

Dear Mr.

It is the purpose of the American Palestine Fund, a descriptive statement of which is enclosed for your consideration, to replace the separate appeals from educational, cultural, and social service institutions in Palestine, which heretofore have not been included in any unified appeal.

Of our goal of \$155,000 for 1941, we hope to raise \$80,000 in New York City and \$75,000 from the balance of the country. We have already raised a little more than half our New York quota, and are now calling on your organization in (name of city) to support us, so that we can go forward with our program of infusing system into a situation in which heretofore there has been confusion in the matter of fund-raising.

Like the (<u>name of Federation</u>), the American Palestine Fund was asked to help in the direction of unity, and its success in coordinating many more of the separate appeals will depend on receiving adequate support from communities like yours. We have established quotas for the funds throughout the country on the basis of population and amounts raised in 1940; and our suggested quota for (<u>name of city</u>) is \$ (amount).

Dear Rabbi Silver:

We have been friends too long to have any misunderstanding over a lot of foolishness. You have been in drives long enough so as to understand what a heaping of criticism during the height of a campaign actually means. At the present moment we happen to be at that particular point.

Unfortunately we tried something new this year. We established a new Public Relations Committee. Needless to say, we have had startling publicity. It was a new experience for the community and for me. The publicity has been much talked about, and as a direct result I have had all kinds of telephone calls.

My letter to you really was to tell you that I had been overwhelmed with criticism, and that you as an old campaigner had experienced similar situations and recognized the symptoms and could easily diagnose the illness. So please forget the exchange of letters and begin to give your old friend a boost, because anyone trying to organize Philadelphia not only needs it, but from your knowledge - certainly deserves it.

According to a resolution passed by the Executive Board of Keren Hatarbut, we are sending you, as a member of Keren Hatarbut, our latest financial report.

November 25, 1941.

The following is an abridgment of our audited financial report for the period of the last 18 months (January 1, 1940 to July 1, 1941):

Funds Raised in the United States and Canada\$16,978.04 Sent to Palestine (To the Hebrew Writers Association in Palestine, World Federation for Hebrew Culture, Brit Ivrit Olamit and the national museum Bet Bialik in Tel-Aviv) 9,597.87 Furthering Hebrew Culture in America (Hebrew Literary Forum, lectures about Hebrew literature and culture in Palestine for Men's and Women's Division, Hebrew books to subscribers on account of Hebrew Writers Association of Palestine) 3,765.25 Administrative Expenses (Secretarial service, traveling, stationery and printing, telephone and telegraph, postage, accountant, etc.) 3,461.05

During the period of two and a half years since Keren Hatarbut has been established, <u>\$15,100.00 have been</u> forwarded to Palestine.

You have been helpful in furthering Hebrew culture in Palestine and throughout the world, by helping Keren Hatarbut. We wish to thank you again for your wholehearted support and hope that you will continue your kind interest and cooperation in this effort to aid the Palestinian Hebrew writers and Hebrew culture in their dark hour of need.


EXCERPT OF LETTER ADDRESSED TO ISIDOR COUNS AND HENRY MONTOR

Dated December 19, 1941

Some time ago one or the other of you asked me to let you know the result of the special solicitation here for funds for the Joint Defense Appeal. I said I would let you know after the movement for funds had been inaugurated. The information I can give you now, and it is the only information I have, is that regarding the appeal made at a dinner a few days ago, presided over by Louis B. Mayer.) The principal speakers were George Z. Medalie, Joe Willen, Dick Gutstadt and Rabbi Edgar F. Magnin. A list of principal givers in both the motion picture group and general community was prepared and invitations went out from Mr. Mayer. There were approximately 125 present. The subscriptions taken that night were, as I had it reported to me, for a total of \$57,500.00. The objective was \$125,000.00. It is my understanding that letters have gone out from Mr. Mayer's office soliciting many who did not attend the dinner. The largest subscription announced that night was for \$5,000.00; the next for \$3,000.00 and next for \$2,000.00. I assume that if you want more detailed information on this, Mr. Willen's office can furnish it.


