To ZOA Regional and District Presidents and Secretaries

Dear Friends:

The 47th Annual Convention of the Zionist Organization of America will convene in a four-day session beginning Saturday night, October 14th, through Tuesday, October 17th, 1944. Atlantic City has been selected as the Convention City and the four-day sessions will be held in the Hotels Breakers and St. Charles.

In view of the wartime transportation restrictions and to meet the requirements of our Covernment to reduce the representation, the last meeting of the Executive Committee and the National Administrative Council held on July 9th, unanimously adopted the following changes in the basis of representation:

1. In place of the former unit of representation of one delegate for each fifty members, a district is entitled to one delegate for the first fifty members in good standing, and one additional delegate for each additional 300 members and major fraction thereof.

I direct your attention to the enclosed instructions and regulations for further amplification.

Elections of delegates and alternates to the Convention may be held until Tuesday, August 15th. Election returns, filed on the enclosed official form must be mailed to National Headquarters on or before August 16th, 1944.

Due to wartime difficulties to obtain railroad and hotel accommodations, alternates are asked to attend only in the absence of a regularly elected delegate.

Please hold your Election Meeting early, and file your Election Report as soon thereafter as you can. This will help to

Districts are urged to see that all membors are brought up-to-date, and to enroll as many new recruits as possible before that date.

The Convention will meet in a decisive stage in history. Its decisions will affect the destiny of our people in the postwar world. The participation of your District in this historic conclave is imporative if we are to speak for a united American Jewry.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have not communicated with you before this because I wanted to have something definite to report to you.

After our conversation in your home, I discussed the matter with a number of leading non-Zionists, and was frankly amazed at the opposition which I found. Many of them feel that their experience in the Agency and in the Conference was so unsatisfactory, that they are reluctant to try again. I continued in my efforts, although there was little prospect of success.

This morning's mail brought me a letter from Judge Proskauer, which makes me feel that the difficulties are much deeper than I suspected, and that it will take much more time and effort to overcome them. Hence, I am writing to say that my efforts have thus far not been crowned with the success I hoped. While I shall continue, because I am still convinced that a way out must be found for the good of all concerned, I did not want to delay writing you any longer.

Please be assured that I enjoyed our conversation and greatly appreciated your hospitality.

Please accept for yourself and Mrs. Silver, my kindest personal regards.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

As you have already been advised, the 47th Annual Convention of the Zionist Organization of America will convene on Saturday evening, Octobr 14th and continue through Tuesday the 17th at the Breakers Hotel in Atlantic City, New Jersey. Among other items of convention business will be the election of the members upon the National Administrative Council, pursuant to the following provisions of our constitution Sections 8 and 9 of Article IX):

"Section 8. The Administrative Council shall consist of the officers, members of the Executive, the Regional Chairmen, and such additional number of members, not exceeding one hundred and twenty, as the Convention shall prescribe, of whom no more than half shall reside in the city of New York.

The Administrative Counsil shall be elected as "Section 9. follows: (a) 20st the Convention

(b)100 by the regions thaving due regard to representation of districts and societies) on the basis of the munerical strength of each region in the Zionist Organization of America ... "

In accordance with these provisions and on the basis of your membership enrollment to date your District is entitled to elect one (1) member to the Mational Administrative Council. The final determination cannot, obviously, be made until our membership records are closed on August 31, 1944. We suggest that your Society proceed at once to the election of your representative upon the Administrative Council.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

Pursuant to a directive from the 45th Annual Z.O.A. Convention and upon the recommendation of our Executive Committee, the Administrative Council adopted the resolution hereto attached, which provides for the designation of the Committee on Committees in advance of the annual convention.

In accordance with the formula then adopted, fifty (50) members and fifty (50) alternates of the Committee on lowwittees are to be named by the Regions and largest affiliated Districts. On the basis of our present paid membership a member of the Committee on Committees is to be designated for each 2,200 members or major fraction thereof. The Cleveland Zionist Society is accordingly entitled to elect one (1) member and one (1) alternate on the Committee on Committees.

Will you please arrange for your District to proceed at once with the election of your representatives on the Committee on Committees, Please note that the persons designated as members or alternates on the Committee on Committees are to be named from among those who will be elected as delegates to the convention. Please note, too, that the Committee will meet on Friday afternoon prior to the formal opening of the convention. This arrangement is intended to facilitate the work of the convention and to avoid interfering with the full attendance of the various convention sessions.

Please send us the names and addresses of your representatives on the Committee on Committees as soon as they are elected.

### ELECTION OF COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES

In order to facilitate the work of the convention, the Committee on Committees shall be designated in advance of the convention. The Committee on Committees shall consist of seventy-five (75) persons, who shall have been elected as delegates to the convention. Twenty-five (35) shall be designated by the president of the Zionist Organization of America and fifty (50) members and fifty (50) alternates shall be elected in the following prescribed manner:

> The Regions (having due regard to representation of districts and societies) shall name their representatives on the Committee on Committees on the basis of the mumerical strength of each Region in the Zionist Organization of America, in the same manner as the regions elect members of the National Administrative Council.

In the event that a person designated as a member or as an alternate of the Committee on Committees shall not be in attendance at the convention to participate in the meeting of the Committee, the President of the Z.O.A. is authorized to fill the vacancy.

### Dear Fellow Zionists:

The 47th Annual Convention of the Zionist Organization of America will be held in Atlantic City from Saturday night, October 14th through October 17th. Sessions will be convened at both the Breakers and the St. Charles Hotels. Preceding the formal opening of the Convention, a Sabbath Dinner will be held Friday evening, October 13th, which will be devoted to the subject: Zionist Youth and Education. On Saturday afternoon following Services and the Sabbath meal, an Oneg Sabbath will be held under the auspices of the Histadruth Ivrith dealing with Hebrew Oulture. A tentative convention program will be sent to you within a short time.

### Estel Reservations:

A Hotel Rate card is being enclosed for your convenience. Will you please make immediate arrangements for hotel accommodations directly with the hotel. War committions have restricted the facilities available and it is therefore suggested that you communicate with the hotels at once outlining your needs and making the necessary reservations.

### Meal Reservations:

We have been advised that it will be necessary for us to notify the hotels at least 10 days before the Convention, of the number of persons who intend to be present at luncheons and dinners. Labor conditions are unsettled and additional hotel personnel must be specially brought down from New York. To Z.O.A. District Officers

Dear Friends:

The forthcoming ZOA convention which will represent the largest constituency in the annals of our movement is expected to usher in a revitalized year of activities in all Zienist districts.

However, in view of the present situation affecting the fate of our people, it would be folly to permit a lull in the few weeks still remaining before the convention. It is imperative that Zionist activities be intensified in the fake of world shaking changes now taking place. For these are also momentous days in the history of Zionism.

This year we cannot afford to get into stride gradually. Bold and dynamic action is the order of the day. Zionis: districts must start right off with pace and tempo. This year our Zionist year must begin a full month before the convention.

Particularly I wish to call to your attention one phase-a most important phase-of the ZOA program for the coming year which calls for the utmost consideration on your part and that of your colleagues as you begin to plan your Zionist year.

Zionist activity nationally and locally must be expanded to nourish the cultural and educational needs of American Jewry. Assimilationists have boldly seized control of anti-Zionist propaganda. Our political work for the Jewish Commonwealth and our practical work for the upbuilding of Palestine must be integrated with a systematic and energetic program of education for adults, and especially for our American youth. This is essential to consolidate our great membership growth of the past year; to continue further expansion of Zionist ranks and to recruit youth to its rightful place in our movement. Even before we achieve the Jewish Commonwealth, certainly thereafter, Palestine as the center of Jewish culture, as the spearhead of the Jewish renaissance should and can be made to radiate its influence. its warmth, its Jewish dignity among the Jews of America.

At the same time the ZOA must take the initiative in the launching of major projects to further the economic and industrial stability of the re-created Jewish Commonwealth of Palestine. We shall have to continue our fight against the anti-Zionists who will resist our efforts to strengthen American Jewish life.

For all these purposes, we shall require a sizable special fund, as our normal income for membership dues can only provide for normal organizational needs.

The ZOA Executive at the last meeting authorized the launching of a Cultural Expansion Fund of \$25C,000 for the fiscal year commencing October 1st. It will replace the existing Extension Fund and the Radio Fund\*, and will also provide for additional much needed activities. An outline

\*Whatever money will be sent to the Radio Fund after Oct.15, will be credited to your share of the larger Fund.

of the allocations of the Cultural Expansion Fund to finance the carrying out of our various major projects is contained on the accompanying sheet.

With our organization numbering over 100,000 members, the raising of this Fund for Cultural Expansion should be attained within the prescribed period-before January 1, 1945. This is essential if we are to be in a position to carry out its purposes within the coming year.

You are therefore requested to take up this matter with your colleagues and undertake to provide your fair portion of this fund.

The ZOA is ready to do a worthwhile, greatly needed job in the significant fields of Culture and Education, including the fight against the insidious anti-Zionist propaganda, if the districts throughout the country will provide the necessary resources. We in the national office can start just as soon as you give us the wherewithal.

We must hear from you immediately as to whether we may count on your help.

May we take this opportunity to extend to you and to the members of your district our Rosh Hashanah greetings. May the New Year bring at long last, victory to the United Nations, relief to the tragedy-scarred Jewish people and a free and self-governing Eretz Yisrael.

Dear Dr. Silver:

The Birmingham District of the Zionist Organization of America is planning its annual meeting October 22nd or 29th. Simply stated, we should like for you to address the meeting. I know that stating the request so simply does not mean that it can be answered so simply. I am not at all unmindful of your many engagements, the calls upon your time, the obligation to your own Temple, the pressing demands of the Emergency Council. However, I thought it best to state our desires simply and then to set out what I hope will be persuasive points overbalancing the weight that is henestly tipped against us.

We have approximately eight hundred members. We hope to go to one thousand. There are two members of the Council for Judaism here. One is also a Zionist member but, since we are clear to the point that he does not know the make-up of either of the two organizations, we have concluded: "Requiescat in pace."

We believe that your presence here could light a fire that would burn the year and the flame might catch on in one or two of the neighboring states. Mississippi is altogether dead, yet we are not without friends there. (I do not know whether you are personally familiar with the fact or not but a few days ago, Hans Lamm wrote me to obtain an expression of opinion from Senator James O. Eastman, of Mississippi, with respect to the resolution pending in Congress. I found that Jim Eastman was an old schoolmate and obtained a complete endorsement.)

You have done a splendid job up there - the planks in the platforms of both major parties was a signal achievement. We feel, too, that we are doing pretty well here and, in our small way, acting as a small but essential prop to you. It is most diffi**Birmingham District**

cult to make Zionists of Jews who are not even Jews, but we plough ahead. Every now and again, we feel the desperate need of a great voice for our Jewry. You have that voice. If all of these things, after careful consideration by you, do not tip the scales, we shall be content and secure in the knowledge that you have carefully weighed it.

If you can arrange it, the date, either the 22nd or the 25th, will be at your convenience. Not less than five hundred will attend from neighboring counties and a sprinkle from Mississippi. Arrangements for your transportation by the quickest and most convenient method will be made, and as little of your time will be consumed as humanly possible.

I would like to conclude it this way: For many of us here, in matters Zionist, you are our Willkie, Wallace and Roosevelt rolled into one.

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR ELECTION OF DELEGATES

TO: Z.O.A. DISTRICTS, REGIONS, SOCIETIES, CAMPS OF ORDER SONS OF ZION, AND MASADA CHAPTERS.

Your attention is directed to the following pertinent sections of Article VIII of the Constitution of the Zionist Organization of Amorica relating to the election of Delegates to the Annual Convention:

SECTION 3 --- Each District or Society shall be entitled to one Delegate to the Convention for each 50 paid-up members in good standing . . . . .

> 'The following rule, substituting Section 3." 'was approved by the National Administrative 'Council at a meeting on July 9th, 1944. 'Representation to the National Convention 'shall be elected on the basis of one delegate 'for the first 50 members and one additional" 'delegate for each additional 300 members and 'major fraction thereof. Example: A District with 350 members is entitled to two delegates: 'a District with 501 members is entitled to 'three delegates and so forth.

SECTION 4 ---- Each Region shall be ontitled to one Delegate for each 1,000 members, and major fraction thereof, in good standing, but in no event less than one Delegate.

> 'The following was substituted for above: The 'Administrative Council at the mooting on 'July 9, 1944 decided that Regional representa-' tion shall be on the basis of one delegate for 'each 2,000 members and major fraction thereaf.'

- SECTION 6 --- Delegates to the Convention shall be elected only by paid-up members of the Zionist Organi- . zation of America.
- SECTION 7 --- No momber shall be elected as a Delegate to the Convention unless he has been a member of record of a District or Society for at least six menths prior to the election, and at the time of election is a paid-up member in good standing of the Zionist Organization of America.

The following rules for the election of Delegates and Alternates, adopted in 1940, pursuant to Article VIII, Section 8, by the Executive, with the approval of the Administrative Council, continue in effect:

- No porson shall be granted a credential as Delegate et Alternate to Conventions of the Z.O.A. unless (a) he shall have been duly elected by a District, Society or other duly constituted elective body, and (b) his election shall have been certified to the National Board of Elections by written certifications, as set forth below, no later than Wednesday, August 16, 1944.
- (a) Delegates and Alternates of Districts, Regions, Societies, Camps of the Order Sons of Zion, and Masada Chapters, shall be elected by the members thereof at an election which shall be held pursuant to regulations premulgated by the National Board of Elections.

(b) Delegates and Alternates of Regions shall be elected at a Conference of representatives of all constituent bedies in the Region

(c) Delegates and Alternates of affiliated organizations shall be elected as provided in their respective agreements with the Z.O.A.

(d) In no case shall provies or substitutes be permitted for any duly elected Delegate or Alternate who fails to appear in person at the Convention. Hereafter committees on vacancies, whether local or national, shall be unauthorized.

- 3. Certification of the election of Delogates and Alternates shall be in writing subscribed by the President or Vice-President and the Secretary, or by the local Board of Elections of the District, or other elective body, and if so certified by the local Board of Elections, shall be accepted only if the members of the local Board of Elections and of the officers of the District, or other elective body, shall have filed such returns with the National Board of Elections no later than Wednesday, August 16th, 1944.
- 4. What constitutes a member of good standing? <u>Any member, old or</u> <u>now</u>, whe has paid his dues in full within the twelve-month period, <u>proceeding August 31st. 1944 is a member in good standing of the</u> <u>Z.O.A.</u> and is eligible to vote for Delegates to the Convention.

Will you; therefore, kindly call a meeting of your Executive Committee at which a Nominations Committee and a Board of Elections, each to consist of a minimum of five members, shall be elected.

Every registered member who has paid his dues for the fiscal year 1943-44 should be notified of the date and place of the elections and also of his right to nominate candidates by petition. Nominations may be made by petition over the signatures of not less than 15 members in good stamling.

All nominations, whether by the Nominations Committee or by Petition, are to be filed with the District Board of Elections, one week prior to the date of election, which shall accept these nominations and place all names in alphabetical order on the official ballot to be printed by the Board of Elections.

The number of Delegates to which a District, Region, Society or Camp of the of the Order Sons of Zion is entitled, is to be determined by the number of members in good standing as of August 31st, 1944. The membership record of the District, Region, Society, O.S.Z. Camp, must agree with the records of the Comptroller's Office of the Zionist Organization of America.

No District, Camp, Society, or Masada Chapter having less than fifty members in good standing is qualified to elect a Delegate. <u>Peeling the membership</u> of one or more Districts, Camps, Societies, or Masada Chapters in order to acquire a total of fifty is not permissible.

The number of Alternates that may be elected shall not exceed the number of Delegates.

A member who is in good standing in one of the affiliated organizations (Order Sons of Zion, etc.) and who is also a member in good standing in the Zionist Organization of America, <u>can vote only once</u> for the election of Delegates to the Convention.

### The Election of Delegates to the Convention may be held at any time hereafter but no later than Tuesday, August 15, 1944.

In all cases where more than two Delegates are to be elected, a member shall have the right to vote for only two-thirds of the entire number of Delegates. Voting shall be by secret ballot. <u>The candidate or candidates, receiving</u> <u>the highest number of votes, shall be declared elected.</u> The candidate or candidates receiving the next highest number of votes, shall act as <u>Alter-</u> nates. In case of the resignation of an elected Delegate, the <u>Alternate</u> receiving the next highest number of votes shall take his place as Delegate.

No Delegate or Alternate will be seated unless his election is certified by the National Board of Elections.

The official Election Report properly filled cut and certified by the local Board of Elections <u>must be filed with the National Board of Elections of</u> the Zionist Organization of America, <u>not later than Wednesday</u>, <u>August 16</u>, <u>1944</u>, in order that credentials may be issued in time to the elected Delegates.

The Election Report of the affiliated groups must be filed <u>directly</u> with the National Board of Elections of the Zionist Organization of America at Washington, D. C. in order that such Delegates may receive their credentials from the National Headquarters of the Zionist Organization of America.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

The launching by the United Palestine Appeal of its own campaign in 1945 makes this enterprise and its success of the utmost importance to every officer and member of the Zionist Organization of America. We must bend every effort to the end that in each of our communities a maximum of money is made available this year for the Keren Hayesod and the Keren Kayemeth, the two great national institutions which comprise the United Palestine Appeal.

From the office of the United Falestine Appeal will come more detailed material explaining the budgetary needs of Falestine and the methods whereby each community may best mobilize its forces so that our demand for parity for Falestine may be achieved in this crucial year. The Zionist Organization of America and its personnel must inevitably be the keystone of the United Falestine Appeal. It is we, more than any other single group, who understand (1) that the Jews of the United States must have brought to their attention with unparalleled clarity and vigor the primary truth that Jewish life in Europe must be saved through the Jewish National Home; and (2) that in this great year of decision for the political future of Falestine all our financial resources must demonstrate our determination to do our part to encourage the nations of the world to do theirs.

I would like to summarize the situation:

(1) The United Palestine Appeal had to undertake an independent campaign in 1945 because the Joint Distribution Committee failed to concede the equality of importance of Palestine, whose contribution to the saving of Jowish life is without parallel.

(2) In speaking of an "independent campaign" it must be noted that in every major city where there is a Welfare Fund, the United Palestine Appeal will continue to be a beneficiary. Instead of funds going to one common pool called the United Jewish Appeal, where distribution would be made as in the past few years, the United Palestine Appeal will make application directly to every Welfare Fund and will be a part of the local campaign. (3) In the smaller towns where there are no Welfare Funds, the community will either raise funds independently for the United Palestine Appeal or will seek to raise funds for it in combination with the Joint Distribution Committee or other causes.

(4) The Zionist Organization of America calls upon all its officers and members to give their fullest support to the request by the United Palestine Appeal to each community to give to the <u>U.P.A. parity with the J.D.C.</u> in the distribution of funds.

(5) The United Palestine Appeal is not engaged in a competitive campaign. It is presenting to the Jews of America an affirmative, constructive account of the incomparable role of Palestine in providing a present and a future for the Jewish people. What it accomplishes will be an index to American Jewry and to the Yishuv of the supreme place which Palestine has in the loyalty and affection of our people.

(6) The increasingly important role which Zionists have taken in Welfare Fund activities must achieve new strength. Zionists should seek leadership in Welfare Fund campaigns: they should provide stirring examples of energy and capacity in the solicitation of funds; they should, above all, set new standards of generosity such as are required in 1945 to meet the present relief needs of the Jews of Europe and the permanent security needs of European Jewry through the building of the Jewish National Home.

To expedite action, I am suggesting that you communicate directly with Dr. James G. Heller, National Chairman, United Palestine Appeal, 41 East 42nd Street, New York City, assuring him and his associates of your support. From him you will also obtain information as to how sotion may be taken in each community in the conduct of the campaign, in the presentation of the most effective material to the local Budget Committee and as to the remittance of funds.

The United Palestine Appeal campaign is a great challenge to every Zionist. I am confident that with the strength and vision of our constantly growing manpower we shall give an account of ourselves that will make a glorious chapter in the history of American Zionism.



### Introducing this Newsletter

We are addressing you as a member of the Unity Committee's "army in the field." Your ZOA President gave us your name sometime back as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in your District, and while many of you . have already been working diligently in our cause, you are probably eager to receive some direct guidance from us as to where your duties as Unity Chairman lie.

We're going to attempt to furnish that guidance.

Equally important, though - we want guidance from you.

We want this Bulletin to be the beginning of

A TWO-WAY PASSAGE

We'll funnel our ideas to you,

You give us your reactions and suggestions.

### OUR COMMITTEE'S JOB

..... is clearly defined and vitally important. It is to win non-Zionist Jews to Zionism and to counteract anti-Zionist propaganda with a positive public relations campaigr.

### FROM A POPULAR SONG

An appropriate slogan for our committee is provided by one of the current hit tunes. We've got to "Accentuate the Positive, Eliminate the Nagative." There is no doubt about the positive nature of our movement and our message. The anti-Zioniss Council could not possibly make the same claim.

### WE ARE PROMISED A HEADACHE

That job will not be getting any easier as the year goes on. The Council for Judsism - the organized anti-Zionist group - held a conference in Philadelphia recently and adopted for the coming year a budget of \$250,000. You can buy a lot of "public relations" for \$250,000 - particularly when it is to be spent in one small segment of the community: that part of the Jowish community which has hitherto been non-Zionist. Note that this is the same segment of the community which our Committee is intended to win over (with a budget of less than \$50,000), (so get behind that Expansion Fund Campaign !)

### WHAT WE MUST DO 111

What we must do, then, is follow the recipe old General So-and-So gave for military success := "get there fustest with the mostes"."

In organizing your local campaign, study our leaflets in the series "The Facts" as well as our bulletins. You will find that they are positive and that they usually refrain from mentioning or attacking the Council. This last is something we do not want to do. We do not want to advertise our opponents. These are the things you should do now!

### PROJECT # 1

Initiate a direct-mail campaign designed to win non-Zionists:

- 1. Make up a mailing list composed of members of the Reform Congregations who have not yet joined the Zionist Organization, with the addition of the names of all those people who have been approached by the anti-Zionist Council or are receiving the Council's literature, or are likely to succumb to anti-Zionist propaganda.
- Print letterheads for the local Committee on Unity for Palestine, listing on it the names of those who have been appointed to the Committee. These should be names calculated to impress those to whom this literature will be directed.
- Send a covering letter with the first piece of literature. Here is a suggested form for that letter:

"Dear Friend:

"We know that as a fair-minded person interested in knowing the fasts about Palestino, you will want to read the enclosed leaflet.

"'American Jews and Palestine' is the first in a series of factual broshures which this Committee has issued in the effort to remove some of the misconceptions which have been current about Zionist aims. You will agree with us that there has been altogether too much heat and too little light in the discussion of this vital subject. We feel that the enclosed pamphlet is a first contribution toward a clear understanding of what the Zionist movement actually seeks to accomplish in Palestine.

"We shall be tremendously interested to learn your reactions to this material and eager to answer any questions you may have concerning the effort to provide a home im Palestine for our homeless European brethren.

 Carry "The Facts" leaflets in your pocket for ready distribution and illustration. Have your committee members carry them and hand them personally to their non-Zionist friends.

### PROJECT # II

Arrange parlor meetings to which you will invite the non-Zionists in your community. We have found this to be the most effective means of getting our story across. These are generally in the form of an evening meeting in the social atmosphere of a private home, attended by 20 to 30 people each meeting - (10 or 15 couples). At these meetings someone who is equipped to discuss Zionism in a calm and factual manner should be asked to present the facts about Zionism and answer the questions of those present.

The parlor meeting technique has been used effectively by our Director, Rabbi Lelyveld, in a tour just completed. In San Francisco, for example, he addressed 12 such meetings which were attended by more than 400 non-Zionists representative of every segment of the community. More minds are changed in the intimate give-and-take of a discussion than at a mass meeting. We urge you to organize this activity in the following way:

- 1. Line up 5 or 6 men who would be willing to offer their homes as hosts to such meetings, and who have contacts with the groups you wish to reach.
- 2. Carefully prepare the list of those to be invited to each meeting.
- 3. Persuade someone who is equipped to do so to conduct these meetings, or write to room 600, 41 East 42nd Street, New York 17, for information as to the possibility of securing an outside speaker to lead these discussions. We shall endeavor to help you make contact with someone in your Region who will be capable of doing this job.

The parlor meetings in San Francisco were arranged by Mrs. Henry Harris and the local Zionist leaders, among them Jack Verdi, Sidney Rudy, and the energetic Zionist President, Rabbi Saul White. Parlor meetings in Los Angeles were held at the homes of Dr. Monte Salvin, President of the Hollywood Zionist District, and Mr. Harry Bauman, Southern California Chairman of the ZOA Expansion Fund Campaign. Parlor meetings were also arranged in Houston, Texas and Dallas, Texas, through the efforts of Bernard Lasky, Houston Unity Committee Chairman, and Helman Rosenthal and Sidney Pines, co-Chairmen of the Unity Committee in Dallas.

### WE HAVE TWO REGIONAL CHAIRMEN

Two of our Zionist Regions have appointed splendidly equipped individuals to head our Unity Committee work in their areas. Mr. Julius C. Livingston of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Vice President of the Southwest Region, is serving as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in that Region. Rabbi Sylvan Schwartzman of Augusta, Georgia, has accepted the Chairmanship for the Southeast Region, and is formulating plans for an intensive campaign this Spring.



Dear Dr. Silver:

Thank you verykindly for your letter of March 26th and for sending me another copy of "Public Opinion On The Zionist Controversy". Apparently I was misinformed in connection with our resolution appearing therein. I was, therefore, very happy to notice that it was there. However, I want to make a correction. In the booklet it is stated that we have a membership of fifty, while our membership is over 150 at this time.

Incidentally, our district, which is considered the most active and militant Zionist District in this section of the country, is seriously considering sending a delegation to San Francisco on April 25th, to join with other organisations there for the purpose of making a demonstration in connection with the Falestine situation. The subject is still in the spage of discussion, but will probably take definite form at the next meeting of our Board, which will be tomorrow night.

May I ask you for your views on the subject. It is needless for me to tell you that anything you may say on the subject will be given very serious consideration.

May I also ask you whether you plan to be in San Francisco during the Conference, for if you do plan to be in this part of the country, we would like to plan some sort of function for the sause of Zion and utilize your presence here. You will find it features Earl BROWDER and Max HELFMAN, director of the "Philharmonishe Folks Choir" ( - until recently known as the communist "FREIHEIT GEZANG FERMIN".)

It was suggested that I draw your attention to the fact, that Mr. HHLFMAN, the official director of the communist workers' chorus happens to be also the director of your Zionist Youth musis activities. It may sound unbelievable, but if you will take the trouble to investigate you will find it is actually true.

Enclosed you will find one of the letters our youngsters have been receiving from your Zionist Youth Organization. It reades "... you will be glad to hear that our own Max Helfman will be in charge of all the music work.."

I am told that he also will be in charge of music activities at the Ziomist Youth Camp "Brandels", - and I do not intend to permit my dam hter to go there, if that should turn out to be true.

Is it compatible with the ideals and othics of the Zionist Organization to entrust the education of our youth to persons of - at least - admittedly anti-Zionist convictions? If there can be found no other people to teach our children Zionist songs, - we parents ust go out and find them for ourselvese

How can the Zionist Organization claim the official leader of communist choirs as "our oun" ? What a lack of integrity. Is that our new friendship with Russia that makes such blunders. Where the education of our youth is at stake more precautions ought to be taken. - What an example do we put before our youngsters by entrusting them to a man who on Sundays will direct communist youth with the same seal and "sincertity" as Zionist youngsters in Monday ? Isn't it a shame ?

Now that we have been reading so many announcements of this gentleman's activities in the "FREIHEIT" cicles, we are only waiting for an a nouncement of his Zionist activities - perhaps in our own "New Falestine". The next step would be to have Mr, Halfman direct us in the singing of our "Matikvah", rushing over from some communist gathering where he directed Sovjet Anthemse

I personally feel very much disturbed about the matter, having urged several of my non-Zionist neighbors to let their daughters join these Zionist Youth activities. There has been so much excitement recently about all that, - I just had to put the matter before you, - before it all comes out into the open, which I should like to avoid.

To All ZOA Regional and District Officers

Dear Friend:

This communication is written and mailed to you from the United Nations Conference Hall in San Francisco. I write these lines under the impact of the great and noble utterances that resound within the portals of this historic meeting place and are relayed to the four cormers of the world.

As I listen attentively to the pleas of representatives of great and small nations, my mind is crowded with conversations I have had with many of these statesmen.

A mingled feeling of elation and distress filled my heart as I conferred with them. I felt heartened because of their earnest desire to lay the foundations of an enduring peace. But I am distressed because we Jews, who were the vanguard of the despoiled and massacred and who fought the enemy with rassion are on this day of victory bypassed and not even given a name.

I shall have much to report to you on this historic conference and I shall try to share with you my impressions soon through the columns of our official publication The New Palestine.

In this, my first direct communication to you from San Francisco, I want to report on something that will remain outstanding in my mind. In speaking with the statesmen and delegates of great and small nations on Zionist aspirations and achievements, I was frequently confronted with the question: "How many American Jews are Zionists?" It is obvious that our foes, both within and outside our ranks, have been very busy in San Francisco. It is likewise obvious that an attempt is being mide to persuade the key delegates that the Ziorist program is opposed by a large segment of American Jewry.

I told them of the Palestine Resolution adopted by an overwhelming majority of delegates of the American Jewish Conference and of the hundreds of thousands of contributors to the Palestine funds. But, in the undertone of their reaction I sensed a search for a more direct gauge of Zionist adherence.

I would like to see this challenge met by us - by every region

and district -- through the enrollment of at least 50,000 new members before the end of the San Francisco Conference.

I intend to stay here another ten days. I appeal to you in all earnestness to wire me within the next few days your pledge to increase your membership by a substantial margin. Your telegrams should indicate a definite figure. This barrage of telegrams will be a demonstration of real substance.

Please act at once.
