Before the Albany Zionist
District at the Shaker Ridge
Country Club, May 21st, 1945,
at Albany

On all of the battlefields of Europe, the roar of the cannon has been stilled. The madmen have died or vanished in the nowhere, but their names will, forever, carry with them a long and lasting burden of agony and misery.

Democracy now sights its guns toward the Eastern fiend. The other half of the Fascist terror will soon be vanquished and with it will come the opening of the floodgates for the World of Tomorrow.

The barbaric atrocities of the past ten years illustrate what can happen to the human being when he fails to answer Cain's question "Am I my brother's keeper?" - what has happened and can happen are portrayed by the spectres who stalk the highways and byways of the world today. If a humane civilization is to survive, based on the rights of man and the sacredness of the individual, the world must be concerned with man's treatment of man everywhere.

Palestine has ceased to be a Jewish problem. It lives as part of a world problem, for peace is indivisible and can only be preserved on a global plan. When I speak of Zionism, I speak of a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth for Palestine, and when I speak of Palestine, there are three important questions which arise in the minds of those who are not Zionists- First: Is Zionism consistent with Americanism; Second: What are the legal and moral rights of the Jews to Palestine and Thirdly: Is there any other solution for the Jewish Refugee Problem of Europe.

Is Zionism consistent with true Americanism. Not only is there no possible conflict, answers the late Mr. Justice Brandeis, but there is a positive synthesis: "To be good Americans" he maintains, "we must be better Jews, and to be better Jews, we must become Zionists" . . . Far from it being inconsistent with Americanism "loyalty to America demands rather than each American Jew become a Zionist". "Multiple loyalties are objectionable only if they are inconsistent".

America is full of nationalities which accept their new American citizenship, yet look to some centre in the old world as the source and inspiration of their national culture and traditions. No one impugns the patriotism and the loyalty of the Belgian, the Italian, the Greek and the Pole, on account of their national origin or because of their desire to help the land of their forbears.

What are the legal and moral rights of the Jews to Palestine. Notable and crystal clear is the fact that the claim of the Jewish people to Palestine is based on those very principles of law and morality for which free democracy now fights. Not only does history furnish us with the facts on which the moral claim rests, but civilized nations have solemnly and formally recognized the legality of such claim. For two thousand years Palestine was a Jewish land. There the Jews lived and toiled, struggled and died, and gave to civilization its exalted moral and ethical concept. Palestine was more than a Jewish State. It was the core of the Jewish religious framework. There lie the greatest episodes with which Jewish history is identified. When the Jews were forcibly exiled, Palestine assumed a greater importance to them. The Jews furnish the only instance in history of a disfranchised people neither losing its identity nor relinquishing claim to its homeland. Toward the end of the First World War came the first ray of light. Legal recognition of the right of the Jews to Palestine was given by the world.

The Allies recognized that the Jews had a national character. The first great manifestation of such recognition was the historic Balfour Declaration of November 1917, which declared:

"His Majesty's Government view with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people, and will use their best endeavors to facilitate the achievement of that object,"

Then came the Mandate for Palestine, which affirmed with legal finality the right of the Jewish people to Palestine. It stated with respect to the Balfour Declaration that:

"Recognition has hereby been given to the historical connection of the Jewish people with Palestine and to the grounds for reconstituting their national home in that country."

This mandate of the League of Nations, representing the will of upwards of fifty powers conferred the mandate for Palestine on England. It became the trustee for the establishment of the Jewish National Home. The intention was clear.

At the peace Conference President Wilson stated:

"The Allied Nations with the fullest concurrence of our own Government and the people are agreed that in Palestine shall be laid the foundation of the Jewish Commonwealth."

The United States Congress, by resolution adopted in 1922, gave force to the attitude of the American people as to Palestine, when it called for "the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people." Thereafter the Anglo-American convention of 1925 made British action in Palestine subject to the approval of the United States.

A quarter of a century has passed. In these twenty-five years, based upon the representations of the Great Powers of the world, the land has been rebuilt and a people has been reborn. Acting on the promise of the Balfour Declaration, the Jews brought over half a million people into Palestine. They founded 300 agricultural colonies, invested over \$600,000,000, built 2000 industries and more than 5000 handicraft establishments. The dead soil has been revitalized - out of the dirt,

neglect and stagnancy, there has arisen a new life, molded by the sweat, blood and tears of these pioneers. Side by side with its agricultural rebirth, Palestine has progressed industrially and in this great world war had already proven itself as the military arsenal for democracy. The waters of the Jordan have been harnessed and electrified; great chemical plants draw minerals from the Dead Sea - life has been breathed into the dead.

What will the world do with the European Jew for whom exile is enforced; who cannot return to his old habitat, and who cannot find refuge in any other free country in the universe. Unless civilization has so reverted to the Nazi and Fascist role, as to wish the destruction of these homeless Jews, it must encourage the proved medium to solve the problem - Palestine.

James G. McDonald, Chairman of President Roosevelt's Advisory Committee on Political Refugees and former League of Nations High Commissioner for German Refugees, sums it all up when he says "On the record Palestine offers uncontestedly the primary hope for the solution of the problem of Jewish refugees. The conclusion which emerges inescapably from a realistic resume of twenty-five years of intergovernmental dealings with refugees and from a realistic appraisal of the world situation is that in Palestine and only there can the mass of Jewish refugees hope to be welcome and to be assisted to integrate themselves into the life of the community. Only in Palestine will most of them feel that they have returned home."

Deeply imbedded in every people is the desire for full development; the longing to contribute their share to history. Nationality like democracy has been one of the potent forces making for man's advance. A people to survive need an address; a symbol of sovereignty; a home; a flag and a coat of arms. Switzerland, Norway, Greece, Belgium, Holland, Ireland - we can call the roll - all have standing in the World of Today and of Tomorrow. Yes, let us clearly keep in mind that Zionism is not a

movement to remove all the Jews of the world to Palestine; it is not a movement to compel anyone to migrate there. It is a movement to enable the Jews to exercise the same right now exercised by practically every other people in the world -- to live at their option in the land of their fathers -- or in some other country. Zionism seeks to establish in Palestine, for such Jews as choose to go and remain there, and for their descendants, a legally secured home. Our Jewish Pilgrim Fathers have laid the foundation. It remains for you and for me, for the architects who are to draw the peace, to build the superstructure.

The Jewish people have too long been waiting in the ante-room of history. Just as frontiers all over the world will be moved, so must the Great Nations return to its own, those fertile coastlands of the Mediterranean, where forty centuries ago, the Jews built a nation dedicated to the worship of God and the practice of His moral laws.

My dear Charles:

I was very happy to hear from you. I trust that you and Mrs. Rosenbloom are well.

I should very much like to accept the invitation of the Zionist District of Pittsburgh to address their dinner meeting on July 1. However I am planning to leave the end of June, right after the annual meeting of the Central Conference of American Rabbis for a much needed rest. This has been a long, hard and rather trying year and I feel the need of a complete rest.

Whether I shall be able to come in September, it is too early to say. I would suggest that the officers write to me around that time.

I do not believe that I will be able to attend the meeting of the Council in Detroit. The reconstitution of the UJA ought to make it easier to defeat National Budgeting.

You are undoubtedly in touch with the situation with reference to the Zionist Emergency Council. There has been considerable activity and negotiations within the last week. The Mizrachi served an ultimatum on the Council to re-organize within two weeks. The Zionist regions of Westchester, Bronx and Manhattan all had their annual meetings within the last two weeks and all passed very strong resolutions demanding re-organization and my return to leadership. The Peace Committee of the ZOA has been conferring and has contacted some of our people. Perhaps a solution can be found. We are insisting on being given the active leadership of the Council and a working majority within the Council. The administration forces are pretty well shaken by their successive failures during the past six months on the political scene and by the mounting dissatisfaction of the

Dear Dr. Silver:




I wish to take this opportunity of expressing my deep appreciation and gratitude to you for having appeared in Minneapolis last week.

Dear Abba:

I am still hearing echoes of your address before the convention of Methodist Ministers in Detroit. I am glad you were able to find the time to speak before this strategically important group. You may think it is but another lecture engagement, but I know that your appearances in Detroit exert a lasting influence.

The day after my conversation with you, I contacted the local leaders of the Labor Zionist group. They promised me that they would try to get their local group to take the initiative to bring pressure upon the national group to demand your return to active leadership. Since then has come the news of Chaim Greenberg's resignation. The local Labor group is pleased with that, especially because they regard it as presenting a further argument for your return. They never believed that Chaim Greenberg was suited for active political work.

I have also begun the conversations with local Hadassah leaders. I have spoken to Dora Ehrlich. She is a great friend and admirer of yours, but she is now a very tired woman and evades any job which would involve push and energy. However, a letter from you or from a mutual woman friend might be helpful. I am continuing my efforts with the local Hadassah, and I am contacting purely local leaders who have not Dora Ehrlich's national fame but who may be able to influence the local group to bring pressure on the national group. This takes a little time, as the local Hadassah group is accustomed to take the national directives blindly.

You will be interested in my conversation with Israel Goldstein, when he was here to speak at the Honor Roll rally of Hadassah -- a meeting called to celebrate our local group's raising of \$42000.00 for various Hadassah interests. He asked me boldly why I had become such an active champion of the Silver cause. He was nonplussed when I told him that it was simply because I was interested in the political work of the Zionist Organization, had seen the tremendous burst of energy and successful activity the moment Silver took the reins, and had seen a collapse of all purposeful activity and a state of general confusion the moment Silver resigned. He then confessed to me that he had gotten similar answers from many Zionist leaders throughout the country, and he was impressed with the need of healing the breach and re-establishing unity in the political work. I then told him he must

hurry up; that time was of the essence in the matter. He not only promised me personally that he would hurry but he made a public statement to that effect at his luncheon meeting with our Zionist Executive Board.

I conclude that Goldstein is definitely impressed with the determination of Zionist leaders that Silver leadership shall be restored. Confidentially, he professes that he had been neutral in this matter all along, and that he is now responding to the pressure of objective facts.

I am now looking for a speedy consummation of our project of your return to genuine leadership. If there is anything further I can do, please call on me at any time. If there should be a meeting of the Peace Committee, I shall be glad, now that I am enjoying summer leisure, to go to New York or anywhere else for the meeting.


I want to remind you of my conversation with you, before the others came up, about the desire of our Building Fund Committee that you address the dinner at which we shall make our final effort to complete our half a million dollar fund for the building of our Temple. You asked me to remind you late in the summer or early in the fall and to give you alternative dates. I thought I would do this now and remind you again later.

One feasible date would be Wednesday night, September 19. This is between Yom Kippur and Sukkot. Similarly suitable would be Thursday, September 20. The following week would also be satisfactory to us, say, Monday, September 24; Tuesday, September 25; Wednesday, September 26; or Thursday, September 27. Also suitable would be week-day evenings of the following week, namely, Monday, October 1; Tuesday, October 2; Wednesday, October 3; or Thursday, October 4. I hope that from this wide choice of exclusively week-day dates you will be able to designate one ~~one~~ night when you can come to us and deliver the final word that will build my Temple.

Please convey my greetings to Mrs. Silver and to both your sons whom I have had the pleasure of meeting at our inter-city Temple High School debates.



Gentlemen:

Attached hereto is the Financial Report of the Zionist Organization of America for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1944 and ending September 30, 1945.

Since the Financial Report submitted to you for the last annual convention was for a period ended at July 31, 1944, a special exhibit "Exhibit C" is incorporated in this report to cover the period of two months from August 1, 1944 to September 30, 1944.

It gives me pleasure to report that the Balance Sheet of the General Fund as at September 30, 1945 shows a Surplus of \$8,563.36, as against a Deficit of \$16,552.91 on September 30, 1944.

The aforementioned surplus in our General Fund is exclusive of the balance of \$133,382.17 in the Life Membership Reserve Account, of which the sum of \$122,000.00 has been invested in bonds of the Jewish National Fund, nor does it include a balance of \$53,334.92 in the Expansion Fund Reserve Account, which sum has been specifically earmarked and set aside to meet commitments made in behalf of the Committee on Unity For Palestine, the Radio Committee, the Publications Committee, the Educational Committee, the Economic Bureau, and other specific commitments, all of the aforementioned being under the Expansion Fund Program.

The following is a condensed comparative summary of the income and expenditures for the fiscal year under review.

Introducing this Newsletter.

We are addressing you as a member of the Unity Committee's "army in the field." Your ZOA President gave us your name sometime back as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in your District, and while many of you have already been working diligently in our cause, you are probably eager to receive some direct guidance from us as to where your duties as Unity Chairman lie.

We're going to attempt to furnish that guidance.

Equally important, though - we want guidance from you.

We want this Bulletin to be the beginning of

A TWO-WAY PASSAGE

We'll funnel our ideas to you,

You give us your reactions and suggestions.

OUR COMMITTEE'S JOB

..... is clearly defined and vitally important. It is to win non-Zionist Jews to Zionism and to counteract anti-Zionist propaganda with a positive public relations campaign.

FROM A POPULAR SONG

An appropriate slogan for our committee is provided by one of the current hit tunes. We've got to "Accentuate the Positive, Eliminate the Negative." There is no doubt about the positive nature of our movement and our message. The anti-Zionist Council could not possibly make the same claim.

WE ARE PROMISED A HEADACHE

That job will not be getting any easier as the year goes on. The Council for Judaism - the organized anti-Zionist group - held a conference in Philadelphia recently and adopted for the coming year a budget of \$250,000. You can buy a lot of "public relations" for \$250,000 - particularly when it is to be spent in one small segment of the community: that part of the Jewish community which has hitherto been non-Zionist. Note that this is the same segment of the community which our Committee is intended to win over (with a budget of less than \$50,000), (so get behind that Excision Fund Campaign!).

WHAT WE MUST DO !!!

What we must do, then, is follow the recipe old General So-and-So gave for military success:- "get there fustest with the mostest."

In organizing your local campaign, study our leaflets in the series "The Facts" as well as our bulletins. You will find that they are positive and that they usually refrain from mentioning or attacking the Council. This last is something we do not want to do. We do not want to advertise our opponents. These are the things you should do now!

PROJECT # 1

Initiate a direct-mail campaign designed to win non-Zionists:

1. Make up a mailing list composed of members of the Reform Congregations who have not yet joined the Zionist Organization, with the addition of the names of all those people who have been approached by the anti-Zionist Council or are receiving the Council's literature, or are likely to succumb to anti-Zionist propaganda.
2. Print letterheads for the local Committee on Unity for Palestine, listing on it the names of those who have been appointed to the Committee. These should be names calculated to impress those to whom this literature will be directed.
3. Send a covering letter with the first piece of literature. Here is a suggested form for that letter:

"Dear Friend:

"We know that as a fair-minded person interested in knowing the facts about Palestine, you will want to read the enclosed leaflet.

"'American Jews and Palestine' is the first in a series of factual brochures which this Committee has issued in the effort to remove some of the misconceptions which have been current about Zionist aims. You will agree with us that there has been altogether too much heat and too little light in the discussion of this vital subject. We feel that the enclosed pamphlet is a first contribution toward a clear understanding of what the Zionist movement actually seeks to accomplish in Palestine.

"We shall be tremendously interested to learn your reactions to this material and eager to answer any questions you may have concerning the effort to provide a home in Palestine for our homeless European brethren.

4. Carry "The Facts" leaflets in your pocket for ready distribution and illustration. Have your committee members carry them and hand them personally to their non-Zionist friends.

PROJECT # II

Arrange parlor meetings to which you will invite the non-Zionists in your community. We have found this to be the most effective means of getting our story across. These are generally in the form of an evening meeting in the social atmosphere of a private home, attended by 20 to 30 people each meeting - (10 or 15 couples). At these meetings someone who is equipped to discuss Zionism in a calm and factual manner should be asked to present the facts about Zionism and answer the questions of those present.

The parlor meeting technique has been used effectively by our Director, Rabbi Lelyveld, in a tour just completed. In San Francisco, for example, he addressed 12 such meetings which were attended by more than 400 non-Zionists representative of every segment of the community. More minds are changed in the intimate give-and-take of a discussion than at a mass meeting. We urge you to organize this activity in the following way:

1. Line up 5 or 6 men who would be willing to offer their homes as hosts to such meetings, and who have contacts with the groups you wish to reach.
2. Carefully prepare the list of those to be invited to each meeting.
3. Persuade someone who is equipped to do so to conduct these meetings, or write to room 600, 41 East 42nd Street, New York 17, for information as to the possibility of securing an outside speaker to lead these discussions. We shall endeavor to help you make contact with someone in your Region who will be capable of doing this job.

The parlor meetings in San Francisco were arranged by Mrs. Henry Harris and the local Zionist leaders, among them Jack Verdi, Sidney Rudy, and the energetic Zionist President, Rabbi Saul White. Parlor meetings in Los Angeles were held at the homes of Dr. Monte Salvin, President of the Hollywood Zionist District, and Mr. Harry Bauman, Southern California Chairman of the ZOA Expansion Fund Campaign. Parlor meetings were also arranged in Houston, Texas and Dallas, Texas, through the efforts of Bernard Lasky, Houston Unity Committee Chairman, and Helman Rosenthal and Sidney Pines, co-Chairmen of the Unity Committee in Dallas.

WE HAVE TWO REGIONAL CHAIRMEN

Two of our Zionist Regions have appointed splendidly equipped individuals to head our Unity Committee work in their areas. Mr. Julius C. Livingston of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Vice President of the Southwest Region, is serving as Chairman of the Committee on Unity for Palestine in that Region. Rabbi Sylvan Schwartzman of Augusta, Georgia, has accepted the Chairmanship for the Southeast Region, and is formulating plans for an intensive campaign this Spring.

As members of the National Executive Committee, we are jointly addressing this urgent appeal to you on behalf of the \$350,000 Expansion Fund.

Our Convention at Atlantic City gave its unanimous approval to the Expansion Fund program for wider-scope. Our greatly increased membership has added greater responsibilities.
