Dear Rabbi Silver:

The Jewish community of Winnipeg is now making plans for a city-wide U.P.A. campaign. Owing to circumstances beyond our control we must open our campaign on September 19th, which gives us very little time for campaign preparations. While we are now attempting to obtain the services of a speaker we have been advised to our regret that it would be out of the question for you to visit Winnipeg at this time.

As you no doubt know we are quite isolated and have found it exceedingly difficult to bring noted men to meetings over this great distance. However, if we cannot have you in person, we feel we must have your voice. In this connection our committee is hoping that you will find it possible to make a fifteen-minute recording which we can use over the radio and at a number of parlor meetings that our campaign committee has planned.

The arrangements are quite simple, and I am confident that Mr. Abraham Magida, of your office will make all the necessary arrangements with station WOR which has been kind enough to co-operate with us in the past.

We are planning a \$50,000 campaign for the U.P.A. and we feel that much depends on obtaining your co-operation in this matter.

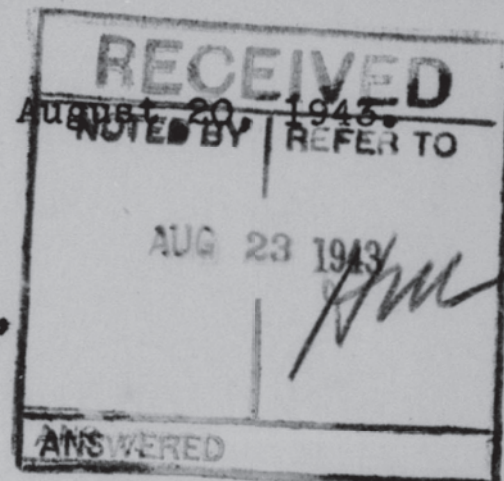

First of all, I want to tell you that I received that magnificent United Palestine Year Book for 1943; and I agree with you that it is a most effective summary of the remarkable achievements in the Jewish National Home.


I also can't tell you how delighted we are in Philadelphia that you are going to deliver the keynote speech at our \$100.00 plate dinner on January 25. Knowing how difficult it is to secure train reservations, I would suggest that you have your secretary make whatever arrangements you find necessary for your travel to and from Philadelphia, and that you have your secretary send to me a bill for whatever expenses will be involved, so that I can take care of same.

I should also like to know whether you will be able to spend the evening with us, as suggested in my previous letter, so that I might make the necessary hotel accommodation for you, or whether you will find it necessary to return to Cleveland the same night.

I think that you will be glad to learn that we met with our Philadelphia Congressmen last night and presented to them the entire Zionist picture, including of course the white paper and its effect on the development of Palestine as the Jewish National Home. We had a most sympathetic audience and discussed the matter for over four hours. We presented to them the tentative resolution which was submitted to us by Mr. Joel Gross, of the Emergency Council; and we received some very constructive suggestions, which I am forwarding to Mr. Gross, who will undoubtedly combine them with the suggestions being received from Congressmen all over the country, so that an effective picture of congressional sentiment will be available to the Emergency Council. Of course, should you be interested in the reaction of the individual Congressmen from Philadelphia, I would be happy to furnish you with that information at any time.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I have checked with the Pennsylvania Railroad and find that the only train leaving for Cleveland on Tuesday evening, January 25, is one that leaves our North Philadelphia Station at 9:46 P.M. While I know that this is early, considering the nature of our meeting, I still have no alternative but to make a reservation, in accordance with your wishes; and I am enclosing your train ticket and Pullman accommodation and will naturally make arrangements to see to it that you make your train on time.

I would like to know when you expect to arrive in Philadelphia and at what station, so that I can make the necessary arrangements. Unfortunately, because of the train situation, we will be unable to save your address for the final position on our program; and while I am sure that as a result the remainder of the evening will be an anti-climax, I also realize that even your appearance is "Dayenu."

According to our program, I judge that you will require from 40 to 45 minutes to deliver the keynote address, in connection with our White Paper protest; and since I feel that, making allowances for the possible delays incident to the serving of a dinner, we should tentatively schedule you to be finished by about 9:00, or a few minutes thereafter, (in order to have you make the North Philadelphia train at 9:46, which is at the other end of town) my schedule calls for your starting your address at about 8:20. We expect to start dinner between 6:30 and 7:00; and, of course, are counting upon your presence at that time.

We are getting an excellent return in the way of dinner reservations; and I am sure that the evening in Philadelphia will be one that will long be remembered by all of us.


Rather than take a chance on mailing the ticket to you, I will hold the ticket and give it to Dr. Silver, so that he will be sure to have it.


Dear Miss Kline:


Dear Dr. Silver:


Dear Dr. Silver:
