
Dear Rabbi Silver:

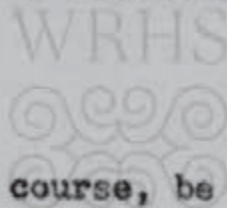

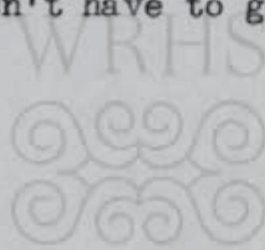

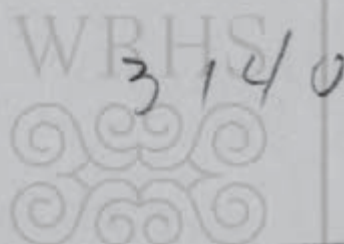

Some of our friends who attended the luncheon phoned me the same afternoon and volunteered a contribution to the Daniel Sieff Research Institute in Rehoboth, of which Dr. Weizmann is President. It was precisely the sort of thing that I had in mind when I discussed with you the question of my talking to such a group, and if I may say so, was admirably arranged.

We shall be in New York for this week-end and then go on to Washington, which we will leave on Thursday afternoon for Florida. I am wondering whether there will be any possibility of seeing you before my departure for Florida. I should very much like to have the opportunity of a talk with you in the event of your being in the East again before I leave for Florida.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have yours of January 30th. and also of February 15th. in reference to a contribution to the Chemical Institute to which Dr. Chaim Weizmann referred at his meeting here a short time ago, and regret that it will be impossible for me to make any contributions beyond those to which I am committed at the present time. I inferred from his talk and other information which came to me that his intention was to finance some large proposition either by loan or investment, but nothing was said at the time of the meeting.

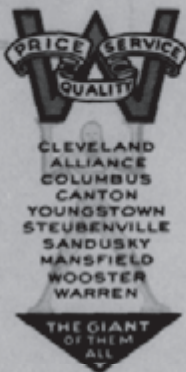

On my return from Boston last evening I was told that you are in town. I called you up this morning at the Commodore but unfortunately you had left already. We had a report from Mr. Arthur Lourie, who arrived in this country a short while ago, about Dr. Weizmann's latest activities which are concentrated on the defence and supply problem of Palestine. The report shows that the research work carried out at the Rehovoth laboratories under the direction of Dr. Weizmann plays a major part in this connection. In my last letter to you of June 11th I already mentioned Dr. Weizmann's efforts to develop pharmaceutical and oil industries which are of vital importance. In addition to this, however, Dr. Weizmann is also engaged in activities along the lines of his discovery during the first war with the only difference that they are supposed to be applied in Palestine.
