Dear Doctor Silver:

On my return from Boston last evening I was told that you are in town. I called you up this morning at the Commodore but unfortunately you had left already. We had a report from Mr. Arthur Lourie, who arrived in this country a short while ago, about Dr. Weizmann's latest activities which are concentrated on the defence and supply problem of Palestine. The report shows that the research work carried out at the Rehovoth laboratories under the direction of Dr. Weizmann plays a major part in this connection. In my last letter to you of June 11th I already mentioned Dr. Weizmann's efforts to develop pharmaceutical and oil industries which are of vital importance. In addition to this, however, Dr. Weizmann is also engaged in activities along the lines of his discovery during the first war with the only difference that they are supposed to be applied in Palestine. I neednot point out to you what this all means to us from every point of view.

Meanwhile we have received during the last ten days three cablegrams from Dr. Weizmann urging us to send as much money as possible to Removeth with a minimum of delay. I don't want to impose upon you but you will forgive me if I ask you again to let us have a check from Cleveland as soon as you possibly can.
