

Dear Dr. Silver:

We of the New England Zionist Youth Commission cannot allow our recent third annual Educational Institute for Zionist youth to pass into history without reporting to you and to the National Executive Committee its outstanding success. Upon my return to Cleveland I found your gracious letter, inviting me to speak at the 26th Annual Convention of the New England Zionist Region on September 28 and 29.



JEWISH AGENCY

1. The New England Zionist Region hails the magnificent accomplishments of the Jewish Agency during the trying years of the war, its marshalling of the industry and fighting power of the Jews of Palestine on the side of democracy, its organization of the rescue of Jews from the maelstrom of Maziism, and its leadership in bringing to the fore the spirit of militant self-reliance in the Yishuv.

2. We appreciate the enormity of the obstacles which have confronted the political negotiations of the Jewish Agency, and we subscribe to its earnest to find a formula which may bring peace and justice to Palestine and open its gates to the suffering Jews of Europe.

3. To the end that we may continue to present a unified front in our political negotiations with the governments of the world, we call for an ever close cooperation between the Jewish Agency and the great organs of American Zionism.

4. We commend these views to the forthcoming convention of the ZOA, with the further understanding that it is the function of the World Zionist Congress not only to receive from the Jewish Agency a careful and detailed report of its six-year trusteeship, but also to examine, and if necessary to restate, both the basic objectives and the immediate aims of the Zionist Movement.

RESOLUTION

It is the sense of the New England Zionist Convention that it is opposed to any partition of Palestine and that it reaffirms the Biltmore program except as it is modified by the Convention of the Zionist Organization of America.

The New England Zionists in convention assembled calls upon our Government to use its best efforts to facilitate the immediate entry to 100,000 Jews into Palestine and to establish a democratic Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine.


