Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am writing you on behalf of Young Judaea to request to serve on our Board of Trustees for the coming year.

Young Judaea, as you are doubtless aware, is that organization which endeavors to bring to the aid of the Zionist cause the Jewish youth of America and to bring to the Jewish youth of America the abiding ideals of Judaism, Jewish life, religion, and culture.

In the pursuit of this aim, it has organized more than one thousand clubs of young people, has published educational books and pamphlets and is maintaining a staff of trained workers to see that the educational programs of the clubs are effectively carried out.

In the past this work was largely financed by the Zionist Organization. The Zionist Organization, at present is rightly turning its attention chiefly to Palestinian work, and Young Judaea must therefore rely upon its own resources.

I know from personal experience as the rabbi of a large congregation as well as by contact with Young Judaea workers that the work they are doing is not only vast educational importance, but that the workers of Young Judaea have manifested a devotion and spiritual enthusiasm seldom equalled. These young people, therefore, have every claim to our moral and material support.

The undersigned, who has been honored with the presidency of Young Judaea, hopes that you will accept the appointment on our Board of Trustees. Your interest in the spiritual welfare of our Jewish youth as well as in the Zionist cause should prompt you to add your name to the list of those who will stand back of Young Judaea.

Kindly let me hear of your acceptance as soon as possible. I make this plea not only on my own behalf, but in the name of Judge Mack who is the Honorary President of Young Judaea.

## The Voice of Twenty Thousand Jewish Children

A whole generation of the Jewish Youth in America is facing a spiritual crisis.

Young Judaea, which has brought up thousands of loyal young Jews, is in danger of having its accumulated forces scattered to the four winds.

Hitherto the Zionist Organization of America supported Young Judaea, but now the parent Organization must apply its financial resources directly to the problems of Reconstruction in Palestine.

Young Judaea must henceforward find its own means for carrying on its work.

### YOUNG JUDAEA'S WORK MUST GO ON!

In this crisis Young Judaea is determined to rely on its own efforts, and calls on understanding American Jewry to rally to its aid.

Commencing January 23rd Young Judaea will carry on a campaign for funds. Forty Thousand Dollars is needed to maintain the Thousand Clubs of Jewish boys and girls for the coming year.

There is no money to be lavished on an expensive campaign. Every penny of the money raised will go into actual Young Judaea work.

The campaign for the first two weeks will be concentrated in its appeal. Young Judaea asks for Two Hundred and Fifty "Contributing Friends" each to subscribe One Hundred Dollars. This will form the solid nucleus of the Forty Thousand Dollar Budget.

In addition a special fund of Five Thousand Dollars will be raised to be used as the "Friedlander Memorial Fund for Publications of Young Judaea."

The remaining Ten Thousand must be raised by the children's clubs through Entertainments and Mass Meetings after the first part of the campaign is over.

Twenty thousand children already enjoying a Zionist education in the Clubs ask for a chance to grow up as good Jews and Zionists.

What will be *your* contribution to meet Young Judaea's needs?

# What Young Judaea has meant in the Life of the Jew in America

## *Young Judaea's Biography.*

Young Judaea began ten years ago in a small way, with a big idea. Boys and girls wanted to receive Jewish education and nationalist inspiration. The happy social atmosphere which children crave was provided in the form of the organization—*a club*. A capable leader soon made the club an influence for Judaism and Jewish nationalism. The idea spread, and took root in many places.

The first President of National Young Judaea was Professor Israel Friedlander.

Within a few years there were hundreds of Young Judaea clubs. Now there are over one thousand. About twenty thousand Jewish boys and girls from eight to eighteen years of age are vigorously participating in the benefits of Young Judaea activity and preparing themselves for Patriotic services to Palestine and the Jewish people.

# Young Judaea's Influence

## YOUNG JUDAEA'S PIONEER WORK—

was the first answer to the problem of the Jewish youth in America, on a national scale. Its method has proved the right one; making Jewish history, Jewish religious life, Jewish tradition, idealism and nationalism *appealing to the American born child.*

**TRAINING AND SUPERVISION:** Young Judaea maintains a training school for leaders and has a capable corps of supervisors throughout the land. They are all American, and skilled in handling the Jewish child so as to inspire love for his people and his people's life. An efficient correspondence and travelling Field Workers keep constant touch with all new developments, and standardize all Young Judaea to a high plane of co-operation.

## "YOUNG JUDAEA'S PERSONALITY"—

has worked as an anti-toxin against missionaries and other destroying influences.

Young Judaea Jewishness has been *cheerful, colorful, bubbling with song, more attractive than vicious surroundings*—and it has succeeded.

**CELEBRATIONS, ACTIVITIES:** At every Jewish Festival Young Judaea holds large gatherings. The twenty thousand members invite many more of their friends; last year there were a total of over half-a-million admissions to Young Judaea celebrations. The entertainment in a Zion'st environment brings new Jewish influences to untold numbers outside the clubs.

## YOUNG JUDAEA'S TEACHING—

is conducted by educational experts, who have prepared palatable, systematic courses in Bible, History, Hebrew, Zionism and cognate subjects.

**PUBLICATIONS:** "Young Judaean" monthly magazine for the young; leaflets in Hebrew, monthly for children; Leader's Bulletin; Books of poems, Music, Maps, Pictures, Directions for Celebrating, Plays; Textbooks, Syllabi. Courses of Study. Outlines, etc.

During the last ten years more than 3,500,000 pieces of study literature, in text books, pamphlets, syllabi and other forms have been prepared, distributed, and used by Young Judaea.

## YOUNG JUDAEA'S ZIONISM—

has created a Jewish solidarity among our boys and girls.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

Some little time ago I sent you a routine letter of the kind written to Young Judaea workers all over the country in order to keep you posted on the doings of the National Campaign.

I am now writing to you personally to ask you to render a service which only you can give.

New York City Young Judaea has arranged for a big affair at Madison Square Garden on Sunday evening, February 20th. This will be known as the "Young Judaea Music Festival". Cantor Josef Rosenblatt has been engaged as the principal musical feature.

You Know Our  
Situation

The Zionist Organization of America at its last convention voted to make Young Judaea autonomous. If the Zionist youth of the country is to continue its activity, it must now establish itself without further subsidy from the national Zionist Organization.

A Matter of

THE WORK OF YOUNG JUDAEA MUST GO ON. The breaking up of the National Young Judaea Organization at this critical time in Zionist and general Jewish affairs would be an irreparable loss to Jewry and to Palestine.

Young Judaea is determined to carry on its work without a break in the continuity of its effort. To this end an Extraordinary Convention was called in Philadelphia on December 18th and 19th. Plans for the maintenance of Young Judaea as an independent body, affiliated with the Zionist Organization of America were formulated. A campaign for funds was decided upon.

Time of the  
Campaign

Young Judaea's campaign will begin January 16th and will continue intensively for two weeks, to be followed by a broader form of campaign for an additional two weeks.

How Much Is  
Wanted and  
Why

Young Judaea needs \$40,000 for this year's activity.  
It costs an average of \$40 to maintain each club each year. (This includes all our publication work, national office, field work, supervision, and local administration).

There are about 1000 Young Judaea clubs in America.

Every club must be given a chance to live and develop. Only the full success of our \$40,000 Campaign will insure this.

A -  
"Concentrate-  
the-Contribu-  
tions-Campaign"

Young Judaea has not the means to conduct an expensive and elaborate campaign. Every penny raised will go towards the carrying out of actual Young Judaea work.

A distinctive plan of campaigning has been hit upon. Instead of a promiscuous appeal a selected list of men and women in each community will be approached and asked to contribute \$100 each towards Young Judaea's budget for this year. You and the National Headquarters together will work out the list for your territory. You will then organize the proper committee to approach this limited number of people. They will be a uniformly sympathetic group of patriotic Jews capable of giving this amount.

250

The total number of men and women who are expected to become "Contributing Friends" of Young Judaea at \$100 each will be limited to 250, and this number will be distributed through the cities and towns of the country, in accordance with the lists of previous campaigns which are now being carefully studied.

This method of procedure will emphasize the fact that we are approaching only those individuals or organizations in the community from whom we have a right to expect immediate relief in our critical situation. They will be so picked as to make refusal on their part almost impossible.

One Banner

About the 1st of February, the second part of the campaign will begin to take shape. However, plans for this as for the first part of the campaign must be started immediately. During the first two weeks in February each local community will run the banner affair of the year in the form of a monster entertainment, concert, or theatrical performance. It will be advisable, where the local situation warrants it, to employ professional talent.

Every Young Judaeon should be expected to sell tickets for this affair. This will be the only form of activity in connection with the campaign that will be demanded of the boys and girls.

Quotas for the District under your supervision will be assigned within the next few days.

You will send all moneys whether raised from "Contributing Friends" or from the one big affair of the year to the National Treasurer at Headquarters. The percentages to be retained for local needs and for the needs of the National Office are being worked out, and we will notify you as to the same at the same time as quotas are assigned. The immediate work on hand is:

a) The selection of the proper committee in your community to interview the prospective "Contributing Friends" and the drawing up of a list of the prospects for approval by the National Campaign Committee.

b) Immediate preparations for a large affair to be held in the early part of February in which all your members will participate by selling tickets, souvenir programs, etc.

Publicity  
Preparedness  
Push

One of the principal values of the campaign will be the education of American Jewry in the activities of Young Judaea. Begin at once to give extensive publicity to all phases of Young Judaea work, in anticipation of the campaign which is to begin within the next two weeks.

We cannot allow any talk of "depression" to stay our efforts. It is not a question of choice with us. Young Judaea must live through this crisis. If the local branches as well as the National Organization do not immediately raise funds it may be too late to attempt to put Young Judaea on a sounder footing at another time.
