leaders of the J.D.C. itself.

- 3. The situation with regard to the N.R.S. is less clear. It might well be said that with the intensification of suspicion of aliens in this country there might be unemployment, with consequent responsibility resting on the N.R.S. and on local refugee agencies. Assurance had been given by various State and Justice Department officials that refugees would not be interned when war was declared. Whether that promise can be adhered to is difficult to say, especially with the news that F.B.I. agents, during the past 48 hours, have been rounding up not only Japanese nationals but also German and Italian residents without American citizenship papers. In such activity it would be unlikely that the F.B.I. would stop to distinguish between Jewish and Christian German and Italian residents. The investigation of the differentiation would come later. Should there be a rounding up of a substantial number of such Jewish refugees, which of course we all hope will not occur, the responsibility would be a government rather than a Jewish one, as was the case when refugees were interned in England at the outbreak of the war.
- 4. The general unpredictability of what might happen to the campaign in 1942 has been enormously complicated by the outbreak of war. It will be inevitable that individuals and communities will question the effectiveness of the U.J.A. agencies with far sharper intensity than before. The Red Cross has just launched a \$50,000,000 campaign which it indicated might be increased at any moment. Should any plan for a \$150,000,000 Red Cross, USO, etc. campaign be inaugurated it would have a great effect upon the local leadership as well as upon the giving requirements.
- 5. If the above observations are validated by the facts two conclusions would be justified: (a) that there must be a complete revision on a realistic basis of the share which the U.P.A. should have from the income of the U.J.A. in 1942; and (b) that if the U.J.A. wants to protect its basic effectiveness it would have to dismiss the prejudices and fears which have thus far paralyzed the campaign, and concentrate on the extraordinary emotional drive resident in emphasis on Palestine.

I believe that we have been unfair to both Palestine and the U.J.A. in the indifference to the stimulation which the stress on Palestine could give to the country. With war the dominant thought in people's minds, with the Jewish community in Palestine the only group as Jews fighting by the side of America today helping to defend the American front, we could galvanize the communities in an unprecedented way. That involves a constructive program and a willingness to yield on preconceptions.

I submit these thoughts for what they are worth.

I had Bernard Reis & Company make up a complete chart showing the prospective income to the United Palestine Appeal from the United Jewish Appeal for the period from December 1, 1941 through June 30, 1942, in connection with the pressure being brought by the National Refugee Service.

Mr. Hyman telephoned me this afternoon, wanting an answer. I could not of course give him any, since it wasn't my decision to make.

You will note on the attached sheet,

- (a) the income expected to accrue to the UPA on account of 1941:
- (b) on account of 1942;
- (c) from the traditional collections of the JNF.

The account is so gotten up as to indicate,

- (1) the amount which would be required as the UPA's share to enable the NRS to get \$250,000 a month:
- (2) how much the UPA must count on spending as a fixed sum month by month for its own operation and for subsidied;
- (3) what would be left over for transmission to the Keren Hayesod and Keren Kayemeth.

On the last line there is also indicated the sum which was available to Palestine after the deduction of expenses and subsidies during the same months in 1941, so that it is easy to compare what would be available to the UPA in the first six months of 1942 and what was available to the UPA in the first six months of 1941.

All calculations and estimates with respect to 1942 and additional income from 1941 take it for granted that there will be no halting in the flow of funds, and no decrease.

In order that you may have before you in writing the suggestion which Mr. Gotshal presented as a method of resolving the New York situation, I am herewith sending you the position as I understand it.

The by-laws of the corporation of the New York U.J.A. would provide for a Board of Directors of between 100 and 150 members. This Board of Directors would presumably consist of the leaders of fund-raising in New York City. The Board would be named by a special nominating committee consisting of representatives appointed directly by the U.P.A., J.D.C., N.R.S. and the Executive Committee of the U.J.A.

This nominating committee might consist of twenty members, or five for each of the bodies mentioned. or it might consist of three each for the bodies mentioned. The object of this arrangement, as I understand it, is to give the city of New York the feeling that its contributors and workers are part of the structure of the New York U.J.A. even though, through this nominating committee arrangement, the U.P.A. and the other agencies would play a part in naming the Board of Directors.

I indicated to Mr. Gotshal that I would advise him as early as possible what the reaction is to this suggestion.

I believe that I informed you previously that the Council of Federations had suggested that there be three sub-sessions of the Assembly in Chicago at the end of January. One would be devoted exclusively to Palestine; one to over-seas, and one to civic-protective agencies.

At previous Assemblies, it has been the practise to arrange two or three or four group meetings at the same time so that each agency competed for the interest of the delegates, with none of them receiving the complete attention of the delegates available. In the case of Palestine, this would involve a unified presentation of the Palestine story by the UPA, the Keren Hayesod, the Keren Kayemeth, Hadassah, Gewerkschaften and Hebrew University.

Proceeding along these lines, I invited representatives of these organizations to meet. We finally got together on Friday afternoon, December 12th. All of the agencies believe that it is a very good idea to have one broad presentation of Palestine by all the agencies for maximum impression upon the entire Assembly.

The program that has been suggested by Friday's conference is along the following lines:

- 1) The chairman or the presiding officer of the session would be Judge Morris Rothenberg or Henry Monsky.
- 2) The principal address of the session would be delivered by yourself, taking as much time as you feel necessary, whether it be half an hour or an hour or more.
- 3) There would be a panel in which there would be prepared discussion on specific phases of their work by representatives of the UPA, Hadassah, Gewerkschaften, Hebrew University, Jewish National Fund. 

Dear Henry:

In accordance with our telephone conversation of this morning, I have drafted the enclosed letter for the purpose of attempting to give at least preliminary satisfaction to the Secretary of State, with regard to the use of the name "The United Jewish Appeal of Greater New York, Inc." by the proposed new corporation. If Doctors Wise and Silver feel that they can safely make the representations contained in the enclosure, same should be recopied on your own letterhead and signed by the two named gentlemen. As we are anxious to forward this matter with all due speed, will you see that this is done as soon as possible.

You will note that the substance of the enclosure will have to be ratified by a meeting of the members of the national comparation. This, too, should be gotten out of the way with as little delay as possible. I have therefore suggested the following procedure: That we call a meeting of the members to be held within the next few days; ask them all to waive notice of said meeting, and to execute proxies obviating personal attendance. We would of course, indicate to the members the nature of the action to be accomplished at the meeting, as well as the fact that the proxies intended to wate in favor of permitting the use of the name chosen by the New York corporation.

The foregoing procedure would require all of the members to sign and return the necessary waivers and proxies. If, for any reason, there is doubt concerning our ability to obtain any signature, we should call the meeting on five to ten days' notice to all members, in which event only the proxies of a quorum would be required.

Will you advise me how long you think it will take to get the aforesaid waivers and proxies out, signed, and returned to us, and the consequent earliest date at which the proposed meeting can be held. Likewise, please advise me as to who will serve as proxies for instant purposes.

When I hear from you with regard to the foregoing, I shall be glad to supply you with all required forms.

SILVER MAKES PLEA FOR PALESTINE FUND

Urges U. S. Jews to Raise Large Part of \$8,000,000 Budget

American Jews were called upon yesterday by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, to raise a large percentage of the \$8,000,000 war budget of the Jewish community in Palestine.

Recently Eliezer Kaplan, treas-urer of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, supreme representative of Jewish interests in the Jewish homeland, sent a cablegram to Dr. Silver's organization announcing that \$8,000,000 was needed during the coming year to develop "every avenue of agricultural and industrial contribution in Palestine," it was announced by Dr. Silver in a statement made public at his or-ganization's local headquarters, 41 East Forty-second Street.

In urging American Jews to help meet this budget, Dr. Silver emphasized the "vital role" Palestine Jews were playing in the Middle Eastern Allied front.

"Every American citizen can be proud of the Jewish community in Service. Palestine which is today the one solid, unequivocal source of support for the Allies in the Middle

East," Dr. Silver declared. "Tens of thousands of Palestine Jews are the skilled workmen essential for the mechanized warfare now under way in the Middle East."

SANTA ARRIVES IN PLANE

Christmas Party at Floyd Bennett Field Is Up-to-Date

Two hundred and fifty persons, the wives and children of officers and men at the Naval Air Station at Floyd Bennett Field in Brooklyn, celebrated a war-time Christmas yesterday in the field's closely guarded administration building.

Unusual precautions were taken to prevent the entrance of outsiders or uninvited guests, as armed guards patrolled the entrances to the field and examined closely the tickets issued to the invited women and children.

A highlight of the party was the arrival of Santa Claus, played by S. D. Tarditi, a radio officer, who used a modern Navy plane in place of a sleigh and reindeer. He taxied up to the administration building with gifts for the children and distributed the presents in front of a large Christmas tree, donated by the National Catholic Community

The Jewish Agency for Palessupreme representative of Jewish interests in that land, has sent a cable asking American Jews to provide the major portion of an \$8,000,000 budget to develop agricultural and industrial contributions to the Allied war effort, it was disclosed today by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, national chairman of the United Palestine

Appeal.

"As Americans we owe every encouragement to these allies in one of the most critical sectors of the war front. As Jews we can be especially proud that the support which American Jewry gave during the past twenty years laid the foundations which are today so strong a bulwark for our common cause. As Americans and as Jews, we owe a solemn obligation, first, to ourselves, and sec-ondly, to the fighters in Palestine, to answer the call for war aid sent to us by Eliezer Kaplan, treasurer of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, who speaks on behalf of the 550,000 Palestine Jews who are among the most stalwart allies of America's fighting forces," said Dr. Silver.

Dr. Silver cited the list of contributions Jews in Palestine are making to the Allied cause. Jewish workmen in Haifa harbor are repairing British ships, he said, and more than 1,500 young Jews are in the R. A. F. He added that the greatest contribution was coming from Jewish farmers who are producing food for the Middle

Eastern armies.

The question arises whether the United Palestine Appeal should go in for the cost of an additional sixteen pages for the New Palestine issue that will cover the UPA Conference in Cleveland. I have a letter from Carl Alpert, Managing Editor, in which he states, "My budget permits me to publish only 16 pages per issue." He is planning to devote most of the sixteen pages of the issue of January 9th to "building up the U.P.A. Conference."

Last year, the New Palestine provided a thirty-two page issue, virtually all of which was devoted to the Washington Conference. Do you feel that the UPA is authorized to spend \$1,205, which would be the cost of sixteen additional pages? Four more pages would be \$347; eight, \$623; and twelve, \$915. Mr. Alpert further writes, "These figures are for printing costs alone and are based on my usual quantity of 55,000."

Naturally, if we wanted any additional copies to be sent to friends of the UPA who might not be subscribers to the New Palestine, this would involve an additional sum. Additional copies for a thirty-two page magazine would be at the rate of \$32.15 a thousand which, of course, is quite cheap.

Please let me have your views on this particular item which, in the face of a seriously reduced budget for the UPA, is very substantial.

Dear Doctor Wise:

Your letter of the 11th makes me feel that there is some doubt in your mind about the wholeheartedness of the Board and its desire to do everything possible for foreign relief this year. I can assure you that this is not the fact. There is only one qualification and that is that such relief shall not in any way impede our country in the conduct of war. I know the answer to that and I am making it all the time. When I prefaced my remarks at the meeting in Chicago with a statement to this effect, it was not done because I felt that there was any necessity for making that reservation. I know that the U.J.A. will guide its course in complete conformity with our national policy. I knew it was unnecessary to suggest that to either you or Doctor Silver. I knew from the comments which had come to me from various of our contributors that this was on their minds, and the best way to handle it was to bordly set that out as a masthead to any campaign. The talks made by you and Doctor Silver did much to help us, and I appreciated your coming. If the discussion at the Board meeting was a little blunt, I hope that both of you will bear in mind that it followed closely on the declaration of war, at a time when men's nerves were fraged and every one was on edge.

We are working hard and earnestly to get the best results possible from this campaign. Each community has its own problems and we will meet ours with courage. You have probably neard by this time of the result of our first meeting. It was not entirely satisfactory, but considering all things I believe we are going to come out all right.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I have never known whether you wished to be continuously informed of the publicity which the United Palestine Appeal is receiving. I have always had to smile when some publicity man usually associated with one of the Zionist organizations, would very proudly recite to an official meeting that as a result of his efforts 1,000 lines or 200 columns or 50 pages of publicity had been secured from Portland, Maine to Yokohama.

I have assumed that you have taken for granted the constant and persistent effort of everybody associated with the United Palestine Appeal to create the largest possible understanding of and publicity for the United Palestine Appeal. Seeing all the papers regularly, Yiddish, general and English-Jewish alike, I think I can firmly say that the United Palestine Appeal, day in and day out, obtains more publicity than any other organization in the field.

The reason I make this special comment is that recently I thought I noted in you a sense of marked appreciation of the publicity of the National Refugee Service, for example.

In order to clear away the misapprehension you have, I am ordering a clipping bureau to provide us with clippings which I can forward to you regularly. Last year and the year before they were dispensed with because that item saved us some \$300 to \$500 a year.

As a result of the thought and timely publicity which the United Palestine Appeal has been receiving, even though it is harder than ever before to get publicity into the press because of the preoccupation of the newspapers with war, there has been a great deal of material both on the affairs of the United Palestine Appeal and on the Cleveland Conference.

As an example, I sand you herewith three clippings of an item which appeared in the Tuesday papers. The Palcor cables were used by our publicity department as a basis for a very effective story. I assume that you see the New York Times and have read in the first editions such items as the building of two new colonies in Palestine with United Palestine Appeal funds, and the mobilization of women in Palestine, as well as the announcements of the Cleveland Conference.

(continued) as most people do, in the justice of his request for the immediate settlement in Palestine of 100,000 refugees, he should be willing to use the power of this country to make possible the relocation of these unfortunate people, who, after all, are now actually the wards of the United States, and for whom we must care through our Occupation Forces, unless they are moved to Palestine. I can not visualize that some such strong action, (phantastic though it may appear on first glance) on the part of our General Staff, would meet with any actual resistance on the part of the British forces in Palestine. In other words, I believe that, if General Eisenhower would move to Palestine, within one month, 50,000 or 100,000 Jewish refugees, on American ships protected by American Naval Officers, the gates of Haifa and Tel Aviv ports would open up very easily and would probably, from then on, remain open.
- 4. Hundreds of millions of dollars have been spent, and will be spent, by this country through the Army Budget, as well as through UNRRA, by way of assistance to the unfortunate people living in many of the countries heretofore occupied by the Nasis. Definite negotiations ought to be commenced, therefore, with the Government of the United States for the allocation of one hundred million dollars, not by way of a loan, but by way of an immediate gift, for the purpose of settling in Palestine 100,000 to 200,000 Jewish refugees, now in Germany and elsewhere in Europe, and who can not possibly attempt resettlement at their own expense. It is quite apparent that even if we had British permission immediately to move 100,000 Jews into Palestine, the Jews alone could not promptly raise the one hundred million dollars, which will, undoubtedly, be required for the transportation, the medical assistance and the food and clothing to be made available to these people, before any thought can even be given to colonizing them on Palestinian land or absorbing them in its life and industry. Besides, this international problem calls for relief on an international scale.
- 5. One good, though somewhat costly, manner in which to present some of the ideas, hereinabove mentioned, to the general American public, including our government and the legislative houses, would be to publish an open letter to the President, incorporating these
 ideas in brief paragraphs, published in about 50 metropolitan newspapers, including
 Washington, D.C., as a full page advertisement.

Of course, I realize that this is a rather broad "menu". However, these are revolutionary times. This country will soon be making a five billion dollar loan to Great Britain - our "safest" customer - at practically no interest rate and with an almost tacit understanding that such loan of the funds of our citizens, made without their direct consent, will not be paid back in less than 50 to 100 years. I leave it to you to figure out the value and possibility of such principal amortisation. If this loan will be based on humanitarian, political and economic grounds, it is not at all outlandish to demand that a hundred million dollar advance be made by the United States for the resettlement of the refugees, whose relatives - five million in number - they are leaving behind in the crematoria of Germany and Poland. - After all, in 1921, when foreign governments were talking in millions instead of billions, I believe that we financed a substantial budget covering the exchange of large segments of population between Turkey, Armenia and Greece.
