It was found that the very meager resources of the Society will not justify any contributions to the Youth Commission or to any other worthy cause. It was decided, however, to appoint a very active chairman who will endeavor through the year to raise as much as possible for the work of your Co mission. The Society, however, cannot commit itself to any specified amount. It was also suggested that the members of the Zionist Youth Commission themselves try to raise the budget of the Commission in the community by individual solicitation.
