## Bercovici, Re: Quoddy, Maine, 1947.

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Bercover Denited States Senate WASHINGTON, D. C.

Dear Julius :

If as you intimated last night, you do go to Cleveland, it might be a good idea to talk with Dr. Silver on a matter of interest to Senator Brewster as well as to Dr. Silver .

June - 1947

Here is the matter in brief : Thewar left the village of Quoddy, on the coast of Maine, destitute. Hundreds of its people are without gainful occupation, which has caused the Senator Bonsiderable concern .

Now comes a man named Frank Cohen , about whom the world of Jewry ought to know much more than it does, presenting a constructive plan which embraces not only the well being of the inhabitants of that village, but hundreds of Displaced Persons . Cohen isan industrialist with a background of success in meth his own field and that of humanitarian endeavor. H has suggested that one of his plants, one in which he manufactures tractors, be moved to Quddyy Maine for the purpose also of training Displaced Persons, at a rate of about four hundread and every six months, which would bring under special State "epartment permit, about eight hundred such persons a year . These trainees would , at the end of their educational period , be transferred to some South American country, such as Brazil, Paraguay or Argentine, where jobs and a better life awaits them .

Mr. Cohen has already discussed the transfer of the D P to those countries, discussed it with the respective governments , andit appears a satisfactory arrangement has been arrived at between him and those Governments .

It is apparent that Mr. Cohen would not attempt to deal with the representatives of the city of Eastport Maine, which includes the Village of Quoddy, had he not considered the arrangements with the S.A sountries more or lessa fait accompli .

Cohen does not offer this project as thefinal solution of theDP problem, but only atemporary palliative, and to be applied and include only those who may be willing to go to S A rather than to Palestine .

The Senator would like you to take up this matter with Dr. Silver, in order that the project may be fully apprised for what it is and for what it aims to do. He intimated to me that D. Slver may be disposed to consider the project as one to interfere with the broader alestine policy and he is anxious to have the matter clarified .
