Dear Rabbi Silver:-

I take the liberty of addressing you on behalf of the Downtown Zionist District. This is the only district on the East Side of New York that has its own Center. Its activities are well known to all the leading Zionists throughout the country. We are now going to celebrate the Thirtieth Anniversary of the Zionist Movement, and for this purpose we have taken two leading Yiddish theatres on Second Avenue with a capacity of 6,000 seats. The Jubilee Celebration will start a week ahead of March 1st, and the whole East Side will be decorated. During the week we are going to have parades, music, open air meetings, etc., and will windup with the Jubilee Celebration at the two theatres on Thursday evening, March 1st.

We could not think of anyone else besides you who should be one of the principal speakers at such an occasion. The East Side as you know is the cradle of American Zionism and the Downtown District has as its members some of the first Zionist workers. The Downtown Zionist District consists of that Zionist element who have been members of Clubs and Societies who for the last twenty or thirty years have spread the Zionist idea in this country. Some of them have belonged to the "Austro Hungarian Zionists", "The Chatechiah Club" and the "Herzl Zion Club", of which you were once a member.

It is therefore that we have taken the privilege of inviting you to be our guest and speaker at one of the two theatres. We hope that you will see that there is no one else who is entitled to such a courtesy as the Downtown Zionists, and accept the invitation and be with us at this most outstanding event of East Side Jewry.

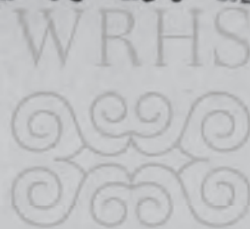
