To ZOA Regional and District Presidents and Secretaries

Dear Friends:

The 47th Annual Convention of the Zionist Organization of America will convene in a four-day session beginning Saturday night, October 14th, through Tuesday, October 17th, 1944. Atlantic City has been selected as the Convention City and the four-day sessions will be held in the Hotels Breakers and St. Charles.

In view of the wartime transportation restrictions and to meet the requirements of our Government to reduce the representation, the last meeting of the Executive Committee and the National Administrative Council held on July 9th, unanimously adopted the following changes in the basis of representation:

l. In place of the former unit of representation of one delegate for each fifty members, a district is entitled to one delegate for the first fifty members in good standing, and one additional delegate for each additional 300 members and major fraction thereof.

I direct your attention to the enclosed instructions and regulations for further amplification.

Elections of delegates and alternates to the Convention may be held until Tuesday, August 15th. Election returns, filed on the enclosed official form must be mailed to National Headquarters on or before August 16th, 1944.

Due to wartime difficulties to obtain railroad and hotel accommodations, alternates are asked to attend only in the absence of a regularly elected delegate.

Please hold your Election Meeting early, and file your Election Report as soon thereafter as you can. This will help to



Since Districts having a membership of less than fifty may not elect a delegate to the Convention, we earnestly request that such Districts bring their roster up to the required minimum as soon as possible. We should very much like to have every District properly represented at this crucial meeting.

Representation is based upon the number of members in good standing as of August 31, 1944. Under these circumstances, each District may anticipate the number of its members in good standing on August 31st. Districts are urged to see that all members are brought up-to-date, and to enroll as many new recruits as possible before that date.

The Convention will meet in a decisive stage in history. Its decisions will affect the destiny of our people in the postwar world. The participation of your District in this historic conclave is imperative if we are to speak for a united American Jewry.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have not communicated with you before this because I wanted to have something definite to report to you.

After our conversation in your home, I discussed the matter with a number of leading non-Zionists, and was frankly amazed at the opposition which I found. Many of them feel that their experience in the Agency and in the Conference was so unsatisfactory, that they are reluctant to try again. I continued in my efforts, although there was little prospect of success.

This morning's mail brought me a letter from Judge Proskauer, which makes me feel that the difficulties are much deeper than I suspected, and that it will take much more time and effort to overcome them. Hence, I am writing to say that my efforts have thus far not been crowned with the success I hoped. While I shall continue, because I am still convinced that a way out must be found for the good of all concerned, I did not want to delay writing you any longer.

Please be assured that I enjoyed our conversation and greatly appreciated your hospitality.

Please accept for yourself and Mrs. Silver, my kindest personal regards.

As you have already been advised, the 47th Annual Convention of the Zionist Organization of America will convene on Saturday evening, October 14th and continue through Tuesday the 17th at the Breakers Hotel in Atlantic City, New Jersey. Among other items of convention business will be the election of the members upon the National Administrative Council, pursuant to the following provisions of our constitution (Sections 8 and 9 of Article IX):

"Section 8. The Administrative Council shall consist of the officers, members of the Executive, the Regional Chairmen, and such additional number of members, not exceeding one hundred and twenty, as the Convention shall prescribe, of whom no more than half shall reside in the city of New York.

"Section 9. The Administrative Counsil shall be elected as follows:

(a) 20st the Convention

(b)100 by the regions (having due regard to representation of districts and societies) on the basis of the numerical strength of each region in the Zionist Organization of America..."

In accordance with these provisions and on the basis of your membership enrollment to date, your District is entitled to elect one (1) member to the National Administrative Council. The final determination cannot, obviously, be made until our membership records are closed on August 31, 1944. We suggest that your Society proceed at once to the election of your representative upon the Administrative Council.

Will you please advise us as quickly as you can the name and address of your representative on the National Administrative Council?

Subject: Election Committee on Committees Members

Pursuant to a directive from the 45th Annual Z.O.A. Convention and upon the recommendation of our Executive Committee, the Administrative Council adopted the resolution hereto attached, which provides for the designation of the Committee on Committees in advance of the annual convention.

In accordance with the formula then adopted, fifty (50) members and fifty (50) alternates of the Committee on Committees are to be named by the Regions and largest affiliated Districts. On the basis of our present paid membership a member of the Committee on Committees is to be designated for each 2,200 members or major fraction thereof. The Cleveland Zionist Society is accordingly entitled to elect one (1) member and one (1) alternate on the Committee on Committees.

Will you please arrange for your District to proceed at once with the election of your representatives on the Committee on Committees, Please note that the persons designated as members or alternates on the Committee on Committees are to be named from among those who will be elected as delegates to the convention. Please note, too, that the Committee will meet on Friday afternoon prior to the formal opening of the convention. This arrangement is intended to facilitate the work of the convention and to avoid interfering with the full attendance of the various convention sessions.

Please send us the names and addresses of your representatives on the Committee on Committees as soon as they are elected.

ELECTION OF COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES

In order to facilitate the work of the convention, the Committee on Committees shall be designated in advance of the convention. The Committee on Committees shall consist of seventy-five (75) persons, who shall have been elected as delegates to the convention. Twenty-five (25) shall be designated by the president of the Zionist Organization of America and fifty (50) members and fifty (50) alternates shall be elected in the following prescribed manner:

The Regions (having due regard to representation of districts and societies) shall name their representatives on the Committee on Committees on the basis of the numerical strength of each Region in the Zionist Organization of America, in the same manner as the regions elect members of the National Administrative Council.

In the event that a person designated as a member or as an alternate of the Committee on Committees shall not be in attendance at the convention to participate in the meeting of the Committee, the President of the Z.O.A. is authorized to fill the vacancy.

Sessions will be convened at both the Breakers and the St. Charles Hotels. Preceding the formal opening of the Convention, a Sabbath Dinner will be held Friday evening. October 13th, which will be devoted to the subject: Zionist Youth and Education. On Saturday afternoon following Services and the Sabbath meal, an Oneg Sabbath will be held under the auspices of the Histadruth Ivrith dealing with Hebrew Oulture. A tentative convention program will be sent to you within a short time.

Hotel Reservations:

To Z.O.A. District Officers

Dear Friends:

The forthcoming ZOA convention which will represent the largest constituency in the annals of our movement is expected to usher in a revitalized year of activities in all Zionist districts.

However, in view of the present situation affecting the fate of our people, it would be folly to permit a lull in the few weeks still remaining before the convention. It is imperative that Zionist activities be intensified in the face of world shaking changes now taking place. For these are also momentous days in the history of Zionism.

This year we cannot afford to get into stride gradually. Bold and dynamic action is the order of the day. Zionist districts must start right off with pace and tempo. This year our Zionist year must begin a full month before the convention.

Particularly I wish to call to your attention one phase—a most important phase—of the ZOA program for the

coming year which calls for the utmost consideration on your part and that of your colleagues as you begin to plan your Zionist year.

Zionist activity nationally and locally must be expanded to nourish the cultural and educational needs of American Jewry. Assimilationists have boldly seized control of anti-Zionist propaganda. Our political work for the Jewish Commonwealth and our practical work for the upbuilding of Palestine must be integrated with a systematic and energetic program of education for adults, and especially for our American youth. This is essential to consolidate our great membership growth of the past year; to continue further expansion of Zionist ranks and to recruit youth to its rightful place in our movement. Even before we achieve the Jewish Commonwealth, certainly thereafter, Palestine as the center of Jewish culture, as the spearhead of the Jewish renaissance should and can be made to radiate its influence, its warmth, its Jewish dignity among the Jews of America.

At the same time the ZOA must take the initiative in the launching of major projects to further the economic and industrial stability of the re-created Jewish Commonwealth of Palestine. We shall have to continue our fight against the anti-Zionists who will resist our efforts to strengthen American Jewish life.

For all these purposes, we shall require a sizable special fund, as our normal income for membership dues can only provide for normal organizational needs.

The ZOA Executive at the last meeting authorized the launching of a Cultural Expansion Fund of \$250,000 for the fiscal year commencing October 1st. It will replace the existing Extension Fund and the Radio Fund*, and will also provide for additional much needed activities. An outline

^{*}Whatever money will be sent to the Radio Fund after Oct.15, will be credited to your share of the larger Fund.

of the allocations of the Cultural Expansion Fund to finance the carrying out of our various major projects is contained on the accompanying sheet.

With our organization numbering over 100,000 members, the raising of this Fund for Cultural Expansion should be attained within the prescribed period—before January 1, 1945. This is essential if we are to be in a position to carry out its purposes within the coming year.

You are therefore requested to take up this matter with your colleagues and undertake to provide your fair portion of this fund.

The ZOA is ready to do a worthwhile, greatly needed job in the significant fields of Culture and Education, including the fight against the insidious anti-Zionist propaganda, if the districts throughout the country will provide the necessary resources. We in the national office can start just as soon as you give us the wherewithal.

We must hear from you immediately as to whether we may count on your help.

May we take this opportunity to extend to you and to the members of your district our Rosh Hashanah greetings. May the New Year bring at long last, victory to the United Nations, relief to the tragedy-scarred Jewish people and a free and self-governing Eretz Yisrael.

Dear Dr. Silver:

The Birmingham District of the Zionist Organization of America is planning its annual meeting October 22nd or 29th. Simply stated, we should like for you to address the meeting. I know that stating the request so simply does not mean that it can be answered so simply. I am not at all unmindful of your many engagements, the calls upon your time, the obligation to your own Temple, the pressing demands of the Emergency Council. However, I thought it best to state our desires simply and then to set out what I hope will be persuasive points overbalancing the weight that is honestly tipped against us.

We have approximately eight hundred members. We hope to go to one thousand. There are two members of the Council for Judaism here. One is also a Zionist member but, since we are clear to the point that he does not know the make-up of either of the two organizations, we have concluded: "Requiescat in pace."

We believe that your presence here could light a fire that would burn the year and the flame might catch on in one or two of the neighboring states. Mississippi is altogether dead, yet we are not without friends there. (I do not know whether you are personally familiar with the fact or not but a few days ago, Hans Lamm wrote me to obtain an expression of opinion from Senator James O. Eastman, of Mississippi, with respect to the resolution pending in Congress. I found that Jim Eastman was an old schoolmate and obtained a complete endorsement.)

You have done a splendid job up there - the planks in the platforms of both major parties was a signal achievement. We feel, too, that we are doing pretty well here and, in our small way, acting as a small but essential prop to you. It is most diffi-

If all of these things, after careful consideration by you, do not tip the scales, we shall be content and secure in the knowledge that you have carefully weighed it. If you can arrange it, the date, either the 22nd or the 29th, will be at your convenience. Not less than five hundred will attend from neighboring counties and a sprinkle from Mississippi. Arrangements for your transportation by the quickest and most convenient method will be made, and as little of your time will be consumed as humanly possible.

I would like to conclude it this way: For many of us here, in matters Zionist, you are our Willkie, Wallace and Roosevelt rolled into one.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ELECTION OF DELEGATES

TO: Z.O.A. DISTRICTS, REGIONS, SOCIETIES, CAMPS OF ORDER SONS OF ZION, AND MASADA CHAPTERS.

Your attention is directed to the following pertinent sections of Article VIII of the Constitution of the Zionist Organization of America relating to the election of Delegates to the Annual Convention:

SECTION 3 — Each District or Society shall be entitled to one Delegate to the Convention for each 50 paid-up members in good standing

'The following rule, substituting Section 3,'
'was approved by the National Administrative'
'Council at a meeting on July 9th, 1944.
'Representation to the National Convention 'shall be elected on the basis of one delegate for the first 50 members and one additional' delegate for each additional 300 members and 'major fraction thereof, Example: A District' with 350 members is entitled to two delegates; 'a District with 501 members is entitled to 'three delegates and so forth.

SECTION 4 --- Each Region shall be entitled to one Delegate for each 1,000 members, and major fraction thereof, in good standing, but in no event less than one Delegate.

'The following was substituted for above: The'
'Administrative Council at the meeting on
'July 9, 1944 decided that Regional representation shall be on the basis of one delegate for'
each 2,000 members and major fraction thereof.'

SECTION 6 -- Delegates to the Convention shall be elected only by paid-up members of the Zionist Organization of America. SECTION 7 --- No member shall be elected as a Delegate to the Convention unless he has been a member of record of a District or Society for at least six months prior to the election, and at the time of election is a paid-up member in good standing of the Zionist Organization of America. The following rules for the election of Delegates and Alternates, adopted in 1940, pursuant to Article VIII, Section 8, by the Executive, with the approval of the Administrative Council, continue in effect: 1. No person shall be granted a credential as Delegate of Alternate to Conventions of the Z.O.A. unless (a) he shall have been duly elected by a District, Society or other duly constituted elective body, and (b) his election shall have been certified to the National Board of Elections by written certifications, as set forth below, no later than Wednesday, August 16, 1944. 2. (a) Delegates and Alternates of Districts, Regions, Societies, Camps of the Order Sons of Zion, and Masada Chapters, shall be elected by the members thereof at an election which shall be held pursuant to regulations promulgated by the National Board of Elections. (b) Delegates and Alternates of Regions shall be elected at a Conference of representatives of all constituent bodies in the Region (c) Delegates and Alternates of affiliated organizations shall be elected as provided in their respective agreements with the Z.O.A. (d) In no case shall proxies or substitutes be permitted for any duly elected Delegate or Alternate who fails to appear in person at the Convention. Hereafter committees on vacancies, whether local or national, shall be unauthorized. 3. Certification of the election of Delegates and Alternates shall

3. Certification of the election of Delegates and Alternates shall be in writing subscribed by the President or Vice-President and the Secretary, or by the local Board of Elections of the District, or other elective body, and if so certified by the local Board of Elections, shall be accepted only if the members of the local Board of Elections and of the officers of the District, or other elective body, shall have filed such returns with the National Board of Elections no later than Wednesday, August 16th, 1944.

4. What constitutes a momber of good standing? Any member, old or now, who has paid his dues in full within the twelve-month period, proceding August 31st. 1944 is a member in good standing of the Z.O.A. and is eligible to vote for Delegates to the Convention.

Will you; therefore, kindly call a meeting of your Executive Committee at which a Neminations Committee and a Board of Elections, each to consist of a minimum of five members, shall be elected.

Every registered member who has paid his dues for the fiscal year 1943-44 should be notified of the date and place of the elections and also of his right to nominate candidates by petition. Nominations may be made by petition over the signatures of not less than 15 members in good standing.

All nominations, whether by the Nominations Committee or by Petition, are to be filed with the District Board of Elections, one week prior to the date of election, which shall accept these nominations and place all names in alphabetical order on the official ballot to be printed by the Board of Elections.

The number of Delegates to which a District, Region, Society or Camp of the of the Order Sons of Zion is entitled, is to be determined by the number of members in good standing as of August 31st. 1944. The membership record of the District, Region, Society, O.S.Z. Camp, must agree with the records of the Comptroller's Office of the Zionist Organization of America.

No District, Camp, Society, or Masada Chapter having less than fifty members in good standing is qualified to elect a Delegate. Pooling the membership of one or more Districts, Camps, Societies, or Masada Chapters in order to acquire a total of fifty is not permissible.

The number of Alternates that may be elected shall not exceed the number of Delegates.

A member who is in good standing in one of the affiliated organizations (Order Sons of Zion, etc.) and who is also a member in good standing in the Zionist Organization of America, can vote only once for the election of Delegates to the Convention.

The Election of Delegates to the Convention may be held at any time hereafter but no later than Tuesday, August 15, 1944.

In all cases where more than two Delegates are to be elected, a member shall have the right to vote for only two-thirds of the entire number of Delegates. Voting shall be by secret ballot. The candidate or candidates, receiving the highest number of votes, shall be declared elected. The candidate or candidates receiving the next highest number of votes, shall act as Alternates. In case of the resignation of an elected Delegate, the Alternate receiving the next highest number of votes shall take his place as Delegate.

No Delegate or Alternate will be seated unless his election is certified by the National Board of Elections.

The official Election Report properly filled out and certified by the local Board of Elections must be filed with the National Board of Elections of the Zionist Organization of America, not later than Wednesday. August 16.

1944. in order that credentials may be issued in time to the elected Delegates.

The Election Report of the affiliated groups must be filed <u>directly</u> with the National Board of Elections of the Zionist Organization of America at Washington, D. C. in order that such Delegates may receive their credentials from the National Headquarters of the Zionist Organization of America.

The Minnesota Region is terribly anxious to have you come to Minneapolis any date you may choose. This territory is at present more Zionistically-minded than ever before, as evidenced by the fact that the Minneapolis membership up to this past year has been 366 whereas last year's membership increased to 1100, plus 18 life members. St. Paul's membership has increased from a little over 200 to over 700. A great percentage of these new members know very little about the movement and your appearance in Minneapolis will bring most of those members out to hear you, thereby giving them an opportunity to get acquainted with the movement.

For the good of the movement, if it is humanly possible for you to come here, it is absolutely imperative that you do so. Your appearance in Minneapolis will mean a regional conference. We will have members and delegates from various communities in this region here for a luncheon meeting and in the evening, we will have a mass meeting, with many members from outlying communities such as Duluth, Fargo and, of course, St. Paul, and Minneapolis.

This letter is signed by myself, as President of the Minneapolis District, Mr. Goldenberg, President of the St. Paul District and Dr. Barren, President of the Region.

Needless to tell you that we, the undersigned, will tremendously appreciate your giving us a day. As I said above, any day that you set will be satisfactory with us.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

The launching by the United Palestine Appeal of its own campaign in 1945 makes this enterprise and its success of the utmost importance to every officer and member of the Zionist Organization of America. We must bend every effort to the end that in each of our communities a maximum of money is made available this year for the Keren Hayesod and the Keren Kayemeth, the two great national institutions which comprise the United Palestine Appeal.

From the office of the United Palestine Appeal will come more detailed material explaining the budgetary needs of Palestine and the methods whereby each community may best mobilize its forces so that our demand for parity for Palestine may be achieved in this crucial year. The Zionist Organization of America and its personnel must inevitably be the keystone of the United Palestine Appeal. It is we, more than any other single group, who understand (1) that the Jews of the United States must have brought to their attention with unparalleled clarity and vigor the primary truth that Jewish life in Europe must be saved through the Jewish National Home; and (2) that in this great year of decision for the political future of Palestine all our financial resources must demonstrate our determination to do our part to encourage the nations of the world to do theirs.

I would like to summarize the situation:

- (1) The United Palestine Appeal had to undertake an independent campaign in 1945 because the Joint Distribution Committee failed to concede the equality of importance of Palestine, whose contribution to the saving of Jewish life is without parallel.
- (2) In speaking of an "independent campaign" it must be noted that in every major city where there is a Welfare Fund, the United Palestine Appeal will continue to be a beneficiary. Instead of funds going to one common pool called the United Jewish Appeal, where distribution would be made as in the past few years, the United Palestine Appeal will make application directly to every Welfare Fund and will be a part of the local campaign.

- (3) In the smaller towns where there are no Welfare Funds, the community will either raise funds independently for the United Palestine Appeal or will seek to raise funds for it in combination with the Joint Distribution Committee or other causes.
- (4) The Zionist Organization of America calls upon all its officers and members to give their fullest support to the request by the United Palestine Appeal to each community to give to the U.P.A. parity with the J.D.C. in the distribution of funds.
- (5) The United Palestine Appeal is not engaged in a competitive campaign. It is presenting to the Jews of America an affirmative, constructive account of the incomparable role of Palestine in providing a present and a future for the Jewish people. What it accomplishes will be an index to American Jewry and to the Yishuv of the supreme place which Palestine has in the loyalty and affection of our people.
- (6) The increasingly important role which Zionists have taken in Welfare Fund activities must achieve new strength. Zionists should seek leadership in Welfare Fund campaigns; they should provide stirring examples of energy and capacity in the solicitation of funds; they should, above all, set new standards of generosity such as are required in 1945 to meet the present relief needs of the Jews of Europe and the permanent security needs of European Jewry through the building of the Jewish National Home.

To expedite action, I am suggesting that you communicate directly with Dr. James G. Heller, National Chairman, United Palestine Appeal, 41 East 42nd Street, New York City, assuring him and his associates of your support. From him you will also obtain information as to how action may be taken in each community in the conduct of the campaign, in the presentation of the most effective material to the local Budget Committee and as to the remittance of funds.

The United Palestine Appeal campaign is a great challenge to every Zionist. I am confident that with the strength and vision of our constantly growing manpower we shall give an account of ourselves that will make a glorious chapter in the history of American Zionism.



Introducing this Newsletter

We are addressing you as a member of the Unity Committee's "army in the field." Your ZOA President gave us your name sometime back as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in your District, and while many of you have already been working diligently in our cause, you are probably eager to receive some direct guidance from us as to where your duties as Unity Chairman lie.

We're going to attempt to furnish that guidance.

Equally important, though - we want guidance from you.

We want this Bulletin to be the beginning of

A TWO-WAY PASSAGE

We'll funnel our ideas to you,

You give us your reactions and suggestions.

OUR COMMITTEE'S JOB

..... is clearly defined and vitally important. It is to win non-Zionist Jews to Zionism and to counteract anti-Zionist propaganda with a positive public relations campaign.

FROM A POPULAR SONG

An appropriate slogan for our committee is provided by one of the current hit tunes. We've got to "Accentuate the Positive. Eliminate the Negative." There is no doubt about the positive nature of our movement and our message. The anti-Zionist Council could not possibly make the same claim.

WE ARE PROMISED A HEADACHE

That job will not be getting any easier as the year goes on. Council for Judaism - the organized anti-Zionist group - held a conference in Philadelphia recently and adopted for the coming year a budget of \$250,000. You can buy a lot of "public relations" for \$250,000 - particularly when it is to be spent in one small segment of the community: that part of the Jewish community which has hitherto been non-Zionist. Note that this is the same segment of the community which our Committee is intended to win over (with a budget of less than \$50,000), (so get behind that Expansion Fund Campaign!)

What we must do, then, is follow the recipe old General So-and-So gave for military success:- "get there fustest with the mostest."

In organizing your local campaign, study our leaflets in the series "The Facts" as well as our bulletins. You will find that they are positive and that they usually refrain from mentioning or attacking the Council. This last is something we do not want to do. We do not want to advertise our opponents. These are the things you should do now!

PROJECT # 1

Initiate a direct-mail campaign designed to win non-Zionists:

- 1. Make up a mailing list composed of members of the Reform Congregations who have not yet joined the Zionist Organization, with the addition of the names of all those people who have been approached by the anti-Zionist Council or are receiving the Council's literature, or are likely to succumb to anti-Zionist propaganda.
- 2. Print letterheads for the local Committee on Unity for Palestine, listing on it the names of those who have been appointed to the Committee. These should be names calculated to impress those to whom this literature will be directed.
- 3. Send a covering letter with the first piece of literature. Here is a suggested form for that letter:

"Dear Friend:

"We know that as a fair-minded person interested in knowing the facts about Palestine, you will want to read the enclosed leaflet.

"'American Jews and Palestine' is the first in a series of factual brochures which this Committee has issued in the effort to remove some of the misconceptions which have been current about Zionist aims. You will agree with us that there has been altogether too much heat and too little light in the discussion of this vital subject. We feel that the enclosed pamphlet is a first contribution toward a clear understanding of what the Zionist movement actually seeks to accomplish in Palestine.

"We shall be tremendously interested to learn your reactions to this material and eager to answer any questions you may have concerning the effort to provide a home in Palestine for our homeless European brethren.

4. Carry "The Facts" leaflets in your pocket for ready distribution and illustration. Have your committee members carry them and hand them personally to their non-Zionist friends.

PROJECT # II

Arrange parlor meetings to which you will invite the non-Zionists in your community. We have found this to be the most effective means of getting our story across. These are generally in the form of an evening meeting in the social atmosphere of a private home, attended by 20 to 30 people each meeting - (10 or 15 couples). At these meetings someone who is equipped to discuss Zionism in a calm and factual manner should be asked to present the facts about Zionism and answer the questions of those present.

The parlor meeting technique has been used effectively by our Director, Rabbi Lelyveld, in a tour just completed. In San Francisco, for example, he addressed 12 such meetings which were attended by more than 400 non-Zionists representative of every segment of the community. More minds are changed in the intimate give-and-take of a discussion than at a mass meeting. We urge you to organize this activity in the following way:

- 1. Line up 5 or 6 men who would be willing to offer their homes as hosts to such meetings, and who have contacts with the groups you wish to reach.
- 2. Carefully prepare the list of those to be invited to each meeting.
- 3. Persuade someone who is equipped to do so to conduct these meetings, or write to room 600, 41 East 42nd Street, New York 17, for information as to the possibility of securing an outside speaker to lead these discussions. We shall endeavor to help you make contact with someone in your Region who will be capable of doing this job.

The parlor meetings in San Francisco were arranged by Mrs. Henry Harris and the local Zionist leaders, among them Jack Verdi, Sidney Rudy, and the energetic Zionist President, Rabbi Saul White. Parlor meetings in Los Angeles were held at the homes of Dr. Monte Salvin, President of the Hollywood Zionist District, and Mr. Harry Bauman, Southern California Chairman of the ZOA Expansion Fund Campaign. Parlor meetings were also arranged in Houston, Texas and Dallas, Texas, through the efforts of Bernard Lasky, Houston Unity Committee Chairman, and Helman Rosenthal and Sidney Pines, co-Chairmen of the Unity Committee in Dallas.

WE HAVE TWO REGIONAL CHAIRMEN

Two of our Zionist Regions have appointed splendidly equipped individuals to head our Unity Committee work in their areas. Mr. Julius C. Livingston of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Vice President of the Southwest Region, is serving as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in that Region. Rabbi Sylvan Schwartzman of Augusta, Georgia, has accepted the Chairmanship for the Southeast Region, and is formulating plans for an intensive campaign this Spring.

Dear Dr. Silver:

Thank you very kindly for your letter of March 26th and for sending me another copy of "Public Opinion On The Zionist Controversy". Apparently I was misinformed in connection with our resolution appearing therein. I was, therefore, very happy to notice that it was there. However, I want to make a correction. In the booklet it is stated that we have a membership of fifty, while our membership is over 150 at this time.

Incidentally, our district, which is considered the most active and militant Zionist District in this section of the country, is seriously considering sending a delegation to San Francisco on April 25th, to join with other organizations there for the purpose of making a demonstration in connection with the Palestine situation. The subject is still in the stage of discussion, but will probably take definite form at the next meeting of our Board, which will be tomorrow night.

May I ask you for your views on the subject. It is needless for me to tell you that anything you may say on the subject will be given very serious consideration.

May I also ask you whether you plan to be in San Francisco during the Conference, for if you do plan to be in this part of the country, we would like to plan some sort of function for the cause of Zion and utilize your presence here. As the time is very short and our members are restlessly aching for action, I would deeply appreciate an early reply, if convenient, by wire.

Dear Sire

Enclosed you will find a clipping from the "Morning Freiheit" of Friday April 13,45 announcing the "FREIHEIT ANNI-VERSARY CONCERT" in carnegie Hall. You will find it features Barl BROWDER and Max HELFMAN, director of the "Philharmonishe Folks Choir" (- until recently known as the communist "FREIHEIT GEZANG FERRIN".)

It was suggested that I draw your attention to the fact, that Mr. HELFMAN, the official director of the communist workers' cherus happens to be also the director of your Zionist Youth music activities. It may sound unbelievable, but if you will take the trouble to investigate you will find it is actually true.

Enclosed you will find one of the letters our youngsters have been receiving from your Zionist Youth Organization. It reads: "... you will be glad to hear that our own Max Helfman will be in charge of all the music work..

I am told that he also will be in charge of music activities at the Zionist Youth Camp "Brandeis", - and I do not intend to permit my dan hter to go there, if that should turn out to be true.

Is it compatible with the ideals and ethics of the Zionist Organization to entrust the education of our youth to persons of - at least - admittedly anti-Zionist convictions? If there can be found no other people to teach our children Zionist songs, - we parents wast go out and find them for ourselves.

How can the Zionist Organization claim the official leader of communest choirs as "our own"? What a lack of integrity. Is that our new friendship with Russia that makes such blunders. Where the education of our youth is at stake more precautions ought to be taken. - What an example do we put before our youngsters by entrusting them to a man who on sundays will direct communist youth with the same seal and "sincercity" as Zionist youngsters en Monday ? Isn't it a shame ?

Now that we have been reading so many announcements of this gentlemen's activities in the "FRETHEIT" circles, we are only waiting for an a nouncement of his Zionist activities - perhaps in our own "New Palestine". The next step would be to have Mr, Helfmen direct us in the singing of our "Hatikvah", rushing over from some communist gathering where he directed Sovjet Anthems.

I personally feel very much disturbed about the matter, having urged several of my non-Zionist neighbors to let their daughters join these Zionist Youth activities. There has been so much excitement recently about all that, - I just had to put the matter before you, - before it all comes out into the open, which I should like to avoid.



To All ZOA Regional and District Officers

Dear Friend:

This communication is written and mailed to you from the United Nations Conference Hall in San Francisco. I write these lines under the impact of the great and noble utterances that resound within the portals of this historic meeting place and are relayed to the four corners of the world.

As I listen attentively to the pleas of representatives of great and small nations, my mind is crowded with conversations I have had with many of these statesmen.

A mingled feeling of elation and distress filled my heart as I conferred with them. I felt heartened because of their earnest desire to lay the foundations of an enduring peace. But I am distressed because we Jews, who were the vanguard of the despoiled and massacred and who fought the enemy with rassion are on this day of victory bypassed and not even given a name.

I shall have much to report to you on this historic conference and I shall try to share with you my impressions soon through the columns of our official publication The New Palestine.

In this, my first direct communication to you from San Francisco, I want to report on something that will remain outstanding in my mind. In speaking with the statesmen and delegates of great and small nations on Zionist aspirations and achievements, I was frequently confronted with the question: "How many American Jews are Zionists?" It is obvious that our foes, both within and outside our ranks, have been very busy in San Francisco. It is likewise obvious that an attempt is being made to persuade the key delegates that the Zionist program is opposed by a large segment of American Jewry.

I told them of the Palestine Resolution adopted by an overwhelming majority of delegates of the American Jewish Conference and of the hundreds of thousands of contributors to the Palestine funds. But, in the undertone of their reaction I sensed a search for a more direct gauge of Zionist adherence.

I would like to see this challenge met by us - by every region

and district — through the enrollment of at least 50,000 new members before the end of the San Francisco Conference.

I intend to stay here another ten days. I appeal to you in all earnestness to wire me within the next few days your pledge to increase your membership by a substantial margin. Your telegrams should indicate a definite figure. This barrage of telegrams will be a demonstration of real substance.

Please act at once.



Before the Albany Zionist District at the Shaker Ridge Country Club, May 21st, 1945, at Albany

On all of the battlefields of Europe, the roar of the cannon has been stilled. The madmen have died or vanished in the nowhere, but their names will, forever, carry with them a long and lasting burden of agony and misery.

Democracy now sights its guns toward the Eastern fiend. The other half of the Fascist terror will soon be vanquished and with it will come the opening of the floodgates for the World of Tomorrow.

The barbaric atrocities of the past ten years illustrate what can happen to the human being when he fails to answer Cain's question "Am I my brother's keeper?" - what has happened and can happen are portrayed by the spectres who stalk the highways and byways of the world today. If a humane civilization is to survive, based on the rights of man and the sacredness of the individual, the world must be concerned with man's treatment of man everywhere.

Palestine has ceased to be a Jewish problem. It lives as part of a world problem, for peace is indivisible and can only be preserved on a global plan. When I speak of Zionism, I speak of a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth for Palestine, and when I speak of Palestine, there are three important questions which arise in the minds of those who are not Zionists-First: Is Zionism consistent with Americanism; Second: What are the legal and moral rights of the Jews to Palestine and Thirdly: Is there any other solution for the Jewish Refugee Problem of Europe.

Is Zionism consistent with true Americanism. Not only is there no possible conflict, answers the late Mr. Justice Brandeis, but there is a positive synthesis: "To be good Americans" he maintains, "we must be better Jews, and to be better Jews, we must become Zionists". Far from it being inconsistent with Americanism "loyalty to America demands rather than each American Jew become a Zionist". "Multiple loyalties are objectionable only if they are inconsistent".

America is full of nationalities which accept their new
American citizenship, yet look to some centre in the old
world as the source and inspiration of their national culture
and traditions. No one impugns the patriotism and the loyalty of the Belgian, the Italian, the Greek and the Pole, on account of their national origin or because of their desire to
help the land of their forbears.

What are the legal and moral rights of the Jews to Palestine. Notable and crystal clear is the fact that the claim of the Jewish people to Palestine is based on those very principles of law and morality for which free democracy now fights. Not only does history furnish us with the facts on which the moral claim rests, but civilized nations have solemnly and formally recognized the legality of such claim. For two thousand years Palestine was a Jewish land. There the Jews lived and toiled, struggled and died, and gave to civilization its exalted moral and ethical concept. Palestine was more than a Jewish State. It was the core of the Jewish religious framework. There lie the greatest episodes with which Jewish history is identified. When the Jews were forcibly exiled, Palestine assumed a greater importance to them. The Jews furnish the only instance in history of a disfranchised people neither losing its identity nor relinquishing claim to its homeland. Toward the end of the First World War came the first ray of Legal recognition of the right of the Jews to Palestine was given by the world.

The Allies recognized that the Jews had a national character. The first great manifestation of such recognition was the historic Balfour Declaration of November 1917, which declared:

"His Majesty's Government view with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people, and will use their best endeavors to facilitate the achievement of that object,"

Then came the Mandate for Palestine, which affirmed with legal finality the right of the Jewish people to Palestine. It stated with respect to the Balfour Declaration that:

"Recognition has hereby been given to the historical connection of the Jewish people with Palestine and to the grounds for reconstituting their national home in that country."

This mandate of the League of Nations, representing the will of upwards of fifty powers conferred the mandate for Palestine on England. It became the trustee for the establishment of the Jewish National Home. The intention was clear. At the peace Conference President Wilson stated:

"The Allied Nations with the fullest concurrence of our own Government and the people are agreed that in Palestine shall be laid the foundation of the Jewish Commonwealth."

The United States Congress, by resolution adopted in 1922, gave force to the attitude of the American people as to Palestine, when it called for "the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people." Thereafter the Anglo-American convention of 1925 made British action in Palestine subject to the approval of the United States.

A quarter of a century has passed. In these twentyfive years, based upon the representations of the Great Powers
of the world, the land has been rebuilt and a people has been
reborn. Acting on the promise of the Balfour Declaration, the
Jews brought over half a million people into Palestine. They,
founded 300 agricultural colonies, invested over \$600,000,000,
built 2000 industries and more than 5000 handicraft establishments. The dead soil has been revitalized - out of the dirt,

neglect and stagnancy, there has arisen a new life, molded by the sweat, blood and tears of these pioneers. Side by side with its agricultural rebirth, Palestine has progressed industrially and in this great world war had already proven itself as the military arsenal for democracy. The waters of the Jordan have been harnessed and electrified; great chemical plants draw minerals from the Dead Sea - life has been breathed into the dead.

What will the world do with the European Jew for whom exile is enforced; who cannot return to his old habitat, and who cannot find refuge in any other free country in the universe. Unless civilization has so reverted to the Nazi and Fascist role, as to wish the destruction of these homeless Jews, it must encourage the proved medium to solve the problem - Palestine.

James G. McDonald, Chairman of President Roosevelt's Advisory Committee on Political Refugees and former League of Nations High Commissioner for German Refugees, sums it all up when he says "On the record Palestine offers incontestably the primary hope for the solution of the problem of Jewish refugees. The conclusion which emerges inescapably from a realistic resume of twenty-five years of intergovernmental dealings with refugees and from a realistic appraisal of the world situation is that in Palestine and only there can the mass of Jewish refugees hope to be welcome and to be assisted to integrate themselves into the life of the community. Only in Palestine will most of them feel that they have returned home."

Deeply imbedded in every people is the desire for full development; the longing to contribute their share to history.

Nationality like democracy has been one of the potent forces making for man's advance. A people to survive need an address; a symbol of sovereignty; a home; a flag and a coat of arms.

Switzerland, Norway, Greece, Belgium, Holland, Ireland - we can call the roll - all have standing in the World of Today and of Tomorrow. Yes, let us clearly keep in mind that Zionism is not a

. .

movement to remove all the Jews of the world to Palestine; it is not a movement to compel anyone to migrate there. It is a movement to enable the Jews to exercise the same right now exercised by practically every other people in the world -- to live at their option in the land of their fathers -- or in some other country. Zionism seeks to establish in Palestine, for such Jews as choose to go and remain there, and for their descendants, a legally secured home. Our Jewish Pilgrim Fathers have laid the foundation. It remains for you and for me, for the architects who are to draw the peace, to build the superstructure.

The Jewish people have too long been waiting in the ante-room of history. Just as frontiers all over the world will be moved, so must the Great Nations return to its own, those fertile coastlands of the Mediterranean, where forty centuries ago, the Jews built a nation dedicated to the worship of God and the practice of His moral laws.

My dear Charles:

I was very happy to hear from you. I trust that you and Mrs. Rosenbloom are well.

I should very much like to accept the invitation of the Zionist District of Pittsburgh to address their dinner meeting on July 1. However I am planning to leave the end of June, right after the annual meeting of the Central Conference of American Rabbis for a much needed rest. This has been a long, hard and rather trying year and I feel the need of a complete rest.

Whether I shall be able to come in September, it is too early to say. I would suggest that the officers write to me around that time.

I do not believe that I will be able to attend the meeting of the Council in Detroit. The reconstitution of the UJA ought to make it easier to defeat National Budgeting.

You are undoubtedly in touch with the situation with reference to the Zionist Emergency Council. There has been considerable activity and negotiations within the last week. The Mizrachi served an ultimatum on the Council to re-organize within two weeks. The Zionist regions of mestchester, Bronx and Manhattan all had their annual meetings within the last two weeks and all passed very strong resolutions demanding re-organization and my return to leadership. The Peace Committee of the ZOA has been conferring and has contacted some of our people. Perhaps a solution can be found. We are insisting on being given the active leadership of the Council and a working majority within the Council. The administration forces are pretty well shaken by their successive failures during the past six months on the political scent and by the mounting dissatisfaction of the

Dear Abba:

I am still hearing echoes of your address before the convention of Methodist Ministers in Detroit. I am glad you were able to find the time to speak before this strategically important group. You may think it is but another lecture engagement, but I know that your appearances in Detroit exert a lasting influence.

The day after my conversation with you, I contacted the local leaders of the Labor Zionist group. They promised me that they would try to get their local group to take the initiative to bring pressure upon the national group to demand your return to active leadership. Since then has come the newsof Chaim Greenberg's resignation. The local Labor group is pleased with that, especially because they regard it as presenting a further argument for your return. They never believed that Chaim Greenberg was suited for active political work.

I have also begun the conversations with local Hadassah leaders. I have spoken to Dora Ehrlich. She is a great friend and admirer of yours, but she is now a very tired woman and evades any job which would involve push and energy. However, a letter from you or from a mutual woman friend might be helpful. I am continuing my efforts with the local Hadassah, and I am contacting purely local leaders who have not Dora Ehrlich's national fame but who may be able to influence the local group to bring pressure on the national group. This takes a little time, as the local Hadassah group is accustomed to take the national directives blindly.

You will be interested in my conversation with Israel Goldstein, when he was here to speak at the Honor Roll rally of Hadassah -- a meeting called to celebrate our local group's raising of \$42000.00 for various Hadassah interests. He asked me boldly why I had become such an active champion of the Silver cause. He was nonplussed when I told him that it was simply because I was interested in the political work of the Zionist Organization, had seen the tremendous burst of energy and successful activity the moment Silver took the reins, and had seen a collapse of all purposeful activity and a state of general confusion the moment Silver resigned. He then confessed to me that he had gotten similar answers from many Zionist leaders throughout the country, and he was impressed with the need of healing the breach and re-establishing unity in the political work. I then told him he must

hurry up; that time was of the essence in the matter. He not only promised me personally that he would hurry but he made a public statement to that effect at his luncheon meeting with our Zionist Executive Board.

I conclude that Goldstein is definitely impressed with the determination of Zionist leaders that Silver leadership shall be restored. Confidentially, he professes that he had been neutral in this matter all along, and that he is now responding to the pressure of objective facts.

I am now looking for a speedy consummation of our project of your return to genuine leadership. If there is anything further I can do, please call on me at any time. If there should be a meeting of the Peace Committee, I shall be glad, now that I am enjoying summer leisure, to go to New York or anywhere else for the meeting.

I want to remind you of my conversation with you, before the others came up about the desire of our Building Fund Committee that you address the dinner at which we shall make our final effort to complete our half a million dollar fund for the building of our Temple. You asked me to remind you late in the summer or early in the fall and to give you alternative dates. I thought I would do this now and remind you again later.

One feasible date would be Wednesday night, September 19. This is between Yom Kippur and Sukkot. Similarly suitable would be Thursday, September 20. The following week would also be satisfactory to us, say, Monday, September 24; Tuesday, September 25; Wednesday, September 26; or Thursday, September 27. Also suitable would be week-day evenings of the following week, namely, Monday, October 1; Tuesday, October 2; Wednesday, October 3; or Thursday, October 4. I hope that from this wide choice of exclusively week-day dates you will be able to designate one are night when you can come to us and deliver the final word that will build my Temple.

Please convey my greetings to Mrs. Silver and to both your sons whom I have had the pleasure of meeting at our inter-city Temple High School debates.



It is a distressing situation and I am writing to you as National Vice Chairman for the Cleveland Zionist Society in order to ascertain the reason why these monies or any part of them have not been remitted. I am charged, by the organization, with the duty of adequately financing this program of activity. I am faced with the problem of deficit operation unless the Zienist communities respond equitably to their obligations which they imposed upon themselves through the Atlantic City Convention. The minimum quota of your District is in the sum of \$5547. Can I be of any help or assistance to you with reference to its collection? The summer months are upon us and it will become increasingly difficult to undertake a campaign of this nature. I would appreciate your immediate courtesy in undertaking this effort, and relieving the difficult situation in which your organisation is finding itself. Gentlemen:

Attached hereto is the Financial Report of the Zionist Organization of America for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1944 and ending September 30, 1945.

Since the Financial Report submitted to you for the last annual convention was for a period ended at July 31, 1944, a special exhibit "Exhibit C" is incorporated in this report to cover the period of two months from August 1, 1944 to September 30, 1944.

It gives me pleasure to report that the Balance Sheet of the General Fund as at September 30, 1945 shows a <u>Surplus</u> of \$8,563.36, as against a <u>Deficit</u> of \$16,552.91 on September 30, 1944.

The aforementioned surplus in our General Fund is exclusive of the balance of \$133,382.17 in the Life Membership Reserve Account, of which the sum of \$122,000.00 has been invested in bonds of the Jewish National Fund, nor does it include a balance of \$53,334.92 in the Expansion Fund Reserve Account, which sum has been specifically earmarked and set aside to meet commitments made in behalf of the Committee On Unity For Palestine, the Radio Committee, the Publications Committee, the Educational Committee, the Economic Bureau, and other specific commitments, all of the aforementioned being under the Expansion Fund Program.

The following is a condensed comparative summary of the income and expenditures for the fiscal year under review.



Introducing this Newsletter

We are addressing you as a member of the Unity Committee's "army in the field." Your ZOA President gave us your name sometime back as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in your District, and while many of you have already been working diligently in our cause, you are probably eager to receive some direct guidance from us as to where your duties as Unity Chairman lie.

We're going to attempt to furnish that guidance.

Equally important, though - we want guidance from you.

We want this Bulletin to be the beginning of

A TWO-WAY PASSAGE

We'll funnel our ideas to you,

You give us your reactions and suggestions.

OUR COMMITTEE'S JOB

..... is clearly defined and vitally important. It is to win non-Zionist Jews to Zionism and to counteract anti-Zionist propaganda with a positive public relations campaign.

FROM A POPULAR SONG

An appropriate slogan for our committee is provided by one of the current hit tunes. We've got to "Accentuate the Positive. Eliminate the Negative." There is no doubt about the positive nature of our movement and our message. The anti-Zionist Council could not possibly make the same claim.

WE ARE PROMISED A HEADACHE

That job will not be getting any easier as the year goes on. Council for Judaism - the organized anti-Zionist group - held a conference in Philadelphia recently and adopted for the coming year a budget of \$250,000. You can buy a lot of "public relations" for \$250,000 - particularly when it is to be spent in one small segment of the community: that part of the Jewish community which has hitherto been non-Zionist. Note that this is the same segment of the community which our Committee is intended to win over (with a budget of less than \$50,000), (so get behind that Expansion Fund Campaign!)

What we must do, then, is follow the recipe old General So-and-

In organizing your local campaign, study our leaflets in the series "The Facts" as well as our bulletins. You will find that they are positive and that they usually refrain from mentioning or attacking the Council. This last is something we do not want to do. We do not want to advertise our opponents. These are the things you should do now!

PROJECT # 1

Initiate a direct-mail campaign designed to win non-Zionists:

- 1. Make up a mailing list composed of members of the Reform Congregations who have not yet joined the Zionist Organization, with the addition of the names of all those people who have been approached by the anti-Zionist Council or are receiving the Council's literature, or are likely to succumb to anti-Zionist propaganda.
- 2. Print letterheads for the local Committee on Unity for Palestine, listing on it the names of those who have been appointed to the Committee. These should be names calculated to impress those to whom this literature will be directed.
- 3. Send a covering letter with the first piece of literature. Here is a suggested form for that letter:

"Dear Friend:

"We know that as a fair-minded person interested in knowing the facts about Palestine, you will want to read the enclosed leaflet.

"'American Jews and Palestine' is the first in a series of factual brochures which this Committee has issued in the effort to remove some of the misconceptions which have been current about Zionist aims. You will agree with us that there has been altogether too much heat and too little light in the discussion of this vital subject. We feel that the enclosed pamphlet is a first contribution toward a clear understanding of what the Zionist movement actually seeks to accomplish in Palestine.

"We shall be tremendously interested to learn your reactions to this material and eager to answer any questions you may have concerning the effort to provide a home in Palestine for our homeless European brethren.

Sincerely,

Local Committee Chairman"

4. Carry "The Facts" leaflets in your pocket for ready distribution and illustration. Have your committee members carry them and hand them personally to their non-Zionist friends.

PROJECT # II

Arrange parlor meetings to which you will invite the non-Zionists in your community. We have found this to be the most effective means of getting our story across. These are generally in the form of an evening meeting in the social atmosphere of a private home, attended by 20 to 30 people each meeting - (10 or 15 couples). At these meetings someone who is equipped to discuss Zionism in a calm and factual manner should be asked to present the facts about Zionism and answer the questions of those present.

The parlor meeting technique has been used effectively by our Director, Rabbi Lelyveld, in a tour just completed. In San Francisco, for example, he addressed 12 such meetings which were attended by more than 400 non-Zionists representative of every segment of the community. More minds are changed in the intimate give-and-take of a discussion than at a mass meeting. We urge you to organize this activity in the following way:

- 1. Line up 5 or 6 men who would be willing to offer their homes as hosts to such meetings, and who have contacts with the groups you wish to reach.
- 2. Carefully prepare the list of those to be invited to each meeting.
- 3. Persuade someone who is equipped to do so to conduct these meetings, or write to room 600, 41 East 42nd Street, New York 17, for information as to the possibility of securing an outside speaker to lead these discussions. We shall endeavor to help you make contact with someone in your Region who will be capable of doing this job.

The parlor meetings in San Francisco were arranged by Mrs. Henry Harris and the local Zionist leaders, among them Jack Verdi, Sidney Rudy, and the energetic Zionist President, Rabbi Saul White. Parlor meetings in Los Angeles were held at the homes of Dr. Monte Salvin, President of the Hollywood Zionist District, and Mr. Harry Bauman, Southern California Chairman of the ZOA Expansion Fund Campaign. Parlor meetings were also arranged in Houston, Texas and Dallas, Texas, through the efforts of Bernard Lasky, Houston Unity Committee Chairman, and Helman Rosenthal and Sidney Pines, co-Chairmen of the Unity Committee in Dallas.

WE HAVE TWO REGIONAL CHAIRMEN

Two of our Zionist Regions have appointed splendidly equipped individuals to head our Unity Committee work in their areas. Mr. Julius C. Livingston of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Vice President of the Southwest Region, is serving as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in that Region. Rabbi Sylvan Schwartzman of Augusta, Georgia, has accepted the Chairmanship for the Southeast Region, and is formulating plans for an intensive campaign this Spring.

As members of the National Executive Committee, we are jointly addressing this urgent appeal to you on behalf of the \$350,000 Expansion Fund.

Our Convention at Atlantic City gave its unanimous approval to the Expansion Fund program for wider-scope. Our greatly increased membership has added greater responsibilities.
