MEMORANDUM TO DR. A. H. SILVER

Report on Meeting of the Central Shekel Board, which was held at the Hotel Biltmore, New York, Friday, February 22, 1946, at 10 A.M.

Representing the Z. O. A. were Dr. Sidney Marks, Mr. Jacques Torczyner, Mr. Mendel Fisher, Mr. Robert Silverman, Mr. Charles Ress, Mr. Joseph Greenleaf, and Mr. Kretchmar Israeli.

Mr. Gottleib Hammer of the Jewish Agency, reported that his last information indicated Tel Aviv, early in August, as the place and time of the World Zionist Congress. There was nothing final about this information. Under the circumstances, he urged that the Shekel campaign be terminated early in May and that elections be held in June. He indicated that the Emergency Council is lending its facilities to publicize the operations of the Shekel Board. Mr. Charles Ress was elected temporary Chairman and Miss Julliette Benjamin of Hadassah was elected temporary Secretary.

The first question that arose was whether the problem of Mizrachi's request for an additional vote. This was requested by Rabbi Zembrowsky but was contested by Mr. Wertheim of Poale Zion who stated that his organization had 34 delegates to the last Zionist Congress and was entitled to 7 representatives on the Shekel Board if the Mizrachi gets A. He indicated that this unilateral action on the part of Mizrachi does not follow the key established. A motion was made to poll the parties and Poale Zion insisted on a strict adherance. We recommended that Mizrachi be given this additional vote and Mr. Wertheim felt that the General Zionists put Poale Zion "on the spot." No definite action was taken in these respects ** It was tabled.

The next order of business on the agenda was as follows: Election of officers, staff and budget, the distribution of shekolim, the establishment of local shekel boards and committees, and finally, bank resolutions, auditors, dates to be set for voting and regular time of meeting of the Shekel Board Committee.

It was felt in the interests of orderly procedure that by-laws and permanent officers should be obtained. Mr. Wertheim made a motion for a sub-committee for the election of officers as well as a sub-committee for by-laws. This was opposed since there was a full representation of all parties present. Mr. Robert Silverman moved that the following officers be constituted: Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and Executive Director. It was carried unanimously.

A conflict thereafter ensued wherein the Labor bloc with which Hashomer Hatzair allied itself, voted against all nominations since they felt that the method of procedure was a break with tradition. This was based upon the contention of Mr. Wertheim that the Poale Zion was entitled to either the Presidency or Executive Directorship. After a discussion, it was decided to proceed with the elections upon the insistence of the General Zionist bloc, the Z.O.A. and Hadassah, - which voted solidly throughout the entire proceedings after discussions had taken place between representatives of both of these groups. Mr. Charles Ress was elected as Chairman, - a vote of 15 to 8, Rabbi Zembrowsky was elected Vice-Chairman, by a vote of 14-8.

In the case of Vice-Chairman and Treasurer, Mr. David Wertheim was nominated by us but refused these nominations. It was obviously the tactic of the Labor block to refuse to participate at all in these elections.

At this juncture, Jacques Torczyner voted that the office of Co-Chairman be created and reserved for Poale Zion. It was passed by the General Zionist block together with Mizrachi which voted consistently with us. Under those circumstances, Rabbi Zembrowsky was permitted to withdraw his Vice-Chairman-ship since that position was abolished.

Rabbi Zembrowsky was thereafter elected as Treasurer, Miss Julliette Benjamin was elected Secretary, and Mr. Abe Tannenbaum was elected as Executive Director of the Shekel Board.

It was decided that two committees be appointed - one, an office committee and two, a By-Law committee which should render reports at the next meetings on both of these scores.

It was unanimously decided that the name of the Shekel Board, on recommendation of Mr. Hammer, be the United States Shekel Board. The By-Law and office committee shall consist of the Chairman and a representative of each party.

A discussion then took place on the question of the sale of shekolim. At this point, Hadassah, under the leadership of Miss Benjamin, took a stand against the position of the Z. O. A. This new coalition insisted on the shekel campaign starting March 1st with the intervening period being devoted to the distribution of shekelim to the various parties. It was also indicated that the campaign shall continue until May 27th with elections being held during the third week of June, We were overwhelmingly defeated on our proposal to wait until the first week in April. Mr. Torczyner indicated that it will be satisfactory since the shekel machinery could not be undertaken for a month after distribution.

A discussion thereafter ensued on the problem of finances. It was decided that 20% of all membership blocks power would cover the expense of the various parties. 10% of all shekolim except membership shekolim would likewise be retained by the parties, the balance of 10% to be placed into a general fund for propaganda. In this discussion, the question was raised whether there would be adequate moneys for this purpose. There was something of an understanding that the Jewish Agency would make additional allocations.

The meeting thereafter adjourned.

Res Shekel Campaign

You will forgive me, Harry, for bothering you again after having told you in person a few days ago how deeply concerned I am with the status of the shekolim campaign.

I am writing this note to you because I know that you and the several people who personify the impact of the Emergency Council revitalized, had a great deal to do in influencing Dr. Silver to accept the Presidency of the Z. C. A. and other burdens he now carries.

I had the opportunity to spend two and a half hours with Dr. Silver on Tuesday at which time I saw that he feels that there is a group of men who are keenly and consistently watching out for the activities and success of the things which surround him and for which he is responsible.

As you know, the shekolim conference will take place Monday at a great cost of money and energy. Being the first such gathering, it should have been so organized that its impact should have been anticipated throughout the country and reflected in the press, both Anglo-Jewish and Middish, neither of which, I am sorry to say, had anything about it.

Today is Friday. I made it my business to see Barbarash a few minutes ago to find out what he is going to do in the next issue of the News Reporter which is going to press tonight, on the question of the shekelim conference, only to find that he knows next to nothing of anything which is going on.

Now, why am I saying all this to you? It is not because I wish to blame anyone since I know that it is my responsibility as much or perhaps more than anyone else's. What prompts me to write to you is the fact that I think that the Emergency Council is at the present stage of our political work, not overburdened with tasks and responsibilities, and that you could, if you will, see to it that part of your organization assumes the responsibility of this Congress struggle, the result of which will be more telling than anything else which has occurred of late, both as regards the personality of Dr. Silver, his destiny as a leader, and what is more, the welfare of our movement.

It represents a vote in a world wide referendum which is to demonstrate to the United Nations that the Jews of this country, the Jewish community in Palestine and Jews everywhere are determined to fight for the national preservation of the Jewish people -- that they are determined to fight for recognition of their just demands -- which is primarily a matter of life and death for the million and a half surviving Jews in Europe.

Local Shekel Committees Organized in Hundreds of Communities. -- Thousands of Volunteers Enlisted.

Under the direction of Jacques Torczyner of New York, chairman of the national ZOA Shekel Committee, an extraordinary effort has been launched to bring into the ZOA shekel and election campaign the many thousands of non-affiliated Jews through their various fraternal organizations, particularly through the Jewish centers, clubs and landsmannschaften in the communities of the land.

Jewish War Veterans Join the Fight.

Of historic import is the action taken by the Jowish War Veterans of the United States, who have for the first time publicly aligned themselves with the cause of a Jewish commonwealth in Palestine. Through their National Commander, Maxwell Cohen, the Jewish War Vaterans have joined in supporting the shekel and election effort of the Zionist Organization of America and are urging every American Jew to become a shekel buyer. The endorsement of the ZOA shekel effort was made through National Commander Cohen in a letter to Major Herschel Auerbach, director of the Veterans Bureau of the Zionist Organization of America.

"We are wholeheartedly in favor of your shekel campaign and urge every American Jew to become a shekel payer," Commander Cohen said in his letter.

ZOA district officers are therefore urged to communicate with the local posts of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States with a view to enlisting their active participation, both in the distribution of shekolim and in bringing out the vote for the ZOA delegates slate.

It is gratifying to note that the Zionist youth organizations, such as Masada, and Young Judea, have rushed to the aid of the ZOA, their parent organization, in helping to roll up huge shekel totals for the organization.

"The ZOA cause is our cause," declare the young Zionists in stirring calls addressed to their memberships. Our parent body -- the Zionist Organization of America -- under the militant leadership of Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, has proclaimed the mobilization for the forthcoming World Zionist Congress of one million Jews under the General Zionist banner. We young Zionists have been called upon to act as the vanguard -- the recruiting officers -- of the army of liberation for our people."

Members of the Masada, Avukah and Young Judea are each pledged to enroll at least 100 shekel payers for their parent body through their families and friends.

"The ZOA fights for the rights of our people. Join in the fight of your parent body!" is the cry of these youthful Zionists.

Re: Shekel Campaign

In connection with the Shekel Conference which will be held Monday, March 25, I would like to suggest the following general program:

- A Morning session...10 A.M...Presentation of the campaign program and strategy for the entire country which will cover:
 - 1. Local Shekel sales committees
 - 2. Publicity
 - 3. Lists
 - 4. Organizations unafilliated with Zionist groups
 - 5. Mass meetings
 - 6. Regional conferences
 - 7. Method of setting up local Shekel and election board
 - 8. Literature
 - 10. Elections
 - a. telephone squads
 - b. ads in newspapers
 - c. automobile squads
 - d. radio spot announcements
 - 11. Senior Young Jude an Clubs
 - 12. Masada
 - 13. Distribution of Shekolim. The immediate sale of Shekolim presents among others one great danger, namely, that the Shoke! presents among others our great danger, nearly, that the Shekel will be lost between the time of sale and the time of voting, and so a person who has lost his Shekel will be deprived of his vote. To overcome this difficulty, I would like to suggest that the ZOA prepare a "Receipt For A Shekel" which will be sold now, and shortly before the elections, the regular Shekel will be mailed to those who purchased Shekolim and also to the membership of the ZOA. This will serve the purpose of making sure that the Shekel holder has his Shekel receipt, and it will give us the opportunity of sending to each one a piece of literature on the issues involved, and "suggestions on how to vote". This procedure will not only entail a great deal of work, but a substantial expenditure of money, but it definitely has in its favor

the fact of control and a greater assurance of getting out the vote.

B - Afternoon session ... 2 P.M.

It is my suggestion that the afternoon session be held in the form of a closed conference. Only those who are invited to attend will be permitted to remain. I make this suggestion with the idea in mind that a closed session will give each person present an added feeling of importance and second, will perhaps make them feel that being brought in on the "inside", they will have to exert greater efforts on the Shekel campaign.

1. Presentation of platform

2. If Hadassah agrees to a joint Shekel campaign and a united slate with the ZOA, it will be necessary to present this matter to the conference.

3. Discussion of the issues involved not only in the Shekel campaign from the point of view of enrolling a tremendous number of Jews for obvious political reasons, but for a discussion of the internal Zionist problems in connection with other parties in the World Zionist Organization. This information, which in my opinion should be direct and factual, and will make the people present understand the significance not only of a large Shekel campaign, but more important, of bringing out our general Zionists to vote.

C - Speakers:

I think it is most advisable for Dr. Silver and Rabbi Miller to be present at both sessions. If it were possible to have someone from Palestine, who is a general Zionist, present at this conference, it would be very stimulating. May I please have your reactions, suggestions, corrections, additions and deletions quickly, so that we can proceed without delay.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SHEKEL CAMPAIGN

- A. Appoint a Shekel Chairman for your District. The committee should consist not only of members of the District, but of representatives from Synagogues, Ladies' Auxiliaries, men's clubs, social, philanthropic, and educational organizations, Senior Young Judea Clubs, Masada. The representative of each organization should be made responsible for the sale of Shekolim to all members of his organization.
- B. Call a Conference of the representatives of all Jewish organizations (not Zionist groups) for the purpose of launching the Shekel Campaign and organizing the Shekel Committee outlined above. Endeavor to obtain committments from each organization to enroll the membership enmasse.
- C. The price of a Shekel is 50¢. Members of the Z.O.A. and other Zionist organizations do not have to purchase Shekolim. It is included in the dues.
- D. Hebrew Schools and Young Judea Clubs.

 Arrange through the children to have their parents, brothers and sisters over 18 years of age purchase Shekolim.
- Veterans should be approached through a Veterans Committee. Perhaps it can be arranged to have the first Shekolim sold to a group of Veterans. Have a group picture taken in uniform, each veteran holding his Shekel receipt. Release the picture to your local papers, and send us a copy for the New Palestine. Masada must be represented on your Shekel committee, and they should work with the young people and on the College Campus.
- F. Arrange a series of mass meetings. We will send you speakers who will present the issues involved, and give the reasons for voting the Z.O.A. ticket.
- G. Family Groups
 The Shekel should be sold not only to the men but to husband, wife, and all children over 18 years of age. This will create a family interest in Palestine, insure a large sale and more votes.
- H. You will be supplied with booklets containing 10 receipts -- "Receipt for a Shekel." The actual Shekel will be mailed from the national office to each Shekel holder a few days before election. Keep a record of each receipt sold -- name and address. Forward the stubs to our office together with 50¢ for each receipt. Use the forms with which you will be supplied.

SEVEN ZIONIST ORGANIZATIONS UNITE IN MOBILIZING LARGEST AMERICAN DELEGATION IN HISTORY FOR WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS

New York, April 3, 1946.

The total mobilization of American Jowry in the 1946 Shekel Roll Call was urged today in a Proclamation issued by the seven national Zionist bodies which comprise the United States Central Shekel and Election Board. The Proclamation calls upon every Jew in the United States to have a voice in determining the destiny of the Jewish people by purchasing a shekel and thereby becoming an elector to the 22nd World Zionist Congress which takes place in Palestine this summer.

The Proclamation was issued by the Zionist Organization of America, Hadassah, Poale Zion, Mizrachi, Hashomer Hatzair, Left Poale Zion and the Jewish State Party.

The document calls attention to the crucial importance of this first post-war international assemblage of Zionists following upon the greatest catastrophe in Jewish history and the decimation of European Jewry.

"That WILL must be strengthened and guided toward freedom and liberation. Even as of old, we will be heard and counted through the shekel, the ancient-modern symbol of Jewish solidarity."

2- Total Mobilization of American Jewry Called For

The Proclamation emphasizes the determination of "American Jewry, 5 million strong, the largest, freest, community in the world, to assert its demand for a Jewish Commonwealth and affirm its solidarity with the heroic Yishuv".

Since the number of American delegates to the Congress depends on the number of Shekolim sold, the importance of the Shekel Campaign among all Zionist organizations becomes manifest.

"The purchase of a shekel is the act of adherence and solidarity with the Jewish people", the Proclamation declares. "We call upon every Jew to buy a shekel. He who holds a shekel -- he alone will vote as an elector to the World Zionist Congress. He who holds a shekel -- he will participate most directly in determining the future of the Jewish people".

The signers of the Proclamation are: Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, president, Zionist Organization of America; Mrs. Judith G. Epstein, president, Hadassah; Leon Gellman, president, Mizrachi; Dr. Hayim Fineman, chairman, Poale Zion; and by Charles Ress and David Wertheim, the chairmen of the United States Central Shekel and Election Board.

The 22nd World Zionist Congress, the first since 1939 and the first to be held in Palestine, will open in Tel Aviv on August 7.

Its decisions will command world attention. The action to be taken by the assembly will depend in large measure upon the report of the Anglo-American Commission of Inquiry on Palestine which is expected to be submitted by the time the Congress convenes.

3- Total Mobilization of American Jewry Called For

Zionist leaders are being urged to set up local Shekel and Election Boards in their own communities to secure maximum participation in the election of delegates to the Congress. Voting for delegates will take place in June.

I am sorry I could not come into the meeting this morning. You saw how crowded my office was; they simply would not let me get out of the room.

I desire to submit herewith to the Shekel Committee the following:

- 1) A special department should be created immediately for the sale of "block-shekels", i. e., that a group buys the shkolim for all its members and their wives.
- 2) The Rabbinical Assembly of America should be immediately approached with the request that they send a telegram to all their congregations and their rabbis urging them to buy block-shekels for themembers of their congregations.
- 3) Together with each shekel should go a short leaflet containing the following appeal:

"Save the remnants of our people in Europe by bringing them to Palestine. By giving them your vote you are helping them towards this end--vote for List #1 headed by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver."

- 4) A group of young men of Masada should be immediately mobilized to attend to each synogogue and temple by supplying the shekel holders with material until election day.
- 5) Each congregation should be declared as a voting station.
- 6) A similar action could be carried out also with a large number of Landsmanschaften. Material given to them must also be in Yiddish. Should you need my help in the preparation of this Yiddish material, I shall try to do it.

The Conference was attended by a member of chaplains who have recently returned from overseas, Rabbis, and many laymen who have volunteered their services in the nation-wide effort to secure a million enrolled voters for the ZOA ticket.

In a communication to all ZOA districts, Mr. Torczyner reiterated the call for the formation of shekel and election boards
in the respective communities, and the appointment of Shekel chairmen.
Local mass meetings are being arranged to acquaint Zionists with the
issues involved and the significance of the forthcoming World
Zionist Congress.

Mr. Torczyner urged that notification of the sale of shokolim
be made before Hebrew Schools, Young Judaea moetings, Masada clubs,
college campus groups and veterans groups. He stressed the fact
that the shekel should be sold not only to men, but to women and all
persons over 18 years of age. The price of a shekel is 50 cents.

Members of the Zionist Organization of America do not have to purchase
shokolim to vote in the elections, since it is included in the dues.

An enclosure has been prepared to go into the envelope with the receipt books.

An enclosure is being prepared to go into the excelope with the actual Shekel.

Some way is being sought whereby a pamphlet with Dr. Silver's personal message can be sent with the Shekel, with a slit in which the Shekel can be placed to try to avoid loss.

A political bulletin will be sent along with the Shekel giving the shekel payer an awareness of existing situations and with "inside information".

Press releases have been going out continuously.

If our people do not respond quickly, a form letter will be ready to prod them and a second notice to impress them with the urgency of submitting their money and stubs. We will enclose return envelopes for same.

Additional personnel will be hired for Chicago, New York and the West Coast.

Every member of the Field Staff will be contacted and instructed to call their people for maximum attendance at tonights meeting.

The three presidents of the Cleveland Districts will receive a wire to make sure that the people of Cleveland attend this Sunday's Conference.

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MINUTES SERFF MEETING - FRIDAY, 4/12/46

There was a general discussion on the meeting held at the Biltmore last evening. It was generally agreed that a great deal of knowledge can be derived from several experiences of last evening which knowledge can be useful in the successful planning and implementation of future meetings.

The meeting hall, as such, was too large and the formal atmosphere was entirely missing that is important a meeting of this type is planned. This was essentially a meeting where speakers were to committed and trained for the job to be done. At the last minute, convert Speakers Guides were distributed and several committments were obtained; these may not ordinarily have been received.

In the future, even it it means interupting the meeting, it might be advisable to ask those present to fell out cards which they would find in their seats, using methods similar to those at Red Cross and March of Dimes appeals in the theatres. This method will be tried in Cleveland.

Copies of the Agenda will be distributed to those present at the Cleveland meeting, and at other meetings throughout the country. These agendas can be prepared in this office and sent to the communities in which the meeting is being held.

A schedule of meetings is on hand and the communities will be contacted to a scertain the attendance anticipated, the type of meeting planned and the facilities at hand and we will endeavor to teach them the proper technique to be used to insure the success of their meetings.

It may be advisable to create a manual of instructions on the procedure to be followed in preparing for a meeting which will give us a reasonable assurance that we can get the meeting under way with the basic essentials of a good meeting provided for.

We must always be sure to provide a Zionist and American Flag for these meetings.

Due to the upset created when Mr. Kipsky did not appear as scheduled, in the future, speakers will be contacted, and in the event that the meeting planned is a small one, all of the invitees will be contacted to insure their attendance.

In planning our manhammen future meetings, we will not limit ourselves to hotels, due to the fact that there are a good many fine halls in the city of New York which may not be affected by the overcrowded conditions.

Unless something concrete is gotten out of a meeting, the entire effort has been wasted. We must strive for a direct personal contact with every individual in the group by a card or a committment from him. Future meetings will be planned scientifically so that we can come out of that meeting with our purpose accomplished.

At future meetings, it may be possible to turn the meeting over to the various groups represented so that they can fomulate their plans immediately.

A program will be wo here in New York to be taken to the Cleveland Conference, together with pledge cards, forms, literature and all other stationery and supplies.

A list of conservative HYMMESSMAN synagogues will be received from the United Synagogues today.

Re. Community Centers and JWB: The latter organization will receive complete shekel kits from this office, which they will cover by a Special News Memorandum and distribute for us.

Early Monday, an automobile squad will distribute to all of the synagogues ShekeY Receipt books which can be sold during the holiday services.

These synagogues should be sent an average of 100 to 150 books and the mobilization pamaphlet. We shall use the list of conservative synagogues received from the United Synagogues. There will be a covering letter with these distributions.

Bnai Brith in Chicago will be contacted.

We are making good headway with Brith Sholom of Philadelphia.

We are also having excellent results with the Jewish War Veterans. Maxwell Cohen, National Director, has written a letter urging the membership to purchase shekolim and he has also accepted our invitation to luncheon next Thursday. At that time, we are entertaining representatives of the various landstmanshaften and organizations such as the American Jewish Congress, Bna, Brith, Free Sons of Israel, Brith Abraham, Fed. of Palestinian Jews and the United Synagogue of America.

Of The speakers menual will be ready in time for the Cleveland Conference.

The poster was submitted to Jack Cohen and will be ready for distribution on Friday, 4/19/46. We are exploring the possibility of having his shipping clerk or one of our staff mail these posters directly from his factory to affect a saving of time. INDICAN Labels will be prepared in advance to further facilitate this measure.

Brith Sholom of Baltimore has been contacted and they have promised cooperation.

A definite ratio was established of a book for every member and by the middle or end of next week, these books will be in every community in the country. Special delivery will be used to insure their receipt.

Telegrams will be sent on Monday to prod those communities which have not as yet submitted the names of their Shekel Chairmen.

The sale of receipts will be checked means of a double postal card. Every week a different color set will be mailed with a new slogan on which they can return the number of books sold to date.

Weekly report forms are completed.

A Second Shekel Bulletin is being compiled.

A political bulletin will be set up over the weekend.

2,000 of the first suggested speech is being made up for general disgribution throughout the country and a second speech will be prepared for distribution to the speakers.

Postal cards on the Radio programs and announcements will be in the mail on Monday.

Shekel Buttons will be ordered after there is a clarification of the joing slate MENNEMENT situation.

The suggestion to use sound trucks is being investigated.

We will have a schedule for every District meeting in the metropolitan area and we expect district meetings to be held throughout the country because of a directive sent to all of our people.

A directive is to be turned out to indicate the technique to be followed in running street corner meetings.

Instructions are to be issued to all Districts indicating that under no circumstances should they accept an arrangement with the other parties by which blocs of non-members will be distributed exclusively for the follow through by specific parties. Instructions should be sent to our Districts to try to get the complete list of non-members. This is in line with the practice that is being attempted in to be fostered upon the ZOA districts by the other parties in various communities throughout the country.

A series of empty stores might be rented in neighborhoods of Jewish population concentration. The store could has display posters and contain visual education media concerning the shekel campaign and equipped with recording machines that played Yiddish music to attract attention and have recorded messages by our leaders urging the purchase of shekolim, which would be available on the premises.

MINUTES STAFF MEETING- THURSDAY, 4/18/46

Dr. Marks indicated to the staff that the Cleveland Conference on Sunday was an example of a well-run meeting. We secured speakers who will mover many communities and pledges and have activated shekel activity in the Cleveland Districts.

On Monday, packages of shekel receipt books were delivered to all of the synagogues in the metropolitan area.

Special delivery packages of shekel receipt books will go out to all of the Districts which have not as yet received these books.

There has been a general mailing of books to members in the metropolitan area, and we are also sending general mailings to those Districts which desire same.

The programs, program manuals went out to the Presidents and Secretaries of all Districts; Executive Committee members, Administrative Council members and Shekel Chairmen. These were mailed on Monday.

The shekolim are being sent to all paid members and the Registration sheets are being prepared. The envolopes have been delivered in which we will mail shekolim and they are being prepared. Election materials are being prepared.

Additional clerical help is being hired. und

Telegrams will go out today to all Districts which have not as yet

All of the receipt books will go off this week to insure every District's having them in their possession.

We will check with Chicago to ascertain whether they have received their booklets.

Posters will be ready by the end of the week and will be mailed directly from the printers office. There should be one in every synagogue and community center throughout the country.

A kit of shekel information and material, plus a covering letter, will go to every community center in the metropolitan area. Additional will be sent throughout the country. These are also being sent to the Jewish War Veteran Posts and Auxilliary posts with shekel books.

Bulletins have gone out and 150,000 copies of the New Reporter will be mailed this week, this edition devoting a great deal of space to the shekel campaign.

100,000 flyers and Yiddish literature are being delivered today.

Ads must be placed in the Yiddish papers, which are not carrying enough ZOA shekel information.

Flyers can be distributed by hand in Jewish neighborhoods.

Street corner meetings will be limited to Jewish neighborhoods. We must be sure to notify the local precinct that these street corner meetings (and also the sound trucks) are political campaigns and not religious meetings. There would be legal difficulty in case they are not so notified..

Mr. Posy has investigated the possibility of renting stores to use as information centers. The field directors will contact the Districts in these neighborhoods to find Likely locations and to ask for volunteers to man these stores.

We had two radio spots on Sunday.

We have in our possession a list of every synagogue in the country.

We will contact I.J. Caplan to approach the Longines-Wittnauer Watch Co. to inject shekel information in their radioannouncements.

It was suggested that we send shekel information and material under the seal of the Unity Committee, such material to be sent to their mailing list.

A memorandum will be sent Air Mail special delivery to the field directors to arrange tours and district meetings for the speakers in their areas, listing the names of the speaker volunteers.

All of the manuals, such as program and speakers manuals as well as speakers kits will be sent to the speakers.

A weekly follow-up is going out to the communities which have received shekel books reminding them to record with us their sales.

Field directors, Administrative Council and Executive Committee members, and shekel chairmen are receiving all of the literature which is being prepared. These people will be urged to take trips on behalf of the campaign as well as to sell shekolim in their communities.

A page will be taken in the "Sports On Parade" manual to advertise shekel and manual to ampaigns. There will be a booth on the premises with literature and cards which will be distributed.

We will try to include Jewish War Veteran posts on the tours of our speakers.

Dr. Silver will be contacted to ascertain what action will be taken on Brith Sholom of Philadelphia.

STAFF MEETING- April 24th



The entire country has been covered by Shekel Receipt books. A second check is being made to avoid error.

100,000 additional books have been received and will be distributed.

The 11 major cities which are going to have two days of shekel elections will receive another batch of books and material.

The first of the series of shekel sales reports have gone out.

The Mt. Vernon District is receiving an individual mailing of receipt books.

Posters have been mailed throughout the country. An additional batch of posters will be sent to the 11 major cities. A poster will be sent to every JWV post in the country, every synagogue and every Jewish community center.

The Association of Kosher Butchers will receive posters to display in their stores.

The Regional directors will receive the names of non-member shekel payers and they will see that these people are reached to assure their voting.

Another follow-up will be made of those districts that have not submitted the name of their shekel chairman.

The Jewish War Veterans posts are receiving their material and shekel receipt books. They have received a basic letter and are now receiving a letter with shekel books, which are being mailed today. These will be sent Air Mail where distance makes it necessary.

The Young Judaea groups have agreed to stuff letterboxes with shekel material and information.

A staff meeting of the Field men will be called for Monday morning. Intensive plans will be worked out.

A mass distribution is being made on the West Coast. The Southeastern Conference is being arranged. We have had speakers on tour in the Southwest. A man is going into the Midwest and another into the Tri-State Region. There is a conference scheduled for the Seaboard Region.

Every member of the Speakers Bureau have received their complete kit and will receive all the material being mailed. A second speech will be prepared for their use.

The second shekel bulletin has gone oute.

The election pamphlet is being prepared.

Mr. Frisch's article is being reprinted and will be amiled on a mass mailing on Friday.

The staff was instructed to insert a short paragraph or P.S. in every letter to urge the sale of shekolim and themasenments ask support for the ZOA slate.

We shall use the report of the Anglo-American Commission of Inquiry and whatever protest there may be as a form of message with re erence to shekel.

We shall set up our machinery for the establisyment of a women's shekel committee in every district. These can be tied up with the Jewish War Veterans Auxilliary and the other women's groups we have contacted.

Mr. Posy will go to the West Coast.

On Sunday night, there will be acrum of Baai Zion. A member of the staff will be there and posters and material and receipt books will be displayed and distributed.

At the Levy Testimonial Dinner in the Bronx, there will be shekl books and material distributed.

On Monday night, when Dr. Neumann speaks at City Centre, we will have a staff on hand to distribute Shekel materials, receipt books, etc. These shall be placed on each and every one of the chairs.

NATIONWIDE SLOGAN: FOR A JEWISH STATE, VOTE ZOA SLATE!

With barely three weeks remaining until the closing date for the sale of Shekolim (May 24th), ZOA regions and districts throughout the country are giving primary attention to the mass sale of Shekolim amongst all adult members- men and woman - of their local communities. The Shekolim drive is being considerably spurred following the publication of the report of the Anglo-American Commission of Inquiry which accentuated the need of madilizing and consolidating all constructive Jewish forces in

the country to continue the fight for the ultimate objective of the Zionist movement - the establishment of Palestine as a Jewish State - the only permanent solution to the problem of Jewish homelessness. Coupled with the efforts of promoting the largest possible sale of Shekolim by the ZOA, a sense of awareness of the need to secure a large turnout at the polls and in the elections on June 16th - 17th (in small communities on June 16th only) on behalf of the ZOA slate is firmly taking root.

Election of ZOA Leaders.

The success of the ZOA slate in the elections to the World Zionist Congress is taking on crucial significance in the light of the political situation growing out of the report of the Anglo-American Commission of Inquiry. A vote for the ZOA slate signifies support of the ZOA, the foremost Zionist organization in America, which in the past half century has carried the major burden of the movement and raised the major portion of the funds which made possible the phenomenal growth of Jewish Palestine.

Moreover, a vote for the ZOA ticket will signify endorsement of its leadership, headed by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, who have so militantly represented American Zionism to the world, who have consistently championed the maximal Zionist program for the establishment of Palestine as a free and democratic Jewish commonwealth. Furthermore, a vote for the ZOA slate will serve to uphold the hands of the leaders of the Zionist movement of America at the World Zionist Congress.

The forthcoming World Zionist Congress which will meet in Palestine early in August will mark the turning point in the history of our movement. The eyes of the entire world will be focused upon its deliberations. The forthcoming Congress will determine the future political status of Palestine, and formulate plans for the post-war development of Palestine and for the

IDENTIFICATION AT THE POLLS

The following rules governing the voting for delegates will be strictly observed:

- 1. Every Shekel holder who will come to the poles to cast his vote will be required to produce a positive identification. The U.S. Central Shekel Election Board has indicated that the following identifications will be acceptable:
 - a. Selective Service Card
 - b. Drivers or registration License
 - c. Ration Book
 - d. Letters addressed to the voter which appear to be responsible
- 2. Only the holder of the Shekel will be permitted to vote. No duplicate Shekelim will be issued for lost ones.
- Provisions for Absentee voting will be made within the next week.
- 4. All districts which are located near Army camps are urged to set up Shekel boards in the various camps for the benefit of Jewish Servicemen.

National and Fraternal Organizations Join

Amongst the first National organizations to join actively in the sale of ZCA Shekolim was the Women's Division of the American Jewish Congress which, at a meeting of its National Board, voted to support the Shekel program of the ZOA. Miss Milly Brand was named Chairman of its Shekel Committee, according to an announcement by Mrs. A. H. Vixman, Vico-President.

The Brith Sholom of Philadelphia, national fraternal organization headed by Grand Master Alex F. Stanton, and the Brith Sholom of Baltimore are canvassing their entire memberships for the sale of ZCA Shekolim.

Sales of ZOA Shekolim are also being conducted amongst the members of other organizations including the Men's Division of the American Jewish Congress, the Free Sons of Israel, and a large number of landsmanshaften.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Shekel Chairmen and Secretaries are again urged to bring to the attention of all Shekel volunteers that shekel receipt stubs and remittances should be turned over immediately to the districts or to the National ZOA headquarters so that Shekolim may be mailed forthwith to all those who paid for them.

Receipt stubs will not entitle the holder to vote in the elections. Only a shekel will entitle one to cast his vote.

May 24th is closing day for the sale of Shekolim.

Overwhelming Support for the ZOA Slate

The Tri-State region will hold a conference on May 12th at which Dr. Emanuel Neumann, Abraham Goldstein, Hartford and Dr. Sidney Marks will speak.

A vigorous campaign for Shekolim is being waged in Detroit. Rabbi Irving Miller addressed a large rally. Another city-wide shekel rally will be held on May 14th with Dr. Sidney Marks, ZOA Secretary, as speaker.

In Chicago, representatives of some 40 communities from the MidWest held a successful Shekel conference, speakers including Daniel Frisch,
Chairman of the Administrative Council, A. K. Epstein, and Dr. S. Marks.
The entire community is being aroused. Milton Silberman, Chairman of
the Chicago Zionist Organization, is giving direction to the formation
of teams and the enlistment of veterans for the sale of Shekolim. Every

Manny Posy, Director of the Expansion Fund, is visiting Portland, Oregon, and Seattle, Washington, and is continuing his tour down the coast.

In New England the Shekel activity has received considerable impetus under the direction of Louis Brenner. A number of mass rallies have been arranged.

Herman Weisman, Chairman of the Youth Commission, addressed the first meeting in Boston.

Gratifying reports are also being received from the Southeast and Southwest through Adalbert Friedman and Julius Israel, regional directors, respectively.

LET US COUNT OUR LIVING By Rabbi Irving Miller

A sacred duty rests today clearly upon the shoulders of every Zionist and every Jew. The shekel has even wider significance. The shekel antedates even the Zionist Congress. It is linked with sacred tradition. The shekel had a two-fold significance, symbolic and utilitarian. Its symbolic significance was the badge of the unity of our people. Its utilitarian significance derived from the fact that the shekolim replenished the public treasury of the household of Israel.

Building a Home

Our enemies are now attempting to divide us from without and from within in. You may be certain that such an attempt will soon be made from within the Jewish camp itself. But we shall not sell our birthright for any attractive offer made to us. We are not concerned with only building a haven for homeless Jews - we are concerned with building a home for a homeless people. Our test has come. Did not Mr. Bevin give us notice when he said "Zionists on the one hand, and Jews on the other hand"? Our answer must be - "There is no difference between Jews and Zionists." Through the shekel we will demonstrate this sense of unity. Millions of shekolim must be sold in order that millions of Jews may be counted as standing side by side with their brethren in the Yishuv and with their fellow-Jews on the other side whose only hope is Palestine.

The shekel will constitute the source from which we will repair the House of Israel and restore again the lives of our people.

"Pick Up a Torch"

How can we lift up the standard of Israel which today is in the dust? Only by counting the members of the Jewish household, by pointing to every Jew and saying, "Stand up where a Jew has fallen; pick up a torch from the hand of a Jew who dropped it when he was led to his destruction."

The world counts the dead Jews; let us count our living Jews.

Let every one of you go out and count your friends - make them stand up and be counted and after you have sold them a shekel, take them to the polls and ask them to vote for the ZOA ticket. By voting for the ZOA slate in the elections on June 16th-17th, you will make sure that your leadership, headed by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, whom you have identified these many years with the struggle for Eretz Israel, will go forth as your elected representatives with your mandate, fortified by your support, to work at the World Zionist Congress on behalf of our people and for the future of Israel.

AMERICAN JEWRY'S DECISIVE ROLE IN THE WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS

The World Zionist Congress which is to meet this summer, probably in Palestine, will not be in a mood of appeasement. Jewry has suffered too much, actively at the hands of the Nazis and passively, through human indifference, to accept anything less than free, unconditional Jewish immigration into Palestine, and its establishment as a Jewish State as soon as the Jews form a majority of the population. This coming Congress may prove to be of epoch-making importance.

American Jewry, now the largest Jewish community in the world, will have a powerful voice in the decisions of the Congress. Its credentials will be not only its numerical and its economic advantages, but its sense of responsibility towards Jewish Palestine, its willingness to bear burdens in the difficult task of securing for the remnant of European Jewry a highway to Palestine and converting Palestine into Eretz Israel.

With Great Britain no longer in the Balfour Declaration mood, and with the United States public opinion unmistakably pro-Zionist, American Jewry may emerge at the Zionist Congress as the chief cornerstone of Zionist hopes.

American Jews have an opportunity to indicate their own awareness of historic responsibility. The Zionist shekel offers that opportunity. If the million American Jews heretofore unaffiliated with Zionist organizations would purchase the Zionist shekel and thereby indicate basic adherence to the Zionist movement, it would be the incontrovertible proof that the Jews of America are Zionists.

A million new shekel-holders would give the lie to Mr. Bevin's insinuation that Zionists are a group apart from the mainstream of Jewish life. It would discredit the American Council for Judaism in the eyes of the American public. It would strengthen the hands of men in government who wish to forward our program. It would be a well-merited signal to the Jews of Palestine that we stand with them in their valiant resistance to the illegal and immoral White Paper. It would be a heartening token of fellowship and encouragement to the miserably afflicted of our brothers and sisters in Europe who long for salvation in Zion.

Since it speaks for the overwhelming majority of the enrolled Zionists of the country, the Zionist Organization of America expects to send the largest American delegation to the World Zionist Congress. Since it has borne the major responsibility for the building of the Jewish homeland over a period of 45 years, it will play a major role at the Congress in the determination of policies affecting Jewish Palestine and in the choice of leadership of the World Zionist Movement.

The Zionist Organization of America will represent the General Zionists. It is from the ranks of this section of the Zionist movement that Theodor Herzl, Max Nordau, David Wolfssohn, Louis D. The forthcoming World Zionist Congress will meet at the most critical moment in the history of the Jewish people. Who but the insensitive and callous can or will remain indifferent to the issues on which decisions have to be made? Those who would abstain constitute, fortunately, an insignificant minority within Jewry. The action of the American Jewish Conference on the Palestine problem and the recent polls of public opinion are conclusive proof of the dominating Jewish influence in Palestine.

The Zionist movement, as a democracy is comprised of parties and groups reflecting different points of view on the social and spiritual aspects of Jewish life in Palestine. Appeals for support are being made by those of the right and of the left. I am of the opinion, however, that the platform presented by the Zionist Organization of America offers that bridge of unity and an opportunity for that fusion of common effort for Palestine upbuilding which have been so largely responsible for past achievements and which is so indispensable in the present political struggle for the attainment of the Jewish Commonwealth.

It is also of the utmost significance for the future of the Zionist movement that a large ZOA delegation take part in the proceedings of the Congress as a co-ordinating influence and a balance wheel against the partisanships which impede the progress of Zionist ideals.

Since time immemorial the Shekel has been a symbol of Jewish unity and a bond of Jewish fellowship. Today it is an expression of our people's will to survive.

THE WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS MUST BACK RIGHTEOUSNESS WITH FORCE

To write about the major problems of the forthcoming World Zionist Congress is particularly difficult, for we know that in addition to the fortuitous there is the certainty of a report from the "Inquiry Commission"; although we can only guess what it will recommend.

I shall hazard the likelihood of an unfavorable report from the "Inquiry Commission" as part of the background of the Congress. Then what? There can be little debate on the course to be pursued which must be based on the mandate. Every effort to whittle this down must be resisted in both principle and practice. Our position will be morally invincible, but we recognize unfortunately the low level of the international ethos. Ergo, besides asserting our rights we shall in a limited way at least have to fight for them which means an affirmation by the Congress of the Haganah. In the world of today, righteousness falls on deaf ears unless it is supplemented with a degree of force. The fact is that injustice seems to be conceived of as such only when it becomes aggravated enough to produce violence in resisting it. To acquiesce to wrong without physical resistance implies acceptance of evil as if it were good. Adjusted to the present we must, therefore, not only proclaim the injustice of the conduct of Britain, but assert it as well.

A word about an internal problem of the Congress. The destruction of most European Jewries is going to make this Congress like none in the past. The power will be entirely in the hands of the Americans and Palestinians. In order to give this remnant of Europe even a feeble voice in the Congress, it would be well to apply to them the principle used in Palestine of making a shekel sold there of double value. This was done in the case of Palestine in recognition of their comparatively small numerical status vis-a-vis the greater stake they had by being in the land itself. In the case of the decimated European groups their desperate need for Palestine gives them a similar claim which should thus be met. We Americans must decide the problems of the Yishuv not alone by our strength of numbers, but by putting those who live there and those who want to go there on a basis that at the Congress their voices can be effectively heard, and their claims effectively presented.

Here at home it is our urgent duty to sell a maximum number of shekolim. This will be a demonstration of Jewish solidarity. We must always romember that we are a political movement; that we can exhibit our strength most impressively to those in political positions of power by the enrollment of large numbers. The sale of 1,000,000 shekolim would, we may be assured, not go unnoticed by those upon whom the fate of Palestine depends. It ought to be mentioned that as General Zionists it is important that we be well represented. In a Congress in which weighty and difficult decisions will be made, the presence of a large bloc of our group will have a moderating and stabilizing influence. We have always taken the position that our major consideration is to obtain Palestine; that we cannot indulge in the luxury of numerous ideologies, and, thereby attenuate this major effect. This message as never before will be needed at the forthcoming Congress. No group is so well qualified as are we to proclaim it.

We have by now grown somewhat weary of the reiteration of the warning of critical situations so rapidly have they followed one another. Yet the decisions to be made in the next few months may well determine the fate of our people for generations to come. Upon each os us rests the responsibility and to each is afforded the privilege of participation in determining through the next Congress the destiny of Israel.

MAY 24TH CLOSING DATE FOR SHEKEL SALES OPENING DATE OF ZOA ELECTION CAMPAIGN

Friday, May 24th, the closing date for the sale of Shekolim, marks the beginning of the second and most important stage in the ZOA drive for the election of a large delegation to the forthcoming World Zionist Congress.

In a joint communication addressed to all regional and district presidents and shekel chairmen, Jacques Torcyzner, National Shekel Chairman and Dr. Sidney Marks, Executive Director of the ZOA, pointed out the fact that the election of the ZOA slate is entirely dependent upon the number of votes cast. A minority party, although it may have sold one half or one third or even less of the total number of shekolim than sold by the ZOA, can easily lead in the elections if their members come to the polls while our shekel payers stay at home.

Attention is called to the fact that the elections will be by secret ballot that a shekel payer -- man and woman -- regardless of the organization and group through which he or she purchased a shekel is free to cast his or her vote for whatever list he has chosen.

Intensive Campaign of Enlightenment: -

To insure the success of the ZOA slate headed by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, President, all districts and regions are called upon to conduct a most intensive campaign of enlightenment and education between now and election day. To this end it is urgently requested that community-wide rallies be held between now and June 16th with outstanding Zionist personalities as speakers for the purpose of impressing upon every shekel payer -- man and woman -- to come to the polls on election day to cast his or her vote for the ZOA ticket.

The urgency to insure the success of the ZOA ticket is particularly underscored by the present political situation. The election of a majority of ZOA delegates to the Congress will mean the support of its leadership which has so militantly represented American Zionism and championed the maximum Zionist program.

The hands of the leaders of the Zionist movement must be upheld at the World Zionist Congress. American Zionism can best be represented at the Congress through the leaders of American Zionism who will be the ZOA delegates. The ZOA leadership has furthered the political interests of the movement and also its economic interest in Palestine. IMPORTANT INFORMATION TO VOTERS

1. Every voter must bring to the polls the shekel which is his registration certificate together with a means of identification, such as, driver's license, selective service card, ration book or a charge account bearing the signature of the owner, or a veteran's discharge certificate.

Any one of these identifications will be acceptable as well as bonafide letters or bills of public utilities addressed to the voter.

- 2. In communities where there are two or more polling places, the voter may cast his vote at any of these polling stations.
- 3. Only a holder of a shekel will be permitted to vote. No duplicate shekolim will be issued to replace lost ones.
- 4. Shekel boards may be established at any of the army camps for the benefit of Jewish servicemen.

Remember:

The number of ZOA delegates to be elected depends upon the number of votes cast.

Go to the polls! Bring with you all adult members of your family, friends and neighbors -- men and women -- who are shekel holders and ask them to cast their vote for the ZOA slate.

Use your franchise. It is a valuable privilege and sacred duty!

In the following communities election of delegates to the World Zionist Congress will be held on two days -- Sunday, June 16th and Monday, June 17th.

Additional Important Information

No voting will be permitted by mail. No one may vote on behalf of another or of others. Each voter must go to the polling station in person, prove his identity and his right to vote. Each voter will be required to sign the voting register. The ballot is secret.

The local Shekel and Election Board has the right to designate one or more polling stations, as it deems advisable. Polling stations are usually set up at synagogues, Center buildings, Y M H As, etc.

Where there is more than one polling station in a community, the local Shekel and Election Board must prepare an alphabetical list of all the voters in that community and supply each polling station with a complete list. The alphabetical list is made up from the certified lists which will be sent to the local Shekel and Election Board by the U.S. Central Shekel and Election Board.

If a shekel-holder is in a community other than his own on election day, he may go to any polling station and vote by delivering up his shekel, giving his name and address and the name of the city where he is registered, and then casting his ballot. The ballot, the shekel and the name and address of the voter are then deposited in a sealed envelope and forwarded to the U.S. Central Shekel and Election Board for verification and counting.

Philadelphia

David Gubin, chairman of the local Shekel Campaign, reports fine cooperation on the part of the 15 Zionist Districts, the Rabbis of the various congregations and the leaders of many large organizations. A large army of workers has been organized for the Campaign.

Englewood, N. J.

The Englewood Zionist District, under the leadership of its president, Mervin D. Hyman, reports considerable progress in all its activities. The community is in the midst of a concentrated shekel and election campaign under the chairmanship of Nathan Lerner.

Bloomsbury, Pa.

Under the chairmanship of Jack Sloan, the sale of shekolim is proceeding briskly as we approach the deadline of May 24.

Hudson, New York

The Shekel Campaign in Hudson District is being ably headed by William Kline, a life member of the ZOA, who is leaving no stone unturned in the drive to enlist every eligible person in his community as a voter for the ZOA slate.

Pittsburgh, Pa.

An educational campaign, together with an admonition to every member of the Pittsburgh Zionist District to "Go to the polls and vote the ZOA ticket!" has characterized the Shekel Campaign here. Chairman of the Shekel Committee is Oscar Robins

Miami, Fla.

Omaha, Nebraska

A drive to bring the membership total to 1,000 has been announced by Arthur Cohen, president and Al Sophir, membership chairman of the local ZOA District. The membership drive is being conducted in conjunction with a concentrated and all-out Shekel Campaign to bring to the polls every Jew - man and woman - over 18 years of age.

San Francisco

The ZOA of San Francisco is winding up a vigorous Shekel and Election Campaign under the chairmanship of Herman Z. Quittman. A proclamation to the Jews of San Francisco has been issued, calling for support of the ZOA in the forthcoming elections.

A Shekel Mobilization Day on Sunday, May 19th, has been proclaimed by the Zionist Organization of America in preparation for the election of the American delegates to the 22nd World Zionist Congress which convenes this summer for the first time since 1939. The Day also marks the festival of Lag B'Omer which commemorates the fight for national freedom of the Jews 1900 years ago.

The purpose of the Shekel Mobilization is to intensify the sale of the shekel by the ZOA, to every Jewish person over 18, which gives him the privilege of voting in the elections of American delegates to the Congress. House to house canvassing for the sale of shekolim will be conducted in Greater New York and elsewhere. Rallies under ZOA auspices will take place in many communities.

In announcing Shekel Mobilization Day, Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, president of the Zionist Organization of America, recalled that the Festival of Lag B'Omer which falls on May 19th symbolizes the fighting spirit of the Jewish people and honors those valiant Jewish warriors who under Bar Kochba and Rabbi Akiba waged their last fight for national indepence.

"We are in the midst of a similar struggle today for the permanent solution of the problem of Jewish homelessness, but this time we cannot fail", said Dr. Silver. "Millions of American shekel-holders will furish the spiritual armament for a World Zionist Congress which must chart the future of our struggle. Million of American shekel-holders will show to the world a united American Jewry under the Zionist banner. I call upon every Jew to buy a shekel - that ancient device of Jewish census-taking—for only in this way can he stand up and be counted as a defender of our historic and legal right to a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine".

HARRY HERSHFIELD A ZOA SHEKEL-HOLDER

Harry Hershfield, noted comedian, is now the holder of a ZOA (Zionist Organization of America) shekel, which entitles him to vote in the elections this June for delegates to the forthcoming World Zionist Congress.

On his regular Sunday program over radio station WHN, Mr. Hershfield has been urging every Jew - man and woman - to purchase a shekel and "Vote the ZOA Slate for a Jewish State".

"I finally sold myself on the idea", said Mr. Hershfield as he handed over his fifty cents and pocketed his shekel. "But seriously," he added,
"I really didn't need much persuading. I know that the time has come for every Jew who has the lease vestige of conscience to do all he can to help save the remnant of our people in Europe. This activity will help register the support of American Jewry for the Zionist movement and insure a united front at the Congress through a strong General Zionist delegation. The hands of those who have so successfully led the Zionist movement in America must be upheld. Anything less would be a disavowal of our own spokesmen.

We rabbis must convey to our own communities the truth about the coming elections. One false impression must be combatted - the impression that support of the Z.O.A. slate is imcompatible with support of the Histadrut and the Labor movement in Eretz Israel. The Histadrut is a labor federation and not a political party. Those of us who support the Histadrut and the development of a progressive society in Palestine - and which rabbi does not - in no way betray our convictions when we support the Z.O.A. slate. Rather, such support gives priority to our effort to win for Palestine through united action that freedom in which a society founded on Jewish prophetic ideals will be able to develop.

We ask you to aid us in two primary objectives:-

- (1) Sell as many shekolim as possible in the few remaining days during which sale will be permitted (THE SALE ENDS ON MAY 24TH), and
- (2) Get out the vote on June 16th and 17th.

We are enclosing two shekel books, one for each day on which the sale will be legal after you receive this letter. We count on you to sell these shekelim to members of your community who do not already hold them, and who will thus register and secure the right to vote in the Congress elections.

Dear Sirs,

Re: The 22nd Zionist Congress.

Further to the news communicated by cable and through the press, we wish to inform you herewith of the resolution adopted by the Inner Zionist General Council at its session held in Jerusalem on May 28th, by which it was decided, in altering the date previously agreed to, to convene the 22nd Congress in the month of December 1946 in Falestine. The exact date will be announced as soon as possible.

Among the reasons which prompted the General Council in their decision were considerations originating in the general external situation and also some connected with the internal position of the movement, especially in the countries affected by the war. It was hoped that many difficulties at present standing in the way of proper representation of such countries at the Congress would be removed by then.

- 2. Elections: Then convening the Congress originally for the month of August, the General Council adopted a series of emergency measures concerning the "Rules for Election of Delegates" etc. in view of the short time then available for the preparations for the Congress. The reasons which had then justified those extensions have become obsolete by the postponement of the Congress to December 1946, and it has therefore been decided to withdraw and cancel the emergency alterations and to restore the "Rules for Election of Delegates" and the "Regulations concerning the World Election Lists," with all provisions as to date etc. contained in them, to their former validity.
- 3. The text of the resolutions of the Inner Zionist General Council is enclosed with this circular letter.
- 4. Instructions will be issued in a few days regarding the implementation of these resolutions and, in particular, announcing the exact date of the Congress and the dates and periods governing the completion of the Shekel drive and the conduct of the elections.

We invite the cooperation of all Zionists and Zionist bodies in the implementation of the resolution which, though upsetting many arrangements already made, offers, by prolonging the time available for preparations, an opportunity for a substantial increase of the Zionist electorate and for arranging the Congress elections in good order and in an atmosphere ensuring the success of the Congress.

THE ZOA EFFORTS FOR A UNITED SLATE WITH HADASSAH STATEMENT BY ZIONIST ORGANIZATION OF AMERICA

Hadassah has rejected the proposal of the ZOA for a united shekel effort and a joint General Zionist slate of delegates to the World Zionist Congress. The ZOA offered Hadassah parity in the number of delegates to the World Zionist Congress, equal representation on Congress committees. and commissions and proper representation on the Jewish Agency Executive.

The National Board of Hadassah resolved to continue its separate shokel campaign and to present a separate slate at the elections because it wishes to reserve for itself the right to act as an independent political entity at the World Zionist Congress.

This action of the National Board of Hadassah is deeply regretted by the ZOA. There exist no ideological differences between the two organizations to justify such action which will weaken the role which General Zionist delegates should play at the next Zionist Congress.

The Hadassah announced its independent action without any prior consultation with the ZOA. The matter was discussed at a meeting of the National Executive of the ZOA on March 19th, when by unanimous action it was resolved to approach Hadassah and urge upon it the desirability of a joint slate and a joint shekel campaign. A committee representing the ZOA met with representatives of Hadassah on March 24th.

On April 3rd, Rabbi Irving Millor, chairman of the Interim Committee in the absence of Dr. Newmann, addressed a communication to Mrs. Moses P. Epstein, President of Hadassah, reiterating the invitation extended by the National ZOA Executive and urging its acceptance by Hadassah on the ground that ... "a joint ZOA-Hadassah slate of delegates to the next Congress on a parity basis would serve the best interests of our common cause." The

communication further emphasized "the fact that the men and women of other Zionist groups are indeed united, and our membership would find it difficult to understand why we alone among Zionist organizations must conduct separate shekel campaigns and be represented at the Congress by separate delegations."

In response to this invitation, Mrs. Epstein, Hadassah President, in a letter dated April 5th, stated that in addition to parity as to delogates and committees and proper representation on the Executive of the Jewish Agency, Hadassah demanded a free hand to act independently at the Congress and the right to hold its own separate caucuses.

The National Executive of the ZOA considered Mrs. Epstein's proposals at a special meeting on April 11th. This meeting again unanimously registered its conviction that in order for the General Zionist bloc at the Congress to be effective, both Hadassah and the ZOA must work as a unit at the Congress and that action should be determined by majority in accordance with democratic processes. It was pointed out that the ZOA did not ask of Hadassah anything that it was not prepared to do itself.

The offer of the ZOA for a joint effort in the interests of the cause and of General Zionism was brought to the National Hadassah Board in person by Rabbi Irving Miller, head of the Negotiations Committee, who made a strong plea for such unity of effort. Following Rabbi Miller's personal appearance before the Hadassah Board, Mrs. Epstein in a communication dated April 24th, on behalf of Hadassah, reiterated its insistence upon independent political action.

The following communication addressed by Rabbi Irving Miller to the President of Hadassah, sets forth in clear terms the efforts of the ZOA to secure Hadassah's agreement to a joint General Zionist shekel activity and election slate:

April 25th, 1946.

Mrs. Moses P. Epstein, President Hadassah 1819 Broadway New York City

Dear Mrs. Epstein:

Permit me to acknowledge the recept of your letter of April 24th which was submitted to the Inner Committee of the Zionist Organization of America on the same day. Very earnest consideration was given to the contents of your letter. I regret to inform you that the Committee found nothing new in your communication to warrant a change in the position which was taken by the Executive of the ZOA at its meeting on April 11th.

It is clear from your letter of April 24th, as well as from your previous communication of April 5th that while the Hadassah wishes to be assured of parity as to delegates to the forthcoming Zionist Congress, equal representation with the ZOA on all Congress Committees and Commissions and appropriate representation or the Jewish Agency Executive -- all of which the ZOA was prepared to accept -- it also wishes to reserve for itself complete freedom of action at the Congress. It does not wish to be bound by any caucus and no majority vote taken at a caucus of all the delegates which would, of course, include both ZOA and Hadassah on a 50-50 basis, would be binding on Hadassah delegates. Furthermore, Hadassah insists on the right to hold its own separate caucuses at the Congress.

To all intents and purposes Hadassah wishes to act at the Congress as an independent political party. But if Hadassah intends to act independently at the Congress, as if there were no general American Zionist bloc, then a joint slate is meaningless.

You are entirely correct when you state in your letter of April 24th that the point upon which we diverge is that of independent action. This indeed is the crux of the whole matter. The Zionist Organization of America, realizing the importance of a large and effective General American Zionist bloc at the Congress, is urging unity of action and is willing to abide by the decisions of a General American Zionist bloc at the Congress whose rule of prodedure wold be determined by the delegates comprising it.

Hadassah is unwilling to enter into such an arrangement. That being the case, it is quite pointless and would be, I am afraid, most misleading both to the Zionists of America and to General Zionists everywhere to have a joint slate in this country.

May I repeat to you what I have stated in my previous communication that the primary purpose of a joint ZOA Hadassah slate is to send to the Congress a large and well-organized General Zionist bloc which will through concerted action, exercise a decisive influence upon the Congress and the future organization of our movement. If the General Zionists of

nication that the primary purpose of a joint ZOA Hadassah slate is to send to the Congress a large and well-organized General Zionist bloc which will, through concerted action, exercise a decisive influence upon the Congress and the future organization of our movement. If the General Zionists of America are not to be bound by the resolutions of their bloc, if each delegate will act for himself as his spirit moves him, if our two large organizations will each go its separate way whenever their spirits move them, then we shall be as helpless at the forthcoming Congress as we were at all previous Congresses. The ZOA cannot agree to such disintegration which would render us ineffective at the Congress. It is far better for us to go our own way now then be confronted at the Congress with a split in the ranks of General American Zionists with the possibility of Hadassah being played off against the ZOA.

The idea of a General American Zionist bloc working as a unit does not, of course, contemplate binding delegates on matters which involve conscience. No majority can conceivable be rallied at a general Zionist caucus to favor such complusion. However, on all other matters both of policy and procedure. If the general Zionist bloc is to be effective it must work as a unit, and in a democracy it is the majority which determines action. A General American Zionist bloc in which Hadassah would have fifty percent representation would formulate its own rules of procedure and they would be liberal enough, I am sure, to protect the individual delegates in matters which involve conscience, as well as to protect our respective organizations in what they may regard of a special concern to them.

We have asked the Hadassah to do no more than the ZOA is prepared to do, to make no sacrifices -- if one can call coordination of effort and coordinated action, sacrifices -- for the sake of discipline and efficiency that we are not prepared to make. Neither of our organizations would be majorized. Heither could possibly impose its will upon the other.

We regret that Hadassah cannot go along with us in what we believe to be the sound and desirable course for two bodies which have no ideological differences, either political or economic to justify separate slates, and whose common Zionist interests would be best served by united action.

Gentlemen:

We understand that you adopted a rule to the effect that nomination lists submitted in proper time to the Central Shekel and Election Board shall receive consecutive numbers, and the lists shall be published in the order of their numbers.

On May 22nd, at 9:03 A.M., our representatives, Messrs. Charles Stern and Israel Posnansky, filed the list of our party by turning over same to the secretary of the Board, Mr. Abraham Tannenbaum, who issued them a receipt for same.

At the meeting of the Board held on Tuesday, May 28th, our representatives were surprised to hear that Mr. Tannenbaum submitted a report to the effect that the Zionist Organization of America had filed their list on May 22nd at 12:02 A.M., and that the lists of the Poale Zion and the Mizrachi were filed on May 22nd at 12:10 and 12:14 A.M. respectively. At the same meeting our representatives contested the veracity of the said report.

In connection with this matter, we desire to present for your consideration the following points and observations:

(1) The usual business hours of the office begin at 9:00 A.M.

(2) To the best of the knowledge of our representatives on the Shekel Board, no resolution was adopted authorizing the office to be open on May 22nd at midnight for the receiving of lists, and no information to that effect was given to our representatives.

(3) That on May 21, at the meeting, Mr. Posnansky asked Mr. Tannenbaum at what time the office would open the next day

(May 22). He answered, "9 o'clock as usual."

(4) That we are in possession of definite proof that the office was closed May 22 at 12:06 midnight and that no one of the Shekel Board was in the office at that time, or at any time the reafter until 9:00 A.M., when Mr. Tannenbaum came to the office and found our representatives at the door.

(5) It was published in the press that the list of the Zionist Organization of America was nominated at the meeting of the National Zionist Administrative Council held in Washington, subsequent to

May 22nd, to wit Friday, May 24th.

(6) Mr. Tanhanbaum did not inform our representatives on May 23nd at 9:00 A.M., when they delivered our list to him, that the other origanizations had already filed their lists at midnight. In fact, he was utterly surprised, looked quite dismayed, and most reluctantly issued a receipt marking the time 9:03 A.M.

(7) We question the veracity of the statement that the Zionist Organization of America, the Poule Zion and the Mizrachi filed their lists on May 22 at 12:02, 12:10 and 12:14 A.M. respectively.

(8) We demand a thorough investigation of the alleged filing of the lists at the said time. If the Board should refuse to take such action, the Zionist Organization of America, the Poule Zion and the Mizrachi ove it to their own sense of honor to make such an investigation and repudiate the zealousness of their partisans.

It seems to us that in order to defeat the rule hereinabove referred to, according to which our list should have been Number I, some persons connected with the Shekel Board have resorted to the use of improper means.

This action constitutes a reflection on the integrity of the entire Board, and we do not believe that the individual members of the Board, with full knowledge of these facts, will want to make themselves a party to the same. There is a limit to partisunship, and no partisanship should demand the sacrifice of elementary homesty, integrity and honor. We are quite certain that the leaders of the various parties, knowing all of these facts, will refuse to be benefited by actions of a questionable character.

We are sending copies of this letter to Dr. Lauderbach, World Zionist Executive Jerusalem, and to the memors of the Executive in New York, as well as to Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, President of the Z.J.A., Mrs. Moses Epstein, President of the Hadassah, Mr. Leon Gellman, President of the Mizrachi, Mr. David Wortheim, Socretary of the Poale Zion, and the other groups affiliated with the Shekel Board.



ZOA SHEKEL HOLDERS TO GO TO THE FOLLS ON JUNE 30th AND JULY 1st

Two Weeks Postponement Will Not Dampen Enthusiastic Turnout by ZOA Despite Wishful Thinking By Certain Parties

Maneuvering of Poale Zion and Mizrachi To Force Postponement Arouses Great Indignation and Protest

Blame for Postponement Placed Directly Upon Shoulders of Poale Zion and Mizrachi

The tactics employed by the Poale Zion and Mizrachi in forcing a two weeks postponement of the elections to the World Zionist Congress which were scheduled for June 16th has aroused considerable indignation and protest among Zionists throughout the country. Resorting to paltry technicalities by invoking an obscure archaic rule which has not been enforced for the past 48 years, the Poale Zion and Mizrachi announced their intention to abstain from participating in the elections unless their demand for a postponement is acceded to. The truth of the matter is --- and this fact was openly admitted by representatives of the parties --- that the Poale Zion and Mizrachi were not ready to go to the polls fearing that the ZOA ticket will emerge with a sweeping victory.

The original date (June 16th) was set months ahead by unanimous decision of the U.S. Shekel and Election Board in which all parties were represented. In fact the Poale Zion and Mizrachi began the sale of shekolim and electioneering campaign months ahead of the ZOA. In fact the ZOA completed its shekel and election campaign within a brief period of six weeks while other parties were engaged in such campaigning for the past four months.

The Poale Zion and Mizrachi had not expected the ZOA to do such a thorough job. They had not expected such an enthusiastic and magnificent response on the part of the ZOA district leaders and workers. The

Poale Zion and Mizrachi were virtually stunned by the reports they received from their own representatives throughout the country, indicating that the ZOA districts and regions are poised and geared in bringing out the largest vote for the ZOA ticket on June 16th in the history of the movement.

Something had to be done to counteract this spirit which engulfed every community - large and small - and which pointed to overwhelming success for the ZOA at the polls on June 16th.

The postponement of the Congress gave the parties the excuse to try to hold back the rising tide of the ZOA votes.

Majority Floated

made it clear that the setting of the date of elections is within the province of the U.S. Shekel Board and that they will not interfere in this issue. The U.S. Shekel Board by a majority reaffirmed its decision to hold the elections on June 16th. The Poale Zion and Mizrachi, which have all the years proclaimed their love for democratic procedure, nevertheless, found it expedient to repudiate the majority and to announce their non-participation in the elections unless their demand is acceded to by the majority. Thus, the ZOA and Hadassah, representing a majority force in the movement have been reduced again to a minority status by the tactics of the minority parties.

The position of the ZOA has been repeatedly presented by Dr. Abba Hillel Silver who declared that any postponement of the elections at this late date would cause serious confusion and additional expense later on and would needlessly prolong electioneering and partisan controversy at a time when Zionist energies must be directed to our great political tasks.

At a special meeting of the National ZOA Executive Committee, members from all parts of the country voiced their vigorous protest and indigna-

tion at the tactics adopted by the parties to force the postponement at this late date and interpreted such tactics as a maneuver to dampen the spirit of the ZOA electorate, who have been keyed up to go to the polls on the original date.

Maneuver Will Not Work

At the same time while agreeing to the postponement under duress, for the sake of the good name of the movement and unity, the ZOA membership made it clear that they are more determined than ever not to permit themselves to be outmaneuvered and to urge with all their strength upon the ZOA electorate in every nook and corner in the country to hold themselves in readiness and to go to the polls on the postponed date, namely, on Sunday, June 30th and in larger communities on June 30th and July 1st.

We state these facts in order that you may convey to your constituency the true reasons behind the forcing of the postponement of the elections and to place the blame where it belongs.

You, as the leaders of our movement in your community, have a great and solemn obligation to continue your election efforts in an unabated tempo. We know that you will even step up and accelarate your efforts to prevail upon every shekel holder -- man and woman -- to go to the polls on Sunday June 30th (in larger communities also on July 1st) to vote the ZOA slate for a Jewish State.

Beria's Attack

The dastardly and vulgar attack of Mr. Bevin upon the Jewish people makes a large turnout at the polls of transcendent, historic significance. Every vote cast will be a demonstration of our unswerving datermination to fight for free inmigration, free land sales, and a Jowish state. THE POSTPONEMENT OF THE ELECTIONS TO THE

WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS

A statement by the Zionist Organization of America

- (1) Our representatives in the National She el and Election Board yielding to pressure by certain parties and their threat to boycott the elections set for June 16th, agreed to a postponement of the elections to June 30th and voted accordingly. But we cannot pass over this painful incident without an expression of protest and making our position absolutely clear to our constituents and to all concerned.
- (2) Never before in the history of American Zionism has such a situation been created. After the date of the elections had been determined months in advance by the National Shekel and Elections Board, with the consent of all parties, after all preparations had been made, both nationally and locally throughout the country, at a great cost of precious Zionist energy and money, certain groups took it upon themselves to withdrew from the elections on the ground of technicalities. Flouting the majority decision of the Shekel and Election Board, they published a declaration that "No official and legal elections will take place on June 16th", thereby sowing confusion in the minds of large numbers of qualified voters.
- (3) We declare that all the parties and groups had exactly the same opportunity to prepare for the elections and none were placed at any disadvantage. We further declare that the technicalities seized upon as

an excuse for demanding postponement were obviously nothing more than a flimsy and transparent excuse for imposing the will of the minority upon the majority.

- (4) For weeks past unceasing propaganda was carried on by word of mouth calculated to create doubt as to whether the elections regularly and legally scheduled, would take place. At the same time we were under constant pressure to make a "deal" on the distribution of mandates to the various parties and cancel the elections. We steadily resisted all these efforts to undermine the elections. We firmly adhered to the view that it was contrary to political morality and to the interest of the movement to deny the hundreds of thousands to whom shekolim were sold, the right and the opportunity to exercise the privilege of voting which they had thus acquired. We honestly believed that after the passage of nine years since elections were last held in this country, it was necessary to give renewed vigor and vitality to the democratic principles and processes on which the World Zionist Organization is based; and we feared the hurt that would be caused to the movement by a refusal to proceed with the democratic elections as promised.
- (5) Since the efforts to postpone the elections or to force a "deal" were made long before the technical legal points were raised, it is impossible to escape the conclusion that the real reason for these efforts was a fear or knowledge on the part of certain groups that the elections' results would not be favorable to them. They evidently desired to secure partisan advantage either by gaining time or by negotiations.
- (6) Such tactics are inadmissible from the Zionist point of view. No Zionist party should pursue its partisan interest to such an extent, especially

at this critical juncture, and in the light of the political situation confronting us. No party has a moral right to plunge the movement into confusion and precipitate an internal "crisis" for the sake of gaining a few extra delegates to the Congress. The damage to the cause is out of all proportion to the partisan advantage which it was hoped to gain.

- (7) The Zionist Organization of America has yielded most reluctantly in order to avoid further bickerings and public scandal. We still regard the postponement as most unfortunate because it needlessly prolongs the interparty struggle in the midst of a serious political crisis for our movement. Moreover, this postponement inflicts a great hardship and a further strain upon our districts, workers and committees throughout the country. It diverts their energies from other urgent Zionist tasks. But we will not shrink from the burden which has been imposed upon us and are calling upon our loyal and devoted fellow-Zionist everywhere to make all the necessary readjustments and proceed with the elections on June 30th.
- (8) We deeply regret and deplore the great inconvenience involved and the next tax upon the strength and energies of all concerned; but it is clear that the responsibility rests upon those who created this internal "crisis" with so little regard for the general political situation and without an adequate sense of proportion and relative values. It will be our purpose in the future, to seek ways and means of preventing any possible recurrence of such a painful experience. Party interests must not be permitted to inflict harm upon the movement as a whole.

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THE ZOA EFFORTS FOR A UNITED SLATE WITH HADASSAH STATEMENT BY ZIONIST ORGANIZATION OF AMERICA

Hadassah has rejected the proposal of the ZOA for a united shekel effort and a joint General Zionist slate of delegates to the World Zionist Congress. The ZOA offered Hadassah parity in the number of delegates to the World Zionist Congress, equal representation on Congress committees. and commissions and proper representation on the Jewish Agency Executive.

The National Board of Hadassah resolved to continue its separate shekel campaign and to present a separate slate at the elections because it wishes to reserve for itself the right to act as an independent political entity at the World Zionist Congress.

This action of the National Board of Hadassah is doeply regretted by the ZOA. There exist no ideological differences between the two organizations to justify such action which will weaken the role which General Zionist delegates should play at the next Zionist Congress.

The Hadassah announced its independent action without any prior consultation with the ZOA. The matter was discussed at a meeting of the National Executive of the ZOA on March 19th, when by unanimous action it was resolved to approach Hadassah and urge upon it the desirability of a joint slate and a joint shekel campaign. A committee representing the ZOA met with representatives of Hadassah on March 24th.

On April 3rd, Rabbi Irving Miller, chairman of the Interim Committee in the absence of Dr. Newmann, addressed a communication to Mrs. Moses P. Epstein, President of Hadassah, reiterating the invitation extended by the National ZOA Executive and urging its acceptance by Hadassah on the ground that ... "a joint ZOA-Hadassah slate of delegates to the next Congress on a parity basis would serve the best interests of our common cause." The

communication further emphasized "the fact that the men and women of other Zionist groups are indeed united, and our membership would find it difficult to understand why we alone among Zionist organizations must conduct separate shekel campaigns and be represented at the Congress by separate delegations."

In response to this invitation, Mrs. Epstein, Hadassah President, in a letter dated April 5th, stated that in addition to parity as to delogates and committees and proper representation on the Executive of the Jewish Agency, Hadassah demanded a free hand to act independently at the Congress and the right to hold its own separate caucuses.

The National Executive of the ZOA considered Mrs. Epstein's proposals at a special meeting on April 11th. This meeting again unanimously registered its conviction that in order for the General Zionist bloc at the Congress to be effective, both Hadassah and the ZOA must work as a unit at the Congress and that action should be determined by majority in accordance with democratic processes. It was pointed out that the ZOA did not ask of Hadassah anything that it was not prepared to do itself.

The offer of the ZOA for a joint effort in the interests of the cause and of General Zionism was brought to the National Hadassah Board in person by Rabbi Irving Miller, head of the Negotiations Committee, who made a strong plea for such unity of effort. Following Rabbi Miller's personal appearance before the Hadassah Board, Mrs. Epstein in a communication dated April 24th, on behalf of Hadassah, reiterated its insistence upon independent political action.

The following communication addressed by Rabbi Irving Miller to the President of Hadassah, sets forth in clear terms the efforts of the ZOA to secure Hadassah's agreement to a joint General Zionist shekel activity and election slate:

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

ZOA AGREES TO ELECTION POSTPONEMENT UNDER PROTEST

New York -- The National Executive Committee of the Zionist Organization of America held a special session last night in New York to consider the situation created by the ultimatum presented by other parties to abstain from participating in the elections to the World Zionist Congress next Sunday, June 16th, unless their demand for postponement is acceded to. Representatives from all parts of the country in attendance registered their vigorous protest against these tactics by the parties in resorting to technicalities for the purpose of forcing postponement to suit their election purposes. They reported that in keeping with the majority decision of the United States Central Shekel and Election Board to hold the elections on June 16, considerable effort and expenditures have been invested in prepartions for elections and that the machinery in all communities has been set up to bring all Zionist voters to the polls.

It was reported that for weeks past certain parties had repeatedly tried, by various means, to bring about cancellation of the elections. These parties evidently feared that they would not do well in the elections but the ZOA leaders had steadily insisted upon carrying out democratic elections in accordance with the Constitution of the World Zionist Organization and the instructions of the World Executive. Surprise and resentment were expressed that certain parties who constantly claimed to be speaking for the democratic masses were desperately trying to avoid democratic elections which would give the masses the chance to express themselves at the polls.

Speakers maintained the postponement of elections which have been publicly announced in the press over a lengthy period of time, will cause considerable resentment amongst Zionists and will serve as a let-down. Such reports were rendered by I. R. Goodman of St. Louis, Abraham Goldstein of Hartford, Louis Falk for the state of New Jersey, Sol Cohen for Long Island, Marcus Abramson of the Bronx, Albert Schanzer and David Spiegel of Brooklyn, and others.

Dr. Emanuel Neumann analyzed the unprecedented situation which had been created by the minority parties and the difficulty at this late date of recalling the elections set for next Sunday, even if it was desired to

WHY THE ZIONIST ELECTIONS WERE POSTPONED

By Carl Alpert

I think the Zionists of America are entitled to know the REAL REASONS for the postponement of the Zionist Congress elections, originally scheduled to be held on June 16th, and now delayed until June 30th. Everybody is going to offer a different explanation, and there will certainly be some who will seek to show that the delay is beneficial.

Postponement was NOT for the best interests of Zionism. Jews the country over, irrespective of the group or party to which they belonged, had been told to prepare to go to the polls on June 16 and express their preferences in democratic fashion. Broadsides, advertisements, speakers, campaign propaganda in every shape and form emanated from the national offices of all Zionist groups, and excitement reached fever pitch in many communities.

Then suddenly, on only four days' notice, the whole thing was called off, the vast voting machinery was halted, the brakes put on, the date postponed for two weeks. A few party leaders sitting in their offices in New York may have found it easy to force this decision by threats of boycott, but it came as a terrific blow to Zionists in the field, to those who are engaged in the day to day work of getting members, raising funds, promoting Zionist activity, again, irrespective of party affiliation.

It is about time that these party leaders learned that the enthusiasm of the average Zionist-in-the-street can not be systematically roused, developed to climatic pitch, and then abruptly turned off like a water spigot. It's time they learned that the great mass of General Zionists should not be trifled with.

I find it difficult to restrain my indignation in the face of this flagrant disregard of the Zionist rank and file, this thoughtlessness of what the preelection period has meant to him in terms of organization, effort, energy, nervous wear and tear, and expenditure of funds, particularly because I know how NEEDLESS
THIS POSTPONEMENT WAS.

THESE ARE THE FACTS.

The June 16th date was set in March, over three wonths ago, and all perties areed unanimously that it was the best date, prior to the inevitable summer slack. When the World Zionist Congress was pertiponed until December the question of deforming the elections was raised at the U.S. Central Shekel Board by the Revisionists, but all the other parties felt that too much money, time and effort had already been devoted to preparing for June 16th, and that postponement would mean a needless waste of additional funds and energy. The election date was unchanged.

NOT UNTIL JUNE 11 - one week before election day - was the bombshell burst, when the Poale Zion, supported by the Mizrachi, asked the U.S. Central Shekel Board to delay elections for another two weeks. The trivial technicality offered as reason for the delay was such an insult to the intelligence, that a Poale Zion spokesman blandly admitted he stood on the technicality merely on legal grounds, but that the real reason was that his group wanted additional time to prepare for the elections. Similar admission was made by the Mizrachi.

The Z.O.A. and Hadassch representatives argued reasonably that delay would serve needlessly to prolong the pre-election controversy, which was already approaching the stage of bitterness; that more than three months had been available to all groups for their "electioneering"; that the June 30 - July 1st dates would find many voters away from the city and at summer resorts where they would have no access to polling places; that all the publicity and preparation had been designed to culminate on June 16th; that delay would place a strain and hardship upon the Zionists in the field; and that Zionist energies were badly needed in more constructive Zionist work.

In view of these powerful arguments the Central Shekel Board decided, by a majority, to proceed with the elections as scheduled. Thereupon the Poale Zion and Mizrachi announced that they would refuse to recognize the legality of the elections, and would instruct their party members to abstain from voting. This they did, immediately giving rise to a flood of rumors, and creating a state of

uncertainty and confusion which doubtless bewildered every Zionist in the country.

It would have been perfectly legal and proper for the Z.O.A. and Hadassah to proceed with the elections, even without the smaller parties. I wish they had. I believe they should have. But the Z.O.A. was confronted with an admittedly difficult situation. There were threats that party members holding ballot forms, as officers of local Shekel boards, would not release them for voting. There was desper that scuffles might ensue at the polls. It was also obvious that the Poale Zion would appeal the validity of the election to the Labor-dominated World Zionist Executive, where they were sure of a very sympathetic hearing. It was a case of political blackmail. It was a case of placing party interests paramount, irrespective of the effects on the movement as a whole. It was a case of a minority effectively gagging a majority by threat. It was a clear case of the WAIVING OF

The Z.O.A. finally yielded and reluctantly agreed to the two weeks' postponement, under duress.

As I write this it has been decided to vote on June 30th. I can't help wondering what other tricks shrewd party leaders may have up their sleeve by which to outsmart the General Zionists once more, and whether they won't leave the Z.O.A. and Hadassah holding the bag after all.

What they're betting on, of course, is either that the General Zionists will have gone off on their vacations in large numbers and will fail to vote at all, or else that the Z.O.A. and Hadassah leadership can be bludgeoned or intimidated into entering a pre-election inter-party agreement, under pressure, for apportionment of the Congress delegation among the parties, and thus make an election completely unnecessary.

I wish the elections had been held on June 16th. Now that they are postponed, I hope they WILL BE HELD, and that every Shekel holder will go to the polls and cast his vote. And when he votes I hope he will bear in mind this outrageous intimidation, this trifling with Zionist democracy, this willingness to jeopardize the strength and unity of our sacred Zionist cause for selfish, partisan advantage.

THE FACTS BEAIND POSTPONEMENT OF THE ZIONIST CONGRESS ELECTION

At a meeting of the United States Central Shekel and Election Board, held in New York over three months ago, it was unanimously decided to hold Shekel elections for the World Ziouist Congress on Sunday, June 16, and Monday, June 17. All parties were fully represented at this meeting, and none made objection to these dates.

Immediate announcement of the dates was made, and all parties directed their efforts and energies, first to promoting the sale of Shekels, and then, increasingly, to urging Shekel holders to vote for one or another of the lists offered on the ballot.

Upon receipt of word from Jerusalem that the Zionist Congress had been postponed until December, the representative of the Jewish State Party (Revisionists) on the Central Shekel Board requested that the date of the elections be postponed until the fall. This suggestion was rejected by the Board, and all parties continued their campaign and publicity activity, seeking to stimulate increased support at the polls.

On Sunday, June 9, one week before the date set for holding the elections, the Shekel Board representatives of the Poale Zion suddenly requested postponement of the elections for two weeks on the grounds that there had been a technical infraction of the regulations. But it was made unmistakably clear, that the objections raised by the Poale Zion, supported by Mizrachi, were notivated by a desire to serve the best interests of their parties, and that they were utilizing the admittedly technical objection as a means of gaining more time to improve their chances.

After considerable discussion the vote was taken, and the Central Shekel Board decided by a majority, Hadassah representatives siding with the Z.O.A., that the elections should NOT be postponed, but should be held on June 16th as scheduled.

Thereupon the two parties, Poale Zion and Mizrachi, announced that they would abstain from participating in the elections, and issued instructions to their constituents accordingly.

With less than a week before election date, the National Executive Board of the Z.O.A. met on June 11 to consider how the best interests of the movement could be served in view of the ensuing confusion. Though there was every legal justification for proceeding with the elections on June 16, it was the considered opinion of the leaders of the Z.O.A. that nothing further should be done which might injure Zionist unity, or provoke additional dissension and divisiveness. It was therefore decided to yield to the pressure brought by Poale Zion and Mizrachi, and to agree to postponement of the elections, even though such delay would mean tying up constructive Zionist activity for two more weeks, and prolonging the campaign period, which had already been so expensive to all parties, in both means and energy.

The Central Shekel Board met on June 12, reconsidered the postponement in view of the Z.O.A. action, and decided to advance the election date to June 30. The Z.O.A. voted with Poale Zion and Mizrachi for such postponement. Hadassah refrained from voting, making it clear that they wished the elections held on the date originally set.

It is the dispassionate judgment of many observers that the sudden objection of the parties to the helding of elections on June 16 stems from revelation of the total Shekel sales by the groups participating. Those totals indicated that the Zionist Organization of America, with 322,204 Shekels, was note than 80,000 ahead of the Poale Zion. An additional 247,634 Hadassah Shekels gave the General Zionists such an overwhelming majority that it was clear how the elections would result, allowing even for considerable possible deviation in the actual voting.

More than one Poale Zion member has been heard to observe that postponement tould serve to injure the voting machinery of the Z.O.A., which had been primed and prepared to produce a maximum vote on June 16th, and that a delayed election, as far as the Z.O.A. was concerned, would be anti-climactical.

Deep and bitter resentment has been aroused in every part of the country at the unfair and undemocratic tactics which have thus prolonged the campaign period two weeks unnecessarily, at a time when Zionist activity and effort should be devoted to other, more vital tasks. There are indications that this indignation will manifest itself in a sweeping and overwhelming vote for the Z.O.A. which emerges from the sorry business as the only American Zionist group whose primary consideration and concern is the welfare of the Zionist movement as a whole.

The personal smear campaign launched by the Poale Zion in paid ads in the Yiddish press last Sunday against Dr. Abba Hillel Silver has evoked a wave of indignation and protest among Zionists throughout the country. Stooping to a violent outburst which cannot be excused even by the heat of election campaigning, the Poale Zion have charged the leader of the Zionist movement in this country with sabotage, all because Dr. Silver is adhering to the democratic principle of permitting the million shekel holders in this country to go to the polls and cast their votes for the delegates of their choice.

The shameful personal attack of the Poale Zion has aroused an extraordinary degree of resentment which is reflected in the numerous telegrams and
messages of protest that have swemped the national headquarters of the ZOA
from all parts of the country. It is ironic that this venemous attack should
emanate from the Poale Zion which have been proclaiming their love for
democracy and democratic procedure. Their repudiation of a majority vote of
the National Shekel and Election Board against postponing the elections from
June 16th, their threat to boycott the elections unless their demand for
postponement was acceded to, and their present attack upon Dr. Silver for
insisting that the voters be given the right to express their will at the
polls on June 30th, is indeed a travesty on their claim to democracy.

-2-It is a matter of deepest regret that at this critical juncture, in their misguided effort to catch votes, the Poale Zion should resort to such a venemous personal attack upon Dr. Silver who is the universally recognized leader of American Zionism. The deep sense of resentment felt by Zionists was voiced by delegates at various Zionist conferences held during the week-end in different parts of the country, including the Annual Conference of the Ohio Valley Region in Dayton, the Long Island Zionist Regional Conference held in Long Beach, L. I., and at the annual convention of the Order Sons of Zion in Asbury Park, N. J. VOICE OF EUROPEAN JEWRY The voice of European Jewry joining in protest was also heard in a strongly worded statement issued by Samuel Segal, national secretary of the Zionist Organization of France, on the eve of his return to Paris last Sunday. Mr. Segal declared that the attack of the Poale Zion upon the person of Dr. Silver will be received with great dismay and indignation by European Jews, particularly in Displaced Persons Camps where the name of Dr. Silver is highly revered for his militant stand and leadership to rescue surviving European Jews through their settlement in Palestine. Mr. Segal added that the Poale Zion attack is reminiscent of the tactics employed by the Poale Zion in Europe in their effort to besmirch American Zionist leadership in the eyes of European Jewry and of the Yishuv in Palestine. Why is Dr. Silver for the holding of democratic elections and why does he want the people to be given a voice in the election of the slate of delegates of their choice? Here are the reasons: 1) For the past eleven years, the Jewish masses have not been given opportunity to cast their votes for delegates to the World Zionist Congress. They must not be denied this privilege. 2) Free democratic elections are the very foundation of the Zionist

movement and it is harmful and dangerous to deprive Zionists of their right;

- 3) By going to the polls, Zionists will exercise their franchise and manifest their interest in the movement. Democratic elections are the highest expression of human organization and cooperation.
- 4) The political crisis in Palestine does not constitute any valid argument against elections. In Palestine itself, elections to the Congress will be held. America successfully conducted its national election for president in the midst of a world war.
- 5) For four months the Jewish public has been aroused and urged to purchase their shekel and go to the polls. It will be a mockery of the franchise were the elections shelved by a few party leaders, sitting in a smoke-filled room who would settle the representation of American Jews at the Zionist Congress without the direct participation of the masses. Such a procedure will forfeit the confidence of the masses in our leadership and organization.
- 6) To call off the elections at this late date after the whole country has been prepared and organized would expose the movement to scorn and ridicule and arouse justified resentment from hundreds of thousands of shekel payers who would be denied the right to vote.

It is clear that having no real issue with which to oppose the ZOA ticket headed by Dr. Silver, the Poale Zion are now trying to create incitement over false issues which have nothing to do with the issues of world Zionism in these critical and fateful days.

Months ago when the campaign first started, the Poale Zion tried to instigate feeling against the leaders of American Zionism, calling such leaders as Dr. Emanuel Neumann and others "reactionaries", "fascists" and "enemies of labor". These charges fell flat and failed completely because the masses of American Zionists treated these accusations with the scorn they deserved.

The Ponle Zion became genuinely frightened beginning May 24th when the

results of the shekel sales were announced. They were dismayed to find that the General Zionists - the ZOA and Hadassah - had to their credit approximately 600,000 shekolim, about twice as many as all other parties combined.

From that moment, the Poale Zion began to concentrate all their efforts and energies on one objective: to prevent democratic elections - to avoid the test of a decision at the polls.

Fearful of the rising strength of the Zionist Organization and the immense personal popularity of its leader, Dr. Silver, they seized upon every excuse, tactic, technicality and stratagem to prevent democratic elections ever since the shekolim were counted.

DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING TO CHANCE!

The Poale Zion and the other tickets are banking on the possibility that the ZOA membership and shekel holders will stay at home or leave town on the day of elections. This is wishful thinking. ABBA HILLEL SILVER FROM ZOA REGIONAL CHAIRMEN Dear Dr. Silver: As the elections approach we wish to assure you for ourselves and co-workers, that no effort is being spared to insure a victory at the polls for the ZOA. We are fully cognizant of the historic importance of the forthcoming Zionist Congress and of the role which American Zionism is called upon to play in these tragic times on behalf of our martyred people. Time and again, you, Dr. Silver, have called upon us to relly our forces in defense of Zionism and the Yishuv. Time and again you have called upon us all to pour out our strength, to mobilize our moral, political and financial resources for the upbuilding of Palestine and the victory of the Zionist ideal. We responded to your appeals. Our constituents and followers, some 200,000 strong have never failed in their duties. True to our convictions as General Zionists we have never pursued a narrow partisan line. We have cooperated with all groups and parties. Our districts and members have repeatedly given generous support to innumerable projects and activities sponsored by other parties as long as they appeared to be useful and constructive. We are not partisans and we are confident that our organization will never be dominated by a partisan spirit. However, the course of the Shekel and Election Campaign has revealed certain disturbing tendencies which bovo startled many of our people in our respective communities. Despite the fact that the ZOA has carried the benner of Zionism in the United States for nearly half a century, despite its glorious record of achievement, despite the fact that it is the driving force behind all important Zionist activities both financial and political, we note a deliberate attempt to belittle it and to deprive it of that influence in the movement which it has richly earned. Even from quarters which have constantly appealed to us for help and cooperation, year in and year out, we are suddenly subjected to a propaganda campaign designed to reduce our great organization from its position of leadership on the American Zionist scene. False issues and irrelevant ideologies are dragged in with the object of deflecting votes from the ZOA slate, for the aggrandizement of small parties whose contribution to the total effort of American Zionism is relatively small. By a loud publicity campaign an attempt is being made to inflate such groups out of all proportion to their true strength throughout the country. Neither we nor our membership and sympathizers will be misled by this party propaganda. At this critical moment, when the Jewish people is engaged in a life and death struggle for its national future, American Zionists are not and will not be concerned with party ideologies. They are concerned exclusively with two major tasks: (1) Large scale financial assistance for the practical upbuilding of a Jewish National Home. The political struggle for free Jewish immigration and a Jewish Commonwealth.

We regard the introduction of all other issues as being irrelevant and untimely and tending to weaken the effectiveness of our united Zionist effort. Whether the Yishuv should develop on Socialist lines or in keeping with Orthodox Judaism, or will develop other patterns of social and religious life is not the question now before us. And it is no service to the cause to project these questions into the forefront of Zionist discussions. The whole future of Palestine is at stake. That and nothing else is the great problem which confronts and unites us all and that must remain our paramount concern until the present crisis is safely behind us.

We are confident that the most far-sighted men of all parties must understand the importance and necessity of maintaining the strength and prestige for the Zionist Organization of America at this time. It has the chief responsibility for the success of our fund-raising efforts, for the Keren Kayemeth and Keren Hayesod, and United Palestine Appeal. It also has the chief responsibility for carrying on our political struggle. If it has these responsibilities it must also have the moral and political authority, without which it cannot continue to exercise effective leadership.

Because of these considerations we wish to assure you, Dr. Silver, of our determination to leave no stone unturned to secure an overwhelmingly large vote for the ZOA ticket in the coming elections. The ZOA has a right to ask the Zionist voters of America for a vote of confidence in itself, its policies and its leadership. We have every reason to believe that such a vote of confidence will be forthcoming.

ZIONIST SELF-SABOTAGE

A Guide for Zionists in the Shekel Elections
By CARL ALPERT

Out of the confusion of inter-party conflict which has needlessly marked the election campaigns for the World Zionist Congress, it is possible to discern a definite pattern into which many of the arguments and controversies have fallen. There is emerging a clarification of certain questions which, though not pertinent to the election itself, or to the major election issue, that of Zionist political action in the international arena, are nevertheless of interest and importance. Challenging as they do the very basis of the relationship between American Jews and Palestine, it is well that they be discussed openly and frankly, and free from the coloration of the campaign spirit.

The first question: To what extent should world Jewry meddle in the internal affairs of the Yishuv?

Second question: Do American Zionists expect any special privileges in the movement by virtue of their contribution of the major part of the funds?

In view of the reckless partisan accusations which have been made against the Z.O.A. in some quarters with respect to these questions, the time has come for laying at rest some of the misapprehensions which are harbored, and some of the canards which have been deliberately broadcast.

No reasonable American Zionist can even for a moment question the complete freedom of the Yishuv in the administration of its internal affairs. The trend has steadily been for agencies and institutions of Jewish Palestine to assume more and more of the functions of a state, acting on their own, with no supervision, interference or guidance of any kind from abroad. If our goal is the establishment of the Jewish

Commonwealth, we should certainly want to see this trend accelerated.

Conceivably the day may come when the Yishuv will proclaim its complete independence of the rest of the Galut, and repudiate all interest, proprietary or benevolent, which the World Zionist Organization manifests in it, save only a cultural link. Such is not yet the case. There is not an element in Jewish Palestine today which does not recognize the need for political action on an international scale to bring about the desired ends, and the vital role which American Jewry must play in helping to attain those ends. The Yishuv issues frequent and urgent calls for such American support, for more and still more American participation in the necessary work for the consummation of the Zionist ideal.

It is necessary to repeat these truisms because in recent months, motivated of course by the Congress elections, there has been stimulated, in Europe and in Palestine, an "anti-American" sentiment, tinctured with a "class warfare", intended to create the impression that American Zionists (meaning the Z.O.A.) and the American leadership (meaning Dr. Silver) are intent upon some sinister plot to seize control of the World Zionist Organization, and to liquidate or weaken labor agencies in Palestine.

Peculiarly, these thoughts have been repeated in this country by small but intense Zionist groups which suddenly disassociate themselves from the rest of American Zionism when it becomes thus fashionable to belittle the movement in this country.

So flagrantly were these charges made in Palestine that some responsible Labor elements felt called upon to warn of the danger in thus fomenting discord between America and the Yishuv where none exists. Ha-Oved Hatzioni, organ of the General Zionist labor block in the Histadruth, spoke out bluntly on the "American" issue:

"Zionist parties, large and small, leftist and rightist, must recognize this elementary truth: the center of influence of the Zionist movement is passing, if not in its entirety, at least in major part, to America. One does not find in American Zionism a movement hostile to Labor and its achievements: on the contrary, it is a complete partner for Zionist creativity and effort. It is the privilege of American Zionism not to follow blindly everything which is done in Palestine, and merely to assume the worry of Zionist collections. American Zionism should be free with its comments and its criticism and its efforts, and should demand full participation both in the realization of Zionism and in the bearing of the responsibility for our constructive work."

This plain speaking from a Labor group in Palestine, which was re-printed with approval in the influential daily, Haaretz, represents more accurately, perhaps, the attitude of the mass of workers in Palestine toward American Zionists, than the expressions of some of the groups in this country which, though loyal and devoted Zionists, often prefer to stand apart from the totality of American Zionism, and assume the martyred role of a minority group. And from this perspective they criticize and belittle everything that the Z.O.A. does and questions the motives of its lenders as though some superior wisdom had been conferred upon the party, and some special pipe-line gave them an insight into the life and thoughts and needs of the Yishuv which was not vouch-safed to the General Zionists.

Not a single instance can be found on record where the Z.O.A.
has, directly or indirectly, sought to influence the direction in which
the internal social, political or economic views of the Yishuv should be
directed. Those are questions which, General Zionist leaders in America
have always felt, are to be determined only by the Yishuv itself.

Members of the Z.O.A., themselves partial to various points of view,
have sought to utilize their power and influence only for the attainment
of the basic goal, and have left to the Jews of Palestine any decisions
with regard to the social or economic patterns which should develop there.

On the other hand, it might be pointed out, when a party
like the Poale Zion in this country campaigns on a strictly labor
platform, seeks to elect only labor delegates to the Congress, and
carries on other political and fund-raising activities which are
strictly partisan in nature, they are endeavoring to intervene in
internal affairs of the Yishuv, and seeking to bring influence to bear,
from these shores, on the social or economic determination of the Yishuv.

To be sure, Poale Zion members here may deem their views to be superior, or necessary, but that is for the Yishuv, and not for them to decide. Thousands of Z.O.A. members defer to no one in their whole-hearted support of the principles of economic social justice for which Labor stands in Palestine, but as Zionists they can not place their devotion to the movement as a whole in second place to any partisan ideology which is itself but part of the movement. The Z.O.A. has confidence in the integrity of the 650,000 free citizens of a Jewish Palestine and in their ability to choose that way of life which they want to live. In those decisions the Yishuv will find approval and support from American General Zionists.

One more important fact should be pointed out. It has been customary in the past for minority parties to cast aspersions upon the quality of American General Zionism, and to charge that Zionists here were interested only in contributing funds, but not in assuming any of the political responsibility entailed in direction of the World Zionist movement. Whatever truth there may have been to this charge at one time has certainly disappeared with the emergence of a strong, politically-conscious American Zionist leadership. Whereupon the parties make an abrupt about-face, and try to find grounds for the claim that the Z.O.A. is seeking to "control" the movement. The inconsistency of these points of view makes one or the other untenable, and indicates

the nature of the opposition to the Z.O.A.

This much must be said, and repeated with vigor and emphasis. If it is true that large financial contribution to the cause does not automatically entitle American Zionists to participation in the political leadership of the movement, it follows with equal truth that neither does such contribution disqualify American Zionists. It has become disgustingly fashionable to ridicule General Zionists, purely on the basis of the magnificent financial support which they render not only to the U.P.A., the Keren Hayesod and the Jewish National Fund, but also to other agencies and institutions, including the Geverkshaften drive and the Histadruth. Mr. Abraham Dickenstein, of the Workers' Bank, might be in a position to elaborate on the remarkable extent to which General Zionists have answered his call for support for this useful Palestine labor institution.

These, then, are the currents which have been stirred up in the pre-election campaigning. The party member may still sneer at General Zionists, but the Z.O.A. and Hadassah have succeeded in enrolling between them some 350,000 individual American Jews in support of the Zionist cause, whereas the party membership is so small that the totals are spoken of only in subdued whispers. Were it not for the General Zionists, the movement would have no more strength or influence in this country than some of the obscure religious sects which appear from time to time.

The Z.O.A. has been patient and tolerant. It has continued to carry the brunt of the responsibility, both political and financial, and has continued to be a tower of strength upon which the Yishuv has learned to lean for that form of support which it needs most now.

Yet it is possible to lose patience with partisan tactics which are

concerned chiefly with narrow party interests, with special party dogmas and ideologies, and with ruthless partisan attempts in times like these to undermine the strength of the Z.O.A. by fragmentizing the Zionist vote, and spreading all sorts of unfounded insinuations against its leaders.

The great majority of American Zionists, Shekel holders, fortunately will not be led astray, and will indicate their own aversion for party politics, and their own desire for strengthening American Jewish participation in the broader political aspects of Zionism, by voting for the Z.O.A., and sending to the Zionist Congress a group of distinguished and representative Zionists who can meet with the leaders of Palestine Jewry, and the leaders of surviving European Jewry, as partners and collaborators in the great task that remains to be done.
