

My dear Doctor Silver:

It is a distinct privilege for me to extend to the delegates of the United Palestine Appeal assembled in Philadelphia a hearty welcome, and I offer my profoundest wishes for the success of your Conference.

I am deeply impressed with the purposes that animate your meeting--to assist in the War effort, and at the same time, to consider a Post-War program. As War-time Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, I am confronted with similar problems. We are at present mobilizing all our resources with one objective in view, and that is, to win the War speedily and successfully, but we are not unmindful of the problems that will face us when peace comes and we are laying our plans so that we may be ready to handle the difficult problems which will come in the wake of the peace.

Even though curbed by a limited policy in effectuating the Balfour Declaration, the Jewish people have performed a miraculous piece of work in agriculture, science, culture and government in Palestine, the original National home of the Jewish race.

In your letter to me you state:

"We all hope that when the horror of this present war is forgotten, there will flourish in Palestine a home where the wandering, disinherited, harrassed Jews who have no permanent haven will at last find peace and freedom in their ancestral homeland."

I heartily concur in this sentiment. In this great World War in which we are engaged, we welcome efforts such as are promoted by the United Palestine Appeal and allied movements toward re-building Palestine not only as a haven of refuge, but as a homeland in accordance with the Scripture.

It is an American ideal to support all freedom-loving peoples in their strivings toward self-realization, and I feel sure that the Jewish people of America, by supporting your movement, will enhance the dignity and honor which they have contributed to their native land. As Governor and profound believer in the American Way of Life, I want you all to know that I bid you Godspeed in your efforts for making Palestine a reality for the Jewish people.

THE NAZI BARBARIANS DECREE THE EXTERMINATION OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE IN EVERY COUNTRY. THIS IS A CHALLENGE TO THE FUNDAMENTAL DOCTRINES AND BELIEFS OF THE ENGLISH SPEAKING PEOPLES TO THE TRADITIONS OF FREEDOM AND JUSTICE, NO LESS THAN TO THE PRINCIPLES OF THE MAGNA CARTA DECLARATION AND THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE. WILL THEY REFUSE TO ACCEPT THE CHALLENGE?

IN THE DARKEST DAYS OF THE LAST WAR THE BALFOUR DECLARATION CON-TAINED AN EXPLICIT PROMISE TO THE JEWISH PROPLE WOULD BECOME THE CITY OF REFUGE AND A NATIONAL HOME. THIS PROMISE HAS STILL TO BE IMPLEMENTED. AT PRESENT IT IS HEDGED AROUND WITH ALL SORTS OF RESTRICTIONS WHICH PREVENT THE FREE FLOW OF JEWISH IMMIGRANTS INTO THE COUNTRY. THESE RESTRICTIONS HAVE PLAYED INTO THE HANDS OF HITLER AND THE TERRORISTS AND THEY ARE THE LAST SHREDS OF THE FOLICY OF APPEASEMENT WHICH BROUGHT THE UNITED NATIONS TO THE VERGE OF DISASTER. THEY CAN ONLY BE REMOVED BY THE COMBINED ACTION OF THE ENGLISH SPEAKING PEOPLES. IT FOLLOWS THAT ALL AMERICAN AND BRITISE CITIZENS WHO STILL CHERISH THE PRINCIPLES AND THATHITLERS CHALLENGE BE ACCEPTED AND THE GATES OF PALESTINE AT ONCE THROWN OPEN TO JEWISH IMMIGRANTS AND REFUGEES FROM ALL PARTS OF THE WORLD.

MESSAGE TO THE UNITED PALESTINE APPEAL

From Lord Melchett

IT IS BECOMING CLEARER THAT OUR GENERATION IS WITNESS TO THE SLOW UNFOLDING OF A PERIOD UNPARALLELED FOR ITS TRAGEDY IN THE HISTORY OF OUR PEOPLE. WE CAN ONLY HOPE THAT THE MASSACRES INITIATED BY THE GERMAN GOVERNMENT IN 1942 AND 1943 WILL MARK THE CLIMAX OF THIS EPOCH AND THE REACTION WHICH APPEARS TO HAVE SET IN THROUGHOUT EUROPE AND AMONG THE UNITED NATIONS, SIGNALIZED BY THE GREAT TRIBUTE PAID BY THE BRITISH HOUSE OF COMMONS TO THE SUFFERINGS OF THE JEWISH PEOPLE, WILL BE SUSTAINED AND WILL GO FROM STRENGTH TO STRENGTH WITH AS MUCH ENERGY AND VIGOR AS THE WICKED ANTI-SEMITIC DOCUMENTS FLOURISHED IN THE PAST DECADE.

WHETHER THIS IS TRUE OR WHETHER GREAT DISASTERS STILL TO BEFALL ARE HIDDEN FROM US TODAY, BUT IN EITHER EVENT THE WORK OF BUILDING PALESTINE IS OF PRIME IMPORTANCE. THERE CAN BE NO OTHER ANSWER TO THE PERSECUTED MASSES OF EUROPEAN JEWRY OR TO THE WORLD AT LARGE THAN THE SETTLEMENT OF THE JEWS UPON THEIR OWN LAND IN THEIR OWN COUNTRY.

THERE IS NO OTHER COUNTRY THAT CAN HEAL THE JEWS BOTH IN BODY AND SOUL. THEREFORE IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT THE JEWISH COMMUNITY OF PALESTINE BE MAINTAINED, INCREASED AND SUPPORTED WITH THE UTMOST POWER WE CAN SUMMON AT THIS TIME IN ORDER THAT WE MAY OBTAIN AND DEVELOP THAT SOIL WITHOUT WHICH ALL OTHER SCHEMES ARE FRUITLESS.

The National Conference for Palestine, comprising representatives of American Jewry meeting in Philadelphia on May 2, 1943 under the auspices of the United Palestine Appeal to further the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home in Palestine,

Pledges to the President of the United States our wholesouled devotion to the winning of the war and all our resources of life and property to the end that victory may bespeeded for the United States and for all the United Nations, and

Sends greetings to all our men and women in the Armed services, and also records with pride their gallantry and heroism.

RESOLUTION ON GREETINGS TO THE YISHUV

This National Conference for Palestine, convened by the United Palestine Appeal, sends its affectionate greetings to the Yishuv.

The Yishuv is making a mighty contribution to the cause of the United Nations. By its labor and blood it is still further sanctifying the soil of Palestine, and strengthening the historic link between the Jewish people and its ancestral home.

We at this National Conference for Palestine pledge all our resources of spirit and support to the task of realizing the goal which the Yishuv and we have in common: the creation of a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine to which may come all Jews who wish to do sound which, in turn, will strengthen the foundations of Jewish life throughout the world.

RESOLUTION ON THE WHITE PAPER

WHEREAS, in May, 1939 the British Government issued an official White Paper for the explicit purpose of terminating Jewish immigration at the end of five years, and thus in effect limited the Mandate for Palestine and terminated the growth of the Jewish National Home; and

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WHEREAS, the White Paper thus issued is an illegal document in that it is in effect a unilateral denunciation of a covenant, and the new policy of the British Government is in contravention of its trusteeship under the Mandate with respect to the Jewish National Home; and

WHEREAS, Winston Churchill, now Prime Minister of Great Britain, voted against the said White Paper in the House of Commons, declaring that he regarded the new policy as an act of repudiation and that the provision that Jewish immigration could not continue without the consent of the Arab population was a breach of faith; and

WHEREAS, the Permanent Mandates Commission in June, 1939 held that the new policy of the White Paper viol ted all the interpretations of the Mandate heretofore made by the Permanent Mandates Commission, the Council of the League of Nations, and the Eritish Government; and

WHEREAS, the Government of the United States gave its endorsement of the Balfour Declaration in 1917; assented to the award of the Palestine Mandate to Great Britain in 1922; subsequently entered into a treaty with Great Britain in which it was agreed that no modification or change in the status of Palestine would be made without its prior consent,--

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this National Conference for Palestine condemn the Palestine White Paper of 1939 as illegal, unjust and inhuman, and calls upon the Government of the United States to make representations to Great Britain forthwith to annul the White Paper of 1939 and to ask for assurances that Jewish immigration into Palestine shall not be abridged nor shall the purchase of land by Jews be restricted.

RESOLUTION ON THE BERMUDA CONFERENCE

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WHEREAS, in response to the demand of the peoples of the United Nations that immediate steps be taken looking toward the relief of the plight of the Jews of Germany, Nazi-occupied and controlled countries, a Conference of representatives of the Governments of the United States and Great Britain has recently been held in Bermuda, and

WHEREAS, the terms of reference to such Conference were so restricted in scope and authority as to make it powerless to take effective measures to carry out its original purposes, and

WHEREAS the Conference has failed to announce acceptance of the offer of the Jewish Community of Palestine to receive and provide for such jews, and

WHEREAS, the situation of the Jews of Germany and Nazi-occupied and controlled countries grows steadily in tragic proportions threatening their utter destruction by hunger and disease and massacra, and

WHEREAS, Palestine by reason of its geographical position and the anxious desire and readiness of the Jews of that country to do all that is possible to care for their brethren and to provide for their rehabilitation, can be made the haven of refuge for hundreds of thousandsof them, and

WHEREAS the Jews of the free countries of the world are prepared to assist the Jews of Palestine in assuming the responsibility of caring for their fellow Jews,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved that this Conference calls upon the governments of the United States and Great Britain to take immediate measures for the implementation of far-reaching plans of rescue; and that immediate advantage be taken to save large numbers of the Jews in Germany, Nazi-occupied and controlled countries through their transfer to Palestine.

RESOLUTION ON A JEWISH ARMY

This Conference reaffirms its deep interest in and approval of the organization of a Jewish Army in Palestine, to be comprised of citizens of Palestine and stateless Jews residing in that country, such army to be officered by Jews and to be incorporated in the armed forces of the United Nations.

We desire further to express our protest against the denial of these just demands of the Jewish people of Palestine.
