

I feel certain you will deem it an honor, as I do, to participate in this tribute to a great American statesman in his 80th year.



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Dear Rabbi Silver:

I have been thinking recently about the terribly explosive situation in the Middle East. It seems to me that there is enormous danger of violence crupting there which could spread and cause the very destruction of civilization itself.

It seems to me that the United States will probably build up the Arab nations because the United States needs oil and that the Russians will build up the Arabs in order to cause trouble.

If this analysis is right, in the long run Israel's best hope for security lies in the United Nations. Would it not therefore be in Israel's best interests to urge her not only to allow the present UN Emergency Force on her side of the border of the Gaza Strip but actually to urge that this force be built up and invited to patrol all of Israel's borders?

I know that the above is not in line with the thinking of Israel's leaders. I wonder, however, if it would not be desirable for the leaders to begin to think along these lines both in Israel's self-interest and for the security of the civilized world?

Boston Herele - now 4 1957

Wiley Insists U.S. Maintain Freedom for State of Israel

Sen. Wiley (R-Wis.) said lest night at the Amerisan Zionist Fund Dinner in the Hotel Somerset that the United States seeks friendship with all Mid-East nations but must be "unalterably committed to the maintenance of the independence of the State of Israel."

Wile: , chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. spoke before more than 1,000 persons who attended the dinner aponsored by the 52 districts of the New England Zionist Region.

Other speakers were Sen. Morse (D-Ore.) and Dore Schary, writer and motion picture producer.

Wiley said we should use our best efforts toward the "sanctity of its (Israel's) border against direct aggression in the form of open invasion, or so-called 'indirect aggression' in the form of terrorist attacks or thefts by marauders."



Its officers are willing and eager to continue their support, but on such a drastically reduced financial basis, it is necessary for us to appeal to the friends of the publication for their support, if the magazine is to live.

We believe that you would agree with us that the discontinuance of JUDAISM would be a confession of bankruptcy of Jewish intellectual life in America. JUDAISM is, as you are aware, the single undenominational Jewish journal devoted to a high level presentation of current thinking of the issues that make up the core of our faith and heritage.

We are writing to you in the hope that you can, out of some fund at your disposal, make a contribution of \$100. and thus help assure the uninterrupted publication of JUDAISM. There has been a rather substantial ground swell of opinion in the congregation that more weddings should be performed at the Temple, and that the objection has been that the reception following the wedding ceremony could not include alcoholic beverages.

The Board of Trustees is reviewing this policy now. I would greatly appreciate it if you would tell me what the practice is at The Temple.

Dear Rabbi Silver:

I am aware that Israel Chipkin was a fellow member of yours at the Dr. Herzl Zion Club all the way back in the first years of this century. Msny of us take great pride, as I am sure you do, in the records of those of you who first banded together as young boys in a love of Hebrew culture and in devotion to the highest ethical principles of Judaism.

Some twenty years ago Dr. Chipkin interested the ladies of Ivriah in the establishment of a nursery school based on a bi-cultural and bi-lingual pattern. This chool was named Beth Hayeled. It has flourished and has had a very salutary influence on the development of Jewish education not only in New York City but elsewhere as well. Within the past year, based on the same principles which impelled Dr. Chipkin toward the formation of Beth Hayeled, the School has been expanded to a full Day School program up to the end of the Junior High School years. It has honored itself in paying tribute to Dr. Chipkin, by taking his name.

The Israel Chipkin School is a pilot program in integrated education. It is one of the few schools in the country, if not the only one, which is trying to forge new educational tools, and create new settings within which to carry out a bi-cultural (and bi-lingual) education of young Jewish children which will give them a sense of unity and of belonging to both cultures of which they are a part.

Precisely because it does not attempt to speak for a specific Jewish ideology, but rather concerns itself (at the children's level) with lasting and meaningful Jewish and other cultural values, it is different from any parochial school.

New educational techniques have had to be devised, and are continuing to emerge, in line with the unique educational philosophy, which permeates the School. Teachers whose general pedagogical background may be excellent have had to be retrained. This involves educational research, writing of new books for teaching teachers, development of

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver page 2 March 18, 1958 special lectures, etc. Im many cases, present books or teaching tools for imparting educational content to the dildren are not adequate to the needs of the School. This means that new texts and other teaching materials for the children have to be created. Because this type of program has such significance for the future education of American-Sewish children, it must constantly be evaluated, and developed along these lines which appear to be most fruitful. 24 We are presently engaged in the creation of a Development Fund, to serve as a sound financial foundation for the future of the School. We would be most grateful if you could bring to our attention the names of those individuals who knew Dr. Chipkin and who might be sympathetic to the program upon which we are embarked, with a view to inviting them to join with us in the establishment of this living memorial to a most wonderful merson. We would be honored if you would permit us to list you as a sponsor of The Israel Chipkin School Development Committee, indicating your own personal interest in Dr. Chipkin and in the work which he so brilliantly executed.
