PRESIDENT WEIZMANN SENDS CONGRATULATIONS TO JUDGE ROTHENBERG ON ELECTION TO U.P.A. POST

NEW YORK, March 13. (JTA) -- Characterizing 1949 as "a momentous year" for the Jews of Israel as well as for the thousands of homeless Jews still in the DP camps of Europe, President Chaim Weizmann of Israel yesterday expressed his "deep appreciation" over the election of Judge Morris Rothenberg as acting national chairman of the United Palestine Appeal and a national chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, a U.P.A. announcement revealed today.

In a cable to Judge Rothenberg, Dr. Weizmann voiced confidence that "American Jewry will rally behind you in providing necessary funds for the reception and absorption of hundreds of thousands now pouring into our new state." The Israeli President added that "the people of Israel are heartened to know that they will have your devoted services in this momentous year." Other congratulatory messages were also received from Israeli Premier David Ben Gurion; Eliezer Kaplan, Finance Minister; Leo Herrmann, secretary-general of the Palestine Foundation Fund in Jerusalem; Berl Locker, chairman of the Jewish Agency executive in Jerusalem; Henry Morgenthau, Jr., general chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, and numerous other Jewish leaders.

MOVEMENT TO DRAFT DR. ABBA HILLEL SILVER FOR Z.O.A. PRESIDENCY LAUNCHED IN MIAMI

MIAMI, March 13. (JTA) -- A movement to draft Dr. Abba Hillel Silver for the presidency of the Zionist Organization of America was launched here today following a meeting held last night and this morning by representatives of Miami Zionist districts and Zionist leaders from various parts of the country. The Z.O.A. will elect a new president at its next convention this summer.

Among those who participated in the meeting were Abraham Goldstein, of Hartford, Z.O.A. vice-president; Mortimer May, of Nashville, Z.O.A. vice-president; Milton Pollock, Z.O.A. finance chairman; Abe Goodman, of Miami, Z.O.A. vice-president; Morris Weinberg and I.R. Goodman, members of the Z.O.A. national executive.

A wire to Dr. Silver, dispatched at the conclusion of the meeting, urged him to accept the presidency of the Z.O.A. and pointed out that his leadership in behalf of Zionism at this critical juncture was indispensable.

N.Y.U. TO CONDUCT SUMMER WORKSHOP IN ISRAEL; PALESTINIAN LIFE TO BE STUDIED IN COLONY

NEW YORK, March 13. (JTA) -- New York University's School of Education will conduct a six-week "Workshop in Palestinian Life and Culture," it was announced today. Prof. Abraham I. Katsh, who will direct the workshop, said it would be held July 3-Aug. 23 at the Katzenbach Institute, Kfar Saba, Israel.

In addition to N.Y.U. officials, the workshop will be guided by representatives of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, the Katzenbach Institute and other co-operating institutions. The project will be conducted both in Hebrew and English.

PROF. ALBERT EINSTEIN TO CELEBRATE 70TH BIRTHDAY TODAY; UNESCO BROADCAST TO MARK EVENT

PRINCETON, N.J., March 13. (JTA) -- Prof. Albert Einstein will celebrate his 70th birthday here tomorrow. His fellow scientists plan to mark Dr. Einstein's birthday in a radio broadcast arranged by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.

4. Copies of these resolutions are to be forwarded to Dr. Neumann, Dr. Silver, Mr. Berle Locker of the Jewish Agency Executive, to Judge Morris Rothenberg, Acting Chairman of the United Palestine Appeal, to Prime Minister Ben Gurion, and Foreign Minister Moshe Sharet of Israel.

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

ISRAEL ACCEPTED INTO MEMBERSHIP IN INTERNATIONAL WHEAT CONFERENCE AT WASHINGTON PARLEY

WASHINGTON, March 17. (JTA) -- Israel was accepted into full membership in the International Wheat Conference here this afternoon. This is the first international trade organization to which Israel has been admitted with complete equality with other nations.

Membership will permit Israel to buy wheat for much less than she has been paying on the open market. Wheat heads the list of crucial shortages in Israel. It was estimated that Israel will save approximately \$2,000,000 in the next four years through its membership in the body.

Dr. Ludwig Samuel and Arthur C.A. Liverhant, both now attached to the Israeli embassy staff in Washington, were recognized by the conference as plenipotentiary delegates. The only votes opposing Israel's admission were those of Egypt, Lebanon, and Saudi Arabia.

GREEK FOREIGN OFFICE ANNOUNCES DECISION TO GRANT ISRAEL DE FACTO RECOGNITION

ATHENS, March 17. (JTA) -- The Government of Greece extended de facto recognition today to the state of Israel. Greece is the 47th country to recognize the Jewish state.

Panavoti Pipinellis, permanent Under-Secretary of the Greek Foreign Office, announced that his government had instructed the Greek consul at Tel Aviv to inform the Israeli Government of the extension of recognition.

(In Tel Aviv no official confirmation of the Greek announcement of the granting of recognition to Israel was available.)

HAITIAN GOVERNMENT RECOGNIZES STATE OF ISRAEL; BECOMES 48TH NATION TO DO SO

WASHINGTON, March 17. (JTA) -- The Republic of Haiti has officially recognized Israel, a spokesman for the Israeli embassy said today. This recognition brings the total to 48.

DR. SILVER ISSUES STATEMENT DECLINING DRAFT NOMINATION FOR PRESIDENCY OF Z.O.A.

CLEVELAND, March 17. (JTA) -- Dr. Abba Hillel Silver, chairman of the American Zionist Emergency Council, today issued a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency declining to be drafted for the presidency of the Zionist Organization of America. Dr. Silver's statement follows:

"I greatly appreciate the sentiments of those who would like to draft me for the presidency of the Zionist Organization of America. It is a high honor to be president of the Z.O.A. and a great responsibility, especially in the days ahead when our work in behalf of Israel will call for new methods and emphases and for utmost vigilance against the forces bent upon usurpation and liquidation. But I have already served as president for two terms, and I find it impossible to accept the office again."


At a meeting of our Executive Board of the Bensonhurst Zionist District #19, the following resolution was adopted:

## In Brief . . .

\* The assault upon the Zionist Organization of America by an odd coalition of assimilationists, professional fund-raisers and the Ben Gurion party in Israel has left grievous scars upon the status and influence of the strongest American Zionist group. The hands of the ZOA leaders are tied because of the perennial cries of the fund-raisers, who shed crocodile tears and plead that "you must not criticize us in the midst of a campaign for our dear brothers in the DP camps and the brave pioneers of the Jewish State." And indeed, Dr. Silver and Dr. Neumann have remained silent though bitter over one of the most infamous incidents in Jewish life when they were rebuffed and humiliated by Henry Morgenthau at the behest of Henry Montor. The ultimate aims of the Montors must be thwarted. We therefore agree with those leaders of the ZOA who have launched a "Draft Silver" movement that, because the organization has been struck a crippling blow, the leadership of Dr. Silver is indispensable at this time. This is no reflection on the qualifications of Daniel Frisch, Rabbi Miller and other potential candidates for the ZOA presidency. But, we believe, that with the Silver opponents seeking nothing less than the destruction of the ZOA, it is essential that his dynamic militant personality return to the helm to block the aims of that power-hungry clique that wishes to dominate Jewish affairs in all American communities and which stretches its gold-laden fingers to the inner chambers of Israel's government. The ZOA is reeling. Only Dr. Silver can restore it to its dominant position in American Jewish life.

### Back Strong FEPC Bill

The Fair Employment Practices measure that seems to have the best chance of winning in the legislature at this session is a wishy-washy affair with no enforcement agency provided. The Republican lawmakers are sponsoring the bill in the hope that it will silence demands for strong civil liberties legislation in the state. The Michigan Committee on Civil Rights, which has the support of the Detroit Jewish Community Council, and the Michigan region of the American Jewish Congress, have been urging individuals and groups to write letters to their state senators and representatives demanding that Gov. Williams' bill modeled after the effective New York statute be supported rather than the flabby Republican measure. The Community Council is ready to help organizations frame letters to the legislature. Call CH. 1657 for information. "Bigotry is respectable in the best circles," Oscar Cohen, retiring Council director, told the recent delegates meeting. "The best way to fight it outside of education is by means of legislation," he said. Groups and individuals in this community must join this struggle against ignorance and intolerance. Get your club or Synagogue to send a letter to the legislature endorsing the Williams measure.

### A Great Jew and Great American

"After a long life I still believe in one world and one humanity with freedom under law, with justice and peace for all peoples and races and faiths." This was the statement of faith of one of America's and Jewry's great—Dr. Stephen S. Wise—as he reached the age of 75. Dr. Wise has been one of the most active figures on the American Jewish and world scene for more than 50 years. An idealist by inclination and tradition, he has stood at the helm of every forward movement in the United States, fighting for the rights of the Jew, the Negro, the working man and the aggrieved everywhere, ringing his convictions with a voice and sincerity reminiscent of the ancient prophets of Israel. The voice of the golden orator of the earlier days still rings over the land and in every community where there are Jews. At 75 his voice is mellower. But his thoughts are sharper. The fervor of youth has given

way to the glow of wisdom and retrospection. The belief that was his as he first stepped on pulpit has crystallized into a profound faith—a faith in man and humanity which has remained unshaken even by the tragic events of our generation. Historians, sociologists and psychologists for years have been seeking the key to Jewish existence through the ages in face of adversity and persecution which would have ended the chapter of a less tenacious people. The explanations have been many. But in the end it was one factor which has largely been responsible for Jewish survival—faith. Read the history of the Jews since the dispersion and you find that the outstanding cohesive force in their lives was belief, belief in God, belief in redemption, belief in the basic goodness of man, belief in the ultimate emergence of a just society and belief in the return to Zion. Dr. Wise epitomizes that characteristic in Jewish life to the highest degree. Only a man of great faith could have said some four years ago, when the picture was still so blurred, that he will live to see the establishment of a Jewish state in Palestine. Dr. Wise's prophecy has been fulfilled, and probably the happiest moment in his life was when he received an invitation from President Weizmann to visit Israel. In a century which has witnessed so much destruction, Dr. Wise has been a builder. May the Lord strengthen his hands as a builder of Israel for many years to come.

### The Aqaba Incident

Legally the Aqaba incident is settled. Moshe Sharett has made it clear that the Israeli forces never crossed the Transjordan frontier, but moved only within the territory allotted to them by the UN partition decision and occupied the small port town of Elath on the Red Sea adjoining Aqaba. Even King Abdullah of Transjordan evidently agreed with this position because he had acquiesced to the signing of an armistice between his government and Israel after he had known of the so-called "incident" at Aqaba. The only reason the incident still corrodes minds and occupies much space in the British and world press is because it has revealed the ill-feeling, suspicion and undisguised antagonism which still exists in the British foreign office to Israel despite the recognition of the Jewish state. And this is quite serious, probably more so than all the opposition of the Arab countries.

### A Wise Ambassador

Here is a story that is worth repeating. It appeared in Robert Allen's column in Sunday's Detroit News: Shortly after being named Israeli ambassador to Washington, Eliahu Epstein announced that he had changed his name to Eliahu Elath, after his home town in Palestine. Later, another diplomat jestingly remarked to the Israeli envoy that he was following British practice. "You are like Sir Archibald Clark-Kerr, the former British ambassador to the United States," the diplomat said. "When he became a member of the House of Lords, he changed his name to Lord Inverchapel." "It may look that way," laughed Elath, "but there is no real similarity. In the first place, our parliament is unicameral. We have no House of Lords. Secondly, we recognize only one Lord."

### The Workers Give, Too

The International Ladies Garment Workers Union broke its own fine record of generosity by contributing a quarter of a million dollars to the UJA 1949 campaign. David Dubinsky in presenting the check to Henry Morgenthau said that the money did not come from the treasury of the union, but "donated by individual members in free-will collections raised in New York shops by workers regardless of racial origin and religious faith out of their good hearts for a great humanitarian cause."

## Anglo-Jewish Press Freer Than Yiddish

NEW YORK—The dean of Yiddish journalism, Dr. B. Hoffman of the Forward, better known as "Zivion" has utilized the occasion of the one hundredth anniversary of the English-Jewish press to make a comparison between the Yiddish and the English-Jewish press in this country. He came to the conclusion that the Yiddish press is incomparably higher than the English-Jewish. He summarizes the latter's centenary as a "jubilee of spiritual poverty."

Zivion is not only a veteran journalist and publicist, but also one of the few Yiddish newspaper men who have retained their independence of thought and expression after 50 years of writing for that press.

He has a clear mind, a succinct style and is probably one of the least biased Yiddish writers. From a person like that, one might have expected not only a more generous appraisal of the English-Jewish press on such an occasion, but at least, a truer and less shallow one.

### COMPARISON DIFFICULT

TO BEGIN WITH, no real comparison can be made between the Yiddish and the English-Jewish press. The two are entirely different products, produced by different people of different cultures.

The Yiddish press is a product

of eastern Europe which adapted itself to American conditions. At one time, about 40 to 50 years ago, it had high standards of social idealism, fine writing and good art.

It has done a great job in educating the East European immigrant and in preparing him for life in the United States.

It has a fine record in fostering good literature, poetry and the theater. It served the Yiddish speaking immigrant not only as a newspaper, but also as a magazine and in many cases took the place also of the book.

### TIMES ARE CHANGED

BUT THIS WAS long, long ago. For the last quarter of a century the Yiddish press in this country has been on the decline not only in circulation, but what is more important, spiritually, intellectually and literary.

With the exception of a few outstanding figures like "Zivion," himself, the vast majority of Yiddish journalists are not producing anything of their own.

# Prof. Einstein, at 70, Hailed as Symbol of Peace

AMONG THE MESSAGES of congratulation Prof. Albert Einstein received on his seventieth birthday was a telegram signed by the two outstanding playwrights in America, Arthur Miller, author of the "Death of a Salesman," and Clifford Odets whose most recent play "The Big Knife" is capturing Broadway.

The wire greeted Einstein, "as the symbol of peace and the rallying inspiration for those who strive to prevent a third world war."

Both Miller and Odets are members of the American Committee of Jewish Writers, Artists and Scientists of which Albert Einstein is the honorary president since its inception.

THE EVER YOUNG Stephen S. Wise, who last week celebrated his 75th birthday, proved the other day that he is still the most courageous advocate of freedom of the pulpit.

In this atmosphere of hysteria, when men of the church dare not oppose the edicts of big business, Wise made an unequivocal statement, supporting the two Christian ministers, Mellish, father and son, who are



under fire, because the son is the chairman of the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship.

Wise, when a young man, refused the invitation of the wealthy Temple Emanuel of New York, rejecting the authority of the trustees of the Temple, who were used to control their Rabbis. The spiritual leadership of Stephen S. Wise, should serve as an inspiration to our younger Rabbis, who are too silent in these turbulent days.

THERE ARE MORE than rumors to the effect that David Wahl, the executive director of the former Americans for Haganah, is slated for the position of administrative head of the Zionist Progressive Committee, the Lipsky-Wise group that intends to make a fight for the leadership of the Zionist Organization.

Morris Margulies, one-time secretary of the ZOA, who until now carried the responsibility of the committee, is said to be tired and eager to withdraw. Wahl is able, efficient and imaginative. He should prove a shot in the arm of the rather lethargic, drifting opposition.

Without Montor's UJA victory, the Progressive committee would hardly be visible on the Zionist map.

BEVIN'S BOARD of strategy is preparing trouble for the Israel government. UN Representative Eban

will have to be on his toes to avoid great difficulties at Lake Success. . . . Dorothy Thompson is peeved and has lost all her interest in the Jewish State. She no longer cares whether Jewish organizations book her for speeches. . . . Ted Thackrey, editor of the New York Post, is packing his bags for a trip to Israel. Which reminds us that the prospects for the tourist season this summer in Israel are exceedingly bright. American business is very much interested in trade with Israel.

One of America's best selling authors is leaving for Israel in May to produce and direct a full length movie feature. . . .

The world Zionist congress, this summer will be an anti-climax since it will have no say on state matters in Israel. The next big Zionist move in the U.S., will be a national campaign for Chalutzim to Israel. . . .

The oil interests in America are making overtures to the Jewish State and are ready to spend big money to cement friendship between Israel and Saudi Arabia.

Prof. Einstein has definitely refused an invitation from the Israeli government to settle in Israel. . . . The Habimah in Israel is on the downgrade and badly in need of a new repertory. . . . Now that the food campaign for Israel is about to close in this country, the Bnai Brith is looking for a new cause to continue its fund raising activities.

### Fear Bevin May Seek to Bar Israel at UN

BEVIN WOULD like nothing better than see a break in the Israeli-Transjordan armistice talks.

He is to visit Washington next month. Should no settlement be reached by then he will try to sell Secretary of State Acheson a number of his ideas on the Palestine question.

Don't be surprised if he makes a dramatic appearance before the General Assembly in a plea against Israel's admission to the UN. Calm advisors have urged him against such a move. But Bevin is known to follow only Bevin's advice.

He still hopes to torpedo the current Rhodes talks. Resumption of fighting, he believes, would give him an opening to have the UN reconsider its own settlement of the issue.

#### REGRETS DEPARTURE

HE IS A pipedreamer with all the habits of that clan. His new line is that it was a mistake of Britain to have yielded the mandate and gotten out of Palestine.

He has told American diplomats in London that there were certain military miscalculations when the British cabinet decided to throw the Palestine baby into the laps of the UN.

The miscalculations are evident. He and his anti-Jewish clique believed Arab might would solve the problem before the UN could reach a decision. Bevin still cannot see Israel as a fact and is looking for pretexts to embarrass and harass the new State. His ambition is to thwart establishment of friendly relations between Israel and the neighboring Arab states.

The "war scare" his foreign office created had one purpose, to create confusion and restore strain.

#### PLUG FOR SECRETARY

WHEN MY SECRETARY recently read about the two New

York "goyim" who became converted to Judaism she said they must have really been "meshugim."

One of the converts, Arthur Vendetti, was raised on the East Side among Jews.

He adopted Judaism under the impact of the establishment of Israel.

The other convert, Frank Bolan, was an Alabaman who never met a Jew before coming into contact with Jews in German DP camps. What he saw impressed him so much that he decided there and then to become a Jew some day. When the well-decorated Bolan returned from the war he settled in New York City in order to closely familiarize himself with Jews and Jewish life.

One of Bolan's brothers is serving in the U. S. Marine Corps guarding the U.S. consulate in Jerusalem. His brother often wrote admiringly of Jewish accomplishments in Israel.

Both converts are looking forward anxiously to the day when they set foot on Israeli soil.

### 3,116 Jewish Children Still in Christian Hands

AMSTERDAM (WNS)—Disclosure that 3,116 Jewish children who had been placed for safety under Nazi occupation were still living with their Christian benefactors was made in a report released by a Dutch commission.

Most of the children are no longer aware of their Jewish origin. Those who did not forget their ancestry are generally permitted to visit Synagogues and to join Zionist youth groups.

The vast majority of the children have become so attached to their benefactors that they refuse to part with them.



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

The question of the ZOA presidency has been solved this week in a somewhat unexpected manner in the unanimous endorsement, by the top leaders of the ZOA, of Mr. Daniel S. Frisch as the banner bearer for the next two years. This public endorsement by Dr. Emanuel Neumann and Dr. Abba Hillel Silver automatically does away with all other candidates and practically amounts to the election of Mr. Frisch. But it also means, according to reliable information, that Mr. Frisch will not follow a different line of policy from that of the old administration, and that the fears that existed that the ZOA will turn reactionary under the new president are groundless. Mr. Frisch, his friends say, has changed with the new times, as did many other leading Zionists and Jews, with the emergence of the Jewish State, and he will not make any radical changes in the administration but will strive to unite all sections of the ZOA. There are even rumors that some members of the oppositionist "Progressive" Zionists will join the majority in voting for him.

An interesting report on Israel was given by Mr. Robert Gamzey, editor of the Intermountain Jewish News of Denver, who has just returned from a tour of Israel and stopped over in New York. Mr. Gamzey belongs to the younger type of American Jewish editors who are taking their journalism as a social responsibility, not merely as a source of income, and who are attempting to introduce American methods and American tolerance into the Jewish press in English. According to Mr. Gamzey, the prevailing mood in Israel now is that of optimism, self-confidence, self-assertion, bordering almost on expansionism. The average Israeli, native, old-timer, or new arrival, is convinced that there is nothing in the world that Israel cannot achieve militarily, economically, culturally and in every field of human endeavor. There is a certain cock-sureness about these people which might become dangerous, if it were not controlled and disciplined by a level-headed and progressive leadership.

The Israelis have a terribly wrong conception of American Jews. Most of them believe sincerely that the good and prosperous days of American Jewry are counted. Sooner or later there will be persecution and even pogroms in America and American Jews will have to look for refuge in Israel. They are so obsessed with the tragedy of Germany that they are certain that the Hitler process will be repeated in the U.S. For this reason they do not hesitate to demand that American Jews should transfer every thing that they have of their worldly goods to Israel before the pogroms start, in form of investments, contributions and skilled labor.

Religion does not play the important part in Israel as Mizrachi propagandists try to make believe. The average Israeli, native and immigrant, is completely indifferent to institutionalized religion. Only the Sabbath, Yom-Kipur and "Yizkor" (Memorial services) are generally observed. Otherwise the Synagogues are empty, or they are filled with old Jews, or with Jews from backward Arab countries who are becoming one of the difficult problems of Israel. A new and rather interesting theory prevails in Israel about religion, according to Mr. Gamzey, one which is best described in his words. "Over and over again", he said "you hear young people saying: 'Religion was necessary to keep the Jewish people together during two thousand years of Dispersion. Now, that we have the Jewish State and a land of our own, we do not need religion any more. Those old people who want it can have it, but it is not for us.'"

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver has confirmed his forthcoming resignation from the chairmanship of the American Zionist Emergency Council which he held since 1943. This is the third withdrawal from Zionist activites in the last few months by the famous Zionist leader. The first was his resignation from the Jewish Agency; the second was his withdrawal of the candidacy for the presidency of the ZOA. Now this. The Emergency Council itself is on the verge of being liquidated.
