Dear Rabbi Silver,

At the meeting of the Governing Body held on Monday, February 6th in London we discussed the programme of our Conference to be held in Hamburg on August 5th to 8th, and made it as definite as possible. My colleagues were very glad to hear that you had consented to give a paper at the Conference. We should be grateful if you would take as your subject "Public Worship," bearing in mind that our central subject is "The Place of the ynagogue in modern Jewish Life," and that Mr. Montefiore has been asked to give an introductory address on "Judaism and modern Thought." We are asking you to speak at the session on the Sunday morning, and we ask that the paper should not exceed 25 minutes so as to give time for discussion. We all reasise what a great privelege it is to have your co-operation, for we feel sure that you will make the subject a thoroughly live one and will make it possible for those who attend the Conference to feel stimulated bu it. The Governing Body has decided, that, although we have stringently to limit our expenses for printing, it is necessary to give sunopses beforehand for the benefit of those who do not understand well the language in which the paper is read. I should be very grateful if you could send me your synopsis in good time for translation. It would be a great help if I might have it before the end of June.
