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



I concur with both your observations:
that the Ohio Region is defunct and that a live Region
should be created in that part of the country, to include
the State of Michigan.

As you undoubtedly are aware, at the
last Zionist Convention there was considerable feeling
about the matter of Regions and that some resolutions were
adopted, but to the regret of all of us, these resolutions
failed to give any specific direction.

The Committee on Organization is now attempting
to prepare something definite, which, when in shape, will
be communicated to the Districts. In the meantime, the
National Organization has no mandate to oblige Districts to
belong to any specific region. As this operates at present, it
is conducted on a purely voluntary basis.

I would therefore suggest that you as a Zionist
leader in your community, sound out the communities you
have in mind, as to their willingness to join a region along
the lines you propose, and if a sufficient number of
affirmative replies are received, we will then proceed to
take some official action. In your specific instance, the
National Organization is faced with an additional difficulty.
This is absolutely confidential -- notwithstanding the fact
that the Ohio Region is in this moribund condition, it
exists, if only on paper, and were we to do what you propose,
namely, to reorganize the region, the present heads of the
Ohio region might consider it as an unfriendly act. That
cannot apply to you, because as a Chairman of a District,

you never felt the presence of any region.

Dear Rabbi:

In line with the suggestion which you made to me when I was in Cleveland recently, I wrote to the National Office, proposing the reorganization of the Ohio Zionist Region, and the inclusion therein of the state of Michigan. Enclosed herewith you will find the response which we received from Morris Margulies.

It occurred to me, after talking to you, that if Michigan were included in a reorganization of the region, it would furnish a valid reason for proceeding. Michigan has only two or three Zionist districts, and is therefore not active enough to maintain a region of its own. I am on very intimate terms with the leaders of the Detroit Zionist District, and am quite positive that I can enlist their cooperation.

Will you look through the letter from the National Office, and suggest to me what you think ought to be the next line of action to take. I originally thought of calling a conference in Toledo, but Toledo might not be regarded as "neutral" territory, any more than Cleveland would.

What do you think of the following plan? Suppose that I were to consult with the leaders of the Detroit Zionist District and obtain their formal consent to enter into a Michigan-Ohio Region. Then suppose we were to issue a call for a conference, let us say, in Columbus, over the signatures of the presidents of the Detroit, Columbus and Cincinnati districts, together with your signature and mine.

Let me know what you think of it.



The Report of the Royal Commission for Palestine.

Dear Rabbi Silver,

I have been asked to invite you to speak at a Public Demonstration, which we are holding either on Monday or Tuesday evening, the 19th or 20th instant, in connection with the Report of the Royal Commission on Palestine.
