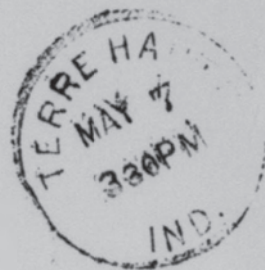


Your letter of the 25th inst. addressed to Mr. Charles Wise, was turned over to me by Mr. Wise for attention.
