Dear Leonard:

I have neither made a donation to the Extension Fund, nor have I done any work in connection with same, as frankly, I am not sold on this idea. I may be wrong, but it seems to me that the objective of the Extension Fund is simply getting across the whys and wherefores of the Zionist Organization and its work and objectives. That, of course, is the best answer to the propaganda of the American Council for Judaism, Inc. If this is true, then why should we create another organization to do this job?

This is a job that should have been done, and should be done now, by the Zionist Organization, as such. I believe one of our troubles has been, and is, that we create a new organization to handle every little thing that comes up, thereby duplicating both work and personnel. It also makes it necessary to go to practically the same people all the time, with requests for funds, and requests that seemingly are trivial. While \$100,000.00 may seem large, after all, it is not much for the whole United States.

In my opinion, the Zionist Organization is wasting a fine opportunity, by not going out and getting additional memberships that would bring in probably several times the \$100,000.00 requested, based on the plain truth that the American Council for Judaism, Inc. has made it necessary for the Zionists to defend their position and the most necessary work they are doing, which the American Council for Judaism, Inc. is attempting to sabotage. Even now, a certain amount of dues is coming in for the Zionist Organization, without additional membership, and I do not see why this money should not be used for propaganda purposes in the same way as you propose to use the money you are seeking to collect thru a separate drive.

In my opinion, something has been radically wrong all the time with the approach of the Zionist Organization, since they have not received the support of the ~~Zionist Organization~~ younger elements of our people. Zionism and Palestine (which are practically one and the same) is a pioneering job and should appeal to the pioneering instincts of our people, and especially to the younger generation. That it has not done so, is probably due to the fact that we have not presented it to them in just this way. So this very attack by the American Council for Judaism may really be a blessing in disguise, if it will force us to be more aggressive in our approach, and present our cause to more people.

Again I say that I think the Zionist Organization of America would be losing an opportunity, if they did not seek additional memberships and do this work thru the Zionist Organization, rather than thru the Extension Fund.

I further believe that a distinct mistake has been made in having Dr. Heller make speeches attacking the anti-Zionist group here, and in other parts of the country. Not that they should not be attacked, but since Dr. Heller has been made head of the United Palestine Appeal, it seems to me he should be entirely neutral as far as the Zionist aspect of the Jewish homeland is concerned. I believe it is his job to seek the support of both non-Zionists and anti-Zionists in the upbuilding of Palestine, regardless of what their position might be concerning the political angle of Palestine. In other words, his job should be the uniting of all elements favorable to the upbuilding of Palestine, and he should not concern himself about our differences, only to concentrate on our common desires in this respect.

To sum up, I do not think there was ever any justification for a new organization, as the work could have been done, and should have been done, by the Zionist Organization of America, and I am still of that opinion, although I am, of course, open to other angles of the situation that I may have overlooked.

Dear Mr. Lee:

Speaking in Dallas last month before the Regional Meeting of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, the eminent Dr. Barnett Brickner of Cleveland said: "It does not matter whether or not there is a Jewish Commonwealth in Palestine. The only thing that matters is how quickly we can get these people out of Europe and into Palestine. All other issues are unimportant." Dr. Brickner had just returned from a 40,000 mile trip overseas, as one of three clergy representatives sent by the President to visit our armed forces.

The late Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis was undoubtedly the greatest Jew of this era and certainly no one could question his patriotism, love of country, or his American citizenship. He said: "It is the duty of every right thinking Jew to become a member of the Zionist organization."

There are 600,000 Jewish refugees in Palestine. The Zionist Organization initiated this humanitarian program and has always been the motivating force behind it. We certainly do not want the scattered, hounded remnant of a once flourishing European Jewry to remain homeless wanderers. They are in dire need of our help and the least that any of us can do at this time is to become a member of the Zionist Organization of America and give that body our support.

Local membership is now 300. This list must be doubled. To that end you are asked to sign the enclosed application and check, and mail them back immediately.

My dear Dr. Goldstein:

Mr. Goldburg of San Antonio was in to see me this morning. He asked my opinion about a letter which the Zionists of San Antonio are about to send out as part of their membership campaign, which is to be signed by three leading Jewish citizens of that city. I am enclosing, herewith, copy of the draft of the letter. I told him, of course, that it is a palpable deception and people should not be inveigled into membership in the ZOA on any such false representation of what the Zionist movement stands for. He asked for a statement from me to that effect. I told him that I was not the head of the ZOA and that any statement on this should logically come from the President of the ZOA.

The President of the San Antonio Zionist District is Mr. Max Rosenman (a brother, I understand, of Judge Rosenman). His address is 739 West Commerce Street.

Mr. Goldburg also told me that Rabbi Binstock is coming to San Antonio within a week or so for the American Council for Judaism. I understand that Rabbi Heller had visited San Antonio not so long ago. I am wondering whether the Texas field is being adequately covered by the new department which the ZOA established to counteract the propaganda of the Council.

GENERAL RESOLUTION

The Zionist Organization of America, assembled in annual convention, reaffirms its adherence to the Biltmore Program, calling for the reconstitution of Palestine as a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth. That this is the program of American Jewry is evidenced by its adoption in the Palestine resolution of the American Jewish Conference. That this program has the support of the American people is attested by the President of the United States in his historic and inspiring message to this convention.

I

The tragic need of the masses of Jews who have survived the brutal terror of Hitler aggression demands that the doors of Palestine be opened at once to unrestricted Jewish immigration and land colonization, and we request the United States government to use its good offices with the Mandatory Power to that end.

In view of the Palestine planks adopted by the Democratic and Republican parties, the declaration of President Roosevelt, the recent statement of Governor Thomas E. Dewey, and the official announcement by Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson that congressional action should now be determined upon by the political rather than the military basis. We urge early adoption by the Congress of the United States of resolutions calling for the opening of Palestine to unrestricted Jewish immigration and land purchase and the reconstitution of Palestine as a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth.

II

We demand that the free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth to be established shall embrace the whole of Palestine, undivided and undiminished.

III

In the restoration and rehabilitation of the many peoples who have been devasted and decimated by the Axix aggressors, special attention should be given to the needs of the Jewish people, which has been the major victim of their ruthlessness. We urge the United Nations to extend to the Jewish people, through its constituted agencies the economic, technical, and financial assistance required for the transfer of the maximum number of Jewish settlers to Palestine and for the creation of the economic conditions requisite to their integration into that country.

We urge that in the discussions by international bodies charged with the responsibilities involving the rights and interests of the Jewish people in relation to Palestine, duly accredited representatives of the Zionist movement shall be accorded voice and status.


IV

The Jewish people must also now be granted the indispensable conditions for its reconstruction and re-establishment -- unrestricted immigration in Palestine, and Palestine as a free and democratic Jewish Commonwealth.




