Dear Dr. Silver;

Dr. Marks has referred your communication dated February 4th to me.

It is the practice of the Z.O.A. Speakers Bureau to endeavor to provide speakers to our districts, and to cooperate with brotherhoods, Jewish community centers and forums exploring Zionist questions.

✓ In most cases where the speakers are to address Zionist districts, we reimburse their traveling expenses. A great number of speakers listed in our brochure "Speakers on Palestine and Zionism" and our supplementary lists charge an honorarium. Many voluntary speakers accept engagements because of their intense desire to be of service to the organization, but when it becomes necessary for them to leave their pulpit or their profession for any length of time, they are considerably out of pocket, and reasonably enough, expect some compensation.

✓ It is our practice to endeavor to have districts pay the honoraria involved and we carry traveling expenses. However, many of our districts, especially the newer and smaller ones, are unable to pay these fees, and in cases which we deem justifiable, we pay the fee or share it with the district. We feel that it is important to stimulate the community to Zionist activity. Of course, we always attempt to obtain voluntary speakers first, but it is becoming increasingly difficult to do so.

We have had many requests for Rabbi Miller, but unfortunately he has not as yet found it possible to accept any engagements proposed to him by this office by reason of pressure of activity.

February 8, 1946

The Cleveland Zionist Society, as well as all other districts throughout the country, have been regularly supplied with speakers' lists. During the past year, we have not had any request from this district. On January 3, 1946, we wired Dr. Falkman offering him Dr. Max Nussbaum as speaker for a meeting. However, the district did not avail itself of this opportunity. We have received urgent requests from Dr. Falkman to book Pierre Van Paassen. We approached Mr. Van Paassen repeatedly trying to induce him to visit this district, but were informed that at the present time he was not in a position to go to Cleveland. We wired Dr. Falkman on January 8, 1946 to this effect, and requested him to advise us whether we could secure other speakers for him. We have not as yet had an answer to this telegram. We trust that we will have the opportunity of servicing the Society.
