STATEMENT BY SENATOR WAGNER

I feel it my duty to address myself publicly and frankly to the Jewish community and the leaders of Jewish public opinion in this country. My record as a defender of Jewish rights and in support of the Zionist cause and other Jewish causes is sufficiently well known. For that reason I am confident that what I have to say will be received as the utterance of a sincere friend of the Jewish people and will not be subject to any misinterpretation.

For the past three years, since early 1941. I have served as Chairman of the American Palestine Committee. I have not only served as its Chairman but actually took the initiative in bringing about its organization. I did so on my own responsibility but with the knowledge and approval of the leaders of the Zionist movement, with whom I personally and the Committee have acted kept in close contact ever since its organization. From the start our Committee was remarkably successful in enlisting the support and adherence of outstanding figures in American public life, from among members of Congress, Government officials, the clergy, academic circles, writers and intellectuals and civic and business leaders. The membership roll of the Committee includes two-thirds of the members of the U. S. Senate, more than 200 members of the House of Representatives, more than 20 Governors of state, leaders of both political parties as well as of the great labor organizations, and thousands of othermembers throughout the country. I doubt whether any other cause or movement can show among its supporters such a cross-section of American opinion as is represented in the American Palestine Committee. The record of the Committee is also well known on every important issue which has arisen regarding Palestine. It has taken a clear and vigorous stand and has given its fullest support to the legitimate demands of the Jewish people and the Zionist leadership on the question of a Jewish military force, on the admission of refugees to Palestine, on the revocation of the White Paper, on the demand for a Jewish Commonwealth.

More recently I, together with Senator Taft, introduced a Resolution in the Senate calling for the free entry of Jews into Palestine and its establishment as a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth, and though action on the Resolution has been deferred at the request of the War Department, we have seen to it that the Resolution is neither withdrawn nor tabled nor killed. It is alive and will be kept alive, to be taken up again at the first favorable opportunity.

Moreover, our Committee has carried on a ceaseless campaign of education on behalf of the Jewish National Home through the press, through public dinners and meetings, through speeches delivered by our members in all parts of the country, by speeches on the floor of the Senate and of the House of Representatives. In all modesty I believe I can claim that the American Palestine Committee has contributed greatly towards the creation of a climate of opinion favorable to Zionist aspirations. Our activity has become a political factor widely commented upon and seriously reckoned with not only by our own government but by other governments as well.

My attention has now been drawn to the fact that a new body is being organized under the name of "American League for a Free Palestine."

Many members of the American Palestine Committee have received invitations to join this new organization and have come to me perplexed and confused.

They do not understand any more than I do why they are asked to join a new organization having substantially the same object in view, and why any such organization is necessary at all.

It is obvious, of course, that the initiators and promoters of this new organization, described as non-partisan in character, are a group of Jews who for some reason which I do not understand are not associated with any of the responsible Jewish organizations which have long been recognized by the Christian public as representing the Jews in this country, such as the American Jewish Congress, the Zionist Organization, the American Jewish Conference, the Bnai Brith, etc.

I do not question the right of any group of Jews or of any imividual to undertake to initiate such a movement on their own responsibility and to appeal for Christian support, but as a friend of the Jewish cause, I am deeply concerned and distressed over the increasing and bewildering multiplicity of committees purporting to act on behalf of the Jewish people and undertaking political activity in Washington. We have been approached in the past by the Committee for a Jewish Army and the Committee to Rescue the Jewish People of Europe, and many of us were disposed to cooperate with them out of sympathy with these causes, despite many misgivings. This last attempt, however, to set up a new Committee or League for Palestine is the most distressing evidence of us disunity and rivalry that we have yet had. It is obvious that such a body must necessarily "compete" with the American Palestine Committee for public support. It must either duplicate our activities or else nullify our efforts by following a divergent policy. All of this can only result in confusion and possibly in alienating the sympathies of many persons who are unable to follow the complicated currents in internal Jewish affairs.

If there are any persons, whether Jews or Christians, who wish to help the cause of a Jewish Palestine, I see no reason why they should not come to us and offer their cooperation and work in close harmony with the American Palestine Committee. I would point out that there is in existence a Christian Council for Palestine consisting largely of Christian clergymen. While they constitute a distinct entity, they maintain the closest relations with our Committee and cooperate on common programs and projects. An illustration of such cooperation was the successfully conducted National Conference on Palestine held in Washington on March 9th. I therefore say to my Jewish friends throughout the country: Beware of splitting up your energies and dissipating

your influence by establishing competing and conflicting organizations.

The direction of public effort and action on behalf of Palestine requires a high degree of responsibility and prudence as well as courage and vigor.

The cause may be endangered by divergent policies or ill-considered action.

After twenty years of undeviating support and service of the Zionist cause,

I issue this solemn warning and advice: Unite your forces; refrain from fragmentation; avoid confusion; do not discourage your tried and trusted friends. However dark the moment, I am confident that we shall see the dawn of a new day and the successful outcome of our struggle.
