



As per your advice, I got from Miss Klein, the Jewish Daily Bulletin of March 31st, and read your editorial. I find that while this editorial serves a good purpose for the national Zhitlowsky Jubilee activities, the article in the special Zhitlowsky Jubilee Volume for our city, should be, in my judgement, of a strictly local character. You are the chairman of the Zhitlowsky Jubilee Committee and your article should be more of a summary statement in regard to our local activities, such as commending all those organizations who have so splendidly responded, and the individual workers, such as the Executive Committee and your Vice-chairmen. Of course, you understand, Rabbi, that this is my personal opinion, and if you should think otherwise, I will be glad to make up an article from the one in the Jewish Daily Bulletin.

Herman Rosen has accepted our invitation to play at the Jubilee celebration, which solves our program problems, as it is now complete.





# **CONCESSION AGREEMENT**

herein called the "Grantee," witnesses the following duly authorized concession agreement then and there entered into by and between them:

1. The City hereby grants to the Grantee the right to use space in the Cleveland Auditorium and/or Cleveland Stadium, for the purpose of **LECTURE**.

and for no other purpose; this concession being granted strictly upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth:

2. Said Grantee shall pay to said City for the use of such premises the sum of ONE DOLLAR PLUS EXPENSES.

(\$ 1.00 ) to be paid in cash at the time of the signing of this instrument, the receipt whereof by the City  
from the Grantee is hereby acknowledged, and the balance EX AS COMPUTED ON THE EVENING OF THE ABOVE

The Grantee shall also pay to the City for the use of the premises aforesaid during the time aforementioned, IN  
ADDITION to the above sum of Dollars

(\$.....) hereinbefore specified, a further sum equal to

of all admission fees collected from the public for entrance fee paid upon entering the said building and also from the sale of tickets of admission to said exhibit wheresoever and by whomsoever the same may be sold.

3. It is mutually agreed that in order to properly secure the enforcement of all of the provisions of this agreement, the City shall have the complete and sole supervision, charge and conduct of the sale and collection of all tickets; there shall be such places for the sale and collection of all tickets upon said premises as may be necessary in the discretion of the Commissioner of the Cleveland Auditorium and Stadium; it is further agreed that the City shall receive directly from the printer all tickets. The number of free or complimentary tickets to be distributed shall be mutually agreed upon and the City shall receive (therefrom) a mutually agreed upon quantity of tickets in a desirable location.

4. As a further consideration of this agreement the City shall have and retain complete custody, control and possession of all moneys received from the sale of all tickets wherever sold and of all moneys received for admission fees; the entire proceeds from the sale of all tickets, all moneys received for admission fees, and the sum deposited as a minimum guarantee in accordance with paragraph two above shall all be the rightful property of the City for the purpose of applying in accordance with all the terms and conditions of this agreement toward payment of any unpaid balances for rent and/or for any and all amounts of any nature or kind due the City for any purpose whatsoever necessarily arising in preparing and maintaining the said premises for the use above stipulated, and said Grantee shall not be entitled to receive any part of said moneys unless and until all charges for rent and all other items shall have been fully received by the said City.

5. In the event the Commissioner of the Cleveland Auditorium and Stadium deems it necessary and expedient to permit the sale of tickets in places other than the aforesaid premises he may do so at his sole discretion and thereupon Grantee shall furnish the City an accurate statement of all moneys received by said Grantee, or his agents, for admission fees and sale of tickets sold by the Grantee, or his agents, and shall make settlement with the City according to the terms and conditions of this agreement immediately after the close of the engagement or upon demand by the City at any time during or prior to the performance of the events or engagement herein designated.

6. The form and contents of all tickets shall be subject to the written approval of the Commissioner of the Cleveland Auditorium and Stadium. The schedule of admission prices to be charged by the Grantee is as follows:

To be mutually agreed upon.

~~TO THE RENT HEREIN RESERVED SHALL INCLUDE IN ADDITION TO THE USE OF SAID PREMISES, THE USUAL LIGHTING, HEATING AND COOLING SERVICES, CLEANING, MAINTENANCE, MAINTENANCE OF CORRIDORS, STAIRS, BALCONIES AND ELEVATORS; AND SUCH STORAGE FOR LOADING AS MAY BE AVAILABLE, EXCEPT~~

8. All electricity and gas used for display advertising or power, rental of equipment and all other special services available in the building shall, if utilized by said Grantee, be paid for at the prevailing rates; and in particular the following items: The Grantee will pay for ticket sellers, ticket takers, ushers, stage hands lights, cleaning, and in fact any and all services or labor rendered the herein Grantee by the City. The Grantee will pay for liability insurance on attendance at the rate of Fifty-Five and One-half Cents (.555) per hundred.

9. The Grantee shall not assign this agreement or any rights hereunder, and any attempt to sell or assign this agreement or any rights hereunder shall thereby terminate this agreement and any and all payments that shall have been received by the City hereunder shall be deemed to be the property of the City and in addition thereto Grantee shall be liable to the City for any and all damages occasioned to the City.

10. In the event that the several portions of the said hall are not vacated by the Grantee on the date above named as the end of the term for which said portions of said hall are respectively granted to said Grantee then the City shall be and is hereby authorized to remove from said hall at the expense of the Grantee, all goods, wares and merchandise and property of any and all kinds and description which may be then occupying the portion of the said hall on which the term of this concession has expired, and said City shall not be liable for any damages or loss to such goods, wares, merchandise or other property which may be sustained either by reason of such removal or of the place to which it may be removed, and the City is hereby expressly released from any and all such claim for damages of whatsoever kind or nature.

11. Grantee shall use and occupy said premises in a safe and careful manner; it shall comply with all laws, rules, regulations and ordinances in force in the City of Cleveland, Ohio; and all rules and regulations relating to the use of said hall; it shall use said premises solely for the purposes herein provided; it shall not permit said premises, or any part thereof, to be used for the sale of liquor or for any unlawful or immoral purpose or in any manner as to injure persons or property in, on or near the premises covered by this concession; said Grantee shall not do any act or suffer any act to be done during the term of this agreement which will in any way mar, deface or injure any part of said hall; and upon termination of this agreement Grantee shall deliver up to said City the premises aforesaid in as good condition and repair as the same shall be found at the beginning of the term of this concession, loss by fire alone excepted.

12. The City reserves the right of the Commissioner of the Cleveland Auditorium and Stadium or his representatives, to enter upon and to have access to said premises at any and all times on any matters connected with said premises.

13. Grantee shall pay and save the City harmless from any and all damages, loss or liability of any kind whatsoever occasioned within said hall or on the premises adjacent thereto by reason of any injury to person or property occasioned by any act or omission, neglect, or wrong doing of the Grantee or any of its officers, agents, representatives, guests, employees, invitees or other persons admitted by Grantee upon the premises, and said Grantee will at its own cost and expense defend and protect said City against any and all such claims or demands.

14. If any term, condition, agreement or covenant of this concession agreement on the part of the Grantee to be performed, shall not be complied with as required by the terms of this concession agreement; or if the Grantee shall cause or permit any substantial waste or damage to be done within the premises herein described, or any part thereof, then the City may, at its option, forthwith enter on said premises and terminate this concession agreement without in any manner impairing the right of the City to retain so much of the money as the City may have in its possession, under and by reason of the terms of this concession agreement and to apply the same to the payment of any and all claims which may then be justly due the City, and in the event such sum of money is insufficient for such purpose or purposes the right of the City shall not be impaired to recover such portion of the rent, other charges and damages then due the City, and also to recover such other damages to which the City may be entitled by reason of the default, violation or other wrongful acts committed or permitted by the Grantee, and the City may if it so elects waive its right to so enter into possession of the aforesaid premises and may pursue its remedy at law to collect any and all amounts which may be due said City. In the event the City of Cleveland waives its right to and/or refuses to enter into possession of the aforesaid premises, the City shall not thereby waive any or all rights said City may have or had prior to or subsequent to said breach of the terms of this concession agreement on the part of the Grantee, and in any event the City shall have the right to retain any and all moneys received from the sale of tickets whenever and wheresoever sold and the receipt from any and all admission charges, and to apply all or any part of said proceeds to any rent due, expenses incurred and damages sustained by said City of Cleveland, and this the City shall have the right to do either before or subsequent to any breach of any or all of the terms of this concession agreement on the part of the Grantee.

15. In case said hall or any part thereof shall be destroyed by fire or damaged by fire, or other cause so as to prevent the use of the premises for the purpose and during the time specified in this agreement, then and thereupon this agreement shall terminate and the Grantee shall pay rental for said premises only up to the time of such termination of the rent herein specified, and the said Grantee hereby waives any claim for damages or compensation which might arise by reason of such termination.

16. The City assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any property placed in said hall, and said City is hereby expressly released and discharged from any and all liabilities for any loss, injury or damages to person or property that may be sustained by reason of the occupancy of said hall under this agreement; and all watchmen or other protective service desired by the Grantee must be arranged for by special agreement with the Commissioner of the Cleveland Auditorium and Stadium or his representatives.

17. As a further consideration for this concession agreement, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto that the Grantee shall pay to the City of Cleveland, in addition to all other rents and charges hereinbefore mentioned and referred to, an amount of money sufficient to cover the liability insurance for personal injury, at the prevailing rate, carried by the City of Cleveland therefore on the premises herein let; said total sum to be determined upon the basis of actual attendance at the particular event or events.

18. The City specifically reserves the program, checking, taxicab, and refreshment privileges and concessions and any and all concessions except **No exceptions.**




