AHS Filo February 5, 1944 (Get O'Pounell Column) His Excellency The Ambassador of Great Britain, The British Embassy. Washington, D. C. My dear Mr. Ambassador: My attention was drawn to the column of Mr. John O'Donnell called "Capitol Stuff" which appeared in the Washington Times Herald of February 4th, and which purports to be a report by way of a running commentary on things which I said at a Press Conference held in Washington last Thursday. I felt so disturbed by the inaccuracies and distortions of this column that I immediately telephoned to Mr. Berlin to express my sentiments and to a pprise him of just what was said by me. I am enclosing, herewith, a copy of a letter which I addressed this morning to Mr. O'Donnell. Should questions arise about this particular columnist's report, I would appreciate it if you would make the true facts known to your government.
