Gentlemen:

In accordance with instructions, we have examined the books and records of United Jewish Appeal, Inc. (1941) - national organization - from the effective date of the reconstitution of the joint appeal, March 16, 1941, to June 30, 1941. Reports were submitted by the constituent organizations setting forth the 1941 campaign collections received by them prior to the reconstitution of the joint appeal; we ascertained that the amounts paid over to U.J.A. were in accordance therewith. The expenses incurred by the constituent organizations in connection with launching their 1941 campaigns were reimbursed by the U.J.A. as hereinafter discussed.

Herewith we submit our report consisting of:

EXHIBIT A - Statement of Assets and Advances on Account
of Allocations and Liabilities at June 30,
1941

EXHIBIT B - Statement of Income and Expenses for the period
reviewed

together with three supporting schedules.

We also submit, in Exhibits C and D and supporting schedules, comparative data relative to the campaigns from the beginning of the joint appeal, January 1, 1939, to June 30, 1941.

Under an agreement dated May 29, 1941, between American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and United Palestine Appeal, the 1941 Appeal continued the 1939 and 1940 organization of United Jewish Appeal, Inc., and conducted the unified fund-raising activities, in the United States, for refugees, overseas needs and Palestine, on behalf of:

American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, Inc. (J.D.C.)
United Palestine Appeal, Inc. (U.P.A.)
National Refugee Service, Inc. (N.R.S.)

The agreement included the following provisions:

(a) The first \$8,800,000.00 allocated to the beneficiaries is to be divided as follows:

An addendum to the agreement provided that the amount received by N.R.S. from United Jewish Appeal (national organization) shall be deemed to include the participation of the former in the proceeds of the Greater New York Campaign of the United Jewish Appeal.

(b) All amounts thereafter available for allocation shall be divided among U.P.A., J.D.C. and N.R.S. in the sole and exclusive discretion of an Allotment Committee. The Allotment Committee shall be composed of an equal number of nominees of J.D.C. and U.P.A., and shall also include three representatives of Welfare Fund communities who have been approved by J.D.C. and U.P.A. The members named by J.D.C. and U.P.A. are the following:

(c) An amount, agreed upon between the parties, shall be allocated to the Allotment Committee, when organized, for 1941 budget studies, personnel and overhead expenses. (For this purpose an amount not exceeding \$10,000.00 was authorized by the Treasurers.)

(d) All funds and assets, with certain specified exceptions, pledged to and/or collected directly by the beneficiaries, which would, in the ordinary course, be credited to the 1941 United States campaign of the recipient, including such items resulting from 1941 United States campaign activities, shall be transferred and/or paid over to the United Jewish Appeal, Inc., and shall be considered part of the receipts of the joint campaign and subject in their entirety to the provisions of this agreement.

(e) The agreement shall be deemed to have commenced on January 1, 1941, and to expire on December 31, 1941.

(f) All details for implementing and carrying out the agreement are in charge of the National Chairmen of United Jewish Appeal, Inc., or their respective nominees.

The agreement also provides that expenditures incurred by J.D.C., U.P.A. and N.R.S. in connection with the launching of their campaigns for 1941, prior to the reconstitution of the United Jewish Appeal, shall be dealt with as provided in a memorandum approved and subscribed by representatives of J.D.C. and U.P.A. Schedules (which we were informed represented the memorandum referred to above) submitted by the accountants for J.D.C. and U.P.A. and approved by Frederick F. Greenman, Esq., who, we understand, was designated as the mediator, indicated the amounts to be reimbursed to J.D.C. and U.P.A. by the reconstituted Joint National and Greater New York Appeals.

Checks issued by the United Jewish Appeal, Inc. (for 1941) are to be signed by at least two persons, one designated by J.D.C. and the other by U.P.A.

The bank accounts of the 1941 joint appeal were not opened until about July 11, 1941; prior thereto the 1940 campaign bank accounts were utilized by the 1941 campaign as the depository for remittances received and for disbursements on its behalf.

The scope of our examination of the income of the 1941 campaign is similar to that of the 1939 and 1940 campaigns; for details thereof, reference should be made to our report dated February 3, 1940.

An expense budget of \$370,000.00, net (\$395,000.00 for current expenses, less \$25,000.00 to be charged to the 1940 campaign for collection expenses) for the period from March 16, 1941, to December 31, 1941, was adopted for the campaign. The amount budgeted does not include: (a) any allowance for reimbursements to the constituents (previously referred to); (b) the collection costs of 1941 campaign balances which will be outstanding at the end of the current campaign year; and (c) the expenses of the Allotment Committee.

The items comprising the amounts reimbursed to J.D.C. and U.P.A. (total \$162,659.12, exclusive of asset items such as advances to field representatives, automobiles, etc.) were negotiated and agreed upon by the contracting parties. Since your executive committee approved these payments, we did not consider that these expenditures came within the scope of our examination.

DUE FROM 1940 UNITED JEWISH APPEAL --- \$133,980.90

This account represents the aggregate of 1941 campaign collections deposited in the 1940 bank account plus a charge of \$25,000.00 for collection expenses of the 1940 campaign balances, less the allocation and expense disbursements, etc., of the 1941 campaign. In July, 1941, the net amount due was withdrawn from the 1940 bank account and deposited in the 1941 bank account which was opened at that time.

Dear Mr. Montor,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 25th.

Detailed analyses of the income and expenditure of the four institutions, viz. the Jewish Agency, the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jewry, the Keren Hayesod and the Keren Kayemeth, will accompany our Semi-Annual Report - October 1940---March 1941 - which we shall send you in the course of the next few weeks. These will also contain all the missing details for our monthly reports which we have already sent you. In the meantime I wish to reply to the queries enumerated in your letter insofar as they concern the Semi-Annual Report:

ad (1) We have received the notes which you transmitted to us through Dr. Bernard Joseph and shall endeavour to follow your directions in our future reports and indicate the cash on hand or deficit for each individual institution as well as in the consolidated account.

ad (2) "Contributions". We do not possess specific figures indicating on account of what year the remittances are made to us. However, we have asked the Keren Hayesod and Keren Kayemeth to furnish us with these indications and in spite of the difficulties involved we hope to be able to comply with your request in our future reports.

ad (3) Accounts of the Central Bureau. In the Reconciliation Statement attached to our Consolidated Account of Income and Expenditure (beginning with the year 5701 issued quarterly) we indicate what sums are transferred from one institution to another, stating also the amounts contributed to the Central Bureau. During the first half of the year 5701 the Keren Hayesod remitted to the Central Bureau on account of Youth Aliyah the sum of LP.3,012.585 received from Canada.

ad (4) "Service charges, etc." At the end of the first half of the year 5701 the Keren Hayesod's income from dividends and interest totalled LP.483.953. This amount is made up of: dividends and interest LP.178.581, difference on exchange LP.109.936, adjustment in respect of General Mortgage Bank Debentures LP.92.353, collections by General Mortgage Bank (on account of mortgages and interest) LP.86.073, American Zion Commonwealth (Bills collected) LP.17.010.

ad (5) The total sum received by the Jewish Agency under "grants and participations" was LP.16,455.913 at the end of March 1941 consisting of grants-in-aid from the Palestine Government, from the Board of Trustees of the Czech Transfer, and from various other sources in order to be expended through the departments of the Jewish Agency on special earmarked purposes.

ad (6) "Participation from private land purchasers". Jointly with some private purchasers, mainly residing in England, the Keren Kayemeth effected various land purchases in Wadi Kabani near Nathania and near Hadera. According to this scheme the private purchasers paid a certain amount to the Keren Kayemeth on condition that each one would receive a plot of land the size of which would be determined proportionately to the purchaser's share in the total amount which the Keren Kayemeth paid for

the land. After such parcellation the land is registered in the name of a Trust Co. for the private purchasers. It is stipulated in the agreement with the Keren Kayemeth that the private purchaser has the right to give up his land within a certain period of time and request the refund of his investment, but the Keren Kayemeth is to make the refund over a period of 5-10 years.

ad (7) "Leasehold rent". During the first half of the year 5701 a sum of LP.6,792.756 was received from rental fees, of which LP.3,180.- was on urban holdings. The item of leasehold rent includes only fees actually collected and this is of course only on a part of the Keren Kayemeth holdings. On some of its land, contracts have not yet been drawn up.

ad (8) "Realization of assets". The amount of LP.8,040 to which you refer relates to a transaction dating back to 1938. In that year the Keren Kayemeth sold a quantity of its debentures in Czechoslovakia but was unable to transfer the proceeds to Palestine in the normal way. Therefore, it placed these proceeds at the disposal of Palestinian merchants, "Nir" Co. and Mr. Teiber, two of the country's largest importers of building materials, who employed those proceeds for the purchase of goods. By way of security for the amount which they thus received from the Keren Kayemeth they gave the Keren Kayemeth mortgages over certain property in Palestine. The amount in question represents payments received from the "Nir" Co. and Mr. Teiber on account of this transaction. The Semi-Annual Report which you will soon receive shows a total collection on account of this transaction to the date of the Report of LP.17,851.574. In the books of the Keren Kayemeth the securities received in respect of this transaction were treated as assets and all collections on account thereof are now treated as proceeds of the realization of those assets.

ad (9) "Keren Kayemeth loans". The amount of loans contracted by the Keren Kayemeth from Oct. 1st 1940 to March 31st 1941 was LP.215,341. Received from private individuals; ordinary loans totalled LP.96,370 and loans from sellers of land totalled LP.118,971. The average rate of interest is 6%. The term of the ordinary loans is 1-10 years and the loans from sellers of land are for 1-2 years. In most cases annual interest is charged.

ad (10) "Special earmarked funds". The Semi-Annual Report shows the receipt of LP.1246.875 from South Africa for the WIZO. This does not affect the Keren Hayesod budget in any way and is merely a transfer. In the same report there is a further sum of LP.13,965.- also received from South Africa for specific emergency purposes. This sum came from the proceeds of the United War Effort Campaign which was launched in South Africa in November of last year and it was earmarked for various specific purposes with the consent of the Zionist leaders of South Africa.

ad (11) "Immigration and Training". The average cost of transportation to the hostels, etc., is 100-150 mils per capita. The average loan granted to each immigrant is LP.1.500-LP.2.500. The borrowers sign promissory notes and undertake to repay the loans on demand. Repayments on loans granted to immigrants during the last 20 years which exceed a total of LP.150,000 - amounted to LP.1826.196 in the year 5696, LP.818.932 in 5697, LP.349.574 in 5698, dropping to LP.190.658 in 5699 and to

LP.67.708 in the year 5700. Collection is not easy, and usually it is only when the immigrant who has established himself in Palestine, again needs the services of the Jewish Agency on some matter or other, as when he applies to the Jewish Agency for an immigration permit for his relatives, that it is possible to collect from him what he owes.

These loans appear in the books of the Jewish Agency after the deduction of a reserve of approximately 60%.

In addition to the medical treatment which the immigrants receive in the immigrants' hostels, they are covered by sick insurance with Kupath Cholim for the first 3-4 months after their arrival. The cost of sick insurance is up to 650 mils per person.

During the first half of the year 5701, 285 people were insured with Kupath Cholim.

ad (12) "Tents". 99 tents were purchased and a few were repaired during the six months covered by the Report at a cost of LP.629.379 on a/c of Immigration budget (apart of 194 tents brought on a/c of Labour & Housing budgets). These tents can accommodate about 500 people and are intended for the use of immigrants immediately upon their arrival. They are placed in workers' camps and in immigrants' encampments.

ad (13) "Training abroad". During the period of Oct. 1st 1940 to March 31st 1941 a sum of LP.1368.684 was spent on training abroad by the "Hechalutz" organisations and training delegations. "Hechalutz" organisations still existed in different countries. The training was mainly for agricultural work, but instruction was also given in the building trades. Various small sums which were spent for the study of Hebrew are also included under "Training abroad".

ad (14) "Administrative expenses". The expenses of the Department, totalling LP.5,397.007, are distributed as follows: Salaries of 16 officials in Jerusalem, 11 in Tel-Aviv and 12 in Haifa - LP.4467.484, office expenses - LP.681.790, and expenses in connection with the landing of immigrants - LP.247.733.

ad (15) "Refugees' fares". A sum of LP.3124.368 was spent during the period of the Semi-Annual Report. This amount constitutes part of the sum which was spent by the Immigration Department for the transportation of immigrants and refugees from the Balkan States. The amounts spent by you directly have not been incorporated in our books so far, but after proper consideration I believe that they will be included in our Report.

ad (16) "Land purchase". We have applied to the Keren Kayemeth for all the particulars which you desire and shall send them to you as soon as possible. In the meantime we have obtained a list of the new land purchases of the Keren Kayemeth which were made during the six months period covered by our Report:

The total land possessions of the Keren Kayemeth at the end of March 1941 comprised 529,631 dunams.

"Loans to settlements, afforestation". We have asked for particulars concerning this item, too, and so far we have received the following details concerning afforestation: During the six months covered by our Report the forest area of the Jewish National Fund was increased by 870 dunams and 155,468 trees. The total number of trees in the forests of the Jewish National Fund was 3,261,549 at the end of March 1941, covering a total area of 13,650 dunams.

The above sum was given to 26 settlements with a population of 3434 people, including 15 small-holders' settlements, 5 Sephardi & Yemenite settlements, 4 Mizrahi and 1 middle-class settlement.

ad (18) The Agricultural Experiment Station. Its aims are two-fold:
 1) to serve as an instrument of Jewish colonisation through investigation of the agricultural possibilities in the various sections of the country;
 2) the promotion of agriculture through systematic research by means of experiments in laboratory, field, dairy and fowl-barn. The Station's headquarters were transferred from Tel Aviv to Rehoboth in 1932 and comprise various laboratories, field sections, library, acclimatizing garden for subtropical fruit trees, an experimental orchard, fodder-crop fields and a model mixed farm - all the above covering about 300 dunams. The central farm of the Station is located about 5 kilometres from Rehoboth, near Ayanoth. It extends over an area of 1200 dunams representing most of the different characteristic types of soil in Palestine,

and comprises experimental fields for seed growing, for medical plants, plants for industrial exploitation, experimental fruit plantations and a dairy unit. The buildings in Rehoboth: 2 buildings are devoted to plants, one of them housing the Departments of Agronomy, Physiology and Genetics, and the other housing the Department of Plantations and the Department for the Research of Citrus Fruit Rots. There is a special building for the Agricultural Economics Institute containing the Departments of Farm Economy, Marketing, Agricultural Sociology and Planning Office. One building contains a laboratory for preserved fruits and the library. There is a building for the Department of Plant Protection which contains a Pathological and Entomological Section as well as a Training Department. One building contains a chemical laboratory with a special annex for a soil testing laboratory which was built with funds contributed by the former High Commissioner, Sir Arthur Wauchope.

Branches: 1) At Kiryat Anavin - a plantation of deciduous fruit trees particularly suited for hilly regions (about 100 dunams); 2) At Gvat - experiments in dry farming in the valleys have been carried out on an area of about 1400 dunams and a tract of about 1000 dunams will be devoted in future too for growing selected seeds for the Emek under the guidance of the Experiment Station; 3) At Geva - experiments in irrigated crops in the Emek Jezreel region (30 dunams); 4) At Dagan - acclimatizing garden for subtropical fruit trees in the name of Dr. Ruppin. The Station and its Extension Department maintain experimental fields in different parts of the country carrying out research work and experiments in the following branches of agriculture: 1) seed culture, field and garden crops; 2) citriculture, viticulture, deciduous fruit trees; 3) plant physiology and genetics and forestry; 4) cattle-feeding - experiments in the cow-barn and testing of fodder; 5) agricultural economics - marketing, farm administration, settlement planning; 6) soil testing and analysis; 7) plant pathology; 8) entomology; 9) agricultural produce - dairy products and preserves; 10) instruction. The personnel of the Station numbers 100 people, 70 of whom are scientific workers engaged in research activities and as instructors in the various branches of agriculture. The budget of the Station for the current year totals LP.30,000 derived as follows:

More than 250 research works have been published by the Station to date in almost all branches of agriculture, in addition to instructions for farmers (over 200 publications). This wealth of material contains all the essential elements for instruction in the Agricultural College which was established according to an agreement between the Hebrew University and the Experiment Station. The school building was erected on the Station grounds in Rehoboth at the end of 1940.

ad (19) "Administration expenses" of the Colonization Department totalled LP.3223.349 during the period of the Semi-Annual Report, distributed as follows:

There are 13 people employed in the Colonization Department and 4 people in the Water Department which is concerned mainly with the installation of irrigation works in the settlements.

The Colonization Department is entrusted with the general planning of settlement and its organisation, the determination of the colonization budget, the choice of settlers, and the financial and technical supervision over the settlements. The Technical Office employs 12 people and its expenses totalled LP.1591.910. The Technical Office of the Department prepares the general building plans of the new settlements as well as the plans for the various types of construction and supervises over the actual building operations. The Technical Office also deals with questions relating to the erection of buildings for other Departments of the Jewish Agency.

The Department appoints special inspectors and instructors in every rural region whose duty it is to advise settlers on problems connected with their farms and to supervise the utilisation of the funds which they receive from the national institutions.

The term general expense in our Report refers to overhead expenses such as travelling costs, postage, telephone, telegraph, etc.

ad (20) "Relief works". In order to relieve unemployment the Jewish Agency gave partial guarantees in respect of "Bitzur" loans for various public works which provided employment for a large number of workers. The Jewish Agency guaranteed the repayment of these loans on the date of maturity, and its expenses on account of defaulting borrowers amounted to LP.1812.740 at the end of March 1941. The balance of the Jewish Agency's guarantees to "Bitzur" amounted to LP.17,564.183 at the beginning of this year. The works actuated by the above guarantees provided a total of 106,000 work days.

ad (21) Government works. The activity of the Jewish Agency in this connection consists in securing the employment of the maximum numbers of Jewish workers on Government public works. About 8000 Jewish workers were engaged on Government works. Expenses on this item during the period of the Semi-Annual Report amounted to LP.1317.371, most of which went for the transfer of workers to the sites of work, thus enabling them to accept the low wages paid by Government.

ad (22) Joint labour exchanges. There are at present 22 labour exchanges in the following colonies: Even Yehudah, Beer Yaakov, Binyamina, Gedera, Gan Yavneh, Hadar, Herzlia, Zichron Yaakov, Hadera, Kfar Yona, Kfar Saba, Karkur, Nezz Ziona, Nathania, Pardess Hanna, Petach Tikvah, Rishon le-Zion, Rehoboth, Ramat Hasharon, Ramatayin, Meged, Raanana, Tel-Mond. The following organisations participate in the joint labour exchanges: General Federation of Labour (Histadruth), Hapoel Hamizrachi, General Zionist Workers, Agudath Israel Workers, Yemenite Organisation, National Workers' Front (the last being a section of the Revisionist Labour Organisation).

During the last three months of the Report period the unemployment situation in the colonies was as follows:

The Jewish Agency contributes 50% towards the upkeep of the labour exchanges and bears, in addition, the cost of supervision over them. The remaining 50% is contributed by the participating organisations according to their respective number of workers enjoying the benefits of the labour exchanges.

ad (23) In order to alleviate the plight of the citrus growers and at the same time assist inexperienced workers to attain the minimum volume of production required, these workers - most of them refugees - are instructed while at work in the groves. They are accompanied every day by capable instructors who work side by side with them and show them how to work with spade, pruning knife, etc. without injuring the trees or fruit. Many growers who formerly refrained from employing Jewish workers now engage them willingly.

About 3000 workers were trained each month by some 250 instructors, 6-10 of whom are permanent, whilst the rest are veteran workers whom the Jewish Agency pays a premium of 50-100 mils per day for giving instruction to the new men working alongside with them.

ad (24) "Auxiliary farms". The average per capita loan to rural labourers for auxiliary farms was up to LP.10. During the period of the Report, October 1940 to March 1941 - 625 loans totalling LP.5252.950 were given to individual workers. This money was used for preparing the land, the laying of about 5000 metres of irrigation pipes, the erection of 35 chicken coops, the purchase of about 10,000 hens, baby chicks and ducks, 50 cows, 350 sheep and goats, 15 bee-hives and draught animals. In addition, repairs were carried out on old inventory belonging to the workers (chicken coops, fences, sheep-folds and barns). These loans were given through the Workers' Banks, the "Hir" Co. and the Union Audit of Cooperative Societies and their repayment is anticipated.

The considerable fall in unemployment in March is due mainly to the loans for orange grove development which the Jewish Agency then began to distribute.

Besides the loans to individual workers, loans totalling LP.7,474 were extended to 64 kibbutzim and 4 Betar groups. These loans served for the extension of vegetable gardens to an area of over 300 dunams, the supply of some 25 tons of seeds, the supply of fertilizers, the increase of livestock and the erection of chicken-coops and bee-hives.

ad (25) "Refugee labour camps". These camps were established in order to assist the refugees arriving in the country who have no relatives here to help them. All those capable of physical labour were accommodated in labour camps at Hadera, Petach Tikvah, Ness Ziona, Ramat Gan and Bat-Yam, near Jaffa. Altogether there entered during the first year 5700, 1268 refugees, of whom 756 were trained in the camps and absorbed later in various places throughout the country. At the beginning of the year 5701 there remained in the labour camps 512 refugees. Nearly 150 refugees were absorbed by agricultural settlements.

ad (26) Marine and Fishing. At the beginning of 1941 there were 170 Jewish workers engaged in fishing. The tables below give details of the Jewish Fishing catch and number of workers:

ad (27) Urban Settlement, Trade, Industry & Investments. This category is constituted according to the type of persons for whose benefit the operations were undertaken, namely the urban population. However, in order to make the category still more intelligible we shall in future exclude from it all investments, which will appear separately.

ad (28) Loans for industrial recovery. The Loan Fund established with the Anglo-Palestine Bank is contributed as to 40% by the Jewish Agency, 50% by the Anglo-Palestine Bank and 10% by the Palestine Industrial Bank. The Jewish Agency bears the first risk for losses. Up to the end of 1940 the loans granted out of this Fund totalled LP.81,000, of which the Jewish Agency contributed LP.33,000. Seventy-five factories and 10 production cooperatives benefited from this Fund. The loans were granted for long terms up to ten years. So far only small losses have been sustained.

ad (29) Payment on a/c of guarantee given to A.P.B. in 5700 in connection with a/m loans.

ad (30) Technical Instruction, Information, etc. The expenditure under this item for the first half of 5701 was LP.3336.066, as follows:

The administration expenses amounted to LP.1613.027, of which LP.1326.610 represents salaries and the balance travelling expenses, postage, telephone and telegraph charges.

ad (31) Loans to Small Tradesmen. From the 1st October, 1940, to the 31st March, 1941, only LP.3653.812 was allocated to the Funds for loans to small tradesmen. The average loan to an artisan or a small tradesman is LP.20.- The collections on account of such loans are used mostly for granting further loans. An additional LP.675.- was granted to 15 Benevolent Loan Funds which distribute loans to small tradesmen and artisans ranging from LP.5.- to LP.10.-

ad (32) Investment in Marine Trust - Tel-Aviv Port. From 1.10.40 - 31.3.41 the Jewish Agency's investments in the purchase of Marine Trust shares totalled LP.2,970.417, whilst additional commitments totalled LP.23,000. The total investments and commitments amount to LP.57,240.- These commitments are payable to the "Bitzur" Co. which extended an equivalent sum in loans to the Marine Trust on the strength of our guarantees. Upon Italy's entrance into the war, a decree was passed forbidding large vessels to call at open ports, thus bringing almost to a standstill the movement of vessels at the Tel Aviv Port with the exception of a few smaller craft engaged in coastal shipping. The port management has now reduced operating expenses to the very minimum, allowing for the use of the harbour only in cases of urgency. There are now prospects of an improvement in the situation.

ad (33) Investments in the Tel Aviv Development Co. The Company was founded in the year 5698 at the initiative of the late M. Diezengoff and it owns the Exhibition Grounds of the Levant Fair. It has since been reorganised and at the beginning of 1941 representatives of the Keren Kayemeth, Keren Hayesod and of the Municipality of Tel Aviv were added to the Management, thus giving the Company a public and national character. The grounds which the company owns are very important for the future development of the Tel Aviv Port. The present value of its assets is more than LP.100,000.- The Jewish Agency invested LP.3000 in this company in the year 5700 and another LP.5007.500 during the first half of the year 5701, covering for these investments shares to a nominal value of LP.10,000.- The Keren Kayemeth also has a share in the company's capital.

ad (34) Relief. The number of unemployed to whom relief was given through the "Workers" Organisations was 13,000-14,000 per month during October 1940-January 1941 - i.e. 40,000 persons. From February onwards the number of people receiving direct relief became smaller and nearly 5,000 agricultural labourers were given part-time employment - a number of them through the Jewish Agency's loans to citrus growers. In addition to the above, the Social Service Bureaus of the Vaad Haleumi extend relief to 30,000 needy individuals each month.

The number of children who benefit from the Child Feeding Project in the schools is 24,000.

ad (37) "Administration and General Expenses". This item includes the expenses of the secretarial and bookkeeping departments, pensions, compensations, and collection expenses. Administration expenses in the foregoing paragraphs referred only to the administration of the particular departments which were mentioned.

ad (38) Debt repayments. In the Semi-Annual Report which we shall soon send you we have segregated the payments on account of interest and the payments on account of capital. We shall also attach a list showing the payments on each of the Keren Hayesod loans separately.

With regard to the item of "transportation" which appears both under the category of Immigration and Training and under Labour and Housing, we wish to point out that under the category of Immigration and Training it refers to the transportation of immigrants or refugees immediately upon their arrival in the country, whereas under Labour and Housing it refers to the transportation of workers from one village to another or from the towns to villages in connection with seasonal work. Heretofore the various departments which incurred any expenditure on refugees listed such items under the categories falling within scope of their activities.

In our future reports we shall make a special effort to clarify every single item in the light of your observations.

Jewish National Finances 1939/1940.*

In the first issue of 1940 of our Bulletin we have brought a Summary taken from a publication by Mr. A. Ulitzur on "National Capital and the Upbuilding of Palestine".

The following article contains a Supplementary review on this subject by the same author.

THE YEAR 1939/1940:

The following table shows the net income for the year 1939/40 of the central funds the Keren Hayesod and the Keren Kayemeth Leisrael, and of the other national institutions: "Hadassah" the Women's Zionist Organization of America (whose activities include medical and social services in Palestine), the Women's International Zionist Organization ("WIZO") (engaged in the education and training of women and in the maintenance of various institutions for the welfare of mother and child), and the Hebrew University, the highest Jewish research and teaching institution in the country. The table shows that the aggregate net income of the Jewish National institutions during the year October 1939 - September 1940 totalled LP. 1,918,597, of which LP.1,696,897 (88 per cent) were derived from contributions and LP. 221,700 (12 per cent) represented income from services, collections, grants-in-aid, etc. The net income of the national institutions, as received by their Head Offices, was;

The amount of LP.165,049, representing contributions received by the Jewish Agency's Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews includes an amount of LP.73,801 received from American Hadassah for Youth Aliyah in the year under review. Of the total amount of contributions received by the funds and national institutions, LP.1,027,202 or 60.5% came from the United States and LP.669,695 or 39.5% from other countries.

During the same period October 1939 - September 1940, the aggregate disbursements and investments of the Jewish national institutions amounted to LP.1,941,768, of which LP.97,284 or 5% for immigration and training (including travel expenses of refugees); LP.832,387 or 42.9% for land purchase and agricultural settlement; LP.140,504 or 7.2% for labor and housing LP.98,014 or 5.1% for urban settlement, trade, industry and investments; LP.422,723 or 21.8% for educational and cultural activities and for Youth Aliyah; LP.140,140 or 7.2% for health and social services; LP. 144,405 or 7.4% for national organization and security; and LP.66,311 or 3.4% for general administration and various expenses, such as interest, etc. (excluding organization and collecting expenses of the Funds).

It is with particular satisfaction that one notes the fact that, even such difficult times for world Jewry, large amounts of money continue to come into Palestine, mostly from the United States and the countries of the Sterling Block. This influx of capital offsets to a large extent the considerable deficit in the country's trade balance due to the decline of exports.

Owing to the resuscitating effect of Jewish National capital no national position or asset has been directly affected by war conditions; indeed, the significance of Jewish national funds becomes all the more vital in these times owing to the shrinkage of private economic investments and the restriction imposed on activities of other public bodies (such as P.I.C.A. and the Alliance Israelite Universelle).

SUMMARY FOR THE YEARS 1917 - 1940:

The next pages contain the following two tables:

Table A) gives a summary of the income, expenditure and investments of the Central Funds and National Institutions during the years 1917/1940 (October 1917 to September 1940);

Table B) shows the net income from contributions i.e. income after deduction of collection expenses, of the Central Funds and National Institutions by years, during the years 1917/1940.

The aggregate amount spent by the Funds and National Institutions on their activities in Palestine during the 23 years 1917/1940, totals LP.22,017,024. Of this amount, LP.12,711,863, or 57.7% were spent on activities included in the category of "Immigration and Settlement", and LP.9,305,161/42.3% on "Public Services and National Organization".

It should be observed that, as a result of the coordination of activities, amounts were sometimes transferred from one of the institutions (included in Table A) to another, for specific purposes. To avoid duplication the amounts so transferred are shown within the table against one of the institutions only, while the total amounts transferred by and to each institution are shown separately at the bottom of the table.

It should also be noted that receipts of the Funds shown in Table A. do not include the loans raised by the Keren Kayemeth Leisrael (e.g. from the sale of Debentures and from various loans) and by the Keren Hayesod (from loans obtained from Lloyds Bank in 1934 and 1938). The debts of these two central Funds at the end of the period under review (30.9.40) amounted to LP. 1,681,000, of which LP. 1,121,000 was owed by the Keren Kayemeth Leisrael (as against LP. 1,193,000 on 30.9.39) and LP.560,000 by the Keren Hayesod (against LP.577,000 on 30.9.1939). The accumulated assets of the two central Funds, after providing for depreciation and various reserve funds, amounted at the end of 5700 (30.9.40) to a total of LP 7,971,000, made up of the assets of the Keren Kayemeth Leisrael of LP.5,521,000 (compared with LP. 4,940,000 at the end of September 1939) and those of the Keren Hayesod of LP.2,450,000 (compared with LP. 2,256,000 at the end of September 1939).

* Bulletin No. 6 (November-December 1940) contained a Provisional report on the budgets of the Jewish Agency (out of Keren Hayesod funds), the Keren Kayemeth Leisrael and the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews for the year 1939/1940. Now we are giving the final figures of these institutions, together with those of Hadassah, WIZO and the Hebrew University.

M E M O R A N D U M

TO : Officers of the United Jewish Appeal
FROM : Messrs. Isidor Coons and Henry Montor, Executive Vice-Chairmen
SUBJECT : Pledge and Payment Report

Since the preparation of the attached Pledge and Payment Report giving the status of the 1941 United Jewish Appeal as of September 30th, with \$11,340,434 recorded in pledges and \$6,224,044 received in cash at national headquarters, there have been further advices on the results of campaigns held earlier in the year and the figures as of October 15th have been raised to \$11,435,778 in gross pledges and \$6,551,142 cash received at national headquarters. These gross totals include the sum of \$4,381,096 representing actual pledges received by the Greater New York City Campaign. In addition, the New York City Campaign has on its books approximately \$300,000 in what they term "pledges to raise", making a gross total at this date for New York City of \$4,680,895. Out of this total allowance is to be made for campaign expenses and shrinkage in collections. To date the Greater New York City Campaign has remitted to national headquarters \$2,725,100 out of the total of \$6,551,142 received at national headquarters.

National campaign expenses to date, including the sums reimbursed to the J.D.C., the U.P.A. and the N.R.S. for expenditures prior to the reconstitution of the U.J.A., amount to 438,155.86, or 3.8% of the total raised to date.

The productive campaigns of the Fall period are just getting under way. Reports from Boston, Philadelphia and Cincinnati indicate that the level of advance gifts is being maintained or exceeded above 1940. Although these

campaigns will be completed within a month or so and most of the other sizable communities will also complete their campaigns before December 1st, final word as to their allotments to the U.J.A. may not come in for several months. Early reports, however, seem to indicate that our estimates will be sustained.

At the request of the Allotment Committee we prepared detailed estimates on the probable results of the 1941 U.J.A. indicating that the total gross to be raised for the year will reach approximately \$13,900,000, representing a figure within \$150,000 of the gross amount raised in 1940. After generous allowances for expenses and shrinkage in collections, we estimated conservatively that there would be a net available for distribution from the proceeds of the 1941 U.J.A. of \$11,600,000, so that after the deduction of \$8,800,000 for distribution in accordance with the terms of the national agreement, there would be available for the consideration of the Allotment Committee a sum of approximately \$2,800,000. We expressed the opinion that, all other factors being equal, there might be a variation in our estimates of not more than \$250,000 either way.

1940 UNITED JEWISH APPEAL

Total cash has been received in the amount of \$12,429,485.46, against gross pledges of \$14,048,564.28. New York City has remitted \$3,901,500 including the \$1,000,000 to the N.R.S., and the country at large has paid \$8,527,985.46. After the allowance for local campaign expenses and estimated shrinkage in collections, there remains a collectible balance of approximately \$375,000, which we are making every effort to bring in as promptly as possible.
