Draft of Letter From Dr. Abba Hillel Silver  
to Miami Zionists

Dear Mr. ....:

I am writing to you in my capacity as President of the Zionist Organization of America to request you most earnestly to assist in a task of major importance to all Zionists.

The achievement of our goal of a Jewish Palestine that is so near to our hearts calls for a struggle on a number of fronts, which must all be co-ordinated.

Our task is to help to make the struggle successful on all fronts — the front comprised of the Jews of Europe who wait patiently for the day when they can go to Eretz Israel; the front comprised of the Jews of Palestine who, despite all obstacles and difficulties, go on building Palestine for the Jews of Europe; and the front in the United States which provides the strength upon which the Jews of Europe and Palestine lean.

I urge upon you to do your utmost to insure the success of the United Jewish Appeal campaign for \$170,000,000. The funds which Palestine will receive from a successful campaign will represent far more than dollars. They will represent the building of the Jewish future for the Jews of Palestine and the surviving Jews of Europe, and for our people everywhere.

As a Miamian you are in a peculiarly strategic position. The campaign in Miami is the first major effort of the year in the country. If the campaign in Miami is an outstanding success, the campaigns which follow will be challenged to emulate your community. If it fails — and it MUST NOT fail — the entire campaign will be off to a poor start and this can be a serious blow to our hopes.

I call upon you as a matter of Zionist loyalty to offer your services immediately to the Miami campaign leadership — if you have not already enlisted.

I urge you to give priority to this campaign in time, energy and service. And, of course, I appeal to you to give generously of your substance to the campaign. I should like the Zionists of America to set an inspiring example for all others.

I shall watch with great interest your efforts and those of the other good Zionists in Miami to whom I am writing. I know that you and Miami will measure up to the challenge.

The future of the Jews of Europe, the future of Palestine, and, indeed, our own future, are Zionist responsibilities and Zionists must conduct themselves so as to be a worthy example for all others.

Will you accept this assignment? Will you do your Zionist share to get the \$170,000,000 ~~undertaking~~ started so auspiciously and vigorously that it will snowball to success?

Remember, a chain is only as strong as its weakest link. The link that is the United Jewish Appeal must be strong. Without it the other links will not hold.

Gentlemen:

On June 14th, 1946 a telegram was sent by the Morning Freiheit Association to the American Jewish Conference requesting that immediate action be undertaken with regard to the present crisis in Palestine.

The program outlined in our telegram is supported by important sections of our people. Yet to date we have received no reply, despite the fact that ample time has elapsed and that in the intervening period, a meeting of the Interim Committee has been held.

Since that time the situation has deteriorated greatly. British imperialism has tightened its grip on Palestine and its communities. It has instituted a reign of terror against the Yishuv. Leaders of the Jewish Agency as well as countless thousands of others have been arrested. The Yishuv faces the most critical period in all the years of its existence.

Since that time another factor has come to the fore—the danger of partition. The Anglo-American Cabinet Committee has proposed the hateful scheme for the partition of Palestine, which if realized will infinitely strengthen the British imperialist stranglehold over both Arabs and Jews. It will transform the two proposed separate communities into virtual military reservations. The agreement of the American delegates to the partition scheme is motivated, not by consideration of the needs of the Jewish people but by the expectation that this partition agreement will afford American imperialism greater opportunities for the exploitation of Palestine and the Middle East generally.

There is great danger that leading Zionist circles are preparing to accept a partition scheme. Very disturbing is the recent statement of Dr. Weizmann which left the door open for the acceptance of such a solution while the statement of the Zionist leaders generally, skirted the issue but by no means repudiated it.

The acceptance by Zionist leadership of any partition scheme will be an outright betrayal of the Yishuv and its future peace and security. It would precipitate endless hostility and antagonism between the Jewish and Arab communities. It will not advance the cause of the independence and freedom of Palestine. Nor will it aid the cause of peace between Jew and Arab.

Those, who for the sake of achieving a Jewish state, favor partition or are ready to accept it as a last resort are aiding the turning of the Yishuv into a military reservation of British imperialism. They must assume full responsibility for such a suicidal act.

The central problem which faces Palestine as well as the Yishuv, is its liberation from imperialist rule. This can be achieved only on the basis of a united Arab-Jewish front and on the basis of Arab-Jewish agreement. Only on such a basis can Palestine as a whole, and the Yishuv in particular, gain independence and achieve full national rights.

The acuteness of the situation and the further perils which have been introduced by the partition proposal, demand that there be no further delay. It demands action on a broad basis, in which leadership is given by the entire American Jewish Community, its organizations and leadership and not by the Zionist party alone.

It is now more urgent than ever before that the measures which we propose be immediately carried out. Those measures as outlined in our telegram, were;

1. The American Jewish Conference shall appeal at once to President Truman and to the Secretary General of the United Nations, asking them to recommend to the Security Council of the United Nations
  - a) That the United Nations assume immediately full responsibility for the fate and maintenance of the 100,000 Jewish refugees in German camps, and to intervene with the countries of the United Nations that they open their doors for the immigration and settlement of the Jewish refugees and to provide the necessary means for same;

- b) That Britain shall transfer Palestine at once to the trustee-ship of the Big Three within the United Nations for the purpose of setting up Palestine as an independent and democratic state of Arabs and Jews that will guarantee the equal national rights of both peoples and
  - c) That the United Nations shall recommend to Great Britain the immediate withdrawal of all British armed forces from Palestine.
2. That the American Jewish Conference shall issue an appeal to the Jewish Agency in Palestine asking that the Agency open at once negotiations with the spokesmen of labor and other democratic forces of the Arab people in Palestine; with a view of reaching an agreement for joint Arab-Jewish struggle for the independence of Palestine and for the purpose of reaching an agreement in favor of Jewish immigration into Palestine under joint Arab-Jewish control .
3. That the American Jewish Conference shall organize and send a delegation to President Truman for the purpose of achieving the widest opportunities for the entrance and settlement of Jewish refugees in the United States.
4. That the American Jewish Conference shall undertake to rally the widest united actions of the American Jews in collaboration with all progressive forces of the whole American people, especially with Labor and with the Negro people in support of the foregoing proposals.

We urge that an emergency meeting of the Interim Committee be called immediately to undertake action along the lines proposed in our telegram. We urge that such an emergency meeting, representatives of the Morning Freiheit Association be invited to present in detail the position of our organization.


Dear Dr. Silver:

Dear Dr. Marks:

A newspaper clipping appearing in the September 6 issue of the National Jewish Post, a newspaper published in Indianapolis, Indiana, was directed to my attention as Chairman of the Public Relations Committee of the Fort Wayne Jewish Federation and also as President of the local Zionist District.

This clipping refers to the talk made by Rabbi Leon Feuer at a recent meeting held in Detroit, Michigan. Rabbi Feuer stated "that American Zionists take a stand that they will withdraw political support from the Truman administration in the coming elections if a large number of the 100,000 European Jews are not on their way to the Yishuv by that time".

This clipping, together with your Memorandum of September 19 with reference to the recent political directive of the American Zionist Emergency Council, was submitted to the last meeting of the Board of Directors of the local Zionist District. Mr. Byron Novitsky, Chairman of the local Zionist Emergency Council, was present and also presented information which he had received through his committee concerning the matter. After considerable discussion, the following Resolution was unanimously adopted:

"That we disapprove of the political tactics to use the cause of Zionism as a threat over candidates for political office, and that the President be authorized to communicate to the Zionist Organization of America that such expressions as recently given publicity by Rabbi Feuer of Detroit are not conducive to the Zionist cause."

In fairness to you and to the Board of Directors, I believe I should give you the basis of our reasoning leading to the adoption of this Resolution. First, let me say that we have no argument with the political directive as it appeared in your communication of September 19. We feel, however, that advising

political candidates that Zionists will vote as a unit for or against them is dangerous propaganda and will not, in anywise, help our cause. Some of our reasons are as follows:

1. If you are going to vote against a candidate, you are thereby casting a vote for his opponent, who may not be favorable to the Zionist cause.
2. We have always contended in answer to anti-semitic charges that Jews do not vote as a unit, but as Americans.
3. By virtue of this type of propaganda, we are alienating many people who indirectly contribute to the Zionist cause by their contribution to welfare funds. They know when they make these contributions that 40% of the money contributed is distributed to the U.P.A.

We want our position to be perfectly clear. The directors of our local Zionist District are all ardent Zionists, and they are all vitally interested in the salvation of our distressed brethren in Europe. They feel, however, that propaganda of the type in question will not help, but rather injure their chances of survival.

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



Dear Dr. Silver:

It was good to learn that you have safely returned from Palestine, and I am anxiously looking forward to April 27th to have the privilege to listen to your and Danny Frisch's report at the National Executive board meeting.

I am writing this letter to you in order to use it as a basis for a conversation that I hope to be able to have with you on April 27th before or after the meeting. And this conversation will be with reference to the city of Chicago. As you know, the state of affairs of the Zionist Organization of Chicago is deplorable, and calls for a complete revamping of the set up of the local organization.

I would like to point out at this time that I have observed with admiration the work of Dr. Sidney Marks, Manny Posy and Yale Goldberg. I believe that you have used excellent judgment and choice in retaining the services of these three men. In my experience with the Zionist Organization which dates back to 1913 I have never met a more capable individual than Sidney Marks, and it is a privilege and pleasure to work with him.

In spite of the great deal of effort and time these three fellows have spent in Chicago, very little has been accomplished. And since Chicago is the second largest Jewish population center in the United States and probably in the world, I believe it necessary that you should put your own good mind and effort to some extent to the job on hand. Although I am not spending all my time in Chicago, my home is in Massachusetts, I have been attempting to act as a liaison officer and ambassador of goodwill between National Headquarters and the local Zionist Organization of Chicago, but I am certain that we will need you to give a minimum



".... Dr. Silver called on American Zionists to "be steadfast in demanding from the Truman Administration a loyal and resourceful performance on the Palestine question, in line with the resolutions adopted by the 78th Congress and in the spirit of the Palestine plank of the Democratic Party platform of 1944."

"The handling of the Palestine issue both within the sphere of American-British relations and at the United Nations has been woefully out of tune with the utterances of the White House and the well known sentiments of the Congress," Dr. Silver stated, continuing that "America's conduct in matters of Palestine may well remove a source of far-reaching international friction. Britain's unilateral handling of the Palestine situation is unthinkable without Washington's acquiescence. A solution of the Palestine problem, any solution of the Palestine problem, is unthinkable without active American assumption of political responsibility in the matter. Any American participation in the disposition of the Palestine question is unthinkable unless supporting the Jewish case, in line with the tradition established by Woodrow Wilson, subsequently embodied in the American-British Palestine Mandate Convention of 1924, and constantly reiterated by the leading figures of American public life."

Dr. Silver concluded his address by ~~saying~~ stating: "The time ~~has~~ for action on Palestine by the U.S. Government is now, prior to the fall ~~fall~~ session of the United Nations."



My dear Mr Lipsky,

I respond with the greatest pleasure to the invitation you extend to me in behalf of the Administrative Committee, to send a letter of greetings to the forthcoming annual meeting of the Zionist Organization of America.

I should render myself guilty of presumption if I pretended to bring home to you the notion of your duty towards the Jewish people at the present moment of its history. You are splendidly conscious of it. You are luminously aware that you have a crushingly heavy, but glorious task to fulfill.

The fate of Israel has willed it that the earthly lot of the greater and best half of our people should be thrown in with Russia and Poland. These six millions of Jews, in whom our best hopes of the future were vested, are now fretting in unspeakable pangs, threatened with ghastly dangers, too often a prey of bloodthirsty monsters with vaguely human faces, morally anguished, materially ruined, entirely absorbed with the necessity of using all their energy in the defence of their existence and honour. Of these six millions of our brothers we cannot actually expect any other effort than that of immediate self preservation.

Happily, the genius of Israel has so disposed that during these last forty years a new Jewry should be built up in America, which numbers now more than three millions and has developed into the greatest living force within our people. The burden of providing for the future of Israel rests now mainly on your shoulders. You are stalwart enough to bear it manly.

England has given us, through the mouth of Mr Balfour, the promise to reconstitute us our historic country and to enable us to build up there anew the national home of our people. Almost all the other powers have more or less explicitly approved of this promise. But till now, it has remained a word and nothing more. We must now give it a concrete content and a practical meaning.

You American Jews dispose of the active sympathies of the noblest and best of your gentile countrymen and of the good will of your powerful government. Exert now all your influence in order to obtain without delay the following concessions:

1. Palestine must be respected as an intangible geographical individuality

with its traditional frontier. Every pretension of mutilating it in the north or the south must be resisted with the utmost energy.

2. The country must be widely opened to unrestricted Jewish immigration. It is a mockery and an offense to say solemnly to us "Palestine is yours" and at the same time to shut its frontiers hermetically and regually before us. The argument that Palestine cannot at present feed an accrued number of inhabitants is no excuse for such a paradoxical treatment. England and the other powers may leave it with us to wrestle with this difficulty. We will ask of no outsider aid or help for the maintaining of our new settlers. We will organize them and provide for them ourselves.

3. The ~~P~~ouran which is now an empty and barren country where only small hordes of nomads roam who have never tried to begin the slightest work of civilization, must be comprised in the boundaries of Jewish Palestine. We will and we can conquer it for culture.

4. All the land in Palestine that has belonged to the late Turkish government must be made over to the new occupants, but shall remain the perpetual inalienable property of the Jewish nation and proportioned to individual occupants only on a system of a renewable euphytheosis, in accordance with our wonderfully prophetic law of Moses, of the Sabbath and the Jubilee Year, which Henry George theoretically in North America, Rivedavia practically in Argentine, have tried to modernize.

5. It is time that the voice of Israel be heard, not through the organ of self appointed, however meritorious, spokesmen and leaders, but through the mouth of duly elected representatives who can show a formal mandate from the millions of our people. Only such legitimate deputies can speak to the world with the necessary authority, in the name of Israel, in this era of triumphant democracy and self-determination of great and small nations. The convocation of a world congress of the Jewish nation is therefore an urgent and indubitable necessity. You American Jews must take this matter in your hand. Fix the conditions of the voting, the time and the place of the meeting of this assembly which has to be the point of departure of the new political existence of the old nation of Israel.

You American Jews have behaved wonderfully in these horrible years of war and ruin. You have given lavishly your millions. You have shrunk from no sacrifice. You have

You have realized works of solidarity unparalleled in history. This will be recorded forever in our annals and remain your eternal glory. But money is not everything. We now ask of you, expect from you, that you will make a new and far more decisive effort to act efficiently in the direction of the five points I venture to submit to you.

May your work be blessed and may the date of your convention of 1919 become a great date in the history of Israel.


