REPORT OF THE ZOA NATIONAL EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Yardstick

The Survey of Zionist Education in America conducted by the Education Committee during the year 5704 ended with the following statement and recommendations.

"The Z.O.A. as an adult Zionist organization must carry on an effective and continuing program of adult Zionist education if it is to hold its members and keep alive their interest in the cause of Zionism and Palestine. As a movement which aims to strike roots in American Jewish life and revitalize it in all of its aspects, it must concern itself with Zionist education on all levels and for all ages. The Z.O.A. does carry on at present educational work of a sort. This work, however, is unorganized and inadequate. The educational work of the Z.O.A. must be intelligently planned and directed under the supervision of competent personnel and with adequate resources, and on a scale commensurate with the needs of the Zionist movement in this country.

A. The Department of Education to be established should concern itself with the following areas.

1. Adult Zionist Education - Speakers' Bureau, Study Groups, etc.
2. Schools and Camps
3. Youth
4. Audio-Visual Aids - films, radio, slides, etc.
5. Hebrew and Hebrew Culture
6. Publications; Library and Archives
7. Work with non-Zionist organizations
8. Work with other Zionist organizations and Fund-raising agencies.
9. Inter-Zionist Council
10. Hebrew Arts Committee; Art Groups

Some of the areas of activity included in the above set-up are at present wholly or in part within the province of other existing agencies. The relations of these areas of activity to the total program of the proposed Department of Education are matters for future study and action.

B. The Department of Education should be headed by a director and several associate directors - one for schools and one for adult Zionist education and for the other work as outlined. In addition, two field directors of education should be appointed to travel about the country offering guidance and supervision to field personnel and to regions and districts directly. Other assistants will have to be appointed for special tasks such as the Hebrew arts, the Speakers' Bureau, etc.

C. A Department of Education to carry on an effective program of Zionist Education will require an initial budget of \$50,000.00 exclusive of the grants now made for the Zionist Youth Commission. Experience and need will determine budgetary requirements for subsequent years."

The Background

Since the Zionist Convention in October 1944 accepted the findings of the Survey in principle, the present Zionist Education Committee hoped that it would be able to plan its work in accordance with the Survey's findings and recommendations.

Because of the crisis which occurred within the Zionist Emergency Committee in the Fall of 1944 and because of the preparations for Zionist participation in the second session of the American Jewish Conference, the appointment of an education committee was delayed until December 21, 1944. From the very beginning it was obvious that lack of funds as well as lack of available manpower made the immediate implementation of the Survey's suggestions impossible. However, preliminary steps were taken to explore the possibilities of coordinating the presently existing Zionist educational agencies. A number of meetings were held to which were invited the heads of the Z.O.A. departments. These meetings made the need for coordination much more obvious, but could find no way of effecting that coordination because no recognized leadership was available to assume the task, and, because presently existing organizational forms made effective coordination impossible and finally, because the necessary budgetary requirements could not be met.

At the first meeting of the newly appointed Education Committee held on January 3, 1945, it was decided to attempt to function as well as possible within the existing limitations, but to go on record that unless effective steps be taken within the reasonably near future to implement the suggestions of the Survey, the educational work of the Z.O.A. will continue to be piecemeal, haphazard and therefore not as effective as it ought to be, despite the very commendable achievements of the various individual committees and departments. For the present the Education Committee decided to give its attention primarily to the problem of the districts and to some other specific projects which were within the scope of its work and budgetary allowance.

The committee was fortunate in acquiring, on a part time basis, the services of Mr. Joseph Greenstein, the Educational Consultant of the Metropolitan Bureau. His splendid understanding of the tasks before him and the energetic and efficient manner in which he carried out the decisions of the committee make it possible for the committee to report considerable progress despite the fact that it was not until March 1, 1945 that Mr. Greenstein assumed his duties as the Committee's Executive Secretary. In addition to Mr. Greenstein's services, the Committee had the devoted attention of a faithful group of its members who participated regularly in its monthly meetings and accepted special assignments. The Committee also had the wholehearted support and understanding cooperation of our President Dr. Israel Goldstein, and the sincere interest and fruitful suggestions of Mr. Saul S. Spiro.

The Z.O.A. at its meeting on April 1, 1945 approved a request for a budget of \$10,000 for the activities of the Education Committee for the months of March 1 to August 31, 1945.



RE: SUMMARY REPORT OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE PERIOD OF

DECEMBER 1 - 31, 1945

I. INQUIRIES (420)

More than four-hundred and twenty inquiries received by telephone, letter and in person were serviced by this department. (A total of 2,020 such inquiries have been serviced during the past three months.)

II. MATERIALS (200) Requests for Zionist Literature

More than two-hundred requests for specific materials were received during this period, most of which were the result of PROGRAM AIDS. Thirty (30) of these requests were for materials in quantity. (During the past three months a total of eight-hundred (800) requests for miscellaneous literature and one-hundred and twelve (112) requests for materials in quantity were serviced.)

III. CONSULTATIONS (63)

More than sixty-three consultations were held with Program Chairmen, Committees, individual Zionists, field workers and various people representing related organizations. (A total of two-hundred and sixty-three (263) such consultations were held during the past three months.)

IV. PROGRAM MATERIALS

A. Program Aids Vol. II No. 5 contained listings of new paid and volunteer speakers available for bookings through the Speakers' Bureau, Program Resources for Celebration of Tu B'Shevat, Description of Posters, Pamphlets, Stickers ("Justice for the War's Number One Victim"), Song Sheets available from the Education Department upon request.

#### IV. PROGRAM MATERIALS - continued

##### B. Song Sheets (7)

Seven districts were serviced with song sheets in quantity, making a total of thirty-nine (39) districts thus served during the past three months.

A new song sheets containing Hebrew, transliteration and English words has been made available for Tu B'Shevat.

C. The districts were assisted by this department in the preparation of exhibits and newsletters ( as well as promotional materials such as letters, cards, ads, posters, etc.)

Districts were also serviced with recordings, quizzes and lecture outlines.

##### V. SPEAKERS' BUREAU

A. Twenty-nine (29) speakers were booked through the Speakers' Bureau during this period. (Additional volunteer and paid speakers and artists have been added to the listings of the Bureau.) A total of ninety-two (92) speakers were booked during the past three months.

B. Seven (7) films were booked through the Speakers' Bureau during this month, making a total of forty-five (45) films for the past three months.)

##### VI. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

A. Program Prevues No. VI will be held in the Zionist Archives and Library on Tuesday, January 29, 1946. This meeting which will deal with The Veteran will feature a symposium entitled "The Veteran and the Zionist District", a music-drama presentation by the E.Z. Ensemble, technicolor sound film, "A Pass to Tomorrow" and Palestine Art Exhibit.

B. Manhattan Zionist Forum - All arrangements have been completed for this important program of education which will consist of two series of three lectures each. A special bibliography for further study of the subjects covered has been prepared.

C. Zionist Choral Society - Further promotional work has just been completed for this activity which is developing very nicely. Plans are now being made to implement the benefits of this activity (Program Prevues, Bikkurim Festival).

## PROGRAM ACTIVITIES - continued.

D. Sports on Parade

Assistance was rendered to the group in charge of the Athletic Carnival, under the auspices of the Hakoach-Maccoby Districts, under the sponsorship of the Manhattan Zionist Region.


E. Cooperation

The Zionist Organization of America recognizes the role it can play in this area and has taken concrete steps to insure continuance of Jewish culture by subsidizing the Histadruth Ivrit and the Hebrew Arts Committee. The Zionist Districts should not overlook the opportunity that Hebrew Month presents for giving added emphasis to this responsibility.

# PASSOVER

TUESDAY, APRIL 16th - TUESDAY, APRIL 23rd, 1946

The Season of our Freedom is rich in significant symbolism that points to liberty and freedom for all mankind. It has taught the axiom that liberty is the inalienable right of every human being. It has doubtless influenced the founding of our own American Republic. Engraven on the Liberty Bell, symbol of American independence is the verse from Leviticus: "Proclaim liberty throughout the land unto all the inhabitants thereof."

A discussion on Passover, the Festival of Freedom can be integrated with the "Four Freedoms".

Some things the district can do are:

A\* Arrange a Third Seder for the Zionist District

B\* Publish Passover anecdotes and lore in the district bulletin

C -The Zionist District can build a close association between Passover and Zionism in the mind of the community by:

1. Being a co-sponsor of the local community seder.
2. Being a co-sponsor of the model seder of the religious school (the district can have a Palestinian film shown as its contribution to the program.)
3. The President of the District may have inserted in the local newspaper an item entitled "Passover and the Four Freedoms".
4. Membership representation should be made through the synagogue if possible. (For example:- One of the rabbi's sermons may be devoted to the theme of "L'Shona Fabaah D'Yerushalyim" with the obvious interpretation that to make this possible one must join the Z.O.A.)
5. The public library, upon the request of the district will set up a shelf on Passover and the "Four Freedoms". If the branch library has a book review or story hour, they will be glad to deal with the subject upon proper representation.

RE: SUMMARY REPORT OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE PERIOD OF  
MAY FIRST - MAY THIRTY FIRST, 1946

I. INQUIRIES (440)

More than four-hundred and forty inquiries received by telephone, letter and in person were serviced by this department. (A total of 4,280 such inquiries have been serviced during the past eight months.)

II. MATERIALS (330) Requests for Zionist Literature

More than three-hundred and thirty requests for specific materials were received during this period many of which were the result of PROGRAM AIDS. Eighty-five (85) of these requests were for materials in quantity. (During the past eight months a total of 2,165 requests for miscellaneous materials and 374 requests for literature in quantity were serviced.)

III. CONSULTATIONS (66)

More than sixty-six consultations were held with Program Chairmen, Committee, individual Zionists, field workers and various people representing related organizations. (A total of 626 such consultations were held during the past eight months.)

IV. PROGRAM MATERIALS

A. Program Dia Vol II, No. 11 contained listings of new paid and volunteer speakers available through the Speakers' Bureau; program resources for celebration of Parents' Day, Lag B'Omer and Shevuos; listings of new Palestine and related films; announcement of IZAG mass demonstration featuring the presentation of "Address to the World"; invitation to an Audition Recital sponsored by the Jewish Center Lecture Bureau.

**PROGRAM MATERIALS - continued**

Heavy requests have been received for "Zionism, The Hope of Israel", both in single and quantity copies.

**B. Song Sheets (9)**

Nine districts were serviced with song sheets in quantity. Seventy-seven (77) districts were so serviced in the past eight months. (Special Lag B'Omer and Shevuot Song Sheets were made available for meetings utilizing the holiday theme.)

**C. Exhibits (1)**

This department aided in the preparation of one exhibit during this month. (The department has aided in the preparation and display of twenty (20) exhibits during the past eight months.)

**D. Newsletters (4)**

The districts were also assisted in the preparation of newsletters and promotional materials such as letters, cards, ads, posters, etc. Bulletin editors are also receiving materials, consultations, resources, exchange mailings, etc. to aid them in issuing their publications. Four (4) newsletters were assisted in this fashion during the past month and thirty-six (36) newsletters have been helped by this department during the past eight months.

**E. Recordings (7)**

Seven sets of recordings were made available during the past month. (Twenty (20) sets of recordings have been lent out during the past eight months.)

**F. Quizzes (2)**

Two districts were supplied with quiz material during the past month. Fifteen (15) sets of quizzes were made available to districts during the past eight months.

**G. Lecture Outlines (1)**

One lecture outline was prepared for a study group during the past month. Eighteen (18) such lecture outlines have been prepared in the past eight months.

## V. SPEAKERS' BUREAU

A. Forty-two (42) speakers were booked through the Speakers' Bureau during this period. Additional volunteer and paid speakers and artists have been added to the listings of the Bureau. (A total of 337 speakers were booked during the past eight months.)

B. Twenty (20) films were booked through the Speakers' Bureau during this month, making a total of one-hundred and sixty-two (162) films booked during the past eight months.)

## VI. PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

### Shekel Campaign

A. The Speakers' Bureau booked speakers to address Zionist District Shekel meetings as well as a number of district sponsored shekel meetings (i.e., at Synagogues, Jewish War Veterans Posts, etc.)

B. Especially prepared program materials and general Shekel literature were supplied upon request.

C. At the initiation of the Education Department, Lag B'Omer, Sunday, May 19th, was proclaimed Z.O.A. Shekel Mobilization Day. Material was prepared for district, religious school and community leaders and our efforts to rally school children to sell shekelim on this particular day to their family and neighbors proved successful.

D. With the assistance of the Education Department, the Brooklyn and Manhattan Zionist Regions were able to arrange for a sound truck, complete with large posters and appropriate musical and speech recordings, to tour the Jewish sections of the boroughs.

## VII. BROOKLYN ZIONIST REGION

A. The third and concluding lecture of the BROOKLYN ZIONIST FORUM was held, and the project as a whole met with a favorable response.

B. Plans are being made at present for a more intensive regional education program.

## VIII. WESTCHESTER ZIONIST REGION

The regular May issue of the ZIONIST DIGEST has been postponed until after the Annual Convention which will take place on Sunday, June 2nd so as to include the details of that function.

### VIII. WESTCHESTER ZIONIST REGION

A beautiful plaque, properly inscribed, has already been made up for presentation to Jacob G. Lutashok, retiring President of the Westchester Region.

### IX. MANHATTAN ZIONIST REGION

#### The Zionist Choral Society

The Zionist Choral Society performed very admirably on May 12th, Parents' Day, before the meeting of Zionist Youth Districts sponsored by the Manhattan Zionist Club. A Musicales Program Preview will be held on Tuesday, June 27th which will feature the final performance of the season for the Society. Initial arrangements for this affair have already been completed.

#### Seminar Workshop for Training of Speakers

Due to the lateness of the season and the overlapping of other activities, it has been decided to table this project until the Fall at which time it can get underway as a well-organized and effective group. (In the meantime the Education Department has made its services available to all registrants who wish to do independent preparatory study.)

#### Sports on Parade

Additional follow-up publicity has been received in the local press. Also, arrangements have been in progress for the preparation of a clip sheet and a reception to be held in honor of the participants.

#### Palestine Art Festival

The Palestine Art Festival was held according to schedule on Thursday, May 2, 1946 at Education Hall, the Museum of Natural History. An unexpected overflow attendance was present to be stimulated by the interesting illustrated lecture given by Elias Newman, community singing and a guided tour of the exhibit "Art in Jewish Education" which included a section of pictures from the Bezalel Art School of Palestine.

**X. COOPERATION**

This department cooperated with and rendered assistance to the American Zionist Emergency Council, American Zionist Youth Commission, Jewish Education Committee, the American Jewish Congress, Bnai Brith Youth Organization, Masada, Zionist Archives and Library, Keren Hayesode, Jewish Music Council, Jewish Welfare Board, etc. etc.
