



#### Re: Hechalutz Organization in America.

Pursuant to our conversation as of the 11th of December, 1945, I am subsitting herewith the following proposals concerning the development of Hechaluts in the United States and Canada.

1. It is imperative to put in some order the process of distribution of Chaluz Certificates in the U.S.A. The present Palestine Office, though managed by capable people, must be reorganized in accordance with the decisions of the Zionist Congress and the recent London Conference. The Palestine Office shall include the representatives of all Zionist parties and one representative of Hechaluts in accordance with the established procedure.

The Hechalutz suggests that the above-centioned Palestine Office shall also be the official Zionist body interested in the development of Hechalutz in U.S.A. and to show the Merkaz Hechalutz will report about its activities.

2. In order to facilitate the groath of Hechaluts in America it is intended to increase its present membership of 1930 to the minisum of 3000 in 1945/48. It is believed that next year the membership will grow to 5000, provided memey will be made available for educational work in the cities and for hachshars in agriculture and industry. A budget of S 110,000 is necessary for this year, and a guarantee that if the expansion program proves to be a success a budget will be made available ment year.

The American Fund for Palestine Institutions will guarantee S25,000 towards this budget. The Chalutsin themselves - 15,000. S16,000 were allocated by the Jewish Agency, and a sum of approximately S60,000 is lacking. We suggest that this amount shall be given by the Zionist Organizations in America either through initiating a special campaign or through direct allocation from their own funds.

It must be absolutely clearly understood that unless these funds are made available to Hechelutz, no serious expansion program will be possible.

5. There are right now 900 chalutzin in the United States ready for immediate immigration. 450 of them were on hachshars for over four years, and their aligh is an immediate necessity. We request the Aligah Department to take the situation into consideration and that the Zionist movement in america, through the Palestine Office, shall give preference to these chalutain.

In addition there are a few hundred candidates organized by the Mechaluts from amongst the war voterans, for study at the Hebrew University and the Technical School at Haifa. The Veteran Administration in Mashington has approved these schools as a part of eligible schools for American war veterans, and guaranteed the payment of tuition and maintenance. Many more will join this organization if at least a small fraction of condidates can arrive in Palestine by March 1946. We suggest that at least a 125 war veterans shall arrive in Polestine in the first group on student visae or as tourists.

4. It is obvious that the growth of Hechalutz in America can be most properly secured by the presence of a large delegation from Palestine. Some of the schlichim are already in the United States and more are required. It is important that the work of the Palestinian Delegation be supported by the entire Zionist movement in America.







Your recent letters, relative to the Zionist Expansion Fund, had to be referred to our Executive Committee, which explains my delay in replying to you. Even now, I am unable to give you an optimistic reply, but I can only transmit the opinions of our directors.

To begin with, the amount assigned to our district seems excessive. While we realize the importance of this fund, we neverthelass feel that it should be borne equitably between all districts; according to the figures submitted by you, we are assigned one-twenty-fifth of your entire quota, but we certainly do not represent that proportion of the total ZOA membership.

Furthermore, we must be realistic. This year our community is being asked to give to numerous causes and to a much larger degree. Our Welfare Fund has accepted a million dollar quota compared to a previous high of less than \$350,000. There is also a three quarter million dollar drive for a dewish Center, a quarter million drive for a new, modern synogogue, plus drives for Hillel and other similar organizations.

Even in 2ionist matters, we are raising this year for Haganah, a sum ten times larger than that of any previous year; and our district plans a small campaign for funds to carry on our own extensive program. The two dollars we receive from each membership is not sufficient to enable us to carry on our work.

Shortly after our annual convention last November, the subject was brought up before our Executive Committee and we accepted a quota of \$3500, which was the same as our contribution of last year. When your letter was introduced, our directors could see no way of increasing the original figure; but realizing the importance of your work, they voted that this \$3500 should be a minimum figure only, and that we should endeavor to raise as much more as possible. In other words, they did not actually accept your assignment, but neither did they hold to the original \$3500 figure. I realize that all this is indefinite, but it is the best we could dc under the circumstances, and it, at least, leaves us room for increased efforts.

It was suggested by our board, that if Dr. Silver could arrange to visit Milwaukee and open our campaign, the results could be very satisfactory. I therefore hope that you will give this angle serious consideration. After all, I am sure that Dr. Silver plans to visit Milwaukee at least once during the year, so perhaps he can easily combine this matter with any other plans he may have in mind. Should you decide to act on this suggestion, there are several conditions which I must outine -1) that this effort must be postponed to some date after our Welfare Fund campaign, since we plaged full support to that campaign. This means that we can do nothing until the end of May. 2) That we be given sufficient notice so that we can properly publicize Dr. Silver's visit, and 3) that it is understood, that a certain percentage of all monies raised as a result of Dr. Silver's appeal and efforts, be retained by us for operating purposes, and that the entire balance be turned over to the Expansion Fund in full settlement of our obligation to that Fund. The reason for this condition, is that we do not want to have two campaigns for our district, and that we want to combine our Expansion Fund appeal with our drive for supplementary operating funds.

I would appreciate hearing from you in the very near future, as to your reaction to the above, especially as it relates to Dr. Silver.

For your records, I can also advise that our Ways and Means Chairman is Joseph Brindis, 5509 W. Washington Blvd, Milwaukee, 8, Wisc. You may want to communicate with him as well. At the present time Mr. Brindis is out of the city, but I expect him to return around the end of this month.

P.S. We are now embarking on a concentrated membership campaign and my membership chairman (Dr. Louis Blumenthal) just informed me that he heard that Dr. Silver plans to be in Chicago or March 11. Dr. Blumenthal suggests that it may be possible for Dr. Silver to include Milwaukee as well, on his itinerary, since we are only one and a half hours out of Chicago; and it is his opinion that Dr. Silver could do much to stimulate our campaign. I think Dr. Blumenthal's suggestion is good, but the fact that we want Dr. Silver here later for Expansion Fund purposes somewhat confuses the picture. Will you kindly talk this matter over with Dr. Silver and Dr. Marks and advise me if something can be worked out. Again I must ask for a prompt reply so that we have sufficient time for necessary publicity.

If you believe that the expense of \$1500.00 of the 400foot film reel is justified, I would suggest that you go ahead with it. When would that film have to be made?

I think that Judge Levinthal's request to be relieved from the Chairmanship of the Publications Committee should be granted. He seems to be very much hard-pressed for time. I think that Eleanar Lipsky would make a good Chairman of Publications. Certainly we ought to have him try his hand at it.

Many thanks for your letter dated February 11th. I certainly did appreciate the fullsome consideration which was given to our request. I do believe that your letter requires more than a conventional reply.

I am enclosing herewith a cony of the remarks which were made by Dr. Silver at the last meeting of the National Administrative Committee. It will show the needs and the reason why we had to double our quota from one-half million dollars to one million dollars. It answers most of the statements made by you.

The quota assigned to you was based upon your membership at the end of last year. Your membership on October 1st was 1,950, which based on the national quota would bring your equitable share of \$19,500.We are certainly aware of the drives of at other organizations and are fully appreciative of them. Nevertheless, we are dealing with prime assentials. The Expansion Fund is geared for public relations of the highest order and this is badly needed in these times. Dr. Silver's statement best indicates this need to you.

With reference to the balance of your letter, I will communicate with Dr. Silver and advise him accordingly. I am sending a copy of this letter to Mr. Erindis.

#### MINUTES OF THE INNER COMMITTEE MEETING WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 20, 1946 HOTEL NEW YORKER, NEW YORK

PRESENT: Dr. Emanuel Neumann, Presiding, Dr. Israel Goldstein, Joseph W. Greenleaf, Rabbi Irving Miller, Milton Pollack, Mark Sugarman, Jacques Torczyner, and Yale Goldberg.

The following were present by special invitation: Rabbi Simon Greenberg, Menuel Posy, Abraham Tannenbaum and Herman Weisman.

#### EDUCATION:

Er. Neumann reviewed the plan of Rebbi Miller, as outlined in previous mirutes, that an Education Director be appointed. Rabbi Greenberg suggested that the name of the Education Committee be changed to Committee on District Programs.

Fabbi Greenberg stated that there was no correlation between the various departments in respect to educational content. He indicated the need for a coordination of departmental activities which could be done by a man of stature with creative ability. Dr. Neumann suggested that Rabbi Miller and Rabbi Greenberg, on behalf of the Committee, survey the field and see whether a man of this type can be found.

Habbi Greenberg further stated that the Hebrew Camp Masad will require approximately \$10,000 in order to provide additional facilities for training youth leaders. Dr. Neumann indicated that this subvention would depend upon the state of the finances and the Expansion Fund.

#### BUILDING:

Mr. Pollack reported that two buildings are being considered by the Building Committee - one at 40th Street and Broadway, and the second at 40th Street and Madison Avenue. The latter, at 280 Madison Avenue, is a twelve story office building and was considered most desirable. He cutlined the amount of space in each, indicating costs, etc.

The possibility of floating a bond issue to cover the down payment was considered. It was felt that there would be no difficulty in liquidating a bond issue of \$500,000 within 90 days. Dr. Goldstein suggested that the Funds might advance the monies to be charged towards future rentals. The Building Committee was asked to study the situation and report further on their findings.

Wale Goldberg indicated that the Zoning Commission in Washington has turned down three appeals due to the fact that the Organization is located in a zone that is restricted against commercial and office building use. It was further indicated that Dr. Silver stated that the Emergency Council does not desire to remain on the premises and he suggested that efforts be made to sell the building. The Building Committee will proceed with efforts to dispose of the building, and if the building cannot be sold for approximately \$70,000, the matter will be referred back to the Inner Committee.

#### SHEKEL CAMPAIGN:

B. Str

Jacques Torczyner reported that there will be a meeting of the Shekel Board at 10 A. M. on Friday, February 22nd, at the Biltmore Hotel. It was decided that membership work would be continued to the end of March and that the Shekel Campaign be devoted to the month of April. Mr. Torczyner further stated that 10% of the shekel monies are to be kept by the various organizations and another 10% is to be placed in a common fund to finance the campaign, at the end of which any amount over will be redistributed in proportion to the shekolim sold and any deficit will be financed by the Jewish Agency.

Abraham Tannenbaum indicated that the shekel campaign will involve the entire field staff. The probability: of over-lapping Membership campaigns into April was raised and it was agreed that nothing should prejudice these operations since they likewise involve shekel payments. Dr. Neumann suggested that Mr. Tannenbaum formulate plans for the operation of this campaign with some indication of the budget which will be required, using \$25,000 as a basis for these figures. Dr. Neumann further suggested that a reasonable estimate be made of the amount of shekolim that can be sold and that the budget be designed to accomplish that purpose. Mr. Tannenbaum and Mr. Torczyner will submit such plan and budget.

Dr. Goldstein indicated that he would be unable to serve as the Chairman of the Z. O. A. Shekel Committee and Mr. Daniel Frisch was designated to serve.

#### GENERAL ZIONISTS:

Dr. Israel Goldstein reported on the activity of the sub-committee in an effort to strengthen the position of the General Ziomist position on the continent where there is a fine potential group and a very small actual group. In Palestine, the General Zionist group is a very weak segment of the picture. There is need to entrust former Americans with the responsibility of enlarging our numbers and to delegate one of the group in America to go to Pelestine within the mext few months. Judge Levinthal was considered in this connection.

The General Zionists in Palestine require \$250,000 for rural settlement. It will be indicated to the UPA that an allocation, not to exceed \$500,000 be made available for use in Palestine. Dr. Neumann suggested that Dr. Goldstein appear at the meeting of the Joint Committee to present this matter so that some provision be made in the new UPA contract.

Dr. Neumann suggested that this matter be placed on the agenda of the next meeting of the National Executive Committee.

It was also suggested that before the next meeting of the World Zionist Congress, a delegation of General Zionists should go to Palestine with a director who is trained in such matters, so as to make a study of the situation there for the use of our delegates to the Congress.

#### PALESTINE CORRESPONDENT:

Dr. Neumann pointed out that he discussed with Dr. Silver the possibility of (1) having information sent to us regularly from Palestine,

perhaps in the form of a bi-weekly letter of information distinct from articles for publication, which would convey intimate details of conditions in Palestine for the information of Zionist leadership throughout the United States, and (2) clearing letters and dispatching publications, enswering general inquiries from Z. O. A. Departments and securing material for our rublications. Mr. Elias Epstein had been suggested. His submitted program could be covered by an annual budget of approximately \$3,00C. Motion was made and carried to adopt " this proposal and effectuate the establishment of this service.

#### PALESTINE BUREAU:

A letter from Dr. Simon Bernstein indicated that a meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 26th, to select representatives to the Palestine Bureau. The Zionist Organization would be entitled to four representatives. Mr. Morris Zeldin was suggested as one of the delegates. The remaining to be selected by Mr. Torczyner upon consultation with Dr. Bernstein.

#### VETERANS PROGRAM:

Dr. Neumann indicated that Major H. Auerbach made a very fine impression and a temporary assignment was suggested so that he can make a survey of the situation and submit his plans.

Dr. Noumann reported on the activity of a group of Veterans in Philadelphia which may serve as a pattern for our efforts in this direction. Major Auerbach will be asked to undertake a survey and present a program of activities. He is to be engrged at a fee of \$400 ever a four week period. It will be indicated that this will not in any way prejudice any future assignment in the organization. It was recommended that Major Auerbach consult with the Youth Commission regarding their suggestions.

#### PUBLICATIONS:

The resignation of Judge Louis E. Levinthal as Chairman of the Publications Committee was accepted and Eleazar Lipsky was aprointed to that post.

Dr. Neumann indicated that the second volume of the "Palestine Year Book" should not cost as much as the first, and that an editorial committee work with Miss Udin. Mr. Abraham Duker, Dr. Benjam'n Schwadran, Prof. Joshua Neumann and others were recommended for the Editorial Board. The Publications Committee is to be informed of this decision.

Dr. Neumann indicated that a one-volume Jowish History has been prepared by Israel Goldberg, which fact should be transmitted to the Publication Committee.

#### NEW PALESTINE:

Dr. Noumann indicated that Dr. Silver was dissatisfied with the New Palestine. It does not compare feverably with the publications of other organizations. Dri Meumann suggested that in planning for the coming year, (1) the News Reporter become a bi-weekly, to be sent to all members, and (2) that a monthly publication be sent to subscribers only, at the additional enst of \$1.

It was suggested that a small group be selected to serve as an editorial advisory board, who will not only write, but who will also be responsible for the general content of the magazine. Abraham Daker was suggested as secretary of such a board and the following were suggested as possible members: Dr. I. B. Berkson, Dr. Benjamin Schwadran, Prof. Joshua Neumann, Dr. Theodore N. Lewis and Marvin Lowenthal, Dr. Benjamin Aksin, Prof. Oscar Janowsky. Such a board might organize the next three or four issues of the New Palestine to ascertain what they can accomplish.

Jacques Torczyner shall explore the possibility of also establishing a Business Board for the New Pelestine.

#### MELS REPORTER:

The possibility of a bi-weekly adition of the News Reporter was disoussed. Motion was made and carried that from March Slat, four half issues of the News Reporter are to be printed bi-weekly.

After a thorough discussion, the matter of an increase in salary for Mr. Barbarash was defeared for further study by the Inner Committee of the entire wage scale. Mr. Sugarman, Mr. Pollec' and Mr. Gordman, as financial officers of the organization, are to explore the situation.

#### IMAGER COMMITTE:

Dr. Neumann asked Rabbi Trving Miller to serve as Chairman of the Inner Committee in the absence of Dr. Neumann, pending his return from Palestine.

#### EXPANSION FUND:

Mr. Manuel Posey reported on the progress of the Expansion Fund, indicating that before the close of the fiscal year, an amount very close to the estimated \$500,000 will be received. He cited various communities as exemples of the progress which is being mode and indicated that he had been approached by a community Welfare Fund who asked as to defor our compaign and who cited the fact that they had made an arrangement with enother organization by which, in deference to their not running a compaign, they granted them an allocation of \$25,000. It was established that monies are not to be solicited from Welfare Funds but that offers of this type are to be considered and surveyed. It was also indicated that Expansion Fund compaigns should be timed throughout the country so as not to conflic: with UJA complians. The Acting Chairman of the Inner Committee should contact Dr. Silver, advising him of this content.

Dr. Marks and Mr. Posy, in consultation with Mr. Herman Weisman, shall draft a memorandum containing the e sence of the aforementioned suggestions. This entire matter should be pl ced on the agenda of the National Executive Committee meeting.

It was suggested that members of the staff, such as Dr. David Tannenbaum, Rabbi Arthur J. Lelyveld, and members of the Executive he asked to travel throughout the country on behalf of the Expension Fund. Immediate stops in this direction will be taken.

Jacques Torczyner and Herman Weisman are to discuss with Mendel Fisher the question of co-ordination between Jewish National Fund and Expansion Fund efforts.

Dr. Noumann felt that inasmuch as there is a duplication of activities by the Unity Committee and the work of the Emergency Council, that a reduction in the budget of the Unity Committee can be effected. It was decided that \$25,000 be eliminated from this budget.

Mr. Seismand and Mr. Sugarman were asked to explore the possibility of the transfer of the Palestine Economic Bureau to the Keren Hayesod.

#### AMERICAN FUND FOR PALESTINE INSTITUTIONS:

A letter from the American Fund for Palestine Institutions indicated that there was no precise formula for representation on their Board of Directors. Yale Goldberg was instructed to speak with Judge Levinthal and Judge Rothenberg with regard to Z. O. A. representation on the American Fund for Palestine Institutions.

#### MaSaDa:

Mr. Torczynor is to arringe with the Youth Commission that \$3,000 or \$4,000 of their funds are to be granted to Masada over a period of four months so that Masada be given a better opportunity to prove their ability to organize Zionist youth.

#### MISCHLIAN TOUS:

It was the unanimous decision of the Inner Committee to recommend the appointment of Rabbi Max Musebeum of Los Angeles as a member of the National Administrative Council.

Dr. Isrrel Wochsler shill be invited to attend a meeting of the Inner Committee or Executive Committee to discuss his program for the Hebrow University.

Dr. Shleme Bardin will be invited to the next m eting of the Inner Committee to report on his trip to Pelestine.

It was recommended that Mr. Hyman Shoulson be assigned to assist Dr. Akzin of the Emergency Council in Vashington. ...

The meeting adjourned at 11:15 P. M.

I have just returned from a conference with Reverend Martin Adolf, President of the Paterson Zionist District. He is one of the most ardent worker in our movement.

He has taken Paterson, a dormant community, and has created a district which will double its membership this year. They are already considerably beyond their membership reached at the end of last year.

He has ascertained that you will be in New York on March 31st and wants you to come to Paterson on the evening of April 1st.

Here are the points he makes: (1) \$5,000 will be given to you for the Expansion Funi (he has already collected this money. I saw the bankbook in which it is deposited. Last year he gave us \$2,000, which was one-third of all that we collected in New Jersey.

(2) Cn this occasion they will present \$1,000 to Nachlath, New Jersey in your honor.

(3) They are inscribing in the Golden Book two editors of the two local papers together with Dr. Claire S. Wightman, President of the New Jersey State Teachers College. Mr. Haines, one of the editors and Dr. Wightman are co-chairman of the American Christian Palestine Committee in their community and are ardent Zionists in the fullest sense of the word.

The community mass meeting will be preceded by a small informal dinner wherein the editors, the Gollege President, and some of the biggest men in Paterson public life will be present.

I know of your feelings in this matter and the great demands made upon your time but I do believe that this particular request deserves your particular attention and consideration. Paterson today is, in my opinion, one of the foremost Zionist communities in /



Membership Report: I was disturbed to see in the press a report of our total national membership in the following terms:

"Over 90,000 members have enrolled in the Zionist Organization of America in the four months period ended Jan. 31, 1946, marking a net gain of 25,000 over the same period last year, according to a report issued by the national headquarters."

I feel that it is confusing to the public to make our public announcement of membership dependent upon our system of wiping the elate clean and beginning our enrollment each September. Every other national organization includes the paid-up members of the previous year in its total enrollment figures. This report gives the erroneous impression that our total membership is only 90,000, when, as a matter of fact, we would be justified in claiming at this time over 150,000 members.

My dear Dr. Marks:

The two meetings in Baltimore were very successful. At dinner, I met with some forty or fifty members of the Board of the Baltimore Zionist District and talked to them about membership and the Expansion Fund. They made a pledge to obtain an additional 2800 members which would bring up their total to 5000. Mr. Zinberg seems to be a very energetic person, and he is ally assisted by Mr. Fram who has himself brought in 150 new members.

They have not made much headway on the Expansion Fund. At the evening mass meeting, Rabbi Coblems publicly presented me with a check for \$5,000.00 as a token payment. The leaders do not seem to know what is expected of Baltimore, mor is any organized effort being made to raise its quota. I understand that Mr. Posy has been there, but evidently additional work must be put in if we are to realize a substantial contribution from Baltimore. This should be attended to at once.

The evening meeting was a great success. The Temple was packed and there was a fine spirit of enthusiasm.

My dear Dr. Marks:

The expenses involved in connection with my trip to Chicago Monday, March 11, amounted to \$20.

The meeting was very successful. Some 3500 people crowded into the ballroom of the Stevens Hotel. They announced the enrollment of over 3700 new members and they seem to be on the way to get many more. Mr. Wilton Silberman is doing an excellent job. At noon, I neet with about seventy-five at luncheon where funds were raised for the Expansion Fund. Wilton is under the impression that we will be able to get about \$25,000 from Chicago.

There was considerable criticism of the neglect of the region outside of Chicago. They told me that there has been no one in charge of that region since last October and that quite a number of districts haven't done much even by way of renewing the memberships of last year, not to speak of new memberships. What is being done about it? A field director should be disputched to that important region at once, and some one ought to remain in Chicago to follow up the work of the Expansion Fund.

Subject: Brith Sholom

I contacted Mr. Louis I. Gilgor, grand secretary of the Independent Order Brith Sholom at 506 Pine Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. I am glad that it happened just a day before his planned visit to New York. That saved me a trip to Philadelphia. Mf. Gilgor came to our office, and we went into the past history of megotiations with the Z O A.

Mr. Gilgor states that the Brith Sholom was the first Jewish fraternal order to endorse the Basel program, when other fraternal orders were afraid of Zionism. For years, the Brith Sholom was invited officially to Zionist conventions, with full rights for the delegates. Five or six years ago, the Z O A for some reason stopped inviting the Brith Sholom. But as a Zionist he can't hold that against the organization. He is willing to do everything in his power to help the Brith Sholom membership to affiliate collectively with the Z O A. He says that negotiations a year or two ago seemed to be promissing, but someone on the Z O A executive committee "sabotaged the project".

Coming down to practical suggestinns, here is the plan that we have in mind. Mr. Gilgor and Mr. Stanton, grand master of the Brith Sholom, and one or two other leading members of that fraternal order will meet with Judge Leventhal and me in Judge Leventhal's chambers in Philadelphia to trash out this matter and arrive at definite propositions to be placed before the ZOA executive committee.

The view was particularly satisfactory, because Mr. Gilgor says that if an agreement is reached at least the Sheckel for the entire membership could be paid immediately out of special funis that the organization has on hand.

Furthermore, he says that whatever financial arrangements can be made, it will cost the ZOA very little to carry the Brith Shoiom membership. The organization is willing to serve the its own members, in other words, if the ZOA wishes to reach the Brith Sholom members with a proposition of letting on new members. This can be turned over in bulk to the Brith Sholom office, which will see to the addressing, postage, etc. at its own expense.

Please let ms know immediately, what suggestion you have as to the proposed conference in Philadelphia with the Brith Shclom.

Mr. Gilgor also feels it will be very beneficial for the 20A to have Dr. Silver address the next convention June 23 to 25 in Atlantic City. I am attaching the letter from Mr. Gilgor, which, I hope you will take up with Dr. Silver immediately. All arrangements for Dr. Silver's visit to Atlantic City will be made by Brith Sholom, transportation, hotel, etc. Please call Dr. Silver's attention to the fact that he can choose his own time. Any of the sessions that he wishes to address will suit the Brith Sholom.

Dear Sidney:

Answering your letter of March 14th, received March 15th, I am pleased to advise you as follows:

1. The final ruling of the Board of Zoning Adjustment denied the request of the Z.O.A. for a rehearing for permission to establish a philanthropic institution at the above mentioned address. The Board voted three to two. Mr. Cooperman who attended all the hearings, is fully familiar with this situation.

2. On March 6th, I received a letter from Mr. Cooperman suggesting that I inform the office of the inspector of Buildings that the Z.O.A. has removed its offices to New York City and that the building is for sale. I followed his suggestion in order that the Board vacate and set aside the viclation which had existed at the time we first requested a re-zoning.
