I desire to acknowledge receipt of your kind favor of the 25th, and to thank you for your accepting our invitation. We will be glad to change our afair to suit your convenience and to make it on Sunday, December 2nd, instead of the 5th, as we originally contemplated.

We expect to accomplish the following practical results with this affair:

1. It is an old tradition of the Zionists of Chicago to celebrate Chanukah on a large scale and give the Jews of this City an opportunity to become acquainted not only with the life of the Maccabees, but with their spirit, thereby creating interest in our work.

4. We will appreciate if you will emphasize in your address the importance of organization and we may utilize this meeting in securing a number of new members. Provisions will be made to have application cards distributed in advance.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

The rapid disintegration of the Jewish position in many lands, particularly in Germany and Eastern Europe, and the unparalleled development of Palestine as a permanent haven of refuge for the victims of oppression, offering an opportunity for a free creative life, make it imperative that the full strength of the Jewish people be mobilized to enlarge the scope and possibilities of Jewish settlement in Palestine, if large segments of our people are not to perish.

The most competent and impartial students of the world Jewish scene have emphasized with increasing frequency that all conditions point to Palestine as the greatest center for the salvaging of Jewish life. But if the capacity of Palestine to meet the situation is to be fully utilized, there will be required the unprecedented and whole-hearted support of Jews everywhere.

It is, therefore, proposed to call a National Conference on Palestine to be held on Sunday, January 20, 1935, at Washington, D. C., which will register the will and intention of American Jewry toward the acceleration of the economic development of Palestine.

An impressive demonstration of concentrated purpose, serving as a token of the will to concrete action, will signify to the Mandatory Power, to the League of Nations, and to the Jewish people the earnestness with which we offer our material and moral support for the enlargement of Palestine's absorptive capacity and thus help to bring about a wider opening of the doors of Palestine to Jewish immigration.

To indicate the representative character of this project and to help prepare for the Conference itself, there is being formed a National Sponsorship Committee for the Conference on Palestine. The organizing committee extends an invitation to you to join the Sponsorship Committee and to aid us by counsel and cooperation in this effort. The Conference is being summoned on a platform able to hold all Jews, united solely by their interest in the rebuilding of Palestine as a center of Jewish life.

There is enclosed herewith a card on which you are asked to indicate your acceptance of membership. We shall be glad to hear from you on any phase of this undertaking.

Dear Dr. Silver:

Answering your kind favor of the 25th, I wish to state that while it is true that originally our plans were to give our Chanukah festival at the stadium, but it was not available and we then engaged the Auditorium Theatre, which is the largest hall in Chicago next to the stadium.

Two years ago we had a pagent and a year ago we presented a Chanukah play. This year we decided that the Zionist Organization is not in the producing business and decided to arrange a city-wide Chanukah festival, with a fine musical program and yourself as the guest speaker. This will not be another Zionist meeting; it is a city-wide celebration sponsored by the Zionist Organization of Chicago with the cooperation of all Zionist and nationalistic elements such as Hadassah, Mizrachi, Poale Zion, Women Pioneers, Young Judea and Avukah.

This affair has been given publicity both in the Yiddish, Jewish English weeklies and the secular press. You will note from the enclosed clippings that it will be an "All Chicago Chanukah Festival".

You will have a large, intelligent and responsive audience, perhaps one of the finest Jewish audiences you have ever addressed in this City.

Let me know when you expect to arrive, where you will be located and when you expect to leave.

I am of course sorry that you cannot be with us for dinner.





Dear Rabbi Silver:

This is to acknowledge your acceptance of membership in the National Sponsorship Committee for the National Conference on Palestine, to be held in Washington, on January 20th and 21st.

The sessions on January 20th will be held in the Memorial Continental Hall of the Daughters of the American Revolution. The sessions on January 21st will be held at the Mayflower Hotel which is the headquarters for the Conference.

In order that we may have a fully representative attendance, we are anxious that every Jewish community arrange a city-wide conference to be attended by representatives of every Jewish organization in the city, at which the delegates to the National Conference on Palestine will be properly selected. If this Conference is to have the representative and impressive character which is so essential for its success, it is imperative that the community-wide conferences be held at the earliest opportunity so that there may be ample time for discussion of the issues and preparation for the Conference.

May I ask you as one of the members of the National Sponsorship Committee in your city to help take the initiative in arranging for such a city-wide conference and to cooperate with the local committee that may be created so that the local conferences may achieve their purpose?

I want to emphasize again that the National Conference on Palestine is summoned on a platform broad enough to hold all Jews interested in the reconstruction of Palestine and invites the participation of every Jew who is willing to help the acceleration of the rebuilding of Palestine.

I am enclosing for your information a copy of a pamphlet emphasizing the official character of the support that has been given by the American Government to the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home.

Permit me to thank you for your kind letter of February 5. I am glad that you wrote to Mr. Biron of the Seven Arts Teature Syndicate requesting the correction of his statement of last week. I am also glad to know that you did not give the contents of the letter from the Cleveland Zionist officers to the Syndicate or to anyone else. One of two things seems to be indicated -- either somebne has rifled your mail or one of the Cleveland Zionist officers who had a copy of the letter gave it to the Syndicate in the hope that it would be published.

Your third paragraph is, I am afraid, a bit of clever legal maneuvering. Somehow you overlook the fact that my attack on the Cleveland Zionist officers did not take place until <u>after</u> their infamous communication to you relative to the cancellation of the invitation. Prior to that time, I had made to attack of any character on them. In fact, I kept silent in the face of many provocations until this last indident.

Frankly, my dear Mr. Rothenberg, what amazes me is your own personal reaction to their communication. All you seem to have been concerned about is that it put you in an embarrassing position....

Dear Sir:

I take pleasure in informing you that at a meeting of the Administrative Committee of the Zionist Organization of America, held on Sunday, May 19th, your name was placed on the Z.O.A. list of candidates for delegates to the 19th World Zionist Congress, which will be held at Lucerne, Switzerland, beginning August 27,1935.

As you have previously been informed, the Zionist Organization of America has entered into an agreement for a joint Ticket in the forthcoming Congress Elections with Hadassah and the Order Sons of Zion. The total number of Z.O.A. members who have signified their willingness to be candidates and to go to the Congress, if elected, is 73.

One of the problems connected with the making up of such a list has always been the fixing of the numerical order of the nominees on the Ticket. This is of much importance, because the number of delegates to which the Zionist Organization of America is entitled is much smaller than the number of candidates named. A candidate whose name is higher up on the list naturally will have a better chance of election than one occupying a lower position. In previous years, we were enabled to settle the matter of the order of names by a vote at the Zionist Conventioh, since the Elections followed the Convention. At the urgent request of Hadassah and of other participants in the Elections, the date of the Election this year was fixed for June 23, 1935, whereas the Zionist Convention will be on June 29th, after the Election.

The Administrative Committee gave earnest consideration to the subject, with the view of finding a method whereby the order of names may be chosen in a democratic and fair manner, and unanimously adopted the following procedure: The names of the candidates, as they will appear on the Ticket with alternating Hadassah nominees will be as follows:

- 1. The President of theZionist Organization of America.
- 2. The ex-Presidents of the American Zionist Organization and Chairman of the Provisional Committee for General Zionist
- 3. The Nasi of the Order Sons of Zion. Affairs.
- 4. The Vice-Presidents of the Zionist Organization of America.
- 5. The Governing Council of the Zionist Organization of America.
- 6. The members of the Administrative Connittee, the National Executive Committee, and all nominees of Districts, in alphabetical order.

This order of names, however, will only be for purposes of the General Election. Since under the Congress Rules, the votes in the Election are cast for the Ticket as a whole, and not for any specific candidate, the Ticket as elected will be submitted to the Convention which will, by a secret vote, fix the numerical order of the delegates.

To make it possible that this procedure be carried through, it will be necessary under the Congress Statutes for each condidate to execute a Power of Attorney authorizing someone to act for him in effectuating the plan outlined. Accordingly, such Power of Attorney is herewith enclosed.

I am sure that you will realize that the action contemplated is in the interest of all candidates alike, and I would ask you kindly to sign the Power of Attorney and return it at once, since time is of the essence.




