Dear Sirs:

I had not intended making any issue of my exclusion from the slate of the ZOA for the World Zionist Congress. For some time I had resolved to bear silently the many indignities and injustices that have been emanating from the present administration. But I cannot permit the text of the last minutes of the Administrative Council, which reached me only a few days ago, to go unanswered and unexplained.

I am not able to find a copy of the telegram which came to me asking for a 150-word statement in regard to the Shekel Campaign. As I recall, it contained nothing else. There was no word in it that this was to be regarded as a condition for exclusion as a nominee of the Zionist Organization; and to use it for this purpose is both dishonest and unworthy. I have not the slightest hesitation in saying that I did not reply to the telegram. It is a matter of common knowledge that I have always been in favor of the platform advocated by General Zionism. I have changed no white in this respect. But the matter was not as simple as that. Everyone is cognizant of the fact that the political fortunes of the present President of the Zionist Organization of America is his quest after the position now occupied by Dr. Chaim Weizman. Again, I have no hesitancy in saying that, in my opinion, this would be a calamity. Finding myself in this equivocal position, unable to endorse the one without the other, I preferred to remain silent.

I might add, that from all the knowledge I possess, the whole tactics employed in this instance, and stated without explanation to the Administrative Council at its last meeting, is against the very principles on which the Congress rests. Delegates are not to be instructed or bound. And, if to serve the Zionist cause means to follow every whim and every political ambition of individuals, then I am compelled to serve it in other ways.

I must add that it is a tragic deprivation for me to be estopped at the present time from any help that I might render. My heart goes out to my brethren in Palestine, whom I learned to love and admire so deeply when I had the privilege of being with them for two months last Summer.

This letter is written to be read, I hope, to the next meeting of

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
the Administrative Council and is a considered protest against the unfairness and the unwisdom of the action taken at the last meeting.

Dear Mr. Redelheim:

When the Committee on Chalutzit was established after several months of delay, we hoped that it would be the first practical step to encourage and strengthen chalutz activities in this country. Regardless of the bitter experience in the past, when Hechalutz was left without full Zionist support, we were inclined to hope that a change had been brought into American Zionism, and chalutzit would become a real issue supported by all Zionists.

There is no need to say more about the crucial time in Palestine and the crying need for a strong Hechalutz movement in America. Therefore we placed our faith in the Committee on Chalutzit which started four months ago under your chairmanship. We sincerely thought that this committee meant business, and we are quite shocked and upset that the committee has ceased to exist after only three or four informal meetings. It is indeed discouraging that in these trying weeks and months such a promising body stopped working. And the Hechalutz Organization of America, overburdened with old activities and new obligations of hachshara and aliya is still alone.

Our practical suggestions are as follows:

- 1- To call the Committee on Chalutzit immediately in order to start the entire machinery in motion again.
- 2- To activate the small committee which promised to get immediate financial aid for the various chalutz organizations.
- 3- To call all Zionist parties in the United States for an emergency meeting to carry out a few extraordinary chalutz actions in answer to the situation in Palestine.

We would very much appreciate your immediate reply.

Dear Dr. Silver,

I received the following information today which I thought I ought to transmit to you immediately:-

Sir Norman Brook, a very prominent figure behind the scenes on the question of Palestine and one of the men entrusted with most of Mr. Attlee's ideas on the present conference, has had a number of private conversations with Faris el-Khoury and Emir Adil Arslan, the representatives of Syria and last Saturday, the 14th inst. Camille Bey Chamoun, representative of the Lebanon was asked to attend.

These conversations circled round the fear of the Syrian representatives that emissaries of France would use the present conference for pressure against their countries. The British Government was known to have been presented with these fears before and dismissed them. But now, the repeated meetings between the above parties seems to suggest that the British Government accepts at least

some of the fears expressed by their Arab friends. There is no direct report about these meetings, but one of my contacts reports that Chamoun felt " much happier " after he had met Sir Norman.

It is also suggested by my friends that the inclination by the Agency to accept finally an invitation has been greeted with great relief by all important people like Mr. G. Hall, Mr. Creech-Jones, Under-Secretary for the Colonies and Sir George Gater, Permanent Under-Secretary for the Colonies, the latter, as you will know, is one of the most important members of the Colonial Office and is known to have expressed the opinion that should no Jews attend the conference it would be a waste of time and at the same time a successful attempt by the Agency to ridicule the British Government. Sir George is anything but a friend of Zionism, as you may well know.

There is very little else I can tell you at the moment, but should the Agency really attend, the reaction on the Arab side will be immediately transmitted to me and thus to you.

I am sending this without comment and for what it is worth, it may assist you in your own plans.

Dear Dr. Silver,

In answer to your letter of September 13th, I must advise you that a Drive to raise money for the Expansion Fund will have to be held in abeyance until after the forthcoming Z.O.A. Convention for the following reason -

As you know it was not so many years ago that the Atlantic City Jewish Community made the poorest showing of the entire country in the raising of funds for Overseas and Palestine. Only by the efforts of the Zionist District here have we been able from year to year to slowly increase such amounts.

Four years ago our District fought for and won through for a separate Overseas Drive. As you will recall, when we held the first separate Overseas Drive, in 1943, (I was the Chairman, and you were the Guest Speaker that night) in Atlantic City, the response was so miserable that you left the room. However, we did make our quota that year, which was only \$35,000.00.

This year the funds raised totaled \$350,000.00, or ten times as much. In order to insure the success of this year's Drive, all Organizations agreed to hold no other Drives whatever during the year.

It is unfortunate, but true, that those who can give the most, refuse to give anything on the argument that this year's Drive was all inclusive. Therefore, the only way our District can raise money for the Expansion Fund will be in some form of a Drive - appealing to the average person. Such a Drive is not feasible until after the forthcoming Convention, in accordance with our agreement with the local Federation.

My dear Friends:

I received your kind letter of September 21. Frankly, I am deeply disappointed. This is the second year that the Atlantic City Zionist District has made no contribution to the Expansion Fund. I fully appreciate that you have your local problems. So do other communities. But as a loyal and devoted Zionist you must realize, I am sure, that the ZOA made large financial commitments on the strength of this Expansion Fund, which was voted by two Zionist Conventions held in your city.

I have heard from Mr. Manuel Posy, Director of the Expansion Fund, the full story of the negotiations which have been carried on with your district relative to this fund during the past year. Our representatives visited your community on more than one occasion in connection with this fund. Plans were projected and promises were made, but nothing was carried through.

It seems to me that you still have time, before the ZOA Convention meets again in your community, to make a determined effort to raise a substantial sum of money as Atlantic City's contribution to this fund. It will not look well when the report is rendered at the Convention to have it pointed out that Atlantic City has again failed to contribute its share to this fund.

Money-raising is never a pleasant job as you and I know from long experience. But you cannot make bricks without straw.

INDEPENDENT POLITICAL CIRCLE

Dear Friends:

Your Convention is taking place at what may well prove to be a turning point in our history, and we wish to place before you the views of a section of the Yishuv which while, owing to inadequate organisation, has failed to be fully articulate, is, we believe, important in numbers and of substantial moral weight.

The above organisation aspires to create a bond between those members of the Yishuv and other Zionists abroad, who regard with apprehension the growth of certain tendencies in our public life which detract from the great accomplishment of our people in Palestine. We are concerned to ensure that the future of our people here should correspond to the high hopes Jews everywhere repose in the Yishuv and the Zionist Organisation, and to the fulfilment of which we are all dedicated. We regard the rebuilding of Palestine not exclusively for the purpose of providing a haven, indispensable though that is, for those Jews in the Diaspora who by force of economic or political circumstances, are obliged to emigrate to Palestine. We perceive in Eretz Israel the continuation of Jewish civilisation, the creation of a politically free, democratic, and economically secure and sound National Home of the Jewish People. From this viewpoint we are concerned to cooperate in bringing about certain urgent reforms in our public administration and political organisation.

In pursuance of the aims outlined below we have found it proper to join forces with the "Aliya Hadasha" organisation because it endorses a similar programme in the interests of the Yishuv as a whole.

In the elections of Knesseth Israel we supported "Aliya Hadasha" as Independents, and its list secured second place after Mapai.

We have not, however, identified ourselves with "Aliyah Hadasha" as such, because of its largely Landsmannschaft (German) character and its name. It is our hope, by gathering support for the programme below from Zionists of all countries, to change both these features. This should facilitate cooperation on a domestic programme of essential reform between Zionists who may differ in other spheres of policy.

1. We urge the encouragement of substantial immigration to Palestine from the free democracies in addition to facilities for the Displaced Persons. In particular we need manpower and technical assistance from the Zionists in the English-speaking countries. Such immigration will strengthen the capacity of the Yishuv to expand and govern itself, as well as strengthen the bond between Palestine and English-speaking Zionists. This policy calls for organisational machinery, which should include also encouragement of students from the USA and elsewhere, tourist activity, and cultural bonds between Eretz Israel and the Diaspora.

2. Only by a full ventilation of our problems in a spirit of tolerance and self-criticism can we hope to eliminate the faults and defects of our growing organism. Considerations of propaganda should not prevent us recognising undesirable tendencies. We plead for a free democracy based on constitutional safeguards, whereby the Executive is responsible to its Constituency. A free and independent press should be

encouraged; civil service chosen for its merits and qualifications; and the right for every individual to all the benefits of national services irrespective of his political creed or outlook.

3. The limits of competence as between the Palestine Zionist Executive representing the World Zionist Organisation, and the Knesset Israel representing the Yishuv, are not clearly and realistically defined. In consequence there is overlapping and duplication causing a waste of energy, while constructive initiative is thwarted.

4. The present electoral system favours an excessive splintering of the Yishuv into too numerous political parties and groups. Although, as in the case of the Zionist Executive, the Vaad Leumi is formally a coalition, the fact is that, as in the case of the Zionist Executive, the various parties composing this coalition, persist in opposing one another, and decisions taken represent not so much a coalition compromise, as a bargain between conflicting interests. We recommend the reform of this electoral system so as to ensure that delegates should represent geographic constituencies, rather than parties only, and so as to give the elector the opportunity of voting for the individual in whom he has confidence, rather than for a list of people who are selected by the party secretariat.

#### 5. Financial Control.

The disbursement of our public monies calls in our opinion for stricter control, both in respect to the Jewish Agency and the Vaad Leumi. The budget for the current year is sometimes adopted long after the year has begun, and there is excessive latitude in changing or exceeding budgetary items without provision for current representative check.

6. The influence of political parties, especially those representing the majority, is excessive in respect to current administrative capacity. The party key determines both major and minor decisions. The so-called coalition precludes the wholesome influence of a constitutional opposition. Inasmuch as most parties represent the material interests of their members, public affairs are directed not so much in behalf of the people as a whole, but in accord with the party tug-of-war or bargaining.

7. We consider that the economic policy pursued by the dominant Labour party, which in fact controls all our central institutions, is biased. It limits the expression of individual outlook within its ranks and it restricts the opportunity of those outside to take their full share in public affairs. We favour a planned economy which will reconcile individual and collective interests without suppressing initiative or crushing minority representation. If private enterprise is legitimate, it should benefit from our national capital and services; otherwise, it should not be invited.

8. So important a matter as our educational system is subject to the control of the main political parties. We appreciate a differentiation in the curriculum of our schools in accordance with the wishes of parents. But at present there is no effective integrated control. The Vaad Leumi, nominally responsible for the Educational Department and liable for the budget, is in practice subject to the power of the Labour and Mizrahi parties. The latter regard the schools as nursing grounds for their future members. Under such circumstances we can hardly hope to build up a truly unified single nation.

9. We favour a national rather than party youth service dedicated to the general needs. We deprecate the indoctrination of young children with ideologies, thus splitting our youth before reaching maturity.

10. Such public services as health, social insurance, security, and athletic training should be on a central national rather than a political party basis.

11. We urge a reform of our self-government administration to permit of supreme elected bodies to meet for adequate periods to permit of current control of executive action, discussion of budget, etc. The Zionist Congress Constitution should be brought into harmony with present conditions so that those who carry the burden, should also be able to express and carry out their convictions in respect to policy and its implementation.

12. The great gap between policy and performance of the Palestine Zionist Executive is illustrated especially in respect to the terrorist campaign. The Executive has repeatedly asserted its condemnation of terrorist activity, but has failed to suppress it. Its authority is not recognised by the terrorist groups. We consider that the Executive is bound to resign and, in accord with recognised constitutional procedure, give way to a body that enjoys the confidence of the electorate.

We have confined ourselves here only to domestic affairs deferring the question of foreign policy, in order to establish a measure of agreement upon issues that can and should be determined irrespective of all political viewpoints.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

Please find inclosed herewith a copy of a letter to President Truman suggesting a solution of the Palestine problem.

The writer is aware that there is a considerable body of the Jewish people in favor of an undivided Palestine as a Jewish state. The writer would like to number himself with that body if he thought it were possible of attainment.

If Britain and America would petition the United Nations to give the Jewish people a mandate over Palestine under a United Nations trusteeship, and this petition were successful, I am confident that the Jewish people would grant Britain and the United States naval and military bases in Palestine to safeguard their interests in the Near East. The question is, can a Jewish mandate be secured by this procedure?

If not, it is self-evident that a divided Palestine on the lines suggested in the letter to the President would be far better than no Jewish state at all.

I feel satisfied that if the Jewish people talk tough to Britain and insist on all or nothing, Britain can be still tougher and determine to stand pat on her do-nothing policy or even decide to subjugate the Jewish people, in which case she will find a willing ally in the Arab world.

Under such circumstances, can anyone imagine interference by the United States? The writer does not believe the world political situation would permit it. If things do come to this pass, all the heroism that the world now knows the Jewish people are capable of would be of no avail. The Jewish people in Palestine would indeed be courting entire extinction.

Albright, Prof. Clarence Efroymsen, Dr. Albert Einstein, Judge Stanley Fuld, Dr. Simon Greenberg, Prof. Horace Kallen, Dr. Paul Klapper, Prof. Gustave Klausner, Meyer Levin, Dr. Ludwig Lewisohn, Robert R. Nathan, Dr. A. A. Neuman, Dr. A. L. Sachar, Dr. I. S. Wechsler, Prof. Harry A. Wolfson, and Rabbi Armond E. Cohen, Chairman.

Applications must be received by June 10th. The announcement of the awards will be made on or about July 1st.
