

SUBJECT:

The U.P.A. controversy and other matters seem to have pushed the problem of the Confederation and the approaching Congress into the background.

It is because of my deep seated and, of late, fully justified fear, that we are losing the Confederation, step by step, that I feel it my duty as a matter of record and future reference, to REPEAT my sincere conviction that we are winning the periphery of the struggle for our point of view, and foregoing, or losing if you please, the very heart of it.

To all intents and purposes, there are only two major places, the representatives of which will be factors in determining this drama called "General Zionism", - France and South America.

As you know, I have just returned from Canada which, not unlike Britain, is in the hands of the self-termed "progressives". I am persuaded that both there as well as in Great Britain, and perhaps also South Africa, we could divide the forces and obtain some support at the Congress, if we would but will it earnestly.

All of the above, my dear Dr. Silver, is predicated of course upon "your" plans and thinking.

I feel that your inability or unwillingness to come to a conclusion as to whither we are heading, or if you have come to such a conclusion, your failure to share it promptly and with your characteristic directness with those who are ever ready to follow in your footsteps, may endanger our attempt to recapture what we undoubtedly lost already and are losing every day, by sheer inactivity.

I wish to take this opportunity to also inform you that I feel that the decision as to whom to ship the equipment to, (the last equipment we shall probably send), as well as the manner in which we are handling the Confederation matters, are not conducive, in my humble judgment, to the strengthening of our position, even if our policy would be one of compromise and reshuffling.

Honored Rabbi:

Your Statesmanship in the Zionist movement has given it the inspiration that has made American Jewry rally to its importance. Your God-given talents have given it the necessary impetus to bring the State of Israel to its present position.

But the present controversy, involving the question of whether Mr. Morgenthau will be in the United Jewish Appeal Drive, or not, becomes a most serious disturbance to the nerve centers of hundreds of thousands of workers and contributors.

I am one of the average John Does of American Jewry. All my life I have been in sympathy with every Jewish movement. Zionism was also one of my hopes and dreams. But at no time in my past association, was my heart so tranquil and my devotion to my work so great as it has been since Mr. Morgenthau came into the UJA in active participation.

Last year it was my privilege to be chairman of the Lawrence United Jewish Appeal and while I hesitated for a long time to undertake this responsibility - because I felt that I was not equal to the huge task - the association of Mr. Morgenthau in the work of the UJA was in great measure my inspiration and caused me, not only to accept this undertaking, but also to do an outstanding job. The result being that Lawrence raised \$160,000.00 against \$85,000.00 the year before.

Of course, if Queen Esther had not come to the rescue of her fellow-Jews, God would have provided someone else to save His people from total destruction by Haman. Nevertheless, it is true that the great leaders in the State of Israel and in America are clamoring that we must have Morgenthau continue in the year 1949.

Now, - for the psychological reaction: the fact that Mr. Morgenthau is not a "blue-blooded Yankee" in the Zionist movement became a strong point for many other faint-hearted Jews to get on the bandwagon. All of which has helped to bring closer and unite all Jewry for the great task and the huge responsibility that is ours.

Dear Rabbi, - I therefore implore your sense of charity for the sake of "Sholom", "Gmilous - Chascdim" and "Zdoko". And just because you are one of the very oldest and the most capable leader of the Zionist movement in this country - the "blue-blooded Yankee" - all the John Does like myself expect you to give of yourself to the over-all strength of peace and harmony that all Jewry may march hand in hand and side by side, to raise, this year, the largest sum of money ever raised in spite of the fact that there are many who are crying "We are tired of giving and tired of working".

I can understand, with the great enthusiasm that is yours and the years of work that you have put in - that you may feel with justification, that you can do it and others with you can do it, without Mr. Henry Monter. But since Mr. Morgenthau and hundreds of thousands of others, feel that they want the entire team to handle the greatest job of our day, this year - I implore you to put your magnetic weight in a final effort to liquidate the Monter controversy, once and for all, so that Jewry in America can stand united and give our hearts, our minds, our toil and our money to make the last year of the first half of the twentieth century Heaven-blest by everyone's unstinted and undivided effort.

Now I would like to close by asking you, most honored Rabbi, to bring into life the spirit of Moses Maimonides in his fore-warning words. - "Defile not your souls by quarrelsomeness and petulance. I have seen the white become black, the low brought still lower, families driven into exile, princes deposed from their high estate, great cities laid in ruins, assemblies dispersed, the pious humiliated, the honourable held lightly and despised - all on account of quarrelsomeness. Glory in forbearance, for in that is true strength and victory".


May the philosophy of the great Rabbi, whose name you bear, give you the resourceful ingenuity to bring peace and harmony amongst the American sons of Israel in the work of the United Jewish Appeal for 1949. "Love Peace and PURSUE IT. Love all mankind and bring it closer to Torah".

Your greatness will be remembered now and throughout the generations, if you and your colleagues who have been hurt in this controversy will put aside your personal injuries for the sake of the ultimate goal that is so dear to Jews everywhere. "Kol hamon kekol of God" and let us prove to the world and to the young State of Israel that we can be united, without being uniform, on many of the phases of how best we may solve our problems of the day.

May my hopes and the meditations of my heart be Heavenly inspired and find grace before you.

MEMORANDUM - MEETING OF JANUARY 31, 1949

The problems to be discussed may be summed up under two headings:

- A. PROBLEMS RELATING TO THE POSITION OF THE Z.O.A. BOTH IN THE WORLD CONFEDERATION OF GENERAL ZIONISTS AND IN THE WORLD ZIONIST MOVEMENT.
- B. THE ROLE AND POSITION OF THE Z.O.A. IN THE UNITED STATES.

A - Z.O.A. AND WORLD ZIONISM

1) The creation of the Jewish State in Israel has changed the status of the Zionists the world over. While it is true that the separation of World Jewry and the Jewish State is a matter of agreed policy, the fact remains that the Government of Israel makes no secret of its intentions to interfere directly in the lives of the Jews of the Diaspora.

If there will be a Congress, and all signs seem to indicate that Mapai wants a Congress this year, the Jews of Israel will be represented in a much larger proportion than at the last Congress because of the unchanged double vote in Israel and the large increase of population in Israel itself. This may mean a change of the balance of power at the next Congress. Unless something is done about it the coalition of forces that defeated the appeasers in 1946 may not be strong enough to gain the majority at the next Congress.

We should not forget that there will be no real representation of the Jews of Eastern Europe. The D.P. camps will be emptied of all those who are Zionists. There are only two Zionist centers left in Europe: France and Britain.

In France, the General Zionist forces are rather strong and can be organized if we use the right methods. After conversations with leading British Zionists, I am more than ever convinced that we have a much better chance than we thought before to strengthen our General Zionist representation in England. We must not neglect Latin America where we have great possibilities for General Zionism.

2) The split in Palestine last Summer of the General Zionist party has dealt a dangerous blow to the Confederation. It is only natural that the split should have been intensified during the last few months and that the whole Confederation today should be tottering. As far as we can see, the Confederation has played a very useful and important part in the World Zionist movement up to and including the last meeting of the Actions Committee. Since then, however, things have become chaotic. Rarely do Z.O.A. representatives appear at the meetings of the American Sections of the World Confederation. If we intend leaving the Confederation, we should say so, but as it is, the Confederation is in a state of suspended animation.

At the moment, the Progressives have not yet conquered the Confederation. There is a chance that they will, but when this happens, it will be our own fault, because we still have the strength to influence certain elements within the Confederation who will side with us in important matters.

Whether we decide to leave the Confederation or to break it, we have to strengthen our relations with Zionist groups all over the world. This cannot be done by sending an emissary or two, once in a while, to tour certain countries. We have to establish offices in Europe and in Palestine with a permanent Z.O.A. representative who will see to it that adequate, correct information about American Zionism is spread wherever necessary and who will keep us informed about the developments in various countries. Most important of all, a strong Z.O.A. office in Israel could be the rallying point of General Zionist interests.

We have to make a clear decision....either we remain in the Confederation, and then we have to take an active part in it and fight for the victory of our ideas within it, or, we leave the Confederation and we strengthen the Z.O.A. wherever we can.

B - Z.O.A. IN AMERICA

1) We might as well face the facts. At this moment, the Z.O.A. is passing through critical times. Our old membership is renewing its allegiance to the organization in very large numbers, but we have lost the power to convince the Jews of America that the Z.O.A. still has a task to perform. As a result, we have only 7,000 new members instead of over 30,000 we had at this time last year. Knowing that every year we lose between 15% to 20% of the enrolled membership, we can estimate that the new members will not be able to make up for this deficit. We have to sell to the public the idea that the Z.O.A. is still needed, and it can be done.

Our financial situation is not too good either, and some drastic retrenchments may be needed. The U.J.A. campaign, the talks of the Opposition and their sabotage of our Expansion Fund, will make our financial worries greater in the months to come.

To meet the situation, vigorous steps have to be undertaken. Our membership, when aroused, reacts wonderfully to the appeal of its leaders. It is necessary that the top leadership go all over the country if we want to keep the organization intact and growing.

2) The Opposition:

Since the last Convention, the Opposition has been very active under the new name of Committee of Contributors. It has gained support amongst non-Zionists and has been able to do tremendous harm to the Zionist movement as a whole. It has, by challenging the integrity of the National funds. The opposition has strengthened its links with Israel and has the tacit support of elements of the Israeli Government and members of the Jewish Agency. While there is a paradox in the position taken by the Committee of Contributors which on the one hand maintains that the Z.O.A. has fulfilled its mission and on the other hand constitutes itself part and parcel of a movement to conquer the Z.O.A., they have spread enough confusion and disorder in the ranks of the Zionist membership, that their action has to be opposed.

The newspaper, "Zionist Issues" has not appeared for a few months but in fact "Haganah Speaks" rebaptized "Israel Speaks" is the official organ of the Opposition. It has a circulation of 65,000 and ample funds from the fund raising campaign of last year.

This meeting should consider the creation of a Committee for Zionist Democracy and the publication of a newsletter or a periodical called "Zionist Comment." The initiative of attack should be taken away from the Opposition and the Administration is to take to the offensive.

While it is true that the Opposition is not a homogeneous group, we must bear in mind that an Administration in office for four years has to counteract dissatisfaction in the ranks coming from various quarters. It can be stated for a fact that all the forces lined against us for the moment are the same forces that were aligned against the leadership of Dr. Silver and Dr. Neumann four years ago. This time we have the apparatus of the Z.O.A. and at the moment of this writing, we have neutralized certain evil forces in the machinery of the U.P.A.

There are forces of the Opposition that can be brought over in our camp. We must consider whether such efforts should be made. There are many neutral forces which, if rightly approached, might join us.

3) Zionist Problems:

Our membership, now that the political work is not the main function of our movement, has to have definite tasks assigned to it; it must be bound by projects; by a constructive program in Israel. While the stress has been laid upon the importance of education and culture, it should be understood that these problems have to be handled by the American Jewish Community by institutions created for that purpose. Investment, colonization, industrial development of Israel, assistance in the rehabilitation of the newcomers to the shores of the Promised Land, these are the tasks of the Zionist movement. To these purposes we must rededicate ourselves afresh. At this juncture, when everybody wants to take from us what we have strived and struggled for, the Z.O.A. must reassert itself, because it will be needed in the years to come.

4) We may face elections for the 23rd Congress. Mapai and the Progressives in the United States are determined to fight us on the American scene with the tacit and benevolent assistance of Hadassah. We may be able to prevent elections by some small concessions but we should consider our attitude, knowing that an election effort will mean for our membership a distraction from its normal activities and will involve large expenditures.

5) We should also consider the future of the Administration and see to it that we present a united slate and a united front at the next Convention. As matters stand now, we are rapidly drifting into chaos.

6) If time permits, we should examine the reorganization of the Youth Commission.





SUBJECT:

I wish to submit to you the following proposal, to which I have given a great deal of thought. North African Jewry, amounting to roughly 600,000 is practically leaderless. Many of them, perhaps half, will be leaving for Eretz Israel within the next few years. On the basis of all reports reaching me, I can state that they would be more than happy to see you personally within the shortest time possible. The impact of your visit would be difficult to overestimate. It would be the sun ray they have been waiting for, during the dark dreary days they have lived through. Your journey to North Africa could be compared only to the journey which Theodore Herzl made in his day, to Russian Jewry, who also were looking to him as their recognized world leader.

I know how eager the Zionist Organization of France would be to organize such a trip for you, and to make it the biggest success for the Zionist militant cause of which your personality is the personification. Both in view of the developments in Israel and on the World Zionist scene, I respectfully propose that such a journey is of immense importance.

Dear Dr. Silver:

I would like to bring to your attention, the following matters:

- 1) You will have noticed that the coverage given to the Z.O.A. point of view in the Anglo-Jewish papers and also in the papers in Canada, South Africa and all over the world has been rather favorable. I must say that a great deal of the public relations work to that affect has been done by the Jewish World News Service, of which Mr. William Zukerman is the Editor. As you know, I have been feeding him with material and information in the last year and this relationship has developed very favorably.
- 2) I have had several meetings with Mr. Isaacson and Mr. Ariav of the Farmer's Association. They are leaving in the very near future and they would very much like to see you before they leave. They may get a credit of one million dollars from the American Loan to Israel in order to enable them to purchase agricultural equipment. They intend opening an office here and I have suggested to them that they employ Mr. Ilutovitch as the Executive Director in this office.
- 3) Mr. Ariav received letters from Mr. Rokach thanking you and the other Zionists here for the moral assistance given to them for the elections and has asked for some additional help. I would be very grateful to have your opinion on this matter.
- 4) Dr. Israel Goldstein has sent several cables asking for Mr. Karpman, the Director of the American Bureau of the World Confederation of General Zionists, to come to Israel. Dr. Goldstein intends making him the Associate Director of the Constructive Fund of which Mr. Israel Kubovitsky is the Executive Director at the present moment. While in the United States we have been able to cooperate nicely with Mr. Karpman, even if in his heart his sympathy may be with Haoved ~~Zioni~~ Zion. What will happen with him if he goes to Israel with Dr. Goldstein in his present frame of mind is easy to understand. On the other hand, Mr. Karpman is used to the American way of life and seems to enjoy it quite a bit. This may be the moment, if we exert the proper pressure to our friends in Israel, to put one of our friends in that position.

Dr. Goldstein is now the President of the ~~Zionist~~ but the General Zionists and the Progressives have an equal representation.

5) Dr. Granovsky wrote a letter to the American Bureau of the World Confederation of General Zionists suggesting that we meet with him. Personally, I told Mr. Karpman that I did not see any reason to meet with Mr. Granovsky for when he arrived here, he did not find it necessary to get in touch with you or Dr. Neumann to discuss the situation but rushed immediately to the assistance of Mr. Locker. I told Mr. Karpman to convey this as my personal feelings to Mrs. Halprin.

6) The Actions Committee Meeting has been set for May 3rd in Israel and I suppose that Dr. Goldstein will call a meeting of the Executive Committee of the World Confederation a few days prior to this session. I further respectfully suggest that our representatives in the Actions Committee and on the Executive of the World Confederation should discuss whether they will or will not attend the sessions in Israel.

7) I read, with a great deal of satisfaction, the telegram which our friends sent you from Miami. I have heard from Joe Greenleaf that you have refused to have your name presented to the Convention. I fully realize the validity of your point of view. I would share it if I didn't know that your leadership today is required more than ever before. At the moment when the Z.O.A. is at the crossroads it needs a leader who has the respect, affection and devotion of a large majority of the organization. We cannot afford to elect a candidate who would not have the power to lead the Zionist constituents.

It may not be the time or the occasion, but I feel it my duty to tell you that all my friends and those whom we worked with during the last six years, share the opinion that there is a future for American Zionism and that you have become a symbol of that point of view.

I hope to have the opportunity to discuss this with you during one of your visits to New York and in the meantime, I want to assure you that as always, I stand with you in the ~~fights for~~ the basic principles which you represent. Whatever happens in the near future, nothing can equal the satisfaction and the honor which I have had as a soldier in the ranks to work under your leadership ~~during the last six years~~.

Dear Kib:

I was very glad to talk to you today. It is always a pleasure to hear from you.

I appreciate very much your thoughtfulness and consideration in inviting me to serve on your committee. I must admit however, that its function is not clear to me. If I understood you correct, your committee is "to present the Administration point of view". As I told you, Messrs. Brody and Moskowicz, Judge Blenbogen and I spoke to Drs. Silver and Neumann, after the last National Executive meeting, in order to acquaint them with our sponsoring Mr. Frisch's candidacy. Our entire conversation revolved around the one most outstanding point of Dan's candidacy, namely, that he will follow the Administration line. I need not, I am sure, bring any proof as to where I stand on this question. I have been an Administration man from the first day I joined the Executive. As a matter of fact when Dan approached me months ago, it was because of his assurance that his policies are those of the Administration, that I was persuaded to commit myself to him. He has reiterated the same to me, as well as to the entire committee time and again, and it is for this reason primarily that we went to Drs. Neumann and Silver to ask for their blessing. It should be evident therefore, that if there is "an Administration point of view" to be presented, it is precisely the committee, of which I have the honor to be a member of that is capable and should be entrusted to do so.

As you stated to me, your committee is neither pro, nor against Frisch, and since our committee is definitely pro Frisch, I can not see how I can serve on yours too.

It is really deplorable, that at this late stage of the game there should be no unanimity among ourselves, I mean us, Administration men. I am afraid that some well meaning Zionists may be caught unaware, and to the detriment of the very thing that you and I are fighting for, namely, The Administration point of view.

You will admit, that Dan may attribute some of his unpopularity in certain circles to the very fact that he has always been a stanch supporter of the Administration, and I

honestly feel that since no one has as yet announced his candidacy except him, the Administration should throw its weight and support behind Dan, who is the man that has proven his loyalty over and over again.

It is true that like many others, I have been hearing of some names mentioned as possible candidates, but no one has come out in the open except Dan, and I think it would be fatal to the movement for someone to come out at this late hour and thus split our forces. This will simply denote that our own house is not in order and will give some more ammunition to the opposition.



Upon my return from Miami Beach, where I deputised for none other than Vice President Barkley, I was very glad indeed to find your letter of March 31st. I might add that your message there was received with much enthusiasm.

Judging from all reports I have received so far, the Convention of the British Zionists seems to have been very uninspiring. In accordance with the stand of the Zionist Review for the past few months, everything was done to make the rank and file feel that the progressive movement has a large following. And yet inspite of that Brodetsky and the others were unable to explain just what the progressives stand for, and the election later proved that the delegates were by no means convinced.

Many of the progressives were not re-elected, and a man like Joseph Sagall who always pretended to head them, who has Brodetsky and the entire machine behind them, was not elected Vice President. Yet, Ashe-Lincoln, a friend of ours was elected to that post. Similarly, whilst undoubtedly everything was done to strike me off the list, I was re-elected member of the executive with a great majority, although everyone knows where I stand.


Needless to add, Barnett Janner is again Chairman. But there is much dissatisfaction, and I have come to feel that with proper preparation we might be able to change the structure at the next Convention, should 1950 really prove to be a Congress year.

I have had a series of talks with Gluecksmann of Argentine. Their Convention is due on April 22nd and I am afraid Sam Segal

is doing everything to turn the whole of South America into a "progressive" stronghold. Gluecksmann feels that the only way to arrest their victory would be an investment of \$20,000 for South America, including Mexico. He spoke to Dr. Neumann about it. I am doing my best to make him understand that his resignation would only weaken our position everywhere.

It would really be so important to hold South America and Canada within the fold. And strangely enough I am coming across more and more people both here and from Canada who used to be Zionists in general and who are now eager to fight the issue with separate fund-raising appeals for General Zionist projects in Israel etc. etc. I hope we shall make use of this unexpected revival, although I assume we shall have to wait until after the ZOA Convention before the future line of the movement can be worked out.





RESOLUTION ON OPPOSITIONS

WHEREAS, the Zionist Organization of America organized and functioning in accordance with the basic principles of Democracy and of MAJORITY RULES; and

WHEREAS, the rights of every member of the Zionist Organization of America guarantees him or her the right to vote and act upon any issue in accordance with his or her own conviction; and

WHEREAS, any member or any group of members may not agree with the majority on a given issue at a given time, nevertheless retaining their privilege to file a minority report; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that hereafter no group, small or large, when in the minority, shall be allowed to set up its own Administration and at the same time continue to enjoy the rights and privileges of membership in the Zionist Organization of America; and be it further

RESOLVED, that any group of members of the Zionist Organization of America when in the minority, and not willing to submit to the rule of the majority, their membership in the Organization should cease automatically and they shall not be allowed to claim membership or profess loyalty to the Zionist Organization of America while setting up their own Committees or issuing printed matter of their own, etc., which is in opposition to the majority of the membership of the Zionist Organization of America.


